

FIRST MEETING-1859.

Hamilton, Tuesday, 25th January, 1859.

The Council met at 2 o'clock, P. M., at the Council Chamber, New County Buildings, in the City of Hamilton.

The Clerk presiding, in pursuance of the Statute.

MEMBERS PRESENT.

Messrs. Begue, Brown, Clement, Donaldson, Egleston, Hall, Harvey, Hannon, Jones, McQueen, Sexton, Soules, Stock, Thomas, and Tunis.

Mr. Stock, seconded by Mr. Donaldson, moved,

That Alexander Brown, Esq., be the Warden for the present year.

Mr. Begue, in amendment, seconded by Mr. McQueen, moved,

That W. D. Donaldson, Esq., Reeve of West Flamborough, be Warden for the present year.

The question being put on said Amendment, a division ensued, and it passed in the negative; only Messrs. Begue, Clement, McQueen, Thomas, and Tunis, voting in favor of Mr. Donaldson.

The original motion was then put, and confirmed by the Council, eight having voted in favor of Mr. Brown.

So Alexander Brown, Esq., made the solemn Declaration of Office as Warden for the County, and took his seat accordingly.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment. The Warden in the Chair.

Resolved,—That the letter from E. C. Thomas, Esq., Sheriff, respecting an enclosed Dressing Case for the use of the Judges; the letter from R. D. Wadsworth, respecting rent of Office; the letter from J. Rordans, respecting Surrogate Books, be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance. That the Circular from Maclear & Co., the Circular from Thompson & Co., and the Circular from James Bain. all referring to Assessment Rolls, &c., be referred to the Standing Committee on Printing. Resolved,—That William Lash, Esq., and Dr. W. H. Dalton, be appointed Trustees of the Dundas County Grammar School, in the place of Thomas Robertson and George M. Barton, Esquires, whose term of effice is expired.

On motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mr. Soules,

Resolved,—That James S. Wetenhall, Esq , be appointed County Auditor for the present year.

The Warden appointed M. D. L. Tisdale, Esq., the other County Auditor.

On motion of Mr. McQueen, seconded by Mr. Donaldson,

Resolved,—That Messrs. Thomas, Egleston, and the Warden, be appointed Commissioners on the Dundas and Binkley Road, for the present year.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. Begue,

The Memorial from several Ministers, respecting a Gaol Chaplain, was referred to a Committee of the Whole.

On motion of Mr. Sexton, seconded by Mr. Egleston,

Resolved,—That W. B. Woods and Thomas Egleston, Esquires, be appointed Trustees of the County Grammar School at Ancaster.

On motion of Mr. Tunis, seconded by Mr. Clement,

Resolved,—That the letter from Maclear & Co., with an Account, be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mr. Hall,

Resolved,—That the Rev. George Bull, be Superintendent of Common Schools, in the Township of Barton, for the present year.

On motion of Mr. Jones, seconded by Mr. Soules,

Resolved,—That the Rev. George Cheyne, be Superintendent of Common Schools for the Townships of Saltfleet and Binbrook, for the present year.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. McQueen,

The letters from various parties, soliciting the appointment to the office of County Engineer, were referred to a Committee of the Whole.

On motion of Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. McQueen,

Resolved,--That in reference to the appointment of Dr. Henwood as Surgeon to the County Gaol, the opinion of John O. Hatt, Esq., Solicitor to this Council, be immediately acted upon; and that the Warden notify the Sheriff, that this Council will exercise the power with which it is invested by Act of Provincial Parliament, and will use all legal means to enforce its Resolutions and By-Laws; and in case Dr. Henwood be not recognized and admitted as Surgeon to the Gaol by the Sheriff forthwith, that the Warden instruct the Solicitor of this Council to issue a Writ of Mandamus on that Officer to compel him to do so.

The Warden laid before the Council a letter from the County Treasurer, respecting Debentures maturing in 1859.

On motion of Mr. Stock, seconded by Mr. Thomas,

Resolved,—That the letter from the County Clerk, respecting the securities of the Lessee of the Gate on the Dundas and Binkley Road, be put into the hands of the Commissioners appointed to take charge of the aforesaid Road.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. Begue,

Resolved,--That the Report of the Commissioners of the Guelph and Dundas Road, be referred to the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges.

On motion of Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. Hannon,

Resolved,—That this Council delegate authority to the Townships of Binbrook and Glanford, to open a certain portion of the Town Line between said Townships, lying between the rear of the Fourth Concession of Binbrook and the Seneca Line.

On motion of Mr. McQueen, seconded by Mr. Tunis,

Resolved,—That the letter from the County Treasurer, with Receipts and Disbursements, and also the letter from the Treasurer respecting Debentures maturing in 1859, be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Tunis, seconded by Mr. Donaldson,

The Council resolved itself into Committee of the Whole, on the Memorial from a number of Clergymen, respecting Gaol Chaplain.

Mr. Harvey in the Chair.

The Council resumed,

And the Chairman reported the following Resolution, which was confirmed by the Council, viz.:—

"That the Committee cannot recommend the appointment of a Gaol Chaplain, as prayed for by the Memorial of the Rev. William Ormiston and other Clergymen; but would recommend the Council to instruct the Warden to request the Clergymen of the various Denominations to visit the Gaol whenever they may see fit, for the purpose of administering to the spiritual wants of the prisoners belonging, or claiming to belong, to their respective Denominations."

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. Tunis,

The Council resolved itself into Committee of the Whole, on the Letters from various parties, soliciting the appointment of County Engineer.

Mr. Hall in the Chair.

The Council resumed,

And the Chairman reported the following Resolution, which was confirmed by the Council, viz.:—

"That this Committee think it inexpedient to appoint a County Engineer at present, and would, therefore, leave the appointment to that Office over until next meeting of Council."

On metion of Mr. Stock, seconded by Mr. Donaldson,

Resolved,—That John O'Neil be appointed Pathmaster on the County Road, from Dundas Street to the Lake, between the Townships of East Flamborough and Nelson; also, that James Wheeler be appointed Pathmaster on the Township Line between the Townships of East and West Flamborough, from Freelton to the rear of the aforesaid Townships.

On motion of Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. Hannon,

Resolved—That Messrs. Francis Feneyck, Marius Clark, Charles Ptolemy, and James B. Stewart, be appointed Overseers of Highways, on the Town Line between Binbrook and Saltfleet; and that Messrs. James Gage, John Wilcox, and Daniel Wilcox, on the Line between Binbrook and Glanford.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. McQueen,

Resolved,—That the following persons be appointed Overseers of Highways on the County Road between West Flamborough and Beverly, viz.:—John McGregor, on portion of said Road extending from the Governor's Road to the Dundas and Waterloo Macadamized Road; Samuel C. Cornell, on said Road from Dundas and Waterloo Road to the 3rd Concession Line; Alexander Cowie, on the portion of said Road lying opposite to the 3rd Concession; Thomas McKee, on the part of said Road opposite to the 4th Concession; Robert Mackey, on the part of said Road opposite to the 5th Concession; James Gilmore, on the part of said Road opposite to the 6th Concession; and William Johnstone and Patrick Hamilton, on the portion of said Road lying opposite to the 7th and 8th Concessions.

On motion, the Council adjourned until 3 o'clock, P. M.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment.

On motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mr. Hannon,

Resolved,—That Robert Saunders, Jacob L. Smith, William Gage, Jacob Rymal, and Isa. Kern, be appointed Overseers of Highways on the Line between the Townships of Glanford and Barton, for the present year.

Mr. Hall brought up the Report from the Standing Committee on Gaol and Court House, which, on motion, was adopted.

Mr. Harvey brought up the Report from the Standing Committee on Printing, which, on motion, was adopted.

Mr. Donaldson brought up the Report from the Standing Committee on Finance, which, on motion, was adopted.

Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. Thomas, moved,

For leave to introduce a By-Law to raise, by way of Loan, a sum of money, for the purpose of paying off those Debentures which mature in 1859.

The said Bg-Law was received, and read a first time.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. Tunis,

The Council resolved itself into Committee of the Whole on the second reading of said By-Law.

Mr. Begue in the Chair.

The Council resumed,

And the Chairman reported the said By-Law without amendment.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. Harvey,

Resolved,—That said By Law be forthwith published in accordance with the Statute, and that a Special Meeting of this Council be held on Monday, the ninth day of May, 1859, at 2 o'clock, P.M., for the purpose of taking said By Law into consideration, and that the Clerk do cause the following Notice to be published with the said By Law.

NOTICE.

The above is a true copy of a proposed By-Law to be taken into consideration by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Wentworth, in the Council Chamber, New County Buildings, in the City of Hamilton, on Monday, the 9th day of May, 1859, at 2 o'clock, in the afternoon, at which time and place the Members of the said Municipality are hereby required to attend for the purpose aforesaid.

Mr. Donaldson, seconded by Mr. McQueen, moved,

For leave to introduce a By-Law to make provision for the remuneration of Councillors.

The said By-Law was received, and read a first time.

On motion, the said By-Law was read a second time.

Ordered,—That said By-Law be engrossed, and read a third time this day.

Pursuant to order, By-Law to make provision for the remuneration of Councillors, was read a third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Begue, seconded by Mr. Tunis,

Resolved,—That the Treasurer be authorized and required to pay to the Warden on his cheque, a sum sufficient to pay an additional fifty cents to each member of this Council, to meet his increased contingent expenses per diem, during this and all other Sessions of this Council for the present year; and, also, that each Councillor should receive his mileage of ten cents per mile.

Mr. Begue, seconded by Mr. Egleston, moved,

That an appropriation of \$200 be granted out of the funds of this County, in support of each of the County Grammar Schools of Dundas, Ancaster, and Waterdown.

Mr. Clement, in amendment, seconded by Mr. Tunis, moved,

That this Council do not feel justified in granting any sum of money to the Grammar School of Dundas, or any other Grammar School in this County.

The question being put on said Amendment, a division ensued, and the names being called for, were taken down as followeth:—

YEAS,—Messrs. Clement, Donaldson, Hall, Harvey, Hannon, Jones, McQueen, Sexton, Soules, and Tunis.—10.

NAYS,-Messrs. Begue, Egleston, Stock, and Thomas.-4.

So the Amendment passed in the affirmative, by a majority of six.

Mr. Hall brought up the Report from the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, which, on motion, was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mr. Hall,

Resolved,—That the Warden, Messrs. Thomas, Hall, Donaldson, and the mover, be a Special Committee, appointed by this Council, to confer with the Inspectors, that have been, or may be, appointed by the Government to report on Improvements required in Gaols; and to arrange with the said Inspectors any alterations that may be deemed necessary to make the Gaol of this County satisfy the requirements of the Act 20 Vic., Cap. 28, and to report the same to this Council.

On motion of Mr. Clement, seconded by Mr. Jones,

Resolved,—That the Local Superintendents of Common Schools shall be paid the sum of four dollars, for each School in their several Townships.

On motion, the Council adjourned until Monday, the ninth day of May next.

REPORT

Of the Commissioners of the Guelph and Dundas Road.

TO THE COUNTY COUNCIL:

The Commissioners of the Guelph and Dundas Road beg leave to present their Annual Report, as follows:—

That during the year 1858, they have expended upon Main Section, No. 1, on the stone part of said Road, the sum of \$2595.79, as follows:—

Two hundred dollars of the above sum was expended in purchasing a Gravel Bed, and it is the opinion of your Commissioners that in future years the expense of keeping Main Section No. 1, in repair, will be materially lessened, and the quality of the Road improved by using gravel in repairing a large portion of said section, instead of stone as heretofore.

That upon Main Section No. 2, on the gravel part of said Road, there has been expended the sum of \$1540.36, as follows:—546 dollars for a retaining wall on the Guelph and Dundas Hill, which was much required, as there was a heavy expenditure yearly on account of cleaning out drains, &c., on this Hill; \$949.36 in gravelling and repairing culverts; and 45 dollars for gravel.

The Commissioners beg leave to state that they have also expended in connection with the management of said Road, the following sums:—

The Commissioners beg leave further to Report, that the Road is now in a very good state of repair, and that they have about forty-six cords of Broken Stone ready to lay on when required.

The Commissioners beg leave further to Report, that the Toll Gates on said Road were leased for one year from the 21st of June last, as follows:—

The Commissioners would further state that they appointed two Accountants to adjust the Accounts between the two Counties, on account of said Road, who audited them to the 31st December, 1857, when there appeared to be due by the County of Wellington to the County of Wentworth, \$902.20, on account of excess of Debentures issued by the County of Wentworth over Wellington in the construction of said Road, and which has been paid over to the County of Wentworth,—and on account of the working of said Road, \$2481.68 at that time; the cause of this excess of Expenditure on the part of the County of Wentworth, is in consequence of the stone part of said Road being situated in that County, and costs a great deal more to keep in repair than gravel, and there has not been a heavy outlay on the gravel part of said Road since it was constructed, until within the last twelve months.

The Commissioners would further state, that they have balanced the Accounts for the working of said Road up to 31st December, 1858, and find a balance due by the County of Wellington to the County of Wentworth, of \$22.60, which has been ordered to be paid over.

Your Committee have also taken into consideration the letter of R. D. Wadsworth, asking the Council to remit the sum of \$10, charged him for rent, and would recommend that the same be remitted as asked for by Mr. Wadsworth.

Your Committee have also taken into consideration the letter from E. C. Thomas, Esq., Sheriff, respecting an Account for an enclosed Dressing Case, furnished by him for the use of the Judges; and having duly considered the matter, your Committee cannot recommend the Council to pay the amount claimed by the Sheriff, but would recommend the Council to instruct the Clerk to notify Mr. Thomas, that he is at liberty to remove the said article of Furniture whenever he may choose to do so.

Your Committee beg to state, with regard to the Receipts and Disbursements in the County of Wentworth for the year 1858, Jurnished by the Treasurer, that they call for no notice at the hands of your Committee, inasmuch as they will be laid before the County Auditors.

Your Committee have also taken into consideration a letter from the Treasurer, stating the amount of Debentures that mature in 1859, and beg to state, in reference thereto, that they have deemed it expedient to recommend that new Debentures should be issued for the purpose of raising money wherewith to take up those that mature during the year, and they have accordingly instructed their Chairman to draw up a By-Law for that purpose.

PETITION

For the repeal of the "Act to provide for the Registration of Debentures, issued by Municipal and other Corporate Budies."

To the Honorable the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled:

The Petition of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Wentworth,—

HUMBLY SHEWETH:

That whereas an Act was passed in the last Session of your Honorable House, called—"An Act to provide for the Registration of Debentures, issued by Municipal and other Corporate Bodies;" your Petitioners are of opinion that such an Act is not required by the Country, inasmuch as it neither tends to increase the value of such Debentures issued by authority of By-Laws of Municipal and other Corporate Bodies, nor to give increased security to the holders of such Debentures.

Your Petitioners are also of opinion that the Act is of no benefit to Municipalities issuing Debentures; but, on the contrary, has entailed on them an enormous expense, which, in the estimation of your Petitioners, is unnecessary, inasmuch as all the By-Laws under which Debentures are issued, are entered in the Clerk's Books, and a complete Register of all the Debentures issued, is kept by the Treasurers of the Municipalities; and any person desiring information, respecting the By-Laws under which Debentures are issued, or wishing to purchase Debentures, can as readily and as easily obtain such information, free of charge, at the Office of the Treasurer and

Clerk, as can be obtained at the County Register Office, by the system of Registration enjoined by the aforesaid Act.

Your Petitioners would therefore pray your Honorable House to take the premises under your consideration, and to cause the Act of 22 Victoria, Cap. 91, to be repealed.

And your Petitioners as in duty bound, will ever pray.

A BY-LAW

To make provision for the Remuneration of Councillors.

Whereas it is expedient and necessary to make provision for the remuneration of Councillors, for their attendance during the sittings of the Council: Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Wentworth, under and by authority of the Act 22 Vic., Cap. 99, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and may be lawful for each member of the Municipal Council of the said County of Wentworth, to have and receive for each day's attendance, during the sittings of the said Council, the sum of one dollar and fifty cents per day.

- 2. And be it enacted by the authority of the same, that each Councillor as aforesaid, shall be entitled to receive an allowance equal to one day's pay for coming to, and returning from, the sittings of this Council, in addition to the remuneration they are severally entitled to for the days they may actually attend at the meetings of the Council.
- 3. And be it further enacted, that any Councillor absenting himself from the regular or properly called meetings of this Council, without leave of absence from the Warden for the time being, shall be liable to a fine of one dollar and fifty cents, for each and every day he may so absent himself, without leave of absence as aforesaid.
- 4. And be it further enacted, that all such fines as aforesaid, shall be imposed and collected according to the provisions of the Statute under which this Council is established.
- 5. And be it further enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Warden, on the last day of each Session, to issue his Cheque upon the Treasurer in favor of the respective Councillors for the several sums they may be entitled to for their attendance as Councillors as aforesaid.
- 6. And be it further enacted, that By-Law Number 25 of this Council be, and the same is, hereby repealed.
- 7. And be it further enacted, that this By-Law shall be sufficient Warrant and authority to the Treasurer for the payment of all sums under the provisions of this By-Law.
