Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec,

WAS HELD ON

WEDNESDAY, 5TH JULY, 1848,

IN THE

National School House, Montreal.

THE REVEREND OFFICIAL MACKIE, D.D., Vice-President, in the Chair.
Divine Service had been previously held in the Parish Church.

The Rev. A. W. Mountain, Secretary of the Society, read the Report for the past year. It was then

That the Report now read be received and adopted, and printed under the direction of the Central Board.

2d. Moved by the Rev. JAMES REID, V.P., of St. Armand, seconded by the Rev. W. ABBOTT, and Resolved,

That this meeting desires to express its thankfulness to the Giver of all good for the measure of success which has attended the exertions made on behalf of the Society during the past year.

3d. Moved by the Rev. W. B. BOND, seconded by the Rev. I. HELLMUTH, and Resolved,

That this meeting desires to acknowledge the claim which the Society has upon all members of the Church within the Diocese, for continued and increased exertion in its support.

SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT.

It will not be considered a strange thing if, met together to celebrate another anniversary of the Church Society, and to review the dealings of God with us during the year that has past, we first give expression to our feelings of sorrow, because of the mournful dispensation which has removed so many of the Officers of the Society from amongst us. The eventful summer of 1847 saw the Society deprived of its Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and four members of the Central Board, all of whom counted not their lives dear to them, so that they might minister to the wants, as well temporal as spiritual, of their poor and suffering brethren in Christ. And this present season has opened upon us with another event of the same nature. Another member of the Central Board has fallen in the same cause with those whose departure hence, when we looked only at the case of ourselves who were left behind, we must have all felt that we had the deepest reason to lament. But to them, we have good grounds to hope, to die was gain.—Let us not forget the duty which lies upon us, to shew, by redoubled exertions in the cause of Christ, that we are not unmindful of the effect which these trials of our faith were designed to produce. If God has dealt severely with us, in depriving the Society of so many of its most active and influential members, let us endeavour to exhibit so much increased zeal in its cause, as shall prove that we are imitating the faith and patience of those who have gone before us, and shall preserve its interests from languishing or decaying in our hands.

To the energy and devotedness of its first Secretary, the Society is indebted for much of whatever degree of stability and prosperity it may have reached. It is impossible to pass over the invaluable services rendered by him, without at least some such brief notice as this. Of the estimation in which they were held there never could

be any kind of doubt ; but the very fact of his occupying the position which he did necessarily precluded the Society from rendering any public testimony—such as he was ever ready to yield to others—to his acknowledged efficiency and disinterested zeal : since such testimony must have come through himself.

Time will not admit of our dwelling upon the excellencies of the others who have been taken from us. Suffice it to say, that the Society owes much to all of them ; for though it may have happened that the poverty of their people, or other serious obstacles, have stood in the way of the immediate advancement of the Society's cause in the localities of some among them, yet are we well assured that even when the power *to do* was absent, the *will* was not wanting, and that had it pleased God, in his good Providence, to place them under more favourable circumstances, we should have seen the result of their zealous labors in the Society's behalf.

The Central Board, before proceeding to business at its stated meeting in October last, placed upon record an expression of the deep regret with which they had received from their chairman the painful intelligence that it had been the will of God to remove, by death, so many of its valued members.

During the past year the Society has also been deprived of the assistance and support of one who stood first upon it's list of Vice-Presidents, the late Chief Justice Reid, and who, by his last act, shewed himself not unmindful of the interest which all members of the Church should evince in her prosperity. Conceiving it, we may presume, to be the most effectual and satisfactory way of promoting her welfare in this Diocese, he left a legacy of one hundred pounds to the Church Society—setting herein an example well worthy of the imitation of those to whose stewardship have been committed the riches of this world.

It is rather remarkable that this is only the second instance, during six years, of the receipt of a legacy by the Society—and it is desirable to call the attention of the rich among us to the claims

which the Society has upon them, and which ought not to be forgotten in their final disposal of their worldly substance.—We may be permitted to remind them that a very large proportion of the incomes of the two Venerable Societies in our father land, (to whom, under God, the Church in this Province is mainly indebted for her very existence)—the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, and the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge—was derived from funds of which those bodies had become possessed as the recipients of *legacies*.—The late Miss Margaret Finlay, of Quebec, who died in September last, left by will the sum of of £500 to the Lord Bishop of Montreal, to be applied to the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen in this Diocese, besides legacies for other charitable purposes to a very large amount. Although this legacy was not made to the Society, yet it is not considered out of place to record it here, since the provision for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy is one of the first objects contemplated by the Society, and it is probable that when the legacy shall be paid, his Lordship will transfer the amount from his own hands to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

May God, by His spirit, put it into the hearts of many to go and do likewise.

The past year, it is unnecessary to remind you, has been marked by events in the mercantile world which have no parallel in the history of British commerce, and we are therefore justified in entertaining the belief that had it not pleased God to throw such severe checks upon the temporal prosperity of the community, the financial affairs of the Church Society would wear a very much more favorable aspect than they at present exhibit. This is not a mere problematical conjecture, for great and praiseworthy exertions have been made within the limits of more than one of the District Associations to add to the means of usefulness of the Society, and, as we have no reason to believe that any unaccountable falling off has anywhere taken place, the conclusion is plain that under favour-

able, or even ordinary, circumstances, the income of the Society would have received some considerable increase this year. It may be proper to mention here, that in consequence of the Quebec Bank not having declared a Dividend for the past half year, the income of the Society has been lessened on that account by £30.

The whole amount received by the Treasurers in Quebec and Montreal since the last annual Report was made up, exclusive of Remittances from District Associations, (amounting to £146 10s. 3d) has been £1300 16 7½

being an increase of £234 8s. 6d., over the receipts of last year. The amount in the hands of the Treasurers would have been rather larger if all the Clergy had found it practicable to remit earlier the proceeds of Sermons preached in their Missions, and the District Associations their proportions of Annual Subscriptions. The first amount named includes a sum of £100 sterling, paid into the hands of the Treasurer at Quebec, being donations from England, received through the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel for the orphans of Missionaries of that Society who died of fever last year, £20 of which was a donation from the late Archbishop of Canterbury, which was conveyed, very shortly before it pleased God to remove the Archbishop to a better world, to the Secretary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, in an extremely kind and considerate manner, evincing the warm and paternal interest which His Grace always felt in the welfare of the Church in the Colonies. The collections made throughout the Diocese for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, in compliance with the request contained in the Bishop's Circular of August last, amounted in the aggregate, to £343 10s. 9d. This amount was collected in 50 Parishes or Missions. Four missions were vacant at the time the sermon should have been preached, which leaves only four places in the Diocese

unaccounted for. Some few of these collections, however, have not yet been paid in, and are, therefore, not included in the Treasurer's accounts.

During the past year, the sum of £100 has been invested, for the general purposes of the Society in Montreal Bank Stock, making the whole sum so invested £150—and £25 in Quebec Bank Stock, making the whole sum there invested £1,025. Total, £1175.

Besides this there has been invested on account of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the sum of £350 in Montreal Bank Stock, and of £200 in Government Debentures, making the whole amount invested on this account £1,000.

It is with much satisfaction that we announce that the Governor General has been pleased to evince the interest which His Excellency feels in the prosperity of the Society, by making a donation of £12 10s., thus associating himself with the Society as a Life Member.

The Society has to acknowledge two donations of Land—one lot, of 100 acres, in the Township of Cox, from Dr. George Mellis Douglas, and another of 50 acres, in the Township of Cranbourne from Mr. James Poole, of Quebec. The Central Board would once more earnestly call the attention of landholders among the Churchmen in the Diocese to this mode of adding to the resources of the Society, and would refer them to the appeal made in this be-

half in the conclusion of the last Annual Report.—A list of the Society's lands will be found in the Appendix to the present Report when published.

Travelling Missionaries.

The appointment of the Revd. C. Forest to the office of Travelling

Missionary, in which capacity he attended the Quarantine Station, was mentioned in the last report. He retired from the service of the Society in August, having received a permanent charge from the Bishop. The diminution which the fever of last year made in the number of the Clergy of the Diocese, which was before quite insufficient to meet the demand that existed for their services, and the necessity which has thence arisen for filling up the vacancies in *permanent* Missions, with persons who might otherwise have been employed as Travelling Missionaries preclude the hope of any immediate prospect of finding men for these appointments in connection with the Society. The only clergyman in the Diocese who derives any portion of his income from the Society is the Rev. E. G. Sutton, who receives £50 per annum from its funds. Mr. Sutton has since the last Anniversary succeeded the Rev. R. G. Pless as Travelling Missionary at St. Rémi, Russeltown, and parts adjacent.

Travelling Agent.

Mention was made in the last Report of the appointment of a gentleman to the newly created office of Travelling Agent. But the Society had not enjoyed the advantage of his services in this capacity, or in that with which it was combined, of Assistant Secretary, much more than six months, when he was taken from us. The appointment of Travelling Agent has since been united with that of Secretary. The present Secretary being, by the terms of his engagement with the Society, precluded from holding any pastoral charge, he is enabled to devote the whole of his time to the Society, and will travel, under the direction of the Central Board, at such seasons as will admit of his leaving Quebec without detriment to the proper duties of his office as Secretary.

Depository.

It was also mentioned, in the last Annual Report, that a Depository for Books and Tracts had been established in Montreal. The

books which were ordered last Autumn, from England, did not arrive till May last, so that the stock, and consequently the sales, have hitherto been extremely small. But the Depository being now on a more permanent footing, it is trusted that its usefulness may be widely extended. It is proposed to publish, in an Appendix to this Report, a list of the Books and Tracts in the Depository, which is in charge of Mrs. Walton at her establishment in Great St James Street, Montreal.

At the last meeting of the Central Board, the Book and Tract Committee presented a Report, which was adopted by the Board, and in which it was recommended that Prayer Books be supplied to the Clergy who are at a distance from Montreal, to be disposed of by them, and accounted for to the Board—and that tracts be gratuitously distributed throughout the Diocese.—The prices of all the Books were also reduced—and it is confidently hoped that the present arrangements will give such satisfaction to the Clergy and Laity in general that the stock on hand will be speedily diminished to a considerable extent.

Lands.

The attention of the Lay Committee of the Society has been drawn to a plan proposed by the late Assistant Secretary, for the better preservation and management of the Society's Lands.—The Central Board have adopted the plan suggested by the Committee, by which the nearest resident Clergyman, with his Church Warden, and any member of the Lay Committee who may reside in the neighbourhood, are constituted a Sub-committee for carrying out certain rules which have been framed respecting the management of the lands. The Central Board rely on the kindness of the different Clergymen within whose limits the Society's lands may lie, for their zealous co-operation in carrying into effect a scheme so important to the interests of the Society.

In proceeding to give an account of the amounts raised throughout the Diocese and of the operations of the Society and its different

Associations, it is conceived advisable to deviate in some degree from the course which has been hitherto pursued in presenting the Annual Report, and to reserve for an Appendix the detailed account of the amounts raised in the different Parishes or Missions.

In the Parish of Quebec, the whole amount raised during the past year, for the Society, has been £324 17s. 0d., of which £50 were subscriptions of Life Members, £127 13s. 0½d Annual Subscriptions, £82 11s. 8d. proceeds of sermons for Widows and Orphans £43 17s. 4d. of Quinquagesima Sermons, £14 12s. 5½d donations,—and £6 2s 6d. donations, (including half of one annual subscription so appropriated,) to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund. Independently of the collections made for the Widows and Orphans after sermons, the sum of upwards of £600 was contributed in Quebec, towards the assistance of one particular case, that of the family of a Clergyman who fell a victim to his devoted attendance on the sufferers by the prevailing fever. It is conceived to be only just to mention this here, since this contribution has materially assisted in placing the family in such circumstances as has rendered it unnecessary that any application should be made to the Central Board in their behalf.

No Clergyman having yet been appointed to fill the office of the Travelling Missionary, to whose support the congregation of Trinity Chapel, Montreal, (as mentioned in the last Annual Report) incited by the zeal and energy of their late so much valued and so justly lamented Pastor, had pledged themselves, there has been no necessity for calling upon the Subscribers to the Mission Fund of the

Association of that Chapelry, for the amount of their subscriptions this year. If such necessity had existed, the receipts from Montreal would have amounted to £125 more than the Treasurer's accounts now exhibit.

Upper Ottawa District Association.

There are only two Missions within the limits of this Association, Clarendon and Hull. In the former, the Missionary writes, "there is no money in circulation, and it is impossible, in the present state of the lumber business, on which the people wholly depend, directly or indirectly, to raise contributions for any public purpose, except in produce; even the Municipal and School taxes are paid in grain. Hence, though the objects of the Society are kept in view, and sermons were preached (as required by the Bishop's circular,) no collections were taken up on behalf of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, or of the general purposes of the Society." The sum of £10 8s. 9d., has been contributed towards the completion of the Church at Clarendon. In the Mission of Hull, the only remaining one in the District, the sum of £4 was collected for Widows and Orphans and £2 after Quinquagesima Sermon, and £28 15s. have been raised for different Church purposes contemplated by the Society, but carried on independently of it. The amount, therefore, contributed to the Society from this District is only £6—that raised for Church purposes £39 3s. 9d.

Lower Ottawa District Association.

This District comprises the Missions of St. Andrews, Grenville, Vaudreuil and the Gore. The amount for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund has been £7 5s., of Quinquagesima collections £4 16s. 3d., of annual subscriptions and donations £54 8s. 6d. Total for the Society £66 9s. 9d., being considerably more than twice the amount reported last year. It appears, however, that there was an omission in the Annual Report of 1847 of about £10, from this District;

but, even if we take this into account, the amount raised this year will be found very nearly to double that of last.

The Secretary attributes this increase mainly to the exertions of the chairman, the Rev. W. Abbott, in his own Mission of St. Andrews. But an examination of the detailed account to be given in the Appendix, will shew that the Chairman has been zealously supported as well by the Secretary himself, as by the Missionary at Grenville.

The Annual Meeting of the District was held at St. Andrews on May 24, preceded by Divine Service, when a sermon was preached by the Rev. W. Abbott. The sum of £5 was voted for Church purposes in Grenville.

A meeting of the Parochial Association of St. Andrews was held at that place in February, when the following Resolutions were carried :

1. That having duly considered the tenor of the Lord Bishop's Circular of January 28, 1848, it appears evident to this meeting, that upon the continued results of the operation of the Diocesan Church Society in every Parish or Mission in this Diocese will be made in a great measure to depend the continuance of those ministrations of the Church which they now enjoy, and that it is the duty of this Parish to comply with so reasonable a condition : and, therefore, that such measures be now adopted as will ensure a more efficient and general working of the Parochial Association of the Church Society established in this Parish.

2. That this meeting deem it to be the duty of all members of the Church, both male and female, above the age of 15 years, to identify themselves with this Society, by subscribing annually, according to their respective means, and otherwise advancing its interests to the utmost of their power : thereby forming that bond of union and co-operation which, with the Divine blessing, will assist in securing to us and to our children the perpetuity of our church in the country.

3. That the Committee of this Association be increased in

accordance with the 11th Article of the Constitution of the Parent Society and that the parish be divided into districts, and each district assigned to two or more members of the Sub-committee as their respective fields of operation, in order to carry out the foregoing Resolutions.

The Secretary adds that the "Sub-committee then appointed have zealously performed their duty, and the people liberally responded to the appeal. The Subscription list for the past year is greatly increased, and it is intended that the whole amount of these subscriptions shall be placed at the disposal of the Central Board, notwithstanding that considerable expense has already been incurred by the Parishioners in shingling the Church and paying off a portion of the old debt."

If the spirit which has manifested itself at St. Andrew's were extended over the whole Diocese, we might fairly hope that the income of the Society would be speedily increased to a very considerable extent. This Parish has set an example well worthy of imitation: let us hope that in the ensuing year it may go on and prosper, and that others may exhibit the same forwardness of mind.

The amount remitted, on account of the annual subscriptions, from this District to the Treasurer of the Parent Society, has been £38 16s. 6d.

The sum of about £30 has been this year contributed, partly in labor and materials, for Church purposes at Grenville.

Beauharnois District Association.

The returns which have been received from this District, which comprises the Missions of Lachine, Huntingdon, Ormstown, St. Martin, and Côteau du Lac, shew an amount contributed for the Society of £56 17s. 5d., being an increase of more than one half upon the amount raised last year. The Sermon for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund was preached in all the Missions (except the last mentioned) in this District, and the collections made after it amounted

to £19 2s. 11d.—The Quinquagesima collection was made in all, amounting to £18 2s. 0d. ; and the Annual Subscriptions in Lachine, Huntingdon, Côteau du Lac, and Durham, make up the balance of £56 17s. 5d.

The sum of £11 7s. 6d., has been remitted to the Treasurer at Montreal.

At Côteau du Lac the sum of £47 is annually contributed by the people, towards the support of the Missionary.

Mascouche District Association.

The Annual Meeting of this Association was held at Rawdon, in March last. The amounts collected after Sermons for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, in the three Missions in the District, were altogether £7 4s. 6d.—of Quinquagesima collections £5 10s. 0d. ; of Annual Subscriptions £4 15s. 0d. Total, £17 9s. 6d. Besides these amounts, the sum of £100 17s. 6d. has been raised within the District, irrespectively of the Society, for objects contemplated by its constitution.

Richelieu District Association.

This Association comprehends within its limits the parishes of St. John, Chambly, and Clarenceville, and the Missions of Laprairie, with L'Acadie attached, Lacolle, Christieville, Sherrington, and St. Rémi.

The Annual Meeting was held at St. John, in February. The Rev. I. P. White preached upon the occasion. The attendance at the meeting was very numerous and the spirit manifested extremely encouraging. The amount of collections for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund in six of the above mentioned places was £36 5s. 2d.—of Quinquagesima Collections at all £35 1s. 10d.—of Annual Subscriptions and donations at St. John, Chambly, Clarenceville, Laprairie and Christieville, £90 2s. 6½d.—Total £161 9s. 6d½.—of which sum the parish of St. John alone contributed upwards of £69, in the collection of which the ladies of the congregation were, as in

former years, in a great degree instrumental. The Rector desires to express his obligations to them in this behalf. If it had not been for a temporary vacancy in one Mission, and for the impracticability which, on account of the hardness of the times, was found to exist of getting in the subscriptions promised in another—and, further, if the subscribers in one Mission had not fallen into the mistake of supposing that by the rules of the Society they were at liberty to appropriate the *whole* of their contributions, (by doing which they ceased to be contributors to the Society,) the amount raised this year would probably have been increased by about £25. But the District on the whole has kept up its well-earned reputation, and still stands first as to the amount raised within its limits. It was not to be expected that we should have had any increase to report, since the exertions made in previous years in the majority of the Missions had been as great as there had been any reasonable ground to look for. Yet, when the circumstances just alluded to are taken into consideration, as well as the generally unfavourable state of mercantile affairs, a decrease of only £3 cannot be regarded as otherwise than creditable. The District Committee have rendered assistance to different Church objects within its own limits. The sum of £37 7s. 9d, has been reported as raised for Church purposes independently of the Society. It may be proper to mention here, that it has not been conceived expedient to give in one sum the amounts reported in this way from different parts of the Diocese, inasmuch as to do so would be a very unfair exhibition of what the Church is doing, since a very great deal is contributed for different purposes which is not reported, it being considered in some quarters incorrect to report to the Society any sums except those raised directly for its own funds.

Missisquoi District Association.

The Annual Meeting of this Association was held, at Dunham, in May last, when Divine service was performed and a sermon preached by Rev. T. Johnson. The following Parishes and Mis-

sions are included within its limits ; St. Armand East, Stanbridge, Shefford, Granby, Abbotsford, Farnham, St. Armand West, Dunham, Sutton and Brome. The amount of collections for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund in all of these, has been £22 18s. 8½ ; of Quinquagesima Collections, £20 14s. 7½., and of Annual Subscriptions and donations, together with one life subscription, £101 5s. Total, £144 18s. 4d. The sum of £27 16s. 9d. has been remitted to the Parent Society.

The new Church at Rougemont, in this District, to which, in consideration of the great exertions made by the people upon the spot, the Society granted £25, was consecrated on Sunday last, July 2d.

For Church purposes independent of the Society £27 5s., have been reported as raised within the District during the year, of which £23 10s. are Annual Subscriptions towards the purchase of a Glebe in the Mission of Brome.

St. Francis District Association.

The Annual Meeting was held at Sherbrooke, in February, when Divine service was performed, and a sermon was preached by the Rev. L. Doolittle. The whole amount raised for the Society, during the year, in this District, which contains the Missions of Sherbrooke, Lennoxville, Compton, Hatley, Eaton, Melbourne, Bury, and Kingsey, has been £98 14s., of which £17 9s. 11½d. are the proceeds of collections made after sermons for widows and orphans in all the beforementioned places except Compton, which was temporarily vacant at the time the Sermons were preached—£14 19s. 0½d., the proceeds of Quinquagesima Collections in all the Missions except Melbourne, vacant—and £66 5s., the amount of Annual subscriptions and donations, Melbourne being here also excepted from the cause just mentioned.

The sum of £17 15s. 1d. has been remitted to the Treasurer at Montreal. The remainder of the Annual Subscriptions were either appropriated beforehand (to the extent of one half) by the contributors, or disposed of by the Committee of the Association. Upwards of

£180, (more than one half in Sherbrooke alone, of which particulars will be given in the Appendix) have been raised, during the year, as reported by the Secretary, for local Church purposes, irrespectively of contributions to the Society within this District.

Three Rivers District Association.

This District comprises the Rectories of Three Rivers and Sorel, with the Missions of Rivière du Loup, Nicolet and Drummondville. The aggregate of collections for the Widows' and Orphans Fund in these places is £29 2s. 8½d. of Quinquagesima Collections £17 15s. 5d. of Annual Subscriptions £48 8s. 6½d. Of this last amount £17 19s. 4½d. were specially appropriated, and the District Committee expended about £14 within their own limits, remitting to the Treasurer at Quebec £15 17s. 1d. The whole amount raised for the Society during the year is £95 6s. 8d., being nearly double the amount reported last year. In last year's Report, however, the sum of £12 10s. mentioned as raised at Sorel, for local Church purposes, should have been included in the contributions to the Society. The amount is increased this year by an Annual Subscription of £10 from His Excellency the Commander of the Forces, Lieut. General Sir Benjamin D'Urban. It is proposed to request His Excellency to accept office as one of the Vice Presidents of the Society, in order to mark the Society's appreciation of this kind and liberal proof of interest in its prosperity.

The Nicolet Endowment Fund, to which the Society contributed £100, has received an increase during the year of £48 1s. 2d., (including a dividend of £7 10) part of which was derived from the funds of the Church. This makes the whole amount invested on account of this fund £320. The sum of £27 10s. has been contributed at Lower Durham, in the Mission of Drummondville, towards the completion of the Church at that place.

Megantic District Association.

The Annual Meeting of this Association was held at St. Sylvester in March. A sermon was preached upon the occasion by the Rev.

J. Torrance. Meetings were also held, preceded by Divine service and sermon, at Pointe Levi, Leeds, Ireland, and Inverness; these meetings were attended by the Secretary of the Society. The Missions of Pointe Levi, St. Sylvester, Leeds, Rivière du Loup en bas, Ireland and Frampton comprise this District. The two latter, however, have been vacant during the greater part of the past year, and there are, therefore, no returns from them. From the other four the whole amount contributed to the Society has been £61 10s, being more than the amount contributed last year by the whole six Missions, of which £18 8s. 2d. were the proceeds of Sermons for the Widows and Orphans—£12 6s. 10d. of Quinquagesima Sermons in three missions, and £29 15s., the amount of annual Subscriptions in two Missions, besides one donation of £1.

The sum of £15 has been remitted to the Treasurer at Quebec.

Besides these amounts the sum of £109 7s. 1½d. has been raised in four Missions for local Church purposes.

Portneuf District Association.

Only two Missions are included in this District, Portneuf and Valcartier. The former Mission has been vacant for the greater part of the past year, so that there is nothing to report from it except the proceeds of Sermons for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and two donations given as fees to a clergyman who officiated occasionally during the vacancy of the Mission. In the Mission of Valcartier a Parochial Association has been organized, which has paid in the sum of £2 10s., making the whole amount raised within the District for the Society £6 16s. 4½d.

Gaspé District Association.

This District comprehends all the Missions within the Civil District of the same name—Gaspé Basin, Cape Cove and New Carlisle, being the places of residence of the three Missionaries. From the immense distances the clergy are from one another, it is impossible to maintain anything like frequent intercourse. One consequence of this has been that no meeting of the Association has been

held for some time—nor are there any annual subscriptions raised within the District. At New Carlisle there is an annual amount of £36, contributed towards the support of the Clergyman, which was given to the Society when the Rules permitted contributors to appropriate the whole of their subscriptions.

A like subscription is also made, it is believed, in one or both of the other Missions in the District, but no report of it has been received.

The amounts collected after sermons for Widows and Orphans were £8 9s. 8½d.—Quinquagesima Sermons, £13 15s.—Total, £22 4s. 8½d.

We have thus brought the Report to a close, and it will have been seen that, notwithstanding the unfavourable circumstances to which allusion has already been made, there has been a small increase in the receipts over those of last year, so that the result of the labours undertaken during the past year in the Society's behalf may be considered on the whole satisfactory. But let us not on that account think that we have done enough—for if we can be said to prosper in a year peculiarly unfavourable to such undertakings, it is manifest that we shall be warranted in looking for a very considerable increase if it should please God that the effects of the present depression of affairs should be only temporary. The Society only requires to be better and more extensively known to secure the cordial co-operation and support of all churchmen in the Diocese. Let us then earnestly labor in the good cause—and that we may go on and prosper let us continually seek counsel and support of the Great Disposer of all events, that He would by His Heavenly Grace incline the hearts of His people to give willingly to a Society which has for its object the extension of the kingdom of His dear Son. Let us provoke one another unto love and good works, trusting to the same all merciful Power to crown our labours with success, and confiding in the assurance that these labours, if carried on in faith, will be accepted, as the fruits of faith, in the beloved, and will be reckoned as done for the Saviour Himself, inasmuch as we do them for His little flock who are crying to us for the bread of life.

Forms of Bequests and Debises by Will.

I. A Bequest of a sum of Money, or of Shares of Stock, or Public Debentures for the general purposes of the Society.

I give and bequeath to the "Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec," incorporated by a Statute of the Province of Canada, passed in the seventh year of the Reign of Her Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, the sum of _____ pounds, Currency, (or _____ Shares of Stock in the _____ Bank of _____, standing in my name in the books of the said Bank,) or, (if Debentures, describe them briefly,) upon trust, to be by the said Church Society applied *to and for the uses and purposes of the said Society*, as specified in the said Act of Incorporation, and none other.

II. A Bequest of a sum of Money, or of Shares of Stock, or Debentures for one or more of the specific purposes of the Society.

(Same as the foregoing, only instead of the words in italics, say) for and towards the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland, within the said Diocese of Quebec,—the creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen of the said United Church within the said Diocese,—and making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the widows and orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

Or,

For and towards the encouragement of education and the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the said Diocese of Quebec, in conformity with the principles of the United Church of England and Ireland.

Or,

For and towards a Fund for assisting persons preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the United Church of England and Ireland within the said Diocese of Quebec.

Or,

For and towards a Fund for circulating, in the said Diocese of Quebec, the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the United Church of England and Ireland, and the Books and Tracts approved by the said Church Society for circulation within the said Diocese of Quebec.

Or,

As an aid towards the erection, endowment and maintenance of Churches, according to the Establishment of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Quebec,—the erection and maintenance of Parsonage Houses,—the setting apart of Burial Grounds and Church-yards, and the Endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the said Establishment within the said Diocese.

III. A Devise of Real Estate for the general purposes of the Society.

I give and devise unto the “ Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec,” incorporated by a Statute of the Province of Canada, passed in the seventh year of the Reign of Her Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, all and singular, &c. (Describe the Real Estate clearly.) To have and to hold the said, &c., unto the said Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec, and their successors, for ever: upon trust to hold and apply the same, and the rents, issues and profits thereof *to and for the uses and purposes of the said Church Society*, as specified in the said Act of Incorporation, and none other, and under the provisions of the aforesaid Act of Incorporation of the said Church Society.

IV. *A Devise of Real Estate for any one or more of the specific purposes of the Society.*

Same as in No. 3—only instead of the words in italics, insert the specific purpose, as in No. 2.

V. *A devise to the Society of a Site for a Church, &c.*

Same as No. 3, down to the words “for ever”—then go on as follows :—to the uses and upon the trusts following, that is to say ; Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, as and for the place and Site of a Church and Church-yard, and Burial Ground, for the sole use and benefit of Members of the United Church of England and Ireland, residing in places adjacent to the said site and premises within the said Diocese of Quebec, being in full communion with the same, according to the doctrines and discipline of the said United Church of England and Ireland, and for no other purpose, and under the provisions of the aforesaid Act of Incorporation of the said Church Society.
