Distant from the County Town, Perth, 26 miles, from the City of Ottawa 35 miles, and from Brockville, by Railway, 52 miles. Value of assessed property in the Village, £8,500. A daily mail arrives here. Population about 350.

MONTREAL, C. E.—The largest and most populous City of British North America, and the chief seat of commerce and principal port of entry for the Canadas—is situated at the head of sea or outward navigation, and the foot of the great chain of River, Lake and Canal navigation, which extends westward to Chicago and Fond du Lac, a distance of some 1400 miles, and embraces the largest extent of inland water communication in the world. Montreal is situated on a large, fertile and beautiful island of the same name, 30 miles in length by 10 miles of extreme width, formed by the confluence of the Ottawa and St. Lawrence Rivers, and on the north bank of the latter. Planted thus at the point of junction of two of the mightiest rivers in the world, and having a free communication with the Ocean, though in reality 90 miles above the influence of the tide and upwards of 300 miles from salt water, the City possesses all the advantages of a seaport, accessible to Steamships of 1800 tons burthen and over. Holding, too, the keys, as it were, of Canal and Lake navigation, or, as it has been styled, of "the new Mediterranean," its position with reference to Quebec, Canada West, the Western States, New York, Boston, Albany, Portland, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, &c., makes it, by means of its extensive water and railway communications, the great centre of attraction as well as the COMMERCIAL EMPORIUM of Canada. This City is the chief seat of manufacturing operations in Canada, and has many extensive and costly establishments, the productions of which will compare favorably with those of a like kind from any other part of the world. The principal business streets are Notre Dame, St. Paul, Commissioners, McGill, Great St. James, and the Main Streets of St. Lawrence, Quebec, St. Anns, St. Joseph and St. Antoine Suburbs. The City and Suburbs are well lighted with gas, and many of the principal streets are paved with stone. By the River, or the Mountain, in fact from whichever side approached, Montreal and its vicinages, (the wood-clad "*Mont-Royal*" in rear forming a magnificent back-ground, and the great River and Country beyond towards which it slopes, stretching out in front,) with its numberless beautiful villas and orchards, and delightful drives, its grand and stately edifices and many elegant cut-stone public and other buildings, with their glittering roofs, domes, tall spires and lofty towers, present to the view of the beholder a vast, picturesque and grand panorama. Space does not permit of enumerating the many handsome buildings Montreal can boast; but among them may be mentioned, the Bonsecours Market, erected at a cost of £71,825, which is said to be the finest market building on the Continent, the Court House, costing £50,000, the French Cathedral, the Bank of Montreal, the City Bank, Bank of British North America, St. Andrew's (Scotch) Church, McGill College, the Jesuits College, the General Hospital, St. George's Church, Wesleyan Church, the Post Office, the Custom House, and many other imposing structures. Montreal possesses also magnificent Water Works, constructed at an outlay of £300,000. The water is taken from the St. Lawrence, a mile and a-half above the Lachine Rapids, and is conducted a distance of five miles through an open canal to a spacious basin, whence it is pumped up through the pumping-main, two miles and three-quarters in length, to Reservoirs, on the brow of the Mountain, holding fifteen millions of gallons. The Harbor and Basins, into which the last link of the great Canadian inland canals debouches, though not large, are good, convenient, safe and capable of extension and improvement, at comparatively small expense. The wharves, constructed of massive cut-stone, extending over a mile in length, and affording a fine, unbroken promenade, are unequalled in America, and, for appearance, commodiousness and cleanliness, are unexcelled elsewhere. From Point St. Charles, at the head of the Harbor, to St. Lambert, on the opposite shore, a distance of a mile and three-quarters, "the great Father of Rivers"—the Saint Lawrence—is being spanned by the Victoria Bridge, now in course of construction. With its two long abutments of solid masonry, and twenty-four massive piers on which it rests this bridge of iron, built on the tubular principle, with its centre track for cars and locomotives, and projecting wings forming, on either side, a path-way for foot passengers—the greatest work of the kind ever attempted—will be, when complete, the master-piece of Engineering and the wonder of the world. Montreal possesses great advantages, arising from the great chain of Canadian Railways. This, when the Victoria Bridge is completed, will be the great central depot for the traffic of a chain of unbroken Railway communication upwards of 1100 miles in length. The cars of the Grand Trunk Railway run daily to Quebec, Portland and Canada West, and connect at Toronto with the Great Western and Northern Railways, and the Great West. By the Line to Portland, a communication with the States is obtained, and a winter port is afforded. The Champlain and St. Lawrence, and Montreal and New York Railways, also afford a direct communication with New York, Boston, and the principal Cities in the United States, and connect with all the southern roads on the northern part of the Continent. In summer, as already stated, to these advantages is conjoined, that of the navigation, which is usually open from about the middle of April to the end of November. A line of splendid, powerful and fast Screw-steamers, subsidized by Government, and performing regular Mail-service, ply fortnightly, between Liverpool and Montreal in summer, and the former place and Portland, monthly, during winter. In summer, daily lines of Steamers, Propellers and other vessels, run between Montreal and Quebec, Ottawa City, Prescott, Brockville, Kingston, Cobourg, Port Hope, Toronto, Hamilton, and many other lake and river ports, eastward as well as westward. Montreal is distant from Liverpool 2750 miles, from Quebec 180 miles, from Kingston 173 miles from Toronto 333 miles, from Ottawa City 120 miles, from New York 453 miles, from Boston 332 miles, and from Portland 292 miles. Montreal returns three Members to the Provincial Parliament. Its population is about 75,000, and is steadily augmenting. It increased 5000 during the year 1856. Value of assessed property in 1856, £6,391,333 £s. Sd., and the revenue of the City, from all sources, £71,258.

TORONTO, C. W.—The Metropolis of Western Canada,—situated on the north-west shore of Lake Ontario, and north of the Bay, which is a spacious and beautiful sheet of water somewhat oval in form—is a large, flourishing and progressive City, proudly and justly styled, the “Queen City of the West.” Laid out in the form of a parallelogram with singular regularity—the streets, fine, uniform and wide, intersect each other at right angles. Owing to the banks of the Lake being somewhat low and the site of the City and lay of the Country in rear rather flat—Toronto, at a distance, presents no high commanding aspect from any of its approaches. On nearing it from the Lake, however, it gradually unfolds itself, till, passing through the narrow entrance of, and steaming up the Bay, with the Provincial Lunatic Asylum, Trinity College (Episcopal), the Parliament Houses and other majestic buildings full in view, (and domes and spires not a few, and the wood-dipping banks of the Bay behind and opposite) it improves, and, at last, assumes a very picturesque and imposing appearance. When finished, the projected “Esplanade” will greatly improve its aspect from the Lake and Harbor, which it encroaches upon and faces. Then, from this point of view, all bustling and open, the scene will be rich and imposing. King and Yonge are its two principal streets; the former runs parallel with the Bay, and the latter, intersecting it, extends northward, through a rich and prosperous agricultural country—forming a sort of straggling and irregular village of some thirty miles or more in length. King—the Oxford street or Broadway of Toronto—a very long, straight and spacious street, with its broad side-walks and many handsome, well-filled shops—is the fashionable business resort, great thoroughfare and promenade of the City. The public buildings are very numerous, and many of them extremely handsome, such, for instance, as the new General Hospital, St. James, St. Michael, and Knox’s Churches, the City Hall and St. Lawrence Market place, Exchange, Mechanics’ Institute, Post Office, several of the Banks, the Rossin House, &c., &c.—and especially the Normal and Model School—a spacious edifice, whose organisation and methods of instruction, though not long established, have produced a most beneficial change in academical government and tuition, which is rapidly making itself felt, for good, throughout the whole Province. Osgoode Hall, the seat of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity for Upper Canada, situated on Queen Street, nearly opposite York Street, the University of Toronto, and University College, standing retired amid the pleasing and sequestered retreats of the University Park, are noble edifices. The University Park, with its Avenues to Queen and Yonge streets, and the Normal School grounds, beautifully laid out and planted, are places where all may freely go for tranquil walks and needful recreation. The Provincial Magnetic Observatory is also situated in the University Park, and is one of the meteorological stations established by the British Government, at the request of the Royal Society of England, in 1840. It is now attached to the University of Toronto. Its position is as follows: Latitude, $40^{\circ} 39' 4$ North; Longitude, $79^{\circ} 21' 5$ West; or 5 hours 17 minutes 26 seconds slow of Greenwich time. Toronto has many industrial establishments, some of them extensive—including foundries, tanneries, a great variety of other factories, and some very fine milling-establishments—which are thriving, and rapidly extending their capacity and powers, and improving their productions. Her spacious land-locked Harbor, easy of access to the largest craft that navigate our inland waters, and perfectly sheltered by the bar which faces it and fences off the Lake, affords the utmost facility for any possible extension of business or trade. Connecting, as it does, at all seasons of the year, with almost every place of importance in Canada and the United States (sea-board as well as inland,) by means of the Grand Trunk, Great Western, Northern, New York Central, Erie, and other Railways; and, by navigation, during summer, besides—the future of Toronto can by no means be doubtful. Thanks to her people’s energy, no less than to her centralized and centralizing position—she is already reaping the first good fruits of her new connections in an extending trade—a steady prosperity which seems destined to be both durable and progressive. Distant from Collingwood 93 miles, Hamilton 45 miles, London 114 miles, Kingston 165 miles, Montreal 333 miles, New York 500 miles, Boston 593 miles. Toronto returns two Members to the Provincial Parliament. Population about 50,000, and rapidly increasing. Value of assessed property in 1856, £7,133,076.

At the request of many friends, and others who take an interest in the condition and progress of our local Journalism, the Publisher of the CANADA DIRECTORY has caused the foregoing Statistical List to be prepared, which exhibits the actual state of the Newspaper and Periodical Press of the Province in the present year. The information has been drawn up with much pains and arranged with great care. Neither labor nor expense have been spared to secure the most scrupulous accuracy; and it is now submitted to the public, in the confident hope and belief that it will be found not only substantially but literally correct.

The information itself should prove alike suggestive and instructive. It encourages the belief that the moral and intellectual advancement of the Province has kept pace with its material and political progress, and it inculcates very earnestly upon all, the duty and necessity of adopting such measures as may best preserve the character and extend the usefulness of the Periodical Press of Canada.

It will be neither uninteresting nor out of place to compare the present with the past condition of our Periodical Literature. No better index can, in the opinion of the Publisher, be found by which to determine the progress of the Province in wealth and intelligence, than that which is afforded in the facts which this enquiry will supply. A period of scarcely more than forty years has elapsed since there were published within the Province only six Newspapers, five in Lower and one in Upper Canada; now, as the foregoing List will show, there are printed within the same

territorial limits upwards of two hundred Newspapers and Periodicals. When, too, it is borne in mind, that formerly a Newspaper was published but once a week, and had but a limited circulation, and that now these Journals are issued daily and tri-weekly, as well as semi-weekly and weekly, it is difficult to exaggerate the importance of the conclusions at which we must thence arrive, either as they bear upon the increased intelligence, or the increased wealth of our people. Indeed the opinion may be confidently advanced, that in no Country can there be produced a parallel to that which Canada affords of the history and character of its Newspaper Literature. In variety of information and in moral sentiment it will compare favorably with the press of any other land; while, through the unexampled liberality and cordial co-operation of the Legislature, carried into effect by the untiring exertions of the Post Office Department, it has been enabled to find free access to the homes of our people, and has thus brought to the door of the most humble, without cost for postage, a blessing which is regarded as belonging exclusively to the luxuries of the old world.

The Publisher may be excused for expressing the hope, that time and experience will tend still more to raise the tone and increase the usefulness of our Periodical Press, and that this engine of mighty power, under the control of able and high-minded men, may continue to diffuse the benefits of enlightened instruction and pure knowledge throughout the length and breadth of this noble Province of United Canada.

NEW YORK—The metropolis of the United States, and the second commercial city in the world—is situated on the southern extremity of Manhattan Island, at the confluence of the Hudson with the East River, or Strait of Long Island Sound. This great city, from its admirable position and its magnificent harbor, possesses facilities for trade unsurpassed by any other on the American Continent. The bay, or inner harbor, is one of the most capacious and finest in the world; it is completely land-locked, and affords the best anchorage. The rise of the tide is about six feet, and even at ebb there is twenty-one feet of water on the bar. The water in the outer and inner bays, and in the river, is so deep, that ships of the largest burden lie close to the quays, and may proceed to a great distance up the river. The navigation of the bay is but rarely impeded by ice; the entrance to it, through the Narrows, is extremely beautiful! Either side of the shore, though wooded down to the water's edge, is thickly studded with farms, villages, and country seats. At the upper end are seen the spires of the City, and in the distance the bold precipitous banks of the Hudson. The commerce of New York is most extensive, and its tonnage is greater than that of Liverpool, or any other city, with the exception of London.
