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# ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE OF THE CITY OF TORONTO,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1865.

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF TORONTO.

The Chamberlain begs leave to report, herewith, an Abstract and Detailed Statement of the Receipts and Expenditure of the Corporation for the year ending the 31st December, 1865.

The Detailed Statement is made out in so enlarged a form, as to enable every citizen to understand the various sources of City Revenue, and for what purpose that Revenue is disbursed.

It is to be regretted that there is a considerable deficiency in the operations of the year, arising principally from the Council voting moneys during the year, for which no provision was made in the estimates; to which may be added a large sum expended by several of the Boards in excess of the amount set apart for their special departments.
