The Chamberlain begs to Report a Statement of the Receipts and Expenditure of the Corporation for the year ending the 31st December, 1861, herewith submitted to the Council.

For the information of such persons as may not have leisure to go over the whole of the voluminous accounts hereto appended, the Chamberlain submits the following abstract of the years transactions:—

From the above statement it is shewn that there will be a deficiency of \$14,952.90, for which provision will be required to be made in the present year's Estimates, this deficiency arises from various causes and is in a great measure owing to the Council

voting Funds for certain purposes after the estimates have been made up, without providing the ways and means to meet the outlay, while in some cases the over expenditure by Boards of the Council of amounts exceeding their appropriation has been the occasion of considerable deficiency.

The Chamberlain would further report a Statement shewing the position of the Jail and Industrial Farm Fund and Sinking Fund Accounts on 31st December.

On the 19th January a portion of the Centre Building of the New Jail was destroyed by fire, upon which an Insurance was effected to the extent of \$20,000 ; the damages were agreed to be left to Arbitration, and the amount awarded was \$15,500, which has been punctually paid by the different Insurance Offices in which the Insurance was effected.

The sinking Fund Accounts shews the sum of \$108,878.68 to be at the Credit of the different Sinking Fund Accounts on the 31st December last.

The Corporation have taken advantage of the alteration in the Provincial Law respecting Municipal Sinking Funds, and have invested during the past year, and are continuing to invest that Fund in Toronto Corporation Debentures, by paying them off as Funds are realized for that purpose thereby, in a very simple and efficacious manner, extinguishing the debt gradually both Principal and Interest.

The Corporation held a large amount of Municipal Loan Fund Debentures, \$69,866.66 which were the approved securities of previous investments of the different Sinking Funds. These Debentures, as will be observed, were disposed of during the past year at par, and the proceeds invested in the payment of the Toronto Debentures for which the amount was originally raised.

Having Funds for investment in London contributes materially to the credit and character of Toronto Bonds, and it was no doubt owing in some degree to this arrangement, that, when during the temporary panic which took place some months ago in England, when war seemed imminent between the United States and Great Britain, all Canadian Securities including Provincial Bonds were seriously depreciated to the extent as reported of about Ten per cent. Toronto Bonds could not be procured by the Corporation Agents for investment under Ninety-eight.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF TORONTO.

The Undersigned have respectfully to report that they have this day completed their Audit of the City Accounts for the fiscal year ending the 31st December 1861.

They report accordingly that the whole amount of **CASH RECEIVED** during the year (including the Cash on hand 1st January 1861, viz., \$41,303.24) was **\$776,338.15** as the available resources of the City for 1861; of the nett amount, viz., \$735,034.91, the sum of \$126,009.99 was realized from the sale of Debentures; \$82,830.67 from Bank of Upper Canada overdrawn account at 31st December; \$67,934.62 from notes discounted Bank of Toronto; and the remainder, viz., \$499,562.87 from Taxes, Rents, and other ordinary sources of City Revenue.

They also report that the whole amount of **CASH PAID** during the year 1861 was \$671,023.50, of which \$164,587.18 was paid to redeem City Debentures; \$32,565.08 to repay overdrawn account Bank of Upper Canada on 1st January, 1861; \$22,000 paid on account of notes discounted Bank of Toronto, and the remaining \$451,871.24 was disbursed in payment of the ordinary current expenses of the City for 1861.

The apparent Balance at the credit of the City would therefore be \$105,314.65, said amount being however not a Balance in excess of Receipts over Expenditure, but a sum made up of sundry balances at the credit of certain special funds, together with \$297.87 cash in hand 31st December, and the details of these particulars will be found at page—of the accompanying Statement.

For the more particular information of the Council and the Ratepayers, they also report herewith duly audited and compiled from the Books in the Chamberlain's Office; firstly—a general abstract of Receipts and Expenditure for 1861, and secondly—a general detailed statement of the same, shewing in an extended shape all the financial transactions of the City for 1861, arranged as Dr. and Cr. under numerous separate accounts. This latter statement is so comprehensive, and has been prepared with so much care and labour by the Book-Keeper in the Chamberlain's Office as to afford all the information required.

They also report duly audited a statement of the Assets and Liabilities of the City exclusive of Real Estate on 1st January, 1862.

They have pleasure in reporting the improved condition of the Sinking Fund account. In their Report in 1861 the amount invested was \$87,866.66, while on the 1st December, 1861, the amount was increased to \$177,893.31 and there yet remains the further amount of \$108,878.68, at the credit of the Fund waiting to be invested.

In their last Report the Auditors expressed regret at not being able to report a statement shewing the actual condition of the affairs of the City at the close of the year. On this occasion they are able to supply this information and report the same accordingly as follows, viz:

In consideration of the sum received from the Government as the City proportion of the Upper Canada Municipalities Fund, being nearly \$6,000 in excess of the amount estimated to be received, the Council decided by By-Law No. 335, passed 30th September, 1861, that the said sum of \$6,000 should form a Special Fund, for the purpose of re-building the St. Andrew's Market, in the event of the Council ultimately deciding to do so.

NOTE B, PAGE 12.

This sum of \$2,832 40 received from Masterman, Peters & Co., was for unclaimed dividends, occasioned by the redemption of City Bonds, as an investment on account of the various Sinking Funds. The funds for the payment of such dividends having been remitted to the London Agents prior to the redemption of the Debentures.
