PREFACE.

This edition of the *Medical Register for Upper Canada* contains a correct list of the names, residences, qualifications and additions of all persons appearing on the Register as existing on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven.

I avail myself of this opportunity to make some remarks in explation of the delay which has taken place in the publication of this edition. During the second week of June, several hundred applications were received by post from persons desiring to be registered. It was impossible to attend simultaneously to every application, for the majority of the certificates received were unsatisfactory, and entailed, in addition to the usual acknowledgment, the writing of a letter of explanation. In many cases a lengthened correspondence was necessary, so that some of those who made application early in June were not registered until December, and in several cases correspondence is still going on. was a source of great labor and delay. On referring to the pages of the Register it will be seen that a majority of those whose names appear there, preferred several distinct claims to registration, each of which claims required to be carefully scrutinized, and in those cases where the evidence of the certificates was not corroborated by the records in the office of the Provincial Secretary, or the Calendars of the Universities, I wrote to the applicant for a second statement and to the other authorities to ascertain whether the certificates were correct. By this means I detected many errors and unsubstantial claims to registration. writing and mailing of certified transcripts to each registered person consumed much time, owing to the care which was necessary in copying dates, names, &c. I regret exceedingly to add, that the completion of this work has also been very much delayed during the last four months by my own ill health, for which I can only ask the indulgence of the profession.

In compliance with a very general desire on the part of the profession to have some authentic record of the proceedings of the Council, the minutes thereof are published, and are to be found at the end of the Register.

AN ACT

REGULATE THE QUALIFICATIONS OF PRACTITIONERS IN MEDICINE AND SURGERY IN UPPER CANADA.

[Assented to 18th September, 1865.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that persons requiring medical aid should be Preamble. enabled to distinguish qualified from unqulified Practitioners: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. This Act shall be known and cited as "The Medical Act for Upper short title. Canada."
- II. This Act shall take effect from and after the first day of January, when Act shall take one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.
- III. A Council, which shall be styled "The General Council of Medical General . Education and Registration of Upper Canada," hereinafter referred to as Council established. "The Council," shall be established.
 - IV. The Council shall consist of one person, chosen from time to time, composition by each of the following Colleges and bodies, in such manner, as by By- of Council laws of such Colleges or bodies, or of their Governors, Directors or of the Trustees thereof, shall be provided:-

The University of Toronto,

The University of Queen's College,

The University of Victoria College, The University of Trinity College, Toronto,

The Toronto School of Medicine,

Election

and by every other college or body in Upper Canada, by law authorized or hereafter to be authorized to grant Medical or Surgical Degrees or Certificates of qualification to practice Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery, or either, and of twelve persons to be elected from among the registered practitioners of medicine of Upper Canada as hereinafter is provided.

V. Members of the Council, representing Medical Corporations, must qualification be qualified to be registered under this Act.

VI. There shall be elected from time to time by open public meeting Medical practitioners registered under this Act, resident in each of the different control of the different territorial divisions of Upper Canada, mentioned in Schedule C to this Act, places.

one member of Council for each of such territorial divisions; and the place, time and mode of holding such election, and the person to act as Returning Officer thereat, shall be determined by the Governor-in-Council, Proviso: who and published thrice in the Canada Gazette; Provided always, that at the elections to be first held after the passing of this Act, every person so resident and entitled to be so registered may vote and shall be qualified for election as such member.

Resignation of members and filling vacancies, VII. The members of the Council shall be chosen for a period of three years; any member may resign his appointment at any time by letter, addressed to the President of the Council; and upon the death or resignation of any member of the Council, some other person shall be constituted a member of the said Council in his place, in manner hereinbefore provided, but it shall be lawful for the Council during such vacancy to exercise the power hereinafter mentioned.

VIII. The Council shall hold its first meeting within six months from the commencement of this Act, in such place and at such time as the Attorney General for Upper Canada shall appoint; and shall make such rules and regulations as to the times and places of the intended meetings of the Council and the mode of summoning the same as to them shall seem, expedient, which rules and regulations shall remain in force till altered at any subsequent meeting; in the absence of any rule or regulation as to the summoning of future meetings of the Council, it shall be lawful for the President thereof to summon the same, at such time and place as to him shall seem fit, by circular letter to be mailed to each member; provided always, that at least two weeks' notice of such meeting be given; in the event of the absence of the President from any meeting, some other member to be chosen from among the members present, shall act as President; all acts of the Council shall be decided by the majority of the members present, the whole number not being less than nine; at all meetings, the President, for the time being, shall have a casting vote only.

IX. There shall be paid to the members of the Council such fees for attendance and such reasonable travelling expenses, as shall from time to time be allowed by the Council.

Council may X. The Council shall appoint a President, Registrar and Treasurer, appoint and such other officers as may be necessary to the working of this Act.

Application of moneys. The Treasurer, and shall be applied to carrying this Act into execution.

Duty of Registrar. XII. It shall be the duty of the Registrar to keep his register correct, in accordance with the provisions of this Act, and the rules, orders and regulations of the Council, and to erase the names of all registered persons who shall have died, and he shall, from time to time, make the necessary alterations in the address or qualifications of the persons registered under this Act; and to enable him duly to fulfil the duties imposed on him, it shall be lawful for him to write a letter to any registered person, addressed according to the address of such person on the register, to enquire whether he has ceased to practise or has changed his residence, and if no answer shall be returned to such letter within the period of six months from the sending of such letter, it shall be lawful for the Registrar

to erase the name of such person from the Register; Provided always, Proviso. that the same shall be restored by direction of the Council, upon cause duly shewn to that effect.

XIII. Every person resident in Upper Canada, and now possessed, or who may be who hereafter may become possessed of any one or more of the qualifica-registered. tions described in the Schedule (A) to this Act shall, on the payment of a fee not exceeding five dollars in respect of qualifications obtained on or before the first day of January one thousand eight hundred sixty-six, and not exceeding ten dollars in respect of qualifications obtained on or after that date, be entitled to be registered, on producing to the Registrar the document conferring or evidencing the qualification or each of the qualifications in respect whereof he seeks to be so registered, or upon transmitting by post to the Registrar, information of his name and address, and evidence of the qualification or qualifications in respect whereof he seeks to be registered, and of the time or times at which the same was or were respectively obtained; and it shall be lawful for the several colleges, &c. and bodies, named or referred to in section four of this Act, to transmit may not transmit from time to time to the said Registrar, lists certified under their respectives because the said registrar and Registrar and the said Reg tive seals of the several persons who, in respect of qualifications granted registered. by such colleges and bodies respectively, are for the time being entitled to be registered under this Act, stating the respective qualifications and places of residence of such persons; and it shall be lawful for the Registrat of trar thereupon, and upon payment of such fee as aforesaid, in respect of Registrat of each person to be registered, to enter in the register the persons mentioned fees. in the list with their qualifications and places of residence as thereon stated, without other application in relation thereto.

XIV. Any person entitled to be registered under this Act, but who Persons shall neglect or omit to be so registered, shall not be entitled to any of neglecting to the rights or privileges conferred by the provisions of this Act so long as to foreit such neglect or omission continues; and it shall be lawful for the Council privileges. to charge and receive from the persons who register after the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, a fee not exceeding ten dollars.

XV. The Council shall, at their first meeting, and from time to time, council to as occasion may require, make orders, regulations or by-laws for regulat- make by-ing the registers to be kept under this Act, as nearly as may be in ing registers. accordance with the form set forth in Schedule B to this Act, or to the like effect.

XVI. The Council shall have power and authority to establish a Standard of uniform standard of Matriculation or preliminary education for the education for admission of all students, and to make by-laws and regulations for deter-students. mining the admission and enrolling of students.

XVII. The Council shall have power and authority to fix and deter- Curriculum mine from time to time a curriculum of studies to be pursued by students, and such curriculum of studies shall be observed and taught by all colleges or bodies referred to in section four of this Act; Provided always Proviso. that such curriculum of studies shall first receive the approval of the Governor-in-Council, and be published once in the Canada Gazette.

XVIII. In case it shall appear to the Council, that any of the colleges college does or bodies referred to in section four of this Act, have not observed and not observed and the curricufollowed such curriculum of studies, and have granted the certificates of lum proscribed.

XIX. The several colleges and bodies named or referred to in section to turns of four of this Act, shall, from time to time, when required by the Council, furnish such Council with such information as they may require, as to the course of study and examinations to be gone through in order to obtain the respective certificates of qualification which they are entitled to grant under Schedule A to this Act, and the ages at which such course of study and examinations are required to be gone through, and such qualifications are conferred, and generally as to the requisites for obtaining the same; and any member or members of the Council, or any person or persons deputed for this purpose by such Council, may attend and be present to see that such curriculum is duly pursued and the examination duly held.

In case of attempt to pre vent candiinjunction.

XX. In case it shall appear to the Council that attempt has been made by any such college or body to impose upon any candidate offering himself adopting any for examination, an obligation to adopt or refrain from adopting the pracspecial theory, Gov. tice of any particular theory of Medicine or Surgery as a test or condition ernor in of admitting him to examination or of granting a certificate, it shall be lawful for the Council to direct such college or body to desist from such practice; and in the event of their not complying therewith may represent the same to the Governor in Council, and the Governor in Council may thereupon issue an injunction to such college or body so acting, to desist from such practice, and in the event of their not complying therewith, then to order that such college or body shall cease to have the power of conferring any right to be registered under this Act, so long as they shall continue such practice.

No qualifica-tion to be registered unless Registrar is satisfied of its correctness.

Appeal.

XXI. No qualification shall be entered on the register either on the first registration or by way of addition to a registered name unless the Registrar be satisfied by the proper evidence that the person claiming is entitled to it, and any appeal from the decision of the Registrar may be decided by the Council, and any entry which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Council to have been fraudulently or incorrectly made, may be erased from the register by order in writing of the Council.

Medical Register for U. C. to be published.

XXII. The Registrar of the Council shall, in every year, cause to be printed, published and sold, under the direction of such Council, a correct register of the names in alphabetical order according to the surnames, with the respective residences, in the form set forth in Schedule B to this Act or to the like effect, and medical titles, diplomas and qualifications

conferred by any college or body with the dates thereof of all persons appearing on the register as existing on the first day of January of every year, and such register shall be called "The Medical Register for Upper Canada," and a copy of such register for the time being, purporting to To be evibe so printed and published as aforesaid, shall be prima facie evidence in dence. all courts and before all Justices of the Peace and others that the persons therein specified are registered according to the provisions of this Act, and the absence of the name of any person from such copy shall be primá facie evidence that such person is not registered according to the provisions of this Act; Provided always, that in the case of any person Proviso. whose name does not appear in such copy, a certified copy under the hand of the Registrar of the Council, of the entry of the name of such person on the register, shall be evidence that such person is registered under the provisions of this Act.

XXIII. Any registered medical practitioner, who shall have been con-practitioner victed of any felony in any court, shall thereby forfeit his right to registelony. tration, and by the direction of the Council his name shall be erased from the register.

XXIV. Every person registered under this Act, who may have obtained Higher deany higher degree or any qualification other than the qualification in qualificarespect of which he may have been registered, shall be entitled to have registered. such higher degree or additional qualification inserted in the register in substitution for or in addition to the qualification previously registered, on the payment of such fee as the Council may appoint.

XXV. Every person who shall be registered under the provisions of Persons this Act shall be entitled, according to his qualification or qualifications registered to practice Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery, or either or any of them, practice to practice Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery, or either or any of them, to recover as the case may be, in Upper Canada, and to demand and recover in any fees. court of law, with full costs of suit, reasonable charges for professional aid, advice and visits and the cost of any medicine or other medical or surgical appliances rendered or supplied by him to his patients.

XXVI. XXIX. After the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, no certificate required by any Act now in force, or that may is registered. hereafter be passed, from any physician or surgeon or medical practitioner shall be valid, unless the person signing the same be registered under this Act.

Falsification of register.

XXX. If the Registrar make or cause to be made any wilful falsification in any matters relating to the register, he shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for any term not exceeding twelve months.

Punishment of persons fraudulently causing themselves to be regis-tered.

XXXI. If any person shall wilfully procure or attempt to procure himself to be registered under this Act by making or producing, or causing to be made or produced, any false or fraudulent representation or declaration, either verbally or in writing, every such person so offending, and every person knowingly aiding and assisting him therein, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for any term not exceeding twelve months.

Persons falsely claim-ing to be registered.

XXXII. Any person who shall wilfully and falsely pretend to be or take or use any name, title, addition or description implying that he is registered under this Act, shall, upon prosecution and conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars; and every such penalty shall form part of the funds of the Council, and shall be paid over to the Treasurer for the uses and purposes thereof.

XXXIII. It shall be the duty of the member of the Council represent ing each such territorial division, to notify the Registrar of the Council notify Registerate of the death of any registered medical practitioner occuring within his division, so soon as he shall become aware of the same, and upon the receipt of such notification, the Registrar shall erase the name of the person so deceased from the register.

Penalty for falsely assuming certain titles.

XXXIV. Any person who shall wilfully and falsely pretend to be, or take, or use, the name or title of a Physician, Doctor of Medicine, Licentiate in Medicine and Surgery, Bachelor of Medicine, Surgeon, General Practitioner, or any name, title, addition or description, implying that he is registered under this Act, or that he is recognized by law as a Physician or Surgeon, or Licentiate in Medicine and Surgery, or a Practitioner in Medicine, shall, upon a summary conviction before any Justice of the Peace, for any such offence, pay a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, and in default of the payment of such penalty, on conviction, the offender may be committed to the Common Jail of the County until the same is paid.

SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE ACT OF THIS SESSION

[Assented to 18th September, 1865.]

Whereas certain errors have been discovered in the Act of this present Preamble. No student of medicine having been in regular attendance on medifavor of stu- cal lectures, in any Canadian University or medical school, before the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, shall be compelled to pass any other matriculation or preliminary examination, or to pursue may, 1887, any other curriculum than such as was required at the time he commenced his attendance on such lectures; and every student who had been regularly engaged in the study of medicine, and had matriculated before the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, shall be held to have complied with the requirements of the said Act and of this Act, as regards such matriculation.

What must by persons claiming to under Schedule A of amended Act.

II. Every person claiming to be registered under the said Act, as qualified under the third or under the fourth paragraph of Schedule A, be registered as qualified under the reafter granted, unless he shall have regularly attended lectures in some University or medical school before the first leaves of University or medical school, before the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, must show, in order to make good his claim to such registration, that he duly passed a matriculation or preliminary examination covering all the requirements of the uniform standard established for such examination by Schedule Z hereto appended:

Uniform may be changed; and how.

2. The said uniform standard may be changed hereafter, by by-law of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of Upper Canada, and not otherwise; but no such by-law shall have any force or effect, unless and until the same shall have been approved by the Governor in Council, after three months notice thereof given in the Canada Gazette, and such approval shall have been notified in the Canada Gazette:

Evidence of matriculation examination.

3. The certificate of any University or incorporated Medical School in Lower Canada, that any student thereof has duly passed such matriculation or preliminary examination shall be sufficient evidence thereof.

Schedule A of medi-cal Act amended.

III. The seventh paragraph of Schedule A to the said Act, is amended by adding after the word "registration" the words "or of any qualification which would entitle the party in question to be so registered."

IV. Any person who shall be registered under the said Act, and shall penalty on wilfully and falsely pretend to be, or take or use the name or title of physician, doctor of medicine, licentiate in medicine and surgery, bachelor suming false or descriptions, apothecary, or any name, title, addition, or descriptions. tion, implying that he has taken any degree, or obtained any license or certificate, other than he actually possesses or is legally entitled to, shall, upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace for a first offence, be fined in a sum of not less than ten dollars and not exceeding twenty dollars, with costs, and on each subsequent conviction as aforesaid, shall be fined in the amount of the fine last levied against him, and an additional sum of not less than five dollars and not more than ten dollars, with costs.

V. Of all penalties recovered under the thirty-fourth section of the said Application of penalties. Act, or under this Act, one-half shall go to the prosecutor or the party laying the information, and the other half to the Council for the use thereof.

VII. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.

SCHEDULE Z.

Uniform standard of Matriculation or Preliminary Examination established under this Act:

Compulsory:—English language, including grammar and composition; Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions; Algebra, including simple equations; Geometry, first two books of Euclid; Latin, translation and grammar.

And one of the following optional subjects:—Greek, French, German, Natural Philosophy, including mechanics, hydrostatics and pneumatics.

After one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine Greek shall be one of the compulsory subjects.

Proceedings of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of Upper Canada, at its first Session, held in Toronto, on Wednesday, the second day of May, 1866, and following days, in accordance with the Act, cap. 34, passed in the 29th year of Her Majesty's reign, entituled "An Act to regulate the qualifications of Practitioners in Medicine and Surgery, in Upper Canada."

MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY.

Wednesday, May 2, 1866.

Present at twelve o'clock — Dr. Askin, Dr. Aikins, Dr. Berryman, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Campbell, Dr. Clarke, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Dickson, Dr. Fulton, Dr. Grant, Dr. McGill, Dr. Macpherson, Dr. Morton, Dr. Pattullo, Dr. Richardson, Dr. Turquand, and Dr. Yates.

Moved by Dr. Morton, seconded by Dr. Berryman, "that Dr. Clarke be appointed chairman, and that Dr. Richardson be appointed Secretary pro tem." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Dickson, seconded by Dr. Macpherson, "that Dr. Turquand be President of the Council."

This nomination was withdrawn by unanimous consent.

Dr. Dewar then moved, seconded by Dr. Grant, that Dr. Dickson, Dr. Berryman, and Dr. Macpherson, do constitute a committee to examine the documents relative to the election of the various members of the Council, and report the result of their enquiries; and that the chairman and Secretary be also members of the committee. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Askin, "that this meeting do now adjourn for one hour." Carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

At 2 o'clock, the chairman resumed the chair.

The committee appointed to examine documents relating to the elections of members of the Council presented their report, which is as follows:

Moved by Dr. McGill, seconded by Dr. Pattullo, "that the report be received and adopted."

This was withdrawn, with the consent of the Council.

Moved by Dr. Dewar, seconded by Dr. Morton, "that this Council do now adjourn until 7 o'clock, that the recommendations of the committee be carried out." Lost.

Moved by Dr. Aikins, seconded by Dr. McGill, "that the report of the committee be amended by striking out all after the words 'Medical Board,' and substituting the following: 'but that the said Dr. Campbell is not entitled to a seat in this Council, and that he be therefore excluded from taking any part in its proceedings.'" Carried on the following division:

Yeas—Dr. Askin, Dr. Aikins, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Dickson, Dr. Grant, Dr. McGill, Dr. Pattullo, and Dr. Yates—9.

Nays—Dr. Berryman, Dr. Campbell, Dr. Fulton, Dr. Macpherson, Dr. Morton, Dr. Richardson, and Dr. Turquand—7.

The amendment was then adopted.

Moved by Dr. Dickson, seconded by Dr. Macpherson, "that Dr. Turquand be elected President."

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Grant, "that Dr. Dickson be a candidate for the office of President."

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Fulton, "that Dr. Clarke be President."

Dr. Turquand desired to withdraw from nomination, in favour of Dr. Dickson.

Dr. Clarke also desired to withdraw in Dr. Dickson's favour.

The motion of Dr. Brouse was then carried unanimously, and Dr. Dickson assumed the chair.

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Aikins, "that the thanks of this Council be conveyed to Dr. Clarke, for his courteous and impartial conduct in the chair." Carried.

Dr. Richardson then requested to be released from the position of Secretary pro tem. Granted.

Moved and seconded that Dr. Yates be appointed Secretary pro tem. Carried.

The Council then agreed to postpone voting for Registrar until the next morning, and resolved that the voting be by ballot without open nomination.

The President and Secretary prepared the following list of candidates for the office of Registrar:

The Council then adjourned to meet in the evening, at half past 7 o'clock.

EVENING SESSION

At half past 7 o'clock the President called the Council to order, the following members present: — Dr. Aikins, Dr. Berryman, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Clarke, Dr. Fulton, Dr. Grant, Dr. Morton, Dr. Pattullo, Dr. Turquand, and Dr. Yates.

The minutes of the morning and afternoon sittings were read and adopted.

The applications and credentials of candidates for the office of Registrar were then read, seriatim.

It was then moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that a committee of three be appointed to draft rules and regulations to govern this Council." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Morton, seconded by Dr. Pattullo, "that Dr. Clarke, Dr. Brouse, and Dr. Berryman, be that committee." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Pattullo, seconded by Dr. Richardson, "that the Registrar shall be ex officio Secretary of the Council." Carried.

The Council then adjourned, to meet at 10 o'clock next morning.

SECOND DAY.

THURSDAY, May 3, 1866.

The Council was called to order at twenty-five minutes past 10 o'clock. The President in the chair. All the members present, except Dr. Brouse and Dr. Richardson.

The minutes of last sitting were read and adopted.

Dr. Brouse and Dr. Richardson came in at this stage.

Dr. Macpherson, by request, was permitted to withdraw his name from the candidates for the registrarship.

The name of Dr. Parker was here added to the list of candidates.

The President selected Dr. Clarke and Dr. Brouse as scrutineers.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Askin, "that the candidate who receives a clear majority of the members present shall be the Registrar of the Council." Carried.

The Council then proceeded to ballot for the Registrar; and, after several ballots, Dr. Strange of Hamilton was elected, nine votes being cast for, and six against him.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Berryman, "that Dr. Aikins be Treasurer, without salary." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Turquand, seconded by Dr. Brouse, "that all persons who were possessed of one or more of the qualifications described in Schedule A of the Medical Act for Upper Canada, on or before the first day of January, 1866, be allowed to register their names on the payment of a fee of five dollars; this permission to remain in full force until the fifteenth day of June, 1866. And all those thus entitled, who neglect so to do, shall pay the sum of ten dollars for their registration after the fifteenth day of June, 1866; and all persons who have become qualified to be registered under the provisions of the Medical Act of Upper Canada, since the first day of January, 1866, shall also pay the sum of ten dollars for such registration." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Dewar, seconded by Dr. Askin, "that a vote of thanks be tendered to Dr. Yates for the able manner in which he has performed his duty as Secretary pro tem." Carried.

Dr. Dewar gave notice that, at the next *sederunt*, he would bring in a By-law to define the duties of the officers of the Council..

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Dewar, "that a committee be appointed to strike the standing committees of this Council, and report at the next meeting." Carried.

The Council then adjourned until the afternoon.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The President called the Council to order at half past two o'clock.

*The roll of members being called, all were present except Dr. Dewar and Dr. Morton.

Dr. Dewar came in a few minutes after business had commenced.

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Richardson, "that the names of Dr. Askin, Dr. Turquand, and Dr. Dewar, be added to the committee. on Standing Rules and Regulations, and that they be authorized to report to this Council at its next meeting, on the further enlargement of such rules." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that the President, Dr. Aikins, and Dr. Grant, constitute a special committee to obtain a corporate seal for the Council." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Fulton, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that Dr. Brouse, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Clarke, Dr. Askin, Dr. Richardson, Dr. McGill, and Dr. Pattullo, be a special committee to draft standing committees on Registration, Education and Finance." Carried.

The Council then adjourned for twenty minutes.

On being called to order again, the special committee reported as follows:

- "That the committee on Registration be composed of three members, as follows: Dr. Macpherson, Dr. Aikins, Dr. McGill.
- "That the committee on Education be composed of five members, as follows: Dr. Grant, Dr. Turquand, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Clarke.
- "And that the committee on Finance be composed of the following members: Dr. Berryman, Dr. Pattullo, Dr. Morton."

Moved and seconded, "that the report of the special committee on standing committees be adopted." Carried.

The Council then adjourned till evening.

EVENING SESSION.

The President took the chair at nine o'clock. 14 members present. Dr. Morton and Dr. Richardson being absent.

Dr. Brouse, chairman of the committee on Rules and Regulations, read the report of said committee, which was received by the Council.

The committee appointed to draft rules and regulations reported the following rules, which are as amended and adopted, having been read clause by clause:

- "Section 1.—The President shall be elected from the members of the Council, annually, by open vote of the Council. The names of the candidates shall be put in the order in which they are proposed. The yeas and nays to be recorded, if required by any member. In case there shall be a tie, the question shall be decided by the member representing the greatest number of inhabitants."
- "Section 2.—That the members of Council shall meet at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, for transaction of business. If a quorum be not present, the President may, with the consent of a majority of those present, adjourn. The hour at which such adjournment is made must be regularly entered in the minutes of the Council.
- "When the President has called the Council to order, the names of members shall be called alphabetically, and the minutes of the preceding day be read by the Secretary for approval.

- "Every member, before speaking, must address himself to the chair.
- "If two or more members rise to speak together, the President shall decide who has the right to the floor.
- "Every member present must vote when a question is put, unless excused by the Council.
- "When the President is putting a question, the utmost decorum and perfect quietness must prevail.
- "Members speaking must address themselves to the question under debate.
- "Members called to order must cease speaking until the decision is given from the chair.
- "Members shall not speak more than twice on the same question without permission from the Council, except in committee of the whole.
- "In voting upon a question, any member may call for the yeas and nays, when the names shall be recorded in the minutes of the Council.
- "A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except when a vote is being taken, and is not debatable.
- "A motion, regularly announced by the President, shall be considered in the possession of the Council, but may be withdrawn at any time before voting, with the consent of the Council.
- "When a question is under debate no motion shall be received, unless to amend it, to 'commit' or 'postpone it to a certain day,' or for the 'previous question,' or for adjournment, or to 'lay it on the table.'
- "All questions, whether in committee or in council, shall be put in the order in which they are moved, except, in filling up blanks the shortest time and the lowest sum shall be put first, and amendments shall take precedence of original motions.
- "All motions must be submitted in writing, with the name of the mover and seconder, excepting motions for adjournment.
- "It shall be the duty of the President, whenever he conceives that a motion or resolution in possession of the Council is contrary to the rules of the Council, or inconsistent with the report or other matters to which it was intended to refer, to rule it out of order."
- "Section 3.—The President shall preside and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Council. He is to sign the minutes of the Council, after being approved; to sign all orders on the Treasurer which are duly passed, and to affix his name to the Treasurer's book when properly audited. He shall give no vote on any question brought before the Council, unless there is a tie, in which case he shall give the casting vote.
- "It shall be the duty of the President to call a special meeting of the Council, when requested to do so in writing by at least nine members, or upon his own authority in case of emergency, and shall notify the Secretary to give the necessary notice to members, stating the object for which such meeting is called.
- "The duties of the Secretary, Registrar and Treasurer, shall be defined by By-law.

- "Every By-law shall be introduced by notice for leave to do so, or by a motion to appoint a committee to prepare and bring it in, or by order of the Council on the report of a committee.
- "That no bill shall be committed or amended until after the second reading.
- "That all amendments made in committee shall be reported to the Council by the chairman, standing in his place; after reported, the bill shall be read a third time, and either passed, recommitted, or rejected, without debate."
 - "Section 4.—That every bill shall receive three separate readings.
- "When a bill is read in the Council, the Secretary shall certify the reading, and the time thereof, on the back.
- "The bills committed to a committee of the whole Council shall first be read throughout by the Secretary, and then read by the chairman and debated by clauses, leaving the preamble and title to be last considered.
- "That when a bill passes the Council, the Secretary shall certify the same, with the date thereof, at the foot of the bill.
- "All petitions, memorials, and other papers, addressed to the Council, shall be presented either by the Secretary or some member of the Council, duly endorsed by the parties interested.
- "That in forming a committee of the whole Council, the President shall leave the chair, after having selected one to act as chairman, who shall have the same authority in the chair of the committee, as the President has in the Council, except in deciding questions of order; and in other committees, the chairman shall have the same authority.
- "On motion in committee to rise and report, the question shall be decided without debate.
- "A majority of the members of a committee shall form a quorum in all cases where the number of such quorum is not specified in the motion of appointment.
 - "The standing committees shall be—
 - 1st. Registration committee.
 - 2nd. Education committee.
 - 3rd. Finance committee.
 - "The following shall be the order of business:—
 - 1st. Calling the roll.
 - 2nd. Reading minutes of preceding day.
 - 3rd. Presenting petitions.
 4th. Reading petitions.
 5th. Referring petitions.

 - 6th. Motions.
 - 7th. Presenting reports of committees.
 - 8th. Giving notices.
 - 9th. Orders of the day.
- "All alterations or amendments of the foregoing rules must receive a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the Council."

The report was adopted en bloc.

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Askin, "that the standing rules and regulations for the working of this Council be printed for the use of members." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Aikins, seconded by Dr. Macpherson, "that Dr. Uzziel Ogden, of Toronto, the Secretary of the late Medical Board of Upper Canada, be requested to deliver the records of the said Board to the Registrar of this Council." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Aikins, seconded by Dr. McGill, "that the President, Dr. Richardson, Dr. Berryman, and the mover, be a committee, with power to employ legal counsel in behalf of this Body, if the necessity for the same should arise at any time when the Council is not in session." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Macpherson, seconded by Dr. Grant, "that the next session of this Council shall take place at Ottawa, at such time as the President or Council may find it expedient."

Moved by Dr. Dewar, seconded by Dr. Askin, "that the previous motion do lay on the table until time for further consideration has elapsed." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Clarke, seconded by Dr. Fulton, "that the following gentlemen be a committee to consider the various amendments required to be made to the Medical Act, viz., Dr. Aikins, Dr. Berryman, Dr. Yates, Dr. Pattullo, the President, and the mover." Carried.

Moved and seconded, "that the Council do now adjourn till 10 o'clock to-morrow morning." Carried.

The Council then adjourned.

THIRD DAY.

FRIDAY, May 4, 1866.

The President called the Council to order at 10 o'clock. The Secretary called the roll, twelve members being present. Dr. Askin, Dr. Morton, Dr. Pattullo, and Dr. Richardson, were absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted.

Moved by Dr. Dewar, seconded by Dr. Yates, "that this Council do now adjourn until the committees are prepared to report." Carried.

The Council then adjourned.

The President resumed the chair at half past 12 o'clock.

The report of the committee on Education was read by Dr. Grant, secretary of the committee, and was received.

It was agreed that the report should be taken up clause by clause.

Moved by Dr. Turquand, seconded by Dr. Dewar, "that the Council do now resolve itself into committee of the whole on the report of the committee on Education, as received." Carried.

In committee of the whole, Dr. Morton in the chair, three clauses of the report were amended and passed; and it was moved and seconded,

"that the committee do now rise and report progress, and ask leave to sit again." Carried.

The President resumed the chair, and Dr. Morton reported that three clauses had been amended and passed.

Moved and seconded, "that the Council do now adjourn till 3 o'clock." Carried.

A communication was then read by the Secretary, from Dr. A. M. Rosebrugh, of Toronto, in which he desired to present each member of the Council with a copy of his publication on the optical defects of the eye.

The Council had much pleasure in accepting the presentation; and it was moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Macpherson, "that the thanks of this Council are due to Dr. Rosebrugh for his liberality." Carried.

The Council then adjourned till 3 o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The President called the meeting to order at half past 3 o'clock.

Moved and seconded, "that the Council again resolve itself into committee of the whole on the report of the Education committee." Carried.

In committee of the whole, Dr. Morton in the chair, the remainder of the report was amended, and passed its second reading.

Moved and seconded, "that the committee do now rise and report progress." Carried.

The President resumed the chair; and Dr. Morton reported that the report had been amended, and passed in committee of the whole.

The report as amended was then read, and is as follows:

- "1st. That all students pass an examination in general education before they commence their professional studies.
- "2nd. That the time of commencing professional studies be understood to be from the date of their having passed their preliminary examination, and that no qualified body shall receive a student without his having first obtained a certificate of examination.
- "3rd. That a degree in Arts of any British or Canadian University, or of such other Universities as may be recognized from time to time by the Medical Council, be accepted as a sufficient qualification to enter upon the study of medicine.
- "4th. That the examination in general education be left entirely to one examiner, to be appointed by the members of the Medical Council, and that the examination take place every three months; and that the President, or one or more members of the Council, must be present at such examination.
- "5th. That the following be the subjects of examination to be undergone by all matriculants in medicine

1. Reading aloud a passage from some English author.

2. Writing from dictation.

3. English grammar.

4. Writing a short English composition.

5. Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions.

6. Questions in geography generally.

7. General history.

8. The elements of natural philosophy.

9. Euclid, first and second books.

10. Algebra, to simple equations inclusive.

11. Translation of a passage from the first book of Cæsar's "Commentarii de bello Gallico," and Gregory's Conspectus, first five chapters.

12. Translation of a passage from St. John's Gospel in Greek.

13. In English history, students will be examined from Hamilton's Outlines of English History, to the present time; and in Ancient history, from Schmitz's Manual of Ancient History, extending down to the death of Nero in Roman, and to the death of Alexander in Grecian history.

14. In all these subjects, the quality of the handwriting and spell-

ing will be taken into account.

6th. That all students that undergo the required examination be obliged to pay five dollars prior to examination, and in the event of failure that only three dollars of the sum deposited be returned."

Moved by Dr. Morton, seconded by Dr. McGill, "that the report of the committee on Education, as now read, be adopted."

Moved in amendment by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that the following resolution be added as a rider to the report of the committee: 'That no Greek examination shall be demanded of applicants before the 1st of May, 1867.'" Carried.

Dr. Morton's original motion for the adoption of the report was being put, when Dr. Aikins moved the following amendment, seconded by Dr. Turquand, "that the report be not now adopted, but be amended by adding the following, viz: 'That the matriculation examination established by this Council shall apply to all persons who have not attended one course of lectures in some medical school, and not to others, unless the several medical institutions should otherwise decide.'"

Yeas—Dr. Aikins, Dr. Pattullo, Dr. Turquand—3.

Nays—Dr. Askin, Dr. Berryman, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Clarke, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Fulton, Dr. Grant, Dr. Macpherson, Dr. McGill, Dr. Morton—10.

The report was then adopted.

Dr. Macpherson read the report of the committee on Registration, which was received and read a first time.

The Council then adjourned till next morning.

FOURTH DAY.

SATURDAY, May 5, 1866.

The Council was called to order at 11 o'clock. The President in the chair. All present except Dr. Berryman and Dr. Morton.

The minutes of the last meeting were read.

It was moved by Dr. Aikins, "that that portion of the minutes referring to the presentation from Dr. Rosebrugh be expunged." Which was carried, and the minutes as so amended were adopted.

The report of the committee on Registration was read again, clause by clause. The first four clauses were amended and adopted.

At 12 o'clock, it was moved and seconded "that the Council do now adjourn till Monday." Carried.

The President declared the Council adjourned till 12 o'clock on Monday.

FIFTH DAY.

Monday, May 7, 1866.

The Council was called to order at a quarter to 1 o'clock. The President in the chair.

All the members present except Dr. Dewar, Dr. McGill, and Dr. Morton.

The minutes of last meeting were read.

Dr. Berryman moved "that the minutes be amended by striking out that part referring to the expunging of a former minute, with reference to Dr. Rosebrugh's presentation; and that the said minute be restored." This was assented to, and the minutes adopted as amended.

The fifth clause of the report of the committee on Registration was then read again, and adopted as amended.

The report as adopted is as follows:

- "Your committee on Registration beg leave to report—
- "1. That any person entitled to registration under Schedule A of the Medical Act, or under the Imperial Medical Act, shall be permitted to register upon transmitting to the Registrar a certificate, under the hand and seal of a Notary public, or of any Mayor or Reeve in Upper Canada, setting forth therein that such person had exhibited to him the documents conferring or evidencing the qualification, or each of the qualifications, in respect whereof he seeks to be so registered, and also the names and dates appended thereto, also the date of any credential or credentials he may require to have recorded; which certificate, with the fee, may be transmitted to the Registrar by mail, pre-paid; on receipt of which the Registrar shall record the name, credentials, and residence of the applicant.
- "2nd. It shall also be the duty of the Registrar to transmit to the applicant a receipt for the fee, also a transcript of the entry in the register.
- "3rd. Should any doubt arise at any time as to the genuineness of said credentials, as set forth in said certificate, the Registrar may require the production of the original documents.

"4th. All certificates are to be filed in the Registrar's office.

"5th. The following are the qualifications and additions which may be registered:

First—All those mentioned in Schedule A of the Medical Act.

Second—Any other honorable professional title or designation, degree or diploma."

Moved by Dr. Grant, seconded by Dr. Richardson, "that in the event of any diploma or license being lost, which would have entitled the applicant to be registered, that by producing a certificate of the same from the body granting such diploma or license, he shall then be fully entitled to a certificate of registration." Carried.

Dr. Berryman introduced the following By-law on the appointment of officers and officers' salaries:

"Whereas power has been granted in an act, entitled 'An Act to regulate the qualifications of practitioners in medicine and surgery in Upper Canada,' to appoint a Registrar, Treasurer, and such other officers as may be necessary for the working of the said act,

"Be it therefore enacted, that Henry Strange, M.D., be and is hereby appointed Registrar and Secretary of the Medical Council of Upper Canada.

"And that his salary shall be at the rate of four hundred dollars for one year, and to have his travelling expenses paid.

"And that the said salary shall be paid quarterly, and shall date from the third day of May, A.D. 1866.

"Further, that W. T. Aikins, M.D., be and is hereby appointed Treasurer of the said Council, as aforesaid."

The By-law was read a first time; and it was moved by Dr. Askin, seconded by Dr. Brouse, "that the Council go into committee of the whole on the second reading of said By-law." Carried.

The Council then resolved itself into committee of the whole, Dr. Yates in the chair.

Dr. Dewar and Dr. McGill came in at this stage.

In committee of the whole, the By-law was passed through its second reading; and, on rising, Dr. Yates reported accordingly.

Moved and seconded, "that said By-law be now read a third time and passed." Carried.

Dr. Brouse moved, seconded by Dr. Berryman, "that a committee of three be appointed to confer with the proper authorities of McGill College, and other chartered medical institutions of Lower Canada, in order to secure a common curriculum of medical studies for the two sections of the province; and that the President, Dr. Clarke, and Dr. Grant be that committee." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Turquand, seconded by Dr. Brouse, "that the thanks of this Council be tendered to the Warden and Commissioners of the United Counties of York and Peel, for the use of the council chamber; and also to the Sheriff, for his courtesy in attending to the comfort and convenience of its members." Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded, "that the Secretary transmit a copy of this resolution to the Warden, and also to the Sheriff." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Askin, "that an advertisement be immediately inserted in the *Globe* and *Leader* newspapers, to the effect that Dr. Strange has been elected Registrar of the Medical Council, and that all necessary information can be obtained from him, on application by letter, post paid, addressed to Hamilton. It shall also state that all persons who have not registered on or before the 15th day of June next, will have to pay ten dollars for registration." Carried.

Moved by Mr. Macpherson, "that his motion relative to the next session of the Council, which was ordered to lie on the table, be now taken up."

On being read, it was moved in amendment by Dr. Turquand, seconded by Dr. Berryman, "that the next meeting be held at the city of Ottawa, and the place of all subsequent meetings shall be determined by resolution before each final adjournment."

The original motion was withdrawn and the amendment carried.

Moved by Dr. Aikins, seconded by Dr. McGill, "that the items of expense connected with the election of members of this Council and referred by the government to this Council, be referred to the committee on Finance." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Turquand, seconded by Dr. Richardson, "that the sum of ten dollars be paid to the Treasurer of the United Counties of York and Peel, as per account rendered for gas-light and attendance, which was incurred by occupation of the council chamber." Carried.

Moved and seconded, "that the Council do now adjourn till 3 o'clock, p.m." Carried.

At half past 3 o'clock, the Council was called to order. The President in the chair. Fourteen members being present. Absent—Dr. Morton and Dr. Turquand.

The second report of the committee on Education was read and received.

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Brouse, "that the Council resolve itself into committee of the whole on the said report." Carried.

The report was then considered, clause by clause, in committee of the whole, Dr. Askin in the chair.

At 6 o'clock, the committee rose, reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

The Council then adjourned.

EVENING SESSION.

The Council was called to order at half past 7 o'clock, and immediately went into committee of the whole, on the report of the Education committee, which was amended and carried clause by clause.

Moved and seconded, "that the committee do rise and report progress."

The President resumed the chair, and Dr. Askin reported, that the second report of the committee had been amended in committee of the whole, and was carried.

The report was then read a third time, clause by clause, and further additions were made.

Dr. Turquand moved, seconded by Dr. Fulton, the following resolution:

"Provided the matriculation examination, in any University or College shall embrace the subjects of matriculation established by this Council, and shall be conducted by examiners unconnected with any Faculty or, School of Medicine, a certificate of having passed such examination shall entitle the holder thereof to registration as a student in medicine, without further examination, upon payment of the registration fee." Lost.

Yeas—Drs. Aikins, Fulton, Richardson, Dr. Turquand and Dr. Yates—5.

Nays—Dr. Askin, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Clarke, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Grant, Dr. Macpherson, Dr. McGill, and Dr. Pattullo—8.

Moved by Dr. Richardson, seconded by Dr. Yates, "that in those institutions which require annual examinations for scholarships, the first two such examinations shall be admitted as equivalent to the primary examination required by this Council."

Moved in amendment by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Dewar, "that the motion lie on the table sine die."

Yeas—Dr. Aikins, Dr. Askin, Dr. Brouse, Dr. Clarke, Dr. Dewar, Dr. Fulton, Dr. Grant, Dr. Macpherson, Dr. McGill, Dr. Puttullo and Dr. Turquand—11.

Nays—Drs. Richardson and Yates—2.

The motion was declared lost.

Moved by Dr. Richardson, seconded by Dr. Turquand, "that the final examination shall comprise the subject of anatomy, with the exception of that of the bones, muscles and ligaments. Carried.

Moved and seconded, "that the report as a whole, with the amendments, be adopted." Carried.

The report as adopted is as follows:—

1st. That the age of twenty-one years be the earliest age at which any professional degree or license shall be granted.

2nd. That four years of professional study be required after passing the examination in general education, except as hereinafter provided.

3rd. That the professional examinations may be divided into at least two distinct parts. That the first may be undergone after the termination of two years of study, and the final examination after the termination of four years of study.

4th. That the first professional examination be conducted partly in writing and partly *viva voce*, and that such parts as admit of it be made as practical and demonstrative as possible.

5th. That the second examination be conducted partly in writing and partly viva voce, and practically so far as may be convenient and attainable.

6th. That the professional examinations to be held by the various Colleges and Licensing Bodies be given notice of to the Registrar, so that one or more members of the Medical Council may be present.

- 7th. That returns from the various Medical Schools and Licensing Bodies be made annually on the first of May to the Medical Council, stating the number and names of the candidates who have passed their first as well as their second examinations, and the number of those who have been rejected at the first and second examinations respectively.
- 8th. No candidate shall be entitled to registration who shall not have attended lectures for a period of at least three sessions of six months each, in a University, College, or School of Medicine approved of.
- 9th. Candidates for the final examination shall furnish testimonials of having attended lectures on the following branches of medical education, viz.:—

Anatomy, two courses of	six months each.
Chemistry,	do.
Theory and Practice of Medicine,	do.
Principles and Practice of Surgery,	do.
Midwifery and Diseases of Women and Children	a, do.
Materia Medica and Pharmacy,	do.
Practical Anatomy,	do.
Institutes of Medicine,	do.
Clinical Medicine, two courses of three months e	each.
Clinical Surgery, do.	
Medical Jurisprudence, one course of three mon	ths.
Practical Chemistry, do.	
Botany, do.	

- 10th. The candidate must also give proof by ticket of having attended the practice of a General Hospital for a period of twelve months, or of some other Hospital approved of.
- 11. Moreover, no one shall be permitted to become a candidate for examination, whose final course shall consist of less than four subjects, each six months.
- 12th. That students shall not be permitted to attend any other lectures during their first year than those on the branches comprised in the primary examination. Nor will the certificate of any Lecturer be recognized who lectures on more than one branch of medical science; nor must he deliver more than one lecture daily. But, the Professor of Surgery may lecture on Clinical Surgery; the Professor of Medicine may lecture on Clinical Medicine, and the Professor of Materia Medica may lecture on Botany and Medical Jurisprudence.
- 13th. Each candidate shall present a certificate of having compounded medicine for two periods of six months each, or one period of twelve months, in the office of a "regularly qualified medical practitioner," and he shall present a certificate of having attended six cases of midwifery.
- 14th. Four-fifths of the actual teaching days of a session must be attended before a certificate of attendance at said session can be granted, except in cases of sickness.
- 15th. All graduates from recognized Colleges in the United States shall matriculate and attend one full course of lectures, and all students shall matriculate and complete a course of study in the College in which they intend to graduate, equivalent to the curriculum required by the Council.

16. From a student who is a graduate in Arts of any recognized College or University, only three years of attendance on medical lectures shall be required.

17th. The primary examination shall comprise the following branches:

Anatomy. Chemistry. Materia Medica. Institutes of Medicine. Botany.

The final examination shall comprise the following subjects:—

Anatomy, excluding that of bones, muscles and ligaments. Practical Chemistry.

Practical Chemistry.

Medical Jurisprudence.

Theory and Practice of Medical Practice

Theory and Practice of Medicine. Principles and Practice of Surgery.

Midwifery.

Moved by Dr. Aikins, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that the matriculation of this Council does not apply to students who matriculated in medicine in the Canadian Universities in March last." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Aikins, seconded by Dr. Pattullo, "that the regulations of this Council shall not act injuriously as to time in regard to those students who have already attended one or more courses of lectures in any Canadian school, but such courses shall be allowed them." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that the President, Dr. Aikins, and Dr. Berryman, make the requisite arrangements with the printers, concerning the publication of the By-laws and *Medical Register*." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Dewar, "that the sum of six dollars each day, with all travelling expenses, be paid to each member of the Medical Council." Carried.

Moved and seconded, "that the Medical Register be published on the 1st day of August next." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Turquand, seconded by Dr. Brouse, "that Dr. N. O. Walker, of Port Dover, be appointed examiner of matriculants to the Medical Council." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Grant, seconded by Dr. Turquand, "that a vote of thanks be tendered to Dr. Parker, for the zeal and energy he has displayed in carrying through Parliament the Medical Bill now in operation." Carried unanimously.

The Council then adjourned till 9 o'clock next morning.

SIXTH DAY.

Tuesday, May 8, 1866.

The Council was called to order by the President at a quarter to 11 o'clock; fourteen members present; absent, Dr. Berryman and Dr. Morton.

The minutes of yesterday were read and adopted.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that the annual meeting of this Council shall be held on the second Tuesday in May." Carried.

Dr. Berryman and Dr. Morton came in here.

Moved by Dr. Berryman, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that this Council do hereby recognize the exertions of Dr. Rees in his constant efforts, when in Quebec, for the passage of the Medical Act of Upper Canada, and tender him their thanks for the same." Carried.

Dr. Berryman, chairman of the Fnance committee, begged to present the first report of said committee, which was received and read, as follows:

"Your committee have had the consideration of a certain communication addressed to the Sheriff, ordering him to submit the various accounts for the election purposes under the Medical Act to this Council for liquidation.

"Your committee cannot see the justice of such a procedure; they would recommend that the said accounts be referred again to the Government for its consideration, and would not recommend the Council to pay such debts, which were not contracted by this Council."

Moved and seconded, "that the report of the committee on Finance be adopted." Carried.

Moved by Dr. Brouse, seconded by Dr. Berryman, "that Dr. Clarke, Dr. Turquand, and Dr. Aikins, be a committee to arrange with Dr. N. O. Walker, for salary as examiner to this Council already appointed." Carried.

Moved and seconded, "that the sum of five dollars be paid to Michael Ryan, for attendance, etc., as messenger of this Council." Carried.

Dr. Brouse moved, seconded by Dr. Clarke, "that in our efforts to legislate for the elevation of that branch of the profession to which we belong, we are equally anxious to join with members of any chartered branch of medicine for registration and other purposes, whenever their curriculum of studies shall be the standard of that laid down by this Council in all branches of the profession, except that known as the Practice of Medicine.

The motion was lost on a division.

Moved and seconded, that Dr. Aikins take the chair.

Moved by Dr. Clarke, seconded by Dr. Dewar, "that the cordial thanks of this Council are hereby tendered to the President, for the satisfactory manner in which he has conducted the business of the Council during the present session." Carried nem. con.

The Council adjourned at 12 o'clock, to stand adjourned till next annual meeting, unless called together sooner by the President.
