FIRST MEETING OF COUNCIL.

January 20th, 1879.

The report embraces a detailed statement of Receipts and Disbursements, abstract statement of the same.

Statement of total taxes to be collected for the year 1879, amounts paid by the different collectors and balance outstanding at the close of the year.

The abstract statement ostensibly shows an amount of \$180.04 in the hands of the Treasurer. This will not actually be the case, as against this must be charged interest on overdrawn Bank account, the exact amount not being now ascertainable will have to remain over to appear in next audit.

We find proper authority for all payments during the quarter, with the exception of \$25, Mr. Willson's costs *re* Arbitration, with the Municipality of Parkdale.

By-Law No. 588, covering authority to pay \$100 to Jno. Mallindine and \$50 to James Lesslie, is in hands of Arbitrators *re* Willson and the Municipality; the cheques, however, being countersigned by the Reeve we have consequently passed the payments as correct.

We have not given a list of the securities in the hands of the Treasurer at the close of the year, as this will have to be done in connection with the ensuing Auditors' report from the 1st to the 26th of January, 1880, (the latter being the date at which Mr. A. L. Willson ceased to be Treasurer), and doing so now we thought would be useless labor.

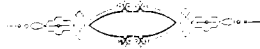
