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FIRST MEETING OF COUNCIL.

January 15th, 1877.

WILLIAM TYRRELL, Esq., Reeve,
HENRY DUNCAN, Esq., 1st Deputy Reeve,

ISAAC DOLLERY, 4th Deputy Reeve,

met at the Council Chamber, Eglington, on Monday, January 15th, 1877, at 11 o'clock, a.m., and having severally subscribed their declarations of office and qualification, the Reeve took the chair.

Mr. Duncan introduced a petition for the adoption of the Council, praying the Legislative Assembly of Ontario to cause an investigation to be made into the management of the General Hospital at Toronto.

Also the petition of Gilbert Smith, *et al.*, praying for aid for John Irwin.

Mr. Watson presented the petition of Jacob Strong, *et al.*, praying for aid for Joseph Barger.

Of J. G. McDonell, *et al.*, praying to have their road division subdivided.

Mr. Dollery presented the petition of Richard West, *et al.*, praying that a portion of School Section, No. 13, be added to School Section, No. 22.

Mr. Dollery introduced a petition for the adoption of the Council, praying the Legislative Assembly of Ontario to extend the time for preparing voter's lists for the election of members of the Legislature of Ontario till the first day of October in each year, and to permit Municipal Councils to form Electoral or Polling Sub-divisions for the Legislative Elections in such manner as they may judge to be most judicial and beneficial for attaining the object contemplated by the Act.

Resolved—That the Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and instructed to notify the Trustees of School Sections Nos. 13 and 22, that the ratepayers on the south halves of Lots Nos. 33 and 34, north of Bloor Street, and Lot 35, on the west side of Credit Valley Railway, have petitioned this Council to attach the above lands to School Section, No. 22, and that it is the intention of the Council to take action in answer to the prayer of the petitioners at its March meeting, first Monday. Carried.

1st. A detailed statement of the Receipts and Disbursements for the year 1877.

2nd. An abstract statement of said Receipts and Disbursements, shewing the total amount received and paid out under the several headings of the accounts, whereby it will be seen that the Disbursements exceeded the Receipts to the amount of £1,368.96.

3rd. An abstract shewing Clerk and Treasurer's Salary Account in detail for 1877.

4th. A statement shewing total amount of taxes levied in the Township of York for 1877, and also the amounts remaining unpaid by each Collector.

5th. A full list of securities held by the Municipality showing all the Debentures, with their respective numbers, also Mortgages, Deeds, Bonds, etc., with dates of each.

6th. We find that the Charity grants have been largely increased during the year, after deducting the "Hospital Account," amounting to \$1,100. There is an increase over the preceding year of \$840.21.

7th. We beg to acknowledge the Receipt of Statement from Mr. Peter S. Gibson, Township Engineer, of work performed, and estimates given on same by him during the past year, which we consider has been done economically, and on the whole satisfactorily.

8th. The Insurance Policy on the "Council Chamber" furniture expired December, 1877, and has not been renewed.

9th. There has been nothing paid on the following Mortgages during the year, viz:—

Stock, Wright, and Weston High School, and as the interest due on same is now a large item, we would recommend your Council to take immediate action in the matter to collect or foreclose forthwith.

10th. In concluding our Report, we beg to state that we have carefully examined the accounts of your Clerk and Treasurer, and find same correct as herein stated, with the required vouchers and orders for payment.
