### FIRST MEETING OF COUNCIL.

January 15th, 1877.

WILLIAM TYRRELL, Esq., Reeve, HENRY DUNCAN, Esq., 1st Deputy Reeve, JOSEPH WATSON, Esq., 2nd Deputy Reeve, and ISAAC DOLLERY, 4th Deputy Reeve,

met at the Council Chamber, Eglington, on Monday, January 15th, 1877, at 11 o'clock, a.m., and having severally subscribed their declarations of office and qualification, the Reeve took the chair.

Communications were received.

From George Leslie, Jr., in reference to several indigent persons, and expressing his inability to attend on account of illness.

From Peter Patterson, M.P.P., re Goulding.

From M. H. Keefler, asking for a share of the Township printing.

From J. H. McCollum, re Medcalfe.

From Messrs. Gamble and Small, re Hospital Accounts.

From Rev. K. D. McDiarmid, re Marquis.

From Rev. H. B. Osler, re Leeder.

From Dr. Rupert, re Barger.

Accounts were received.

From Messrs, Harrison, Osler and Moss.

From J. Mallindine, for use of polling booth.

Mr. Duncan introduced a petition for the adoption of the Council, praying the Legislative Assembly of Ontario to cause an investigation to be made into the management of the General Hospital at Toronto.

No. 22, and that it is the intention of the Council to take action in answer to the prayer of the petitioners at its March meeting, first Monday. Carried.

Stock, Wright, and Weston High School, and as the interest due on same is now a large item, we would recommend your Council to take immediate action in the matter to collect or foreclose fortbwith.

10th. In concluding our Report, we beg to state that we have carefully examined the accounts of your Clerk and Treasurer, and find same correct as herein stated, with the required vouchers and orders for payment.
