FIRST MEETING OF COUNCIL,

January 18th, 1875.

The following members elected to fill the offices of Reeve and Deputy Reeves for the Municipal Council of the Township of York, during the year 1875, viz:—

JOSEPH WATSON, Esq., 3rd Deputy Reeve,

having met at the Council Chamber, Masonic Hall, Eglington, on Monday, January 18th, 1875, in pursuance of the Act in that behalf, and, having severally taken and subscribed their declarations of office and qualification, the Reeve took the chair.

A circular and blank for return was received from the Provincial Treasurer, *re* Tavern Licenses.

A circular was received from the Provincial Secretary's office, in the matter of drainage.

A letter was received from the County Treasurer *re* lot 8, 2nd concession from the bay.

A petition was received from T. C. Lean, *et al*, praying that not more than three Shop Licenses shall be granted in Brocton for the year 1875.

Resolved--That the Reeve and Treasurer be and are hereby instructed to grant a certificate to Richard Ditty, to enable him to obtain a Tavern License as soon as he complies with the Statutes and By-laws in such case made and provided.

The Committee rose and reported the By-law as amended.

The By-law was then read a third time and passed.

Mr. Bull introduced a By-law, No. 449, to grant and apportion the Interest arising from investments of the Clergy Reserve and other funds for the year 1874.

The By-law was read a first and second time.

The Council went into a Committee of the whole on the By-law.

Mr. Bull in the chair.

The Committee rose and reported the By-law as amended.

The By-law was then read a third time and passed.

The Council then adjourned to meet at the Council Chamber, Eglington, on Monday, February 8th, 1875, at 11 o'clock, a.m.

February 27th, 1875.

The Council met at the Council Chamber, Eglington, pursuant to adjournment.

Carried.

SIXTH MEETING OF COUNCIL.

May 3rd, 1875.

The Council met at the Council Chamber, Eglington, on Monday, May 3rd, inst., at 11 o'clock, a.m.

All the members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

A communication was received from Rev. H. B. Osler *re* Leeder.

Mr. Watson presented the petition of W. R. Bartlett, *et al*, Trustees of School Section No. 25, of York Township, praying for a grant of Clergy Reserve Interest for the year 1875, and of John Davidson and 8 others, asking a grant to improve Roncesvalles Avenue.

Mr. Bull presented the petition of James Duncan, Esq., *et al*, asking help to gravel the 6th concession line.

Also of John Kaiser and Daniel Stong, praying for aid for the Widow Westwick.

Also of John Colley and John Seagor, praying for certificates to obtain transfers of Tavern Licenses for the year 1875.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Watson.

The Municipality holds security from him to the amount of \$20,000.00, and notwithstanding that his accounts are audited and balanced every year, if an error is found on either side of the account, it is the duty of the Council to see that it is made correct.

In the month of May last, the Treasurer called the attention of the Council to omissions he had made in the years 1869, 1870, and 1871, in his account with the Municipality. He stated he had discovered that while he had settled and paid Mr. William Brown, in each of those years, for collecting and for assessing in 1870, he had omitted to charge the several amounts against the Municipality, (which he should have done as soon as he credited the same to Mr. Brown); and stated further, that by referring to the published accounts of those years, it would be seen that the Municipality had not been charged with the payments. As soon as the matter was brought before the Council, a special audit was appointed, with instructions to carefully examine the accounts referred to, and report to the Council.

The Auditors reported to the Council, which report is hereto annexed,* and recommended the amounts therein mentioned to be paid. Upon receipt of this report the Council again very carefully examined the Treasurer's accounts for the years above mentioned, and concurred in the views expressed by the Auditors, and then (and not till then) ordered the amount to be charged to the Municipality. We, the undersigned Auditors appointed to examine the accounts of the Treasurer, Mr. A. L. WILLSON, for the year 1875, beg leave to submit the foregoing statements, which comprise, namely :

1st. A detailed statement of the Receipts and Disbursements for the year 1875.

2nd. An abstract statement of the said Receipts and Disbursements, showing the total amounts received and paid out under the several headings of the accounts, whereby it will be seen that the Disbursements exceeded the Receipts to the amount of \$1371 65.

3rd. An extensive list of Securities held by the Municipality, showing all the Debentures, with their respective numbers ; also, all Mortgages, Deeds, Bonds, &c., with dates of each.

4th. A statement of the Total Taxes levied in the Township of York for 1875.

5th. An abstract showing Clerk and Treasurer's Salary Account for 1875.

We notice that there is the sum of \$1130 00 charged to Ward No. 2, for expenditure on Roads, &c., which should have been charged to Ward No. 1.

We find it difficult to check contract accounts, as we have no contract prices from the Engineer, and therefore have to accept all Disbursements when estimate given and order signed by a member of your Council Board as being correct.

We notice a By-law granting \$1000 00 to the town line between Scarboro and York, \$600 of which is subject to certain conditions. The whole amount of grant was paid in 1875.

We would call the attention of your Council to the fact that the law requires all Trustees of School Sections to deposit their Deeds with the Clerk and Treasurer, and only a few have as yet complied with the law.

We find that an Insurance has been effected on the Council Chamber Furniture.

We notice that a large amount of Taxes remained unpaid on the 14th of December, 1875, and would suggest that some action be taken to compel rate-payers to comply with the regulations of the Statute and By-laws of the Township relating to the same.

In conclusion, we would state that we have carefully examined the Books and Accounts of your Clerk and Treasurer, and find them correct as herein stated, with the required vouchers and orders for payment, and we would express our thanks to your Treasurer for the very courteous manner in which he gave us every information required in the prosecution of our work.
