An Act to incorporate the Academy of St. Romuald de

THEREAS an Association hath been formed at the Village of St. Preamble. Romuald de Farnham, in the County of Missisquoi, by divers persons residing in that Village and the neighborhood thereof, under the name of the Academy de St. Romuald de Farnham Association, having for 5 its design to afford a course of instruction to include the Greek, Latin, French and English Languages, Writing, Arithmetic, Mathematics and such other branches of Science and general Literature as it may be deemed proper from time to time to introduce; And whereas the persons hereinafter named being the office-bearers of the said Association, and 10 acting on behalf of the members thereof, have by their Petition to the Legislature represented, that they have obtained a Lot of land in the said Village of St. Romuald de Farnham, and have by subscriptions erected a building thereon, in which the branches of education and knowledge aforesaid may be taught, and have by their Petition represented, that it would be beneficial to the interests of the said Association, and would tend to the success and prosperity of their Seminary, if the members of the said Association were incorporated, and have prayed to be incorporated by the name of the Academy of St. Romuald de Farnham; And whereas it is deemed expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petitioners; Therefore 20 Her Majesty &c., enacts as follows:

I. Louis Bourdon, President; Jean Benjamin Valiquet, Secretary-Certain per-Treasurer; Edmond Clement, Joseph Bérian, Oliver Hébert Pêre, John sons incorpo-Darby, Francis Mullins and Jean Baptiste Bessette fils, the present Directors rated. of the said Association, with all such other persons as now are, or hereaf-25 ter may become members of the same, shall be and are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of "The Academy of St. Romuald Corporate de Farnham," and shall by that name have perpetual succession and a name and noward and noward and noward no common seal, with power to alter, renew or change such seal at pleasure, powers. and shall by the same name and at all times hereafter have power to 30 purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy such lands and tenements as may be necessary for the actual use and occupation of the said Academy, not exceeding in annual value the sum of two hundred pounds, currency, Real pro-exclusive of the value of the necessary buildings for the use of the said perty. Academy, and of the ground on which they are or may be erected, and the 35 same to sell, alienate and dispose of and others in their stead to purchase and acquire and hold for the uses and purposes aforesaid; and the said Corporation, may by the said name, sue and be sued in all Courts of Law or other places whatsoever, in as large, ample and beneficial a manner as any other body politic or corporate in this Province; And in all actions and suits at law Service of 40 which may at any time be brought against the said Corporation, service of process process at the domicile of the President or Secretary of the said Corporation,

Powers limit shall be held to be a sufficient service for all legal purposes; but the powers of the Corporation shall extend only to the purposes and objects mentioned in the preamble, to which only its property and means shall be applied.

Power to Make By-laws. II. The said Corporation shall nave power and authority to make By-laws, Rules and Regulations not contrary to law or to the provisions of the said Corporation, and this Act, for the government and management of the said Corporation, and of the officers, members, affairs and property thereof, and for the admission, demission and qualification of members thereof, and for all purposes relating to the well being and interests of the said Corporation, and the same to amend, alter or repeal from time to time as shall be deemed ne- 10 cessary or expedient.

Election of

III. The affairs of the said Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of not less than eight nor more than fifteen members, who shall be elected from time to time by the members of the Corporation, in the manner prescribed by the By-laws of the said Corporation 15 and who shall remain in office during such term as shall be fixed by the said By-laws; Provided always, that the present Directors shall remain in office until others shall be duly elected in their room and stead.

IV. The said Board of Directors shall have power to meet from time to time for the transaction of the affairs of the said Corporation, and at any 20 such meeting five Directors shall be a quorum competent for the transaction of business; and the said Directors shall from time to time elect one President, &c. of their number to be President of the said Corporation, and another one

Rights and liabilities of

V. All and every the estate and property, real and personal of the said 25 Association, and all property held in trust for it at the time of the passing Association, and all property near in trust for it are the trust of this Act, and all debts due to or rights or claims possessed by the said Corporation. Association, shall be and the same are hereby transferred to and vested in the said Corporation, which shall be liable in like manner to and for all debts due by or claims upon the said Association.

School Commay unite with the Corporation.

VI. It shall and may be lawful for the said Directors of the said Corporation, and the School Commissioners for the Municipality of the Village of St. Romuald de Farnham, at any time to enter into an agreement with each other, having for its object the union of one or more or all of the Common Schools in the Municipality with the said Academy, and during 35 the existence of such agreement the said School Commissioners shall ex officio be Directors of the said Corporation; and it shall and may be lawful for the said School Commissioners at any time to pay to the Directors of the said Corporation such sums of money as the said Commissioners. rectors of the said Corporation such sums of money as the said Commissioners might pay to the Teachers of such Common School or Schools, if 40 the same had not been united with said Academy.

Public Act. VII. This Act shall be deemed a public Act.
