





## CLIFTON.

An incorporated town, situated on the west bank of the Niagara river, about a mile below the celebrated Falls of Niagara, in the township of Stamford, county of Wel-It is the eastern terminus of the Great Western Railway, which connects here with railways to all parts of the United States. Canada is here connected with the State of New York by a suspension bridge, which ranks next to the Victoria tubular bridge at Montreal as the most scientific work on the continent. It is suspended 250 feet above the river, from towers 75 feet in height, by means of four wire cables, ten inches in diameter: the distance between the towers being 822 feet. two separate roadways, one above the other, the upper one being exclusively for the railways, having different guages of track laid down, and the lower one for cariages, pedestrians, &c. The Eric and Ontario Railway also passes through the town, and has a station here. scenery in the vicinity is very romantic, especially near the Whirpool, which is situated at a bend of the river, about a mile below the village. Distant from St. Catharines, 12 miles; from Hamilton, 44 miles; from Buffalo, N. Y., 22 miles; and from Windsor, the western terminus of the Great Western Railway, 229 miles. mails, and money order office. Population 1,400.

#### HAMILTON.

Beautifully situated on the south-western curve of Burlington Bay, in the township of Barton, county of Wentworth. It was laid out in 1812, and occupies a delightful position on a plateau of slightly elevated ground. winding around the foot of the Mountain. The distance between the Mountain and the Bay is about two miles. and on the area thus included, stands, in point of population, wealth and commercial importance, the second city in the western section of the Province. As early as 1813, it became of military importance. Burlington Bay is a beautiful basin, navigable in all parts to within a few yards of the shore, making one of the most commodious and safe harbors on the Lakes. There are several lines of steamers in summer plying regularly between the City and Montreal, and all intermediate The Great Western Railway, from Suspension Bridge to Windsor, has its head offices and machine shops There is a branch of the Great Western Railway to Toronto, connecting with the Grand Trunk Railway East, for all points down the Lake. The chief business portion of the city is situated about a mile back from the Bay, and some of the largest wholesale and manufacturing establishments in the Province are located here. The buildings are chiefly stone and brick, and many of them are very fine, and present an imposing apperance. The city is well supplied with water and gas. jardins Canal connects Hamilton and Dundas, and has a navigation of about four miles in length. Distant from Niagara Falls, 45 miles; London, 76 miles; Windsor, 183 miles; Toronto, by rail, 38 miles; and from Montreal, 378 miles. Population about 25,000.

The chief city of Ontario in the township and county of York, situated on the north west shore of Lake Ontario and north of the Bay, a beautiful oval sheet of water, capacious, well sheltered and accessible to the largest vessels that navigate the lakes. It was founded by Lieutenant-Governor General Simcoe, then residing at Navy Hall, Niagara, who, having formed extensive plans for the improvement of the colony, resolved upon laying the foundation of a provincial capital, and caused the first survey to be made in the spring of 1793 by Bouchette of the Royal Engineers. The place was called York, and soon grew into importance, the inhabitants enjoying peace and prosperity until the war of 1812. In 1813 it was captured by the American army under General Pike, who lost his life at the storming of the It was held, however, but a few days, while in meantime the government house, public buildings and all the stores that could not be conveniently carried away were burned. In 1834 the town was incorporated and the name changed to Toronto, and in 1837 was convulsed by the breaking out of the rebellion led by Wm. Lvon McKenzie. The ground upon which Toronto is situated is nearly level, sloping gently up from the water's edge to the rear, where from several points some fine views of the lake and bay may be had. The city is laid out in the form of a parallelogram, the streets intersecting each other at right angles, the two principal thoroughfares and those containing the largest number of shops, or stores, being King and Yonge; the former runs parallel with the Bay, and the latter intersecting it extends northward through a rich and prosperous agri-

cultural country for upwards of thirty miles. The public buildings of the city are numerous, and many of them very handsome. First of which is the University College, a spacious gothic structure standing amidst the retired retreats of the Queen's Park, with its beautiful avenues leading from Yonge and Queen streets. there are the Normal School Buildings, standing in the centre of the handsome grounds dedicated to educational purposes; the Trinity College, Upper Canada College, Osgoode Hall the seat of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity of Upper Canada; the Crystal Place built for the use of the Provincial Exhibition, which is held quadrennially; the Provincial Lunatic Asylum, situated on Queen street west, near city limits, and its branch in Queen's Park; Merchants' Exchange, Masonic Hall. Post Office, St. Lawrence Hall, City Hall, Mechanics' Institute, City Hospital, St. James' and St. Michael's Cathedrals, Knox, Zion and many other churches; the Bank of British North America, Bank of Montreal, Bank of Toronto, Commercial Bank, Royal Insurance Buildings. Edinburgh Insurance Buildings, Western Assurance Buildings, British America Insurance and Provincial Insurance Buildings, and the Parliament Buildings. The city is well supplied with water and lighted with gas, and has many industrial establishments, several of them extensive, including foundries, tanneries, cabinet and other factories, and large milling establishments which are thriving and rapidly extending their capacity and powers of improving their productions. Her spacious land-locked harbor affords the utmost facility for any possible extension of trade, and her connections at all seasons of the year with almost every place of importance in Canada or the United States by means of the Grand Trunk, Great Western and Northern Railways are not surpassed, and she is now reaping the fruits of her people's enery and central position in a steady prosperity which seems to be both durable and progressive. Distant from Montreal 333 miles; Collingwood, 96 miles; London, 144 miles; Kingston, 165 miles; Hamilton, 39 miles; Boston, 593 miles; New York, 500 miles. Population about 60,000.
