*Resolved*—That the prayer of the petition of Samuel Littlejohn and others be granted, by allowing them to commute and perform their statute labour for the year 1867, during the present fall, in improving the hill in front of Lot No. 14 in front of said fourth concession.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Tyrrell, seconded by Mr. Mulholland,

*Resolved*—That the Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify the Auditors to attend and Audit the accounts of the late Treasurer of this Municipality as soon as they are prepared by his securities, and ready for auditing, and that they be laid before this Council at its next meeting.—Carried.

*Resolved*—That this Council cannot allow the present opportunity to pass without expressing the deep sorrow they feel for the loss of the late John Willson, 4th, Esq., who has for the last sixteen years faithfully served this municipality in the office of Clerk and Treasurer. This Council can with pleasure bear testimony to his indefatigable zeal and integrity, this, together with his kind and gentlemanly manners, has endeared his memory to every member of this Council, and we feel confident, we may say, to the inhabitants of this Township in general. The Council further desire to assure his bereaved widow how truly their sympathies are directed in her behalf, knowing as they do that she has been deprived of a fond and loving husband, and her family of a true protector and guide.—Carried.

In account No. 1, is a full statement of the Clergy Reserve (principal) account, showing that the full amount received from Government, to the 18th of July, 1866, is \$19,213 65 which with amount of bonus received on \$1,800 debentures, matured and collected makes \$19,267 65, and amount invested to same time, \$17,483 62, leaving the balance in Treasurer's hands, and to invest, \$1,784 03.

In account No. 2, is a full statement of interest received from investments of the Clergy Reserve Fund, to the 18th of July, 1866 and expenditure, showing that \$541 09 more than has been received has been paid to School sections.

In account No. 3, is a statement showing that \$9454 62 were invested in mortgages up to 18th of July, 1866—for particulars of interest, see account No. 2.

In account No. 4, is a statement showing that \$7,229 were invested in debentures, and \$800 deposited in the Canada Permanent Building Society up to 18th of July, 1866.

In account No. 5, will be found a general statement of accounts between the late Treasurer, (the late John Willson, 4th, Esq.,) and the Municipality, showing that a balance of \$1,804 93 was due the Municipality by him, 18th July, 1866.

The Auditors in closing their report, would just state that they have discovered several omissions, which they have endeavored to correct, and probably these would not have occurred had the late Treasurer been spared to complete his accounts.
