FOR THE YEAR 1863.

The Members returned for the several Wards of the Municipality, viz:—

Ward No. 1, R. E. Playter; Ward No. 2, C. D. Maginn; Ward No. 3, B. Bull; Ward No. 4, Joseph Shepard; Wm Tyrrell, Ward No. 5, met at Eglington, and having made and subscribed the Declaration of Qualification and of Office. The Clerk having taken the Chair,

Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Maginn, moved, that William Tyrrell, Esq., be elected Reeve for the current year.—Carried.

Mr. Shepard, seconded by Mr. Maginn, moved, that B. Bull, Esq., be elected Deputy Reeve for the current year.—Carried.

The Reeve and Deputy then made and subscribed the required Declarations of Office.

The Reeve took the Chair.

Mr. Shepard presented the petition of N. Shepherd, and others, praying to be appointed Assessor for East York, for 1863.—Received and read.

Mr. Playter presented the petition of Alex. Milne and others, praying that Alexander McClelland be appointed Assessor for East York, for 1863.—Received and read.

Mr. Bull presented the petition of Joseph Dennis and others, praying that Thomas Peers be appointed Inspector for West York for 1863.—Received and read.

Mr. Maginn presented the petition of C. Sherwood and others, with reference to the alteration of the limits of School Section No. 12.—Received and read.

Moved by Mr. Shepard, seconded by Mr. Bull,

Resolved,—That William Brown be appointed Assessor for West York, and Nicholas Shepherd for East York, for the current year.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Playter, seconded by Mr. Bull,

Resolved,—That Nicholas Maughan be appointed Auditor of Accounts.—Carried.

The Reeve appointed John Dew, also one of the auditors.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Playter,

Resolved,—That W. H. Keele be appointed Inspector for West York, and Charles Snider, Inspector for East York.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Playter, seconded by Mr. Maginn,

Resolved,—That the sum of \$125 be the salary for each of the assessors, for the current year.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved,—That the Treasurer's bond and the sureties named therein, be accepted as satisfactory to this Council.—Carried.

The Council then adjourned, to meet at Millar's Tavern, Eglington, on Monday, the 23rd day of February next, at 11 o'clock A. M.

Carried.

Resolved, That the Clerk be instructed to grant certificates to James Bird and Thomas Tuer, to obtain Tavern Licenses on producing the Inspector's certificate of qualification. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr Maginn, Resolved, That the sum of \$35 be paid to the order of Wm. Watson, Supt. of Common Schools, Township of York, out of the Clergy Reserve Interest Fund, for the purpose of purchasing prizes for the Competition Examination to take place in May next, of a certain number of scholars from each school in the Township, and that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the same. Carried.

The Court then adjourned.

FIFTH MEETING of the Council 8th June, 1863.

Present, the Reeve and Councillors Bull, Maginn, Playter, and Shepard.

Mr. Maginn presented the petition of James Mead and 58 others, praying a grant to open a certain Road. Received and read.

Mr. Playter presented the petition of David Priestly, praying that a certificate to obtain a Tavern License be granted him for part of the current License Year at a reduced price. Received and read.

Mr. Shepard presented the petition of C. C. Beckett, praying for a reduction in his Shop License. Received and read.

Moved by Mr. Playter, seconded by Mr. Shepard.

Resolved—That the Petition of C. C. Beckett praying for a reduction in his Shop License, be granted and that the Treastrer grant him a License on receiving the sum of \$30. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Playter, seconded by Mr. Shepard,


