MINUTES
OF THE
MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF YORK,
FROM JANUARY TO JUNE, INCLUSIVE, 1861.

FIRST MEETING of the Municipal Council of the Township of York 21st January, 1861.

The members returned by the several wards of the Municipality met at the Prospect House, Eglington, and having taken the Declaration and Qualification and of office, viz.: Wm. Tyrrell, Esq., B. Bull, Esq., W. M. Morse, Esq., Joseph Shepard, Esq., and C. D. Maginn, Esq., took their seats,

The Clerk in the chair,

Mr. Shepard, seconded by Mr. Bull, moved that William Tyrrell, Esq., be elect-

ed Reeve of the Municipality for the current year,—Carried.

Mr. Shepard, seconded by Mr. MaGinn, moved that Wm. Morse, Esq., be elected deputy Reeve for the current year,—Carried.

The Reeve and Deputy having taken the Declaration of Office, the Reeve took the chair, and having called the Council to order proceeded to busines.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Shepard

Resolved, That John Davis, Esq., be appointed Auditor for the current year,—Carried.

The Reeve appointed Edward Miles, Esq., of Weston, Auditor for the current year.

The Treasurers Bond having expired, it was renewed with two surities, Penalty \$20,000 which was approved and accepted by the Council.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Bull,

Resolved, That Wm. Mulholland and Wm. Brown, be appointed Assessors for the current year—William Brown for

the western division of the Township, and Mr. Mulholland for the eastern division, and that the sum of \$120 be the salary allowed Mr. Brown, and to Mr. Mulholland the sum of \$130,—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard

Resolved,—That the Council do hold its monthly meetings, for the present year, at the Prospect House,—Carried,

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard

Resolved,—That the Clerk be authorized to procure the necessary stationery for the use of the Council for the current year,—Carried.

The Council then adjourned, to meet at the Prospect House on Monday the 18th day of February next at 10 o'clock, A. M.

SECOND MEETING of the Municipal Council of the Township of York, 18th February, 1861.

Present,—The Reeve, and Councillors Bull, Morse, Maginn, and Shepard,

Mr. Morse presented Petitions for Tavern Licences from Thomas Coats, Francis Paddington, Thomas Smith, Charles Gates, Wm. Smith, James Young, Michael O'Halloran, William Parkins, Wm. Bell, David Mathers, Gilbert Smith, John Greenwood, Wm. Vine, Thomas Wilson, David O'Sullivan, and David Priestly.

Mr. Maginn presented the petition of Thomas Palmer and John Aston praying for a Tavern License.

Mr. Shepard presented the petition of Charles Sheppard, Patrick Chapman, R. R. Cherry, James Johnson, Absalom Flay, Robert Wood, and John Eagle praying for a Tavern License.

Mr. Bull presented the petitions of B. A. Irwin, E. Featherstone, John Miller, James Sharks, B. Hammond, Robt. James, James Dawson, John Louney, Joseph Church, Henry Smith, Mary Larkin,

James Johnson, Henry Smith, and Charles M'Bride.

Petitions received and read,—Mr. Morse presented the petitions of Joseph Dennis, Esq., and others praying that Joseph Campion be appointed Inspector for the current year.—Received and read.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved,—That Mr. J. Snider, Senr., together with the mover and seconder, be appointed to visit and inspect the proposed crossing of the Railway at the Hogs Back on Tuesday, 19th instant, at half-past three o'clock P. M.—Carried.

The Council went into committee upon a By-Law to provide for the regulation of Inns, and for granting Shop Licences and Tavern Licenses.

Mr. Bull in the chair.

The committee rose and reported the By Law as amended.

The By-Law was then read a third time and passed.

Mr. Morse presented a By Law to ap-

point Charles Snider and Joseph Campion License Inspectors for the current year.

The Council went into committee upon the By-Law.

Mr. Maginn in the chair.

The committee rose and reported the By-Law as adopted.

The By-Law was then read a third time and passed.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Maginn,

Resolved,—That the sum of Forty Dollars be appropriated out of the general funds of this Municipality for the purpose of repairing the Town Line between York and Scarborough, with a proviso that an equal sum be granted for such purpose by the Township Council of Scarborough, and that Mark Barker, Esq., be appointed commissioner to expend the same on behalf of this Council, and that the Clerk be required to notify the Reeve of Scarborough of such resolution.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Bull,

Resolved,—That the sum of seven Dollars and fifty cents be paid to H. Jackson

as Constable fees, the account having been certified by the presiding Justice and License Inspector.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Bull,

Resolved,—That the Reeve be authorized to issue a proclamation offering a reward of Twenty Dollars to any person or persons except the Inspectors, who may lodge such information as will lead to the conviction of any party or parties who may sell spirituous or other liquors, without being duly authorized by this Council so to do, such reward to include the moiety allowed by Statute to informers.—Carried.

The Council adjourned to meet at the Prospect House, on Monday the 25th day of February instant, at 2 o'clock, P. M.

two Letter Books for the use of the Reeve
and Clerk of the Municipal Council.

day of March nex at 11 o'clock, A. M.

FOURTH MEETING of the Municipal Coun-
cil of the Township of York, March
25th, 1861.

Present,—The Reeve and Councillors

Mr. Maginn presented the petition of James Medd and 44 others, praying for a Special Grant to open part of the 4th Con. East.—Received and read.

Mr. Morse presented the petition of Robert Moody and 30 others, praying for a Tavern License on the Lake Shore Road.—Received and read.

Mr. Maginn presented the petition of James Freer and others, praying for a Tavern License.—Petition read.

Moved by B. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved, That the claim of Mr. McCracken against Ward No. 4, for a Road Shovel, be referred to the Commissioners of the said Ward for the year 1861.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved, That the Resolution authorizing the Reeve to issue a Proclamation offering a Reward of Twenty Dollars to any

person or persons who may lodge such information as will lead to the conviction of any party or parties who may sell spirituous or other liquors without being licensed, be rescinded.—Carried.

Mr. Morse gave notice that he will at the next meeting of the Council introduce a set of Standing Rules and Regulations for the guidance of the Council.

Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Maginn, moved,

That the petition of Messrs. John and William Hogg, praying that a Tavern License be granted to James Freer, upon the condition that the house be found to possess the required accommodation.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved, That the petition of David Priestly be granted, to enable him to obtain a Tavern License.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Morse,

Resolved, That the Clerk be required to notify Mr. Richard Bond to remove his fence or any other incumbrance that he

may have placed on that portion of the public road allowance situate between the Lake Shore Road and Lake Ontario, and on which John Richey, Esq., is Overseer.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Maginn,

Resolved, That the Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized to pay to the order of H. Norris, Esq., the sum of Twenty Dollars, and that this resolution be the order therefor.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved, That the sum of \$12 for notifying Township Officers, \$6 for posting Election Notices, and \$5 for postage, for the year 1860, be allowed the Clerk.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Shepard,

Resolved, That the Auditor's Report of the Treasurer's Accounts for the year 1860, be adopted, being satisfactory to this Council.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Bull,

Resolved, That the Treasurer's Accounts be published in pamphlet form, together with the Minutes of the past four meetings, and also the Auditors' Report; and that the suggestions offered by the Auditors, relative to the issuing of Store and Tavern Licenses, be henceforth established by this Council; and also that the sum of \$8 each be paid to the Auditors for auditing the Accounts for the year 1860.—Carried.

Mr. Morse introduced a By-Law to appoint Township Officers for the year 1861.

The Council went into Committee upon the By-Law,—Mr. Shepard, in the chair.

The Committee rose and reported the By-Law as amended.

The By-Law was read a third time and passed.

The Council then adjourned, to meet at Prospect House on Monday, the 6th day of May, 1861.
