GENERAL RULES FOR STOCK EXHIBITED.

Stock of all kinds must be the *bona fide* property of the Exhibitors, and owned by them previous to day of Show.

Exhibitors of pure bred Stock are required to file certificates at the time of entry, clearly showing that the Stock therein specified are from reliable Breeders of such Stock, or descended from such Stock, accompanied with pedigrees and age. The names of the Breeders to be inserted, and signed by the Exhibitor, who must be a member of the Society (except Crosses and Grade Stock, to state how crossed.) All animals exhibited as breeders to be kept in the Province one year.

P. S.—Judges may pass over any animal entered in the Sections of Pure Breds, if it is their opinion that they are Crosses or Grades, or they may put the owners on their proof, and name a substitute in case they fail to prove purity of Blood.

GENERAL RULES.

ARTICLE 1.—Exhibitors must observe the Rules specified for each class, and no entries will be made unless such Rules are complied with.

ARTICLE 2.—Successful exhibitors of field crops will be required to furnish a statement of the manner of cultivation, setting forth the condition of the land the year previous, and cultivation the present year, with kind and quantity of manure used, the length of time the crops were maturing, and as near as possible the gross amount per acre harvested, within 30 days after Show ; and no premiums will be paid until complied with.

ARTICLE 3.—Exhibitors must be members of the Society, and the owners of what they exhibit, and if possible the Grain, Roots, Manufactures and Horticultural produce to be entered on the two days previous to the Show. Cattle, &c., may be entered previous to 12 o'clock on Thursday.

ARTICLE 4.—Members drawing prizes to the amount of four dollars must pay one dollar out of their prize money, and 12½ cents extra for each additional dollar which they may draw, as their subscriptions for next year.

ARTICLE 5.—All premiums not demanded within 30 days after the Show will be carried forward as donations or subscriptions for next year.
