# ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY 

OF

## CANADA.

The Third Annual General Meeting of this Society was held on Wednesday, 9th January 1867, in the rooms of the Literary and Historical Society, Masonic Hall, Quebec.

President Brunet in the chair.
The Revd. T. E. Hamel, Professor of Natural Philosophy, Laral University, was elected a member.

The following address was then read to the meeting:

## THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Gentlemen :
The Entomological Society enters this day on its fourth year of existence. I believe it is my duty to exhibit to the members and to the public its progress during the past years, and its present condition.

In proportion to our limited pecuniary means and to the small number of really active ard labourin: members, we may feel prond of what we have done since the beginning of our existence.

We do not pretend to rival older institutions, often aided by pecuniary independence or ly the liberality of our Government; every one knows that our Society is yet in its infancy, and that many of our most active
members can devote but a few leisure moments to the pursuit of ulur fivorite science. Nevertheless we have had during his last year our public Conversazione, and difternt interesting papers have been read at our monthly mectings.

That we do mot labour in vain is testified by the rich and various collections of Lepidoptera and Colenptera exhibited to the pullic at our last conversazione. The two large collections of Canadian insects have lecen narle since the existence of our Suciety. I shall say more: I will add that one of these collections will become of general utility to the country ; for the collection of Mr. Counct, one of the largest collectiens of Canalian Coleoptera, found in Iriti-h America, is preantiy mombered ammgst the Zanlogeal chllections of Laval Lniversity. Thus, gentlemen, in cultivatigg the ammities of scionce, we are, in our hrmble way, doing something for the welfare wf our country.

It is also proper to mention that sur Society has contribnted to the scientific literature of Canada. May papers read by our members have lecen published in the "Candian Naturalist," ascientific periodical the circulation of which is general both in Etrope and America, and which is now a medium of intercoure betwecen the Naturalists of Canalia and forcign comtrics. Some of these papers have been faromed with the honour of reprint in British Reviews. lewiles these, numeroms minor communications, entered in the liecords of the Society, will become precions materials for the Entomological Fauna of Canada.

Our monthly meeting, during the past year, have been generally well attended, excepting, however the time of vacations, that is to say during the three months of July, August, and September.

I shall now, in conclusion, express my regret, that the pressure of other duties has prevented ine from deroting more time to the interests of the Society.

The Secretary then read the following report of the Council.

## REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

Tour Conncil have now the pleasing duty of presenting to the Society their Third Inrmal Report.

Owing to the absence of many of our members from the City last summer, it was diffeult to obtain a quorum, so that but seven regular meetings were held during the year ; these, however, were well attended and interesting. A new feature in our proceedings was the holding of a conversazione on the 15th March last, in the rooms of the Literary and Mistorical Society, which were kindly granted for the occasion. Your Council refers to this reunion with gratification, as it was successful in every respect, giving great pleasure to those that attented, and placing before them the objects of our sturly in their true interest and beauty. Four excellent pripers were read, and some of our collections exhibitel, while twelve powerful microscopes, loaned by greatlemen of this city and members of our Society, stood upon
the table, furnished with numerous natural objects for examination. The titles of the papers read were as follows:-
Address by the President, on The utility of Entomology, practical and scientific.

Or the Architecture of Vespa maculata (Linn.), by the Rev. O. Brunet.

Another on the same subject by Mr. Couper.
The Mistory of Canadian Entomology, by Mr. Couper.

Our list has been increased by the addition of four new members during the year, and it is satisfactory to state that the number of working members has also increased.

With reference to the Parent Society, your Council have great pleasure in stating that both it and the London Branch are actively carrying on their work. It is hoped that soon a small entomological serial will be issued by the Society, to contain the whole of its proceedings,-a project which your Council thinks, would, if carried out, be very beneficial to the interests of our science in Canada.

Your Council would respectitlly recommend the publication in pamphlet form, of this year's report, and a list of our members, together with the By-laws of the Branch. The manuscript of the "Instructions for collecting insects," is now nearly ready, and it remains for the Society to decide as $t_{1}$ its publication. The Branch has now a small balance on hand, which would likely defray the expense of printing both the above mentioned pamphlets.

Your Council would congratulate the members on the continued progress of our Branch, as well as on
the prosperity of the Suciety as a viole, at the some time expresing the hope that the coming year wil be more successful than the thice which have claped since our ormanation, and theat our members will continue treary on with rigour and peraceance the stally of one ot the mest haciating and beantiful departments of a atumal science.

## BY-LAWS.

# EYTOMOLOGICAL SOCLETY OR CAYADA. 

 (9UEBEC BRANCH.)TILE.
I. This suciety shiell be known as the "Quebec Branch of the Entommonicsl Suciety of Canada"; which was formed at Torontr, Canada West, on the 16th April 1st: ; it being in connection with, and under the constitution of that Society.

## ODJECTS.

II. The objects of this Branch shall be:

1st. To cullect and study the insects of the Quebec and Lower St. Lawrence Districts.

2nd. To obtain by exchange, dc., with the Parent society ant others, pecimens from all parts of the Province, so as to form a complete collection of the insects of Canada, to be the pruperty of the Branch. Another collection will also be formed, to be, (by agreement) the property of the Literary and Historiral Society of Quebec, the members of this Branch, however, being at liberty to exchange species for species, nut of the surplas specimens, under the supervision of the Curator of this Society. One pair each of the rarer species, and two pairs each of the commoner, being sufficient for the Cabinet all above
these numbers shal: be ennsidere 1 surplus specimens. These regulations shall apply to both collections.

## MEMBERS.

III. All students of Entomology, or those lesirons of becoming such, shall be cligible fur memberalip. Any person dwiring to lecome a menber, shall signify the same to the Sicretary in writing, at the same time depositing with him the amount of one year's subscription. He shall be duly propose at one general meeting and ballotted for at the next, three four the of the ballot leing necessary to his election.

## SUBECRIPTIONS.

IV. The annual subscriptions shall be two dollars, in advance.

## CONNECTION WITH PARENT SOCIETY.

V. In order to entitle the members of this Branch to all the privileges of membership in the Entomolo gical Suciety of Canadi, one dollar for each menber on the roll at the time of each Annual Meeting must (by agreement,) be paid into the funds of the Parent Society, -the remainder of the funds to be expended in publiwing lists of the species, if necessary, and in tranmiting duplicetes, \&re, \&e.
