# MINUTES OF COUNCIL.

---

## FIRST MEETING.

---

SCARBORO', January 20, 1868.

Pursuant to statute, the following named gentlemen, being the Reeves and Councillors elect for the corporation of Scarboro' for the year 1868, made and subscribed to the declaration of qualification of office according to law :—

The Council proceeded to business.

Petitions presented :—

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from Trustees of School Section No. 7, asking for a loan of \$1500 from the Municipalities Fund, to build a school house in said section, and on what terms the Council will loan said sum.

By Mr. Palmer—Petition from John McKeown, praying the Council to grant him aid.

The Reeve laid before the Council an account from Wm. Ferguson, for keep and maintenance of Robert Carlisle, an indigent person, for ten weeks, at two dollars per week, amounting to twenty dollars.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that Archibald Glendenning, Esq., be appointed Auditor of the Township accounts for the year 1867. Carried.

The Reeve nominated William Dickson, Esq., as the other Auditor.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that Andrew A. Thompson be appointed Inspector of Houses of Public Entertainment for the current year at a salary of ten dollars per annum. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that this Council do now resolve itself into committee of the whole on the petition from the Trustees of School Section No. 7. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson in the Chair.

Committee rose and report by resolution.

Report received and adopted.

*Resolved*, That the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars of the Municipalities Fund now in the hands of the Treasurer be loaned to the Trustees of School Section No. 7, for a term of ten years, for the purpose of building a school house in said section, said sum to be payable in ten yearly instalments of one hundred dollars each year, with interest at six and a-half per cent. per annum, on condition that the Trustees of said section comply with the requirements contained in the 276 section of the 29 and 30 Victoria, chapter 51.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that Mr. Palmer and Mr. Whiteside be appointed a committee to sell the timber on the 4th Concession road, in front of Lots Nos. 7 and 8, and also the timber in rear of the road between Lots Nos. 12 and 13, in the 4th Concession. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the sum of six dollars be granted for the relief of John McKeown, and that the Treasurer pay the same into the hands of James Humphrey, jr., for said purpose. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson introduced a By-law to appoint an Inspector of Houses of Entertainment.

By-law read three several times and passed.

Mr. Whiteside introduced a By-law to appoint Auditors for the current year.

By-law read three several times and passed.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the account of William Ferguson, amounting to twenty dollars for maintenance and keep of Robert Carlisle, an indigent person, be paid by the Treasurer on order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Whiteside, moves that this Council do now adjourn and stand adjourned until the second Monday in February. Carried.

## SECOND MEETING.

---

SCARBORO', February 10, 1868.

Council met at Johnson's Hotel, Woburn.

George Chester, Reeve, in the Chair.

PRESENT—Messrs. McCowan, Stephenson, Whiteside, and Palmer.

Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

The Reeve laid before the Council the Auditor's Report on the Township Accounts for the year 1867; also, the Report of the Inspector of Houses of Public Entertainment for the current year; also, a communication from Wm. Tredway and S. Closson, Trustees of School Section No. 7, requesting their share of the Municipalities Fund to build a school house in said section.

Petitions presented :—

By Mr. Whiteside—Petition from William Dickson and thirty-four others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Mrs. A. Thompson to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 27, Concession B, and known as the "Halfway House."

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from Joseph McArdle and thirty-six others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Joseph Moon to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 1, Concession D, and known as the "Port Union Inn."

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from William Galloway and thirty-two others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to William Keeler to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 7, Concession 1, and known as the "Commercial Inn."

By Mr. Palmer—Petition from Joseph Secor and thirty-six others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Jonathan Baird

to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 19, Concession D, and known as the "Railway Inn."

By Mr. Palmer—Petition from Isaac T. Secor and thirty-five others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Eli Shackleton, to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 10, Con. 1, and known as "Shackleton's Inn."

By Mr. Palmer—Petition from James Palmer and seventeen others, praying the Council to call a public meeting of the freeholders, for the purpose of considering the advisability of confirming F. F. Passmore's survey, and dividing the different blocks in accordance with the titles of the different land owners, irrespective of the limitation Act.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. Whiteside, moves that the township accounts, as received from the Auditors, be adopted, and that they be printed along with the minutes of this Council. Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Stephenson, moved that the sum of four dollars be granted for the relief of Jane Kay, she being unable to work for her livelihood, and that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the above on order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that this Council do now resolve itself into a committee of the whole on the communication from the trustees of School Section No. 7. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson in the chair. Committee rose.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that Daniel Ferguson, Collector of taxes for the township of Scarboro', be and is hereby authorized by this Council to continue the levy and collection of unpaid taxes for said township for the year 1867. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that Daniel Ferguson be appointed assessor for the current year, at a salary of seventy dollars. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the Clerk be and is hereby authorized and required to get printed at as cheap a rate as possible, five hundred copies of the minutes and accounts of this corporation for 1867, and that ninety copies be given to each member of the Council for distribution, and fifty copies to the Clerk. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside introduced a By-law for appointing an Assessor. By-law read three times and passed.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the timber on the sideline between Lots Nos. 12 and 13, be granted to Wm. McCowan, on condition that he opens a passable road along said sideline, and also the timber on the 5th Con. road, in rear of Lot No. 13, the same to be subject to the approval of Mr. Palmer, Councillor. Carried.

Mr. McCowan, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the Reeve, Mr. Stephenson, and the mover are hereby appointed by this Council as a committee with power to sell the timber by public competition on Con. C road allowance, in front of Lots Nos. 20 and 21. Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Whiteside, moves that this Council do now adjourn and stand adjourned until the last Monday in February. Carried.

SCARBORO', February 27th, 1868.

On call of the Reeve the Council met this day at Johnston's Inn.

George Chester, Esq., Reeve, in the chair.

PRESENT—Messrs. McCowan and Stephenson.

Petitions presented :—

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from Wm. Abraham and thirty-three

others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to A. Moffat, to obtain a license to keep an Inn on Lot No. 35, Con. C, known as the "Royal Oak Inn."

By Mr. McCowan—Petition from John Taylor and thirty others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Wm. Johnston, to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 18, Con. 1, and known as the "Woburn House."

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from Lewis Millet and twenty-five others, praying the Council to grant relief to Mrs. Frederick Ellis and family, who are in destitute circumstances.

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from A. H. Telfer and twelve others, praying the Council to grant aid to Chas. Champaigne, who is in destitute circumstances.

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from John Holmes and thirty others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Ingol Burton, to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 29, Con. B, and known as the "Farmers' Inn."

By Mr. McCowan, from John Walton and thirty-one others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Ira Bates, to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 29, Con. C, and known as the "Blue Bell Inn."

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from John Louthier and twenty-nine others, praying the Council to grant a certificate to Jonathan Gates, to obtain a license to keep an inn on Lot No. 19, Con. 2, and known as the "Malvern House."

The Chairman of the select committee appointed to sell the timber on Con. C road, in front of Lots Nos. 20 and 21; also on the sideroad between said Lots in said Concession, brought in their report.

On motion of Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, the report was adopted.

Report reads as follows:

The select committee appointed to sell the timber on Concession C, in front of Lots Nos. 20 and 21, and on sideroad between said Lots, beg leave to offer the following report:—

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the parties who purchased the wood on Concession C, in front of Lots No. 20 and 21, viz: Messrs. Joseph Thompson and Archibald Muir, be allowed an extension of time for the removal of said timber, until such time as this Council requires said road for use. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of five dollars be and is hereby granted for the relief of Mrs. Dorathy, a widow with three children, and that the Treasurer do pay the said sum to the mover for this purpose. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of five dollars be and is hereby granted for the relief of Charles Champaigne, he being in destitute circumstances, and that the Treasurer do pay said sum into the hands of David Dickson for the above purpose. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that it be—  
*Resolved*, That the Reeve and Treasurer is hereby instructed to sign certificates to obtain licenses for the following innkeepers, who have complied with the law in that behalf, viz: Messrs. Eli Shackleton, Ingol Burton, Alexander Moffatt, Jonathan Baird, William Keeler, Jonathan Gates, William Johnston, Ira Bates, Joseph Moon, and Mrs. Thompson. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of ten dollars be and is hereby granted for the relief of Isabella Ellis, a widow with six children, the eldest not eleven years of age, with nothing to subsist on, and that the Treasurer do pay said sum to the mover for the above purpose. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the Clerk of this Council do give public notice that at the next meeting of Council the following Township Officers will be appointed, viz. Poundkeepers, Fenceviewers, and Pathmasters. Carried.

Mr. McCowan, seconded by Mr. Stevenson, moves that this Council do now adjourn and stand adjourned until the last Monday in March. Carried.

## FIFTH MEETING.

---

SCARBORO', March 30, 1868.

Council met this day at Johnson's Inn, Woburn.

The Reeve in the Chair.

PRESENT—Messrs. Stephenson, McCowan, Whiteside, and Palmer.

Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

The Reeve read and laid on the table a communication from the Clerk of the Township of Markham, in reference to a grant of money to procure timber for a bridge at Milne's Mill, on the north township line; also, an account from Messrs. Cameron and McMichael, solicitors, for drawing By-laws, opinions, etc., amounting to sixty-five dollars; also, a communication from the Trustees of School Section No. 7, asking a grant from the Clergy Reserve Fund, to build a school house in said section; also, a report on education from the Rev. W. Belt, M.A., Local Superintendent of Common Schools for Scarboro'.

Petitions presented :—

By Mr. Palmer—Petition from William Tredway and twelve others, praying the Council to grant aid to Mrs. William Clarke.

By Mr. Palmer—Petition from William Patterson and two others, praying for a grant of one hundred and twenty dollars to build a bridge on road between Lots Nos. 24 and 25, in Concession D.

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from Simeon Reesor and twenty-three others, praying the Council for a grant to build a bridge and cut down the hill on the north townline, near Milne's saw mill.

By Mr. Stephenson—Petition from William Clark and nine others, praying for aid to support Jane Kay.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the sum of seven dollars be granted to George Atkinson for repairing a bridge on the sideline between Lots Nos. 6 and 7, in the 4th Concession, and that the Treasurer do pay the said sum on order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the account of Messrs. Cameron & McMichael, for drawing By-laws, opinions on survey and on Municipal Act, etc., amounting to sixty-five dollars, be paid by the Treasurer, said account extending over a period of five years. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of twenty dollars be and is hereby granted to turnpike and improve the 2nd Concession in front of Lots Nos. 7 and 8, and that Messrs. Eli Shackleton, Thomas Elliot and James Humphrey be appointed commissioners to expend the same, said sum to be paid by the Treasurer on order of the mover. Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Stephenson, moves that the sum of five dollars be granted for the relief of Mrs. William Clark, and that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the above sum into the hands of D. G. Stephenson for the said purpose. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of five dollars be granted to repair the bridge on the sideline between Lots Nos. 14 and 15, in Concession D, and that Messrs. John Skelton and Joseph Humphrey be commissioners to expend the same, said sum to be paid by the Treasurer on order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of ten dollars be and is hereby granted to improve the hill on the given road crossing Lots Nos. 3 and 4, in the 4th Concession, adjoining the sideroad, and that Messrs. George Pearce, Henry Peters, and John

Cocksworth be appointed commissioners to expend the above sum, and that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the same on order of the mover. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the sum of three dollars and fifty cents be granted to George Taylor for repairing a bridge between Lots Nos. 26 and 27, Concession C, and that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the same on order of Mr. McCowan. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay John Colegrove, on order of the Reeve, the sum of three dollars for making a coffin and burial of a child belonging to Elizabeth Laughlin, *alias* Auhart, an indigent person. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the Reeve, together with Messrs. McCowan, Palmer, and the mover, be appointed a committee to examine the bridge on the sideline, between Lots Nos. 24 and 25, in Concession D, and report thereon at next meeting of this Council. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the Reeve be and is hereby authorized to employ a competent surveyor to survey the hill on the 3rd Concession, in front of Lot No. 3, and also the sideroad between Lots Nos. 2 and 3, from the front of the 2nd Concession to the south bank of the Rouge, for the purpose of exchanging land to build a road up the hill.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. Whiteside, moves that this Council do now go into committee of the whole on the communication from the Trustees of School Section No. 7. Carried.

Mr. McCowan in the Chair.

Committee rose.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the sum of sixteen dollars be and is hereby granted to William Ferguson for keep and maintenance of one Robert Carlisle for eight weeks, at two dollars per week, and that the Treasurer do pay said sum on order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, on motion, asked leave to bring in a By-law for the appointing of Township Officers. Leave given.

By-law was introduced and read a first and second time.

On motion of Mr. Stephenson the Council went into committee of the whole thereon.

Mr. Whiteside in the Chair.

Committee rose and reported the Bylaw amended, with the blanks filled up.

Report received and adopted.

By-law read the third time and passed.

Mr. Whiteside, on motion, asked leave to bring in a By-law to appoint Assessors, and repeal By-law No. 199. Leave granted.

By-law was introduced, read three times and passed.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that Messrs. Whiteside, Stephenson, Palmer, and the Reeve be appointed a committee to examine the bridge on the townline between Scoboro' and Markham, over the Big Rouge ; and also the hill on the west side of the bridge, and report the result of such examination at next meeting of this Council. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that this Council do now adjourn and stand adjourned until the third Monday in April. Carried.

## SIXTH MEETING.

SCARBORO', April 20th, 1868.

Council met this day at Johnston's Hotel, Woburn.

George Chester, Esq., Reeve, in the chair.

PRESENT—Messrs. McCowan, Palmer, Stephenson and Whiteside.

Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

Petitions presented :—

By Mr. McCowan—From Francis Armstrong and thirteen others, praying the Council to open the sideroad between Lots Nos. 31 and 32, in Concession B.

By Mr. Whiteside—Petition from David Brown and eighteen others, praying the Council for a grant of one hundred dollars, to improve the Markham Road in the 3rd Concession.

By Mr. Stephenson—A requisition from school section No. 7, requesting the Council to levy and collect from the ratable property of said section for school purposes (exclusive of per centage for collecting) the sum of two hundred and sixty dollars. Also, a communication from said trustees in reference to said requisition.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the Clerk of this Council do get printed as soon as possible, one hundred bills, with the names of all the Pathmasters and the number of their beat, in the township of Scarboro', and also the names and Post-office address of all the other township officers. Carried.

Mr. Whiteside, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moves that the sum of one hundred dollars be granted to repair the Markham Road in the 3rd Concession, between Lots Nos. 18 and 19, and that Messrs. David Brown, Donald McLevin and John Weir be appointed commissioners to expend the same; said sum to be payable on order of the Reeve.—Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Whiteside, moves that the Council, having considered the verbal application of Abraham Callender and Robert Callender, deem it consistent with justice to them that they be and are hereby exonerated and discharged from performing any statute labor for the current year, in consequence of having no public road out. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of one hundred dollars be and is hereby granted for the purpose of purchasing planks for bridges and culverts in the different beats of this township, and that the Treasurer do pay the said sum on order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Whiteside, moves that the sum of four dollars be and is hereby granted to George Moffat, for the support of Miranda Chelew, and that the above sum be paid on order of the Reeve. Carried.

The select committee appointed to examine and report on the state of the bridge on the townline, near Mr. Milne's saw mill, brought in a report, which reads as follows:

*To the Corporation of the Township of Scarboro' :*

The select committee appointed by this Council to examine and report on the bridge over the Rouge, and also the hill west of said bridge, near Mr. Milne's saw mill, on the north townline, beg leave to submit their report :

1. Your committee met at the bridge on the seventh day of April, and found it in a dangerous and dilapidated state, so much so that the public are endangered by travelling thereon. Your committee would therefore recommend this Council to grant the sum of two hundred dollars to build a new bridge on the present site of the old one, providing the corporation of Markham grant an equal amount.

2. Your committee also examined the hill, but cannot recommend at present such an expenditure as it would require to cut the hill on the original road allowance ; but would recommend a small grant to improve the hill on the present travelled road, providing the corporation of Markham would expend an equal amount.

Your committee would therefore recommend that the sum of twenty-five dollars be granted to repair the same.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the report of the select committee appointed to examine the bridge over the Big Rouge, on the townline between Markham and Scarboro',

and also the hill on the west side of said bridge, be adopted.—  
Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the sum of twenty-five dollars be and is hereby granted for the purpose of repairing bridge and widening the embankment crossing the stream between Lots Nos. 24 and 25, Concession D, and that Messrs. J. S. Palmer, William Patterson, and the Reeve be commissioners to superintend the expenditure of the same. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the corporation of Scarboro' do loan the Trustees of School Section No. 7 the sum of one hundred dollars, until the amount of their requisition is collected by the Township Collector, at seven per cent. interest, and that the Treasurer do pay the said sum on order of the Reeve to the Treasurer of said School Section. Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Stephenson, moves that the Council do grant the sum of three dollars to Mrs. C. Masterman for the keep and support of Jane Kay, and that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the above sum on order of the Reeve.—  
Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. McCowan, moves that the Clerk do give notice that at the next meeting of this Council the Court of Revision will meet at this place on the 26th day of May, 1868, at the hour of two o'clock P.M. Carried.

Mr. Stephenson, on motion, asked leave to introduce a By-law to amend By-law No. 200.

By-law introduced, read a first, second and third time, and passed.

### ANNUAL SCHOOL REPORT, 1868.

*To the Reeve and Municipal Council of the Township of Scarboro'.*

GENTLEMEN,—

I beg to submit the following report of the state of the schools in Scarboro' for the year 1868 :

## FINANCIAL.

1. The total receipts for educational purposes during 1868 were \$7872.15—an excess of \$2350 over those of 1867. This increase was chiefly owing (but not entirely,) to the amount raised in School Section No. 1, to build a new school house. The total receipts consisted of previous balances, \$1113.22; County Assessment, \$544.81; Government Grant, \$536.95 (both including the Pickering apportionments to Union Section No. 4-11); School Tax, \$4898.64; Rate Bill from non-residents, \$15.77½; Clergy Reserves, &c., \$763.56. And the total expenditure was \$7283.31½, being \$2800 more than that of the previous year. But little more than half of this was expended for teachers' salaries, viz: \$3793.44; and the remaining items of expenditure were: building and school site, \$2906.73; rent and repairs, \$29.17; maps, \$23.15; prizes, \$29.50; miscellaneous expenses, including Collector's fees, \$501.32.

## TEACHERS AND THEIR STANDING.

2. The average salary of male teachers during the year was \$365, ranging from \$300 to \$420; and the average salary of female teachers was \$240, ranging from \$200 to \$260. There were 12 teachers employed during the year, viz: 9 male and 3 female. An extra male teacher was employed for a period of three months in School Section No. 7. Eight male teachers had First Class County Board Certificates; one had a Second Class do. Of the female teachers, two had Second Class Normal School Certificates, and one a County Board Certificate. The religious denominations of the male teachers were: Presbyterian, 6; Methodist, 2; Church of England, 1. Of the female teachers, two were Presbyterians, and one a Baptist.

## SCHOOL POPULATION AND PUPILS.

3. The returns as to population were: general population, 4471; pupils of school age, 1381. I consider this quite under the true figure, being less than the general census returns taken three years ago; and less even than the school returns of the previous year. The consequence of trustees not being at pains to make full and correct returns, is a loss of Government money to the township, the Legislative Grant being apportioned to the different municipalities *according to the school population reported in each*. There were 1286 pupils of school age (from 5 to 16), on the registers of the

various schools, and 58 of other ages—in all, 1344. Of these, 744 were boys, and exactly 600 girls. Those not attending any school were returned at 87. The total average attendance in all the schools was 549 for the first half year, being about 50 to each school; and for the second half year, 478, or between 43 and 44 to each school. 139 of the pupils on the rolls, or about one-tenth of the whole, attended school but a few days—less than 20; 237, or about one-sixth, attended only for about 2 months—from 20 to 50 days; one-fourth of the registered pupils (or 323) attended but from 50 to 100 days; about the same proportion (301) attended from 4 to six months (100 to 150 days); one-sixth, or 234, attended from 150 to 200 days; and only one in twelve (110) attended school for the whole year. There were in the lowest class, or First Book (1st and 2nd parts), 290 pupils; in the Second Book, 255; in the Third, 284; in the Fourth, 251; and in the Fifth, 324. There were 898 learning Arithmetic, 426 in Grammar, 767 in Geography, 201 in History, 819 in Writing, 27 in Book-keeping, 25 in Mensuration, 35 in Algebra, 22 in Geometry, 45 in Natural Philosophy, and 30 in Vocal Music.

#### SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL HOUSES.

4. The schools were all free, sustained in the main part by voluntary taxation. Religion was recognized by their being opened and closed with prayer, and the Bible, or New Testament, was daily read in all. The New Series of National School Books has been mostly adopted in all the schools. Six of the school houses are of brick or stone, and the prospects are that the remaining five frame school houses will be shortly superseded by more commodious and substantial brick structures. In three of the sections, indeed, meetings of the ratepayers have approved of the trustees using the powers legally pertaining to them for the erection of new school houses. The trustees of School Section No. 1 have set a good example during the past year, by the erection of a handsome school house very creditable to their Section. It was opened by a public sciree on Wednesday, December 30th, and will, I doubt not, both conduce to the health and comfort of the pupils, and facilitate the work of instruction. Its cost was nearly \$3000. The total value of all the school houses and sites was \$10,470. The value of the maps, apparatus and school furniture was \$882; making an aggregate of \$11,352 invested for the benefit of education.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

5. The total visits paid to the schools during the year were 360, viz: by the Local Superintendent, 22; by Clergymen, 15; by Municipal Councillors, 12; by Magistrates, 10; by Trustees, 40; and by others, 261. There were in all the schools 110 maps, viz: 10 of the World; 12 of Canada; 45 of the Continents; and 43 other maps. All the schools have blackboards, 6 have globes, 2 have geometrical forms, and 6 have object and tablet lessons. A few schools have regular time tables hung up, but none, I regret to say, have as yet a School Section Library. (There are, however, 12 Sunday School and other Libraries, containing about 2800 volumes.) 22 public examinations were held during the year, and 11 school lectures were delivered. 9 schools had public recitations after the examinations; and in 4 schools prizes were distributed. There are about 12 Sunday Schools in the township, attended by about 450 scholars, and taught by about 60 teachers.

## REMARKS.

I look upon the periodical distribution of prizes as a very useful element in school instruction. They cost but little, while they greatly tend to promote regularity of attendance and diligence in study. I believe that the good order and discipline of schools would be largely promoted by the giving or withholding of marks or certificates of merit, with occasional rewards; and, except in extreme cases, without any actual punishments whatever. I have never seen any ill effects from the judicious distribution of rewards. And certainly love and the hope of reward are nobler motives to present to the minds of children than fear or bodily pain.

With regard to the proposed New School Bill, I trust I may venture to make an objection or two without any fear of being charged with interested motives. I see nothing to be gained by the appointment of County Superintendents, which might not be secured by the continuance of Township Superintendents, provided that the latter were required to pass such an examination (unless holding a University degree,) as should establish their competence. The expense of the proposed change will be at least double that of the old system, and the work will scarcely, I think, be done as well. The compulsory clauses of the new Bill cannot be carried out in the rural sections at all. Other objections occur to me, but this report has already reached a sufficient length.
