MINUTES OF COUNCIL.

FIRST MEETING

*Of the Municipal Council of the Township of Scarboro', held
pursuant to Statute, on the Third Monday in January (21st),
1861, at Mr. W. Johnston's.*

The Clerk produced the Returns of the Elections for the several Wards of the Township, and declared the names of the persons elected Members of the Council for the current year—to wit:

WARD No. 1.....JAMES PALMER, Esq.
WARD No. 2.....DANIEL KNOWLES, Esq.
WARD No. 3.....JOHN CRAWFORD, Esq.
WARD No. 4.....JOHN P. WHEELER, Esq.
WARD No. 5.....EDWIN SNIDER, Esq.

The several member select having subscribed to the declarations of qualification and of office, the following motion was put and carried:

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that John P. Wheeler, Esq., be elected Town Reeve for the year 1861. Carried.

Mr. Wheeler being duly elected Town Reeve for the current year, and having subscribed to the declaration of office as such, addressed the Council.

The Clerk then vacated the chair and the Reeve took the same.

Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved that John Crawford, Esq., be elected Deputy Reeve for the current year. Carried.

Mr. Crawford being declared duly elected Deputy Reeve for the year 1861, and having subscribed to the declaration of office as such, the Council organized and proceeded to the business of the day.

On the question for the appointment of Auditors being put, it was moved by Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, that Christopher Thomson be and is hereby appointed one of the Auditors to audit the accounts of this Municipality for the past year.—Carried.

Pursuant to Statute, the Reeve appointed James A. Thomson as one of the Auditors, to audit the accounts for the year 1860.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that Daniel Ferguson be appointed Assessor and Collector for the current year, at a salary of sixty dollars for each office. Carried.

BY-LAW No. 130.

*For the appointment of Auditors, Assessor, Collector, and
License Inspector.*

Be it enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Township of Scarboro', and it is hereby enacted, that Christopher Thomson and James A. Thomson be and they are hereby appointed Auditors for the current year, at a salary of four dollars per annum each.

Be it further enacted, that Daniel Ferguson be and he is hereby appointed Assessor and Collector for the current year, at a salary of sixty dollars for each office.

And be it further enacted, that John Malcolm be and he is hereby appointed License Inspector for the current year, at a salary of fifteen dollars per annum.

Joseph McArdle laid before the Council an account, claiming four dollars for the use of a building and firewood, for holding the municipal election.

Mr. Snider moved, seconded by Mr. Knowles, that the account of Joseph McArdle, for the use of his shop, be paid, and that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the amount of four dollars.—Carried.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved that the License Inspector be and he is hereby required to notify the different tavern-keepers (intending to take out a tavern license for the year 1861) of the Act passed last Session, requiring application to be made to the Council by petition, signed by at least thirty electors, and that the words "Licensed to Sell," &c. be put over the door, and that the Clerk do hand a copy of this resolution to the License Inspector.—Carried.

BY-LAW No. 131.

To authorize the Township Treasurer to pay to the several School Sections of the Township of Scarboro' all interest accruing, or that may accrue, from the Clergy Reserve Municipalities' Fund, an equal proportion to each School Section annually, or semi-annually, to the order of the Trustees or a majority of them.

Be it enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Township of Scarboro', that, from and after the passing of this By-Law, it shall be lawful for the Township Treasurer to pay to the order of the Trustees of the several School Sections of the Township of Scarboro', or a majority of them, all the interest accruing, or that may accrue, from the Clergy Reserve Municipalities' Fund, coming into his hands by virtue of his office, to be annually or semi-annually divided in equal proportions to each School Section, (exclusive of Union School Sections), and to Union School Sections one-half share; such moneys to form part of the general funds of the several School Sections, as herein before mentioned.

Be it further enacted, that all By-Laws heretofore passed by this Council, inconsistent with this By-Law, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Minutes of preceding meeting read and confirmed.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from the Crown Land's Department, Quebec; referred to and laid on the table.

Presented by the Reeve, petition of John Thom, Esq., praying to have a certain road allowance conveyed to him, in lieu of the Kingston Road.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that this Council does not feel justified in granting the prayer of the petition of John Thom, Esq., as they consider he has no lawful claim to the road referred to in his petition, as this Council receives no benefit from the Kingston Road, and it being there when he purchased said lands; and that the Clerk forward a copy of this resolution to his Attorney. Carried.

BY-LAW No. 132.

To Amend By-Law No. 110.

Be it enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Township of Scarboro', that the first clause of By-Law No. 110, be amended by striking out the word "three" after the word "bids," and inserting the word "four" instead thereof.

Be it further enacted, that the seventh section be amended by striking out the word "that" after "enacted" and inserting the following clause, "That every application for a license shall be accompanied by a petition praying for the same, signed by at least thirty of the resident Municipal Electors of the Municipality, and."

Presented by the Reeve, communication from Mr. Norris, claiming
a certain sum of money.

Claim deferred until next meeting of Council.

The Clerk laid before the Council a claim for extra services in
the years 1859 and 1860, for which claim the following motion was
adopted :

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that the Clerk and
Treasurer be paid the sum of thirty-eight dollars for extra services
in the years 1859 and '60, and for issuing Tavern Licenses in the
years 1859, 1860, and 1861. Carried.

Verbal application from Mrs. Jones, asking for relief in her pre-
sent circumstances.

Mr. Snider moved, seconded by Mr. Knowles, that the sum of
ten dollars be granted to Mrs. Jones, for the relief of her husband,
and that the Reeve do grant an order for the same. Carried.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Knowles, moved, that the following
petition to the Provincial Legislature, praying for an Act to estab-
lish and confirm the side roads in this Township, be adopted, and
that the Reeve be requested to forward a copy of the same to the
several branches of the Legislature. Carried.

*Petition of the inhabitants of the Township of Scarboro', in the County
of York,*

HUMBLY SHEWETH,

That in the said Township of Scarboro' the greater number of
the side-road allowances between lots have been opened up and

travelled, and statute labor and public moneys expended thereon for many years back.

That it has been discovered, upon recent and more correct surveys being made, that few, if any, of the said side-roads are upon the true original allowance.

That to alter the said lines of road now, and place the same upon the proper allowance, would present serious objections, both in consequence of the actual loss of labor and money expended upon the same, and also in consequence of the peculiar difficulties and uncertainties attendant upon the litigation of the question of highways and road allowances.

That it is most desirable, therefore, that the side-roads, where opened up and improved as aforesaid, should be confirmed and established for all future time upon the present lines.

Wherefore your petitioners humbly pray, that your Honorable House will pass a law during the ensuing session with that object, and that the said law (excepting that the same shall apply to the said Township of Scarboro', and excepting also, that the expense of the survey, and maps, and reports thereof, shall be met by imposing a tax on the real property in the said Township, instead of by a rate upon the inhabitants), may be similar in all its provisions to the Act passed during the last session, intituled "An Act to confirm certain side-roads in the Township of Vaughan, and to provide for the defining of other road allowances and lines in the said Township,"

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Knowles, moved, that the Treasurer be authorized to pay, on the order of the Reeve, the sum of two dollars seventy-five cents, for engrossing copies of petitions and bill to the Legislature, for establishing the side lines in this Township. Carried.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that the sum of fourteen dollars ninety cents be paid to Daniel Ferguson for collecting non-resident taxes for the years 1859 and 1860, on the order of the Reeve. Carried.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Knowles, moved, that the sum of three dollars be paid to Mark Hutchinson, for taking a man to the

hospital in Toronto, and that the Reeve grant an order for the same. Carried.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Knowles, moved that the Township Accounts, as received from the Auditors, be adopted, and that 250 copies be published with the minutes, and fifty copies in sheet form. Carried.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that this Council do now adjourn, to meet again on the last Monday in April, and that the Court of Revision and Appeal do meet on that day, and that the Clerk do give notice of the same. Carried.

MONDAY, APRIL 29, 1861.

Minutes of preceding meeting read and confirmed.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from the Provincial Secretary, acknowledging the receipt of the petition from the Corporation of the Township of Scarboro', and that the subject will receive His Excellency's attention.

Presented by Mr. Knowles, petition of Andrew McCreight and others, praying for aid to improve side-road between lots 4 and 5, in the 5th concession.

Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that the prayer of the petition of Andrew McCreight, and others, for aid to open a road in the 5th concession, between lots Nos. 4 and 5, be granted, and that the sum of twenty dollars be granted for that purpose, to be paid by the order of the Reeve, and that Noah Reesor and Henry Peters be commissioners to expend the same. Carried.

Presented by Mr. Knowles, petition of George Kilpatrick and others, praying to have refunded, at least, a portion of his outlay for erecting a bridge over a gully leading to the Rouge flats.

Petition deferred until next meeting of Council.

Presented by Mr. Snider, petition of John Walton and others, requesting to have a certain road allowance conveyed to him, in lieu of a road which he has granted for the public benefit.

Said petition deferred until further consideration.

The claim of Mr. Norris, for a certain sum of money, was laid before the Council, and after a short discussion on the matter, the following motion was adopted :

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that Wm. H. Norris' claim of seventeen dollars and fifty cents be paid on the order of the Reeve, said sum having been expended by him for the improvement of the roads in Ward No. 3, in the year 1858, being his claim in full up to January 1st, 1861. Carried.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that this Council resolve itself into a Court of Revision and Appeal forthwith. Carried.

Said Court being composed of the following members, viz :—Mr. Wheler, *Reeve*, Mr. Crawford, *Deputy Reeve*, Mr. Snider, Mr. Palmer, and Mr. Knowles.

Mr. Crawford being called to the chair, the Assessment Roll was produced and examined, and

On motion of Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Snider, that the conjunction *and* be inserted in the Assessor's Roll, connecting the names of the occupants and owners of land as assessed therein, and that the roll be amended accordingly, and that the Township Clerk be authorized and required to number them respectively. Carried.

Mr. Wheler, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that the Assessment Roll as amended, be adopted. Carried.

The Court of Revision and Appeal then closed.

*Of the Municipal Council of the Township of Scarboro', held
pursuant to adjournment.*

MONDAY, MAY 27, 1861.

MEMBERS PRESENT—John P. Wheeler, Esq., *Town Reeve*, John Crawford, Esq., *Deputy Reeve*, Edwin Snider, Esq., James Palmer, Esq., Daniel Knowles, Esq.

Minutes of preceding meeting read and confirmed.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from the Clerk of the Township of York, as follows :

To the Reeve of the Municipality of the Township of Scarboro',

SIR,—I am directed by the Council of the Municipality of York Township, to forward you a copy of the following resolution :

Moved by Mr. Morse, seconded by Mr. Maginn, and Resolved—
That the sum of forty dollars be appropriated out of the general funds

of the Municipality, for the purpose of repairing the town-line between York and Scarboro', with a proviso, that an equal sum be granted for such purpose by the Township Council of Scarboro', and that Mark Barker be appointed commissioner to expend the same on behalf of this Council, and that the Clerk be requested to notify the Reeve of Scarboro' of such resolution.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that the sum of forty dollars be granted for repairing the town-line between York and Scarboro', York Township having granted the same amount, and that James McCowan and John Walton be commissioners to expend the same, to be paid on the order of the Reeve. Carried.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from Mr. Wright, M.P., respecting the Act to confirm the side-lines in this Township.

Presented by Mr. Palmer, petition of Wm. Bell and others, praying for money to repair road on concession C., between the Kingston and Danforth Roads.

Petition read and laid on the table.

Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that six dollars be granted to George Kilpatrick for building a bridge on a road given in lieu of the townline, and that the Reeve grant an order for the same. Carried.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that the sum of fifty dollars be granted to repair the roads, and for plank for bridges in each Ward, said sum to be expended by order of the Councillor for the Ward. Carried.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that the Clerk is hereby authorized to advertize in the *Daily Globe* and *Daily Leader* that sealed tenders will be received by him until the last Monday of June, (after which no tenders will be received), for the surveying of the side-lines, and for the planting of cut stone monuments (the monuments to be, at least, three feet six inches long, and six inches square on the top), in accordance with the Act passed last session of Parliament—the Council to meet at Wm. Johnston's Inn, on the last Monday in June, at 12 o'clock, noon, to open the tenders and let the contract, and that the Council will not bind themselves to accept of the lowest tender unless otherwise satisfactory. Carried.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that the sum of fifty dollars be granted to build a bridge on the north town-line, over the Willcot Creek, (provided that the Municipality of Markham grant eighty dollars,) said sum to be drawn on order of the Councilman of Ward No. 3, and that Nathaniel Battrick and Wm. Minutes of preceding meeting read and confirmed.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from Rev. Mr. Belt, stating that the boundary of Union School Section has been altered by annexing lot 32, in the 2nd range of the broken front of Pickering to the said Union Section, and that this change goes into effect from and after the 25th day of December, inst., according to the 40th Section of the Upper Canada Consolidated Common School Act.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from Rev. Mr. Belt, requesting that the Council will be good enough to allow the sum of twenty-three dollars, repaid to the Township from the Education



Office, to be added to the County Assessments, and apportioned among the Schools.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Helliwell, moved, that the Superintendent is hereby authorized to apportion, for School purposes, the sum of (\$23) twenty-three dollars, referred in his communication to the Council. Carried.

Presented by the Reeve, communication from Skeffington Connor & Co., stating the amount of his account against this Municipality.

Mr. Helliwell, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that the Reeve do settle Connor & Boomer's bill. Carried.

Presented by Mr. Helliwell, petition of John Wilson, praying for aid to repair road in front of lot No. 11, in the 2nd concession.

Petition read and laid on the table.

Presented by Mr. Helliwell, petition of S. Closson and T. Elliot, referring to the support of Wm. Clark.

Mr. Helliwell, seconded by Mr. Crawford, moved, that the Treasurer do pay to Jordan Post, the sum of one dollar every Monday morning, for the maintenance of Wm. Clark, so long as he continues to reside with him, until further orders of Council, and that the former resolution regarding Wm. Clark be rescinded.—Carried.

Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to transfer Wm. Marr's tavern license to Samuel Mighton for the remainder of the year, that is to say, until the last day of February, 1862. Carried.

A verbal requisition of the Trustees of School Section No. 6, asking for a loan of \$200 for the purpose of purchasing a School Site in said Section.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Snider, moved, that the Reeve do purchase a Debenture, with the moneys arising from the Clergy Reserve Fund, issued by the Trustees of School Section No. 6, of two hundred dollars, bearing interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum, payable annually out of moneys raised for School purposes. Carried.

Presented by Mr. Palmer, petition of R. E. Playter, asking to purchase gravel for the repair of the Don and Danforth Road.

Mr. Crawford moved, seconded by Mr. Palmer, that the petition of R. E. Playter be not granted, on account of the unsettled state of the roads in that part of the Township. Carried.

Mr. Snider, seconded by Mr. Helliwell, moved, that the Township Clerk be paid the sum of thirteen dollars twelve cents, for stationery furnished and postage to the Municipality. Carried.

Presented by the Reeve, circulars of Agricultural Queries from the Minister of Agriculture.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Helliwell, moved, that the Clerk do and he is hereby authorized to get printed, (at as cheap a rate as possible) three hundred copies of the Minutes and Accounts of this Corporation for 1861, and that sixty copies be given to each Councillor. Carried.

Mr. Crawford, seconded by Mr. Palmer, moved, that the sum of thirty-four dollars be paid to Andrew Bartram, for the keep, attendance, and funeral expenses of James Black, a pauper, who died at his place, said amount to be paid on order of the Reeve.—Carried.

Mr. Crawford moved, seconded by Mr. Helliwell, that this Council do now adjourn *sine die*.

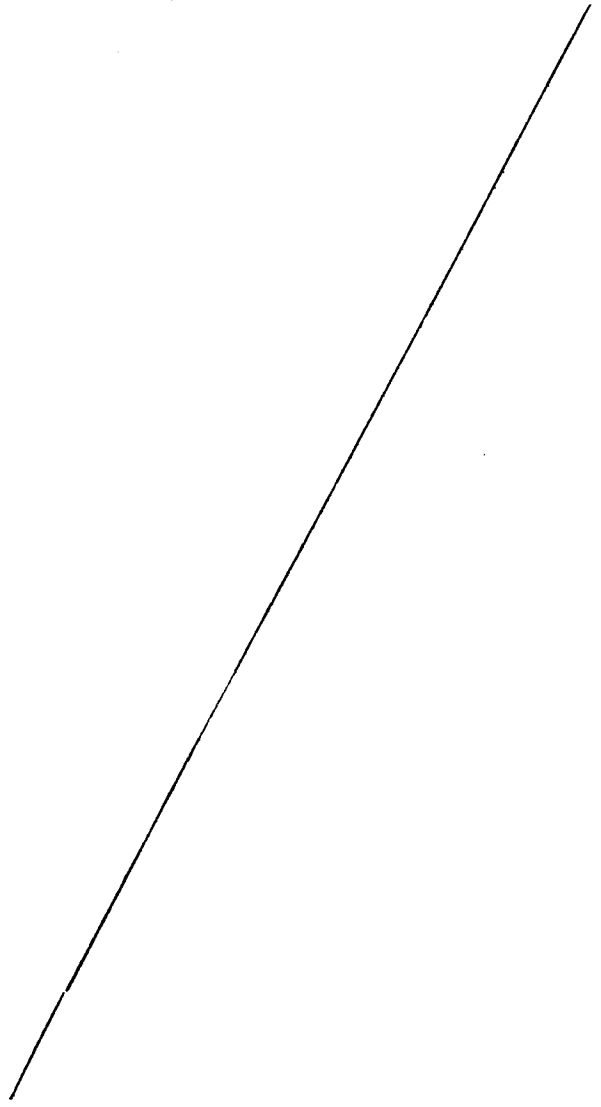
