* The different divisions of the population, with respect to age and sex, are so given in the above statement, that it is not possible to bring them into agreement with the number which purports to be the aggregate of the population of the province.

A Committee of the House of Assembly of Lower Canada, to whom it was referred to examine the accuracy of the returns under the Act of 1825, reported to the House that “ the state of the population, as set forth by the returns, was much below its true amount ; ” a fact which the Committee refers to the wilful misrepresentations of parties who understated the numbers of which their families consisted, and who appear to have been actuated in this matter by their doubts as to the views of the Legislature in instituting the census.

PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

THE number of free schools established in the different parishes throughout the province of Lower Canada, according to Returns made in 1832, was 78. The number of children instructed therein was 3,578, and the expense of the whole to the Provincial Government is stated to have been 2,105*l.* 14*s.* 4*d.* colonial currency.

The mode of instruction followed in each school is left greatly to the choice or discretion of the teacher, not any particular system being enjoined by the Board of the Royal Institution.

Every teacher to whom the management of a school is intrusted, is bound to receive one-third of the number of his scholars free of charge, and to instruct them in reading, writing, and arithmetic. No master of any of these schools is, in any case, allowed to charge more to a scholar than 3*s.* 4*d.* per month: and a power is given to the visitors to vary the rate to be charged, according to the number of children in each family who attend the school, or according to the circumstances of the parents.

The 78 schools above mentioned are under the management of the Royal Institution, a Board incorporated for the advancement of learning by the Provincial Act, 41 Geo. III. c. 17, of which institution the Lord Bishop is the principal. To this Board the Legislature makes an annual grant.

In addition to the schools included in the Return, two grammar-schools, one at Quebec and another at Montreal, are supported by an annual allowance of 200*l.* a-year each, from the revenues of the estates of the late order of Jesuits; and a further allowance of 90*l.* and 50*l.*, respectively, in lieu of school-houses: these schools are also under the superintendence of the Royal Institution. The system of instruction followed in them is that of the public grammar-schools in England. Twenty free scholars are admitted into each of them, and the rate of tuition for other scholars is 12*l.* per annum.

There are also upwards of 1,000 schools established throughout the province under the Provincial Act, 9 Geo. IV., attended, as it would appear by the Returns, by 45,558 scholars of both sexes: 20*l.* currency is granted by the Act to each teacher whose school may be attended by at least 20 scholars. The schools are under the direction of trustees, who are annually elected by the inhabitants of each township or parish in which the schools are situate. Schools established prior to the passing of the Act, are not required to be placed under trustees. The signature of the proprietor to the correctness of the Return, is sufficient to enable the teacher to draw the allowance. No particular system of instruction is followed, but the Lancasterian has been introduced into a few of them.

Several colleges in connexion with the Roman Catholic Church exist in different parts of the province, as well as a considerable number of private seminaries, in which the higher branches of education are taught.

All the different denominations of the above coins pass current: 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. is allowed for every grain under or over weight on English, Portuguese, or American gold; and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. on Spanish and French. Payments in gold above £20 may be made in bulk; English, Portuguese, and American, at 89s. per oz.; French and Spanish at 87s. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ d., deducting half a grain for each piece.

AMOUNT OF COIN in CIRCULATION.

There is no possible way of ascertaining what amount of coin there is in circulation, for there is a free ingress and egress of coin, to and from the province, to and from the United States of America, and to and from the British Colonies, and elsewhere.

COINS.

The specie in circulation consists of British gold and silver coins, Spanish gold and silver coins, gold coins of Portugal, gold coins of France, and French silver coins (crowns) of the reigns of Louis XV. and XVI. There is no copper coinage, but a great quantity of copper tokens are in circulation, of an inferior value to the British half-penny, which they represent; they are brought to the province by speculators, and by persons in trade.

COINS.

The only gold coins current in the province are the doubloon and its parts. The value of the doubloon is £3 7s. 2d. sterling, at which rate it is received at the Custom-House, but it passes at the Treasury Excise Office currently throughout the province at £3 12s. sterling, equal to £4 currency—16 dollars.
The silver current coins are the dollar and its parts; 4 dollars make £1 currency, and 16 dollars a doubloon.
The English shilling passes for 1s. 3d. currency, 4s. making a dollar.
The English half-crown and crown bear a proportional value.

COURSE OF EXCHANGE.

The course of exchange has fluctuated during the year from 14 to 15 per cent. on British bills, and from 5 to 7 per cent. on those of the United States.

ACCOUNTS.

At the Custom-House and Military Offices accounts are kept in sterling money, but at the Provincial Treasury, Public Offices, &c., throughout the province, they are kept in currency.
To reduce currency into sterling, deduct one-tenth. £100 currency equal to £90 sterling.
To reduce sterling into currency, add one-ninth. £90 sterling equal to £100 currency.

WEIGHTS and MEASURES.

The weights and measures in use in Nova Scotia are similar to those used in England.

COURSE of EXCHANGE.

What is termed Halifax Currency, and which generally prevails in British North America, with the exception of Newfoundland.
Currency being an advance of 11½ per cent. on sterling, by adding one-ninth to sterling the sum is brought into currency, and from currency to sterling by subtracting one-tenth.
Halifax Currency is formed upon the basis of estimating the dollar at 4s. 6d., which thus becomes 5s. currency.

The above paper currency has been issued at various times on the security of funded property, the present value of which, according to the last price quoted, is about £122,000 ; this, at the present high rate of exchange, say guilders 17, would produce guilders 2,074,000.

During the years 1830 and 1831, funded property was sold out to the amount of £33,500, principally for the purpose of paying for the new public buildings ; and in the last combined court it was resolved, that the sum of £5,000 should be invested, annually, until a sufficient sum is restored, as a security for the paper money.

The paper is calculated at the exchange of guilders 14.

COURSE of EXCHANGE.

The rate of exchange in all government or public transactions, is fixed, by an order in council, at 4s. 4d. sterling, for the Spanish dollar of three guilders, which is equal to thirteen guilders and eleven-thirteenths of a guilder to the £ sterling. This exchange does not vary.

The rate of exchange in private and mercantile transactions fluctuates from 13 to 14½ guilders, and upwards, per £ sterling, according to the demand for, or scarcity of, bills on Great Britain ; it is now (31st December, 1832,) at 17 guilders to the £ sterling.

The exchange between this colony and Holland has, for several years, been stationary at 115 guilders, colonial money, for 100 guilders Dutch.

This colony has no rate of exchange in any other foreign country.

The rate with Great Britain in the first quarter of the year was fl. 15 10 to fl. 16; the second quarter, fl. 16 to fl. 16 10; the third, fl. 16 10 to fl. 16 15; and in the last quarter, fl. 16 10 to fl. 17—to the pound sterling.

The rate with Holland, the only foreign country with which this country has any intercourse, in the way of drawing and remitting bills of exchange, was from 20 to 33½ per cent. agio the whole year.

With the exception of doubloons, there may be said to be none, excepting what may be brought into circulation for the payment of the troops. It has been equally difficult to ascertain what quantity of cut money was originally put in circulation under the ordinance of 1813; it may be calculated, however, to have amounted to 50,000 dollars, of which a portion is supposed to have been taken away from the colony as bullion. As, however, it is of the cut money that the peculium of the slaves principally consists, there may be a much greater quantity of it hoarded than the Government have any idea of.

There is an inconsiderable whale fishery carried on in Bermuda, that employs about twelve whale boats, and their crews, three months in the year; the number of whales taken seldom exceeds 20 in the season, yielding about 1,000 gallons of oil. This fishery, being carried on very near the land, is capable of very considerable extension, at small risk, by the employment of additional capital. The reefs that surround the islands abound in fish of great variety, and the inhabitants being in general exceedingly well supplied with it at all seasons, it constitutes a considerable portion of their food; there is not, however, any fish cured for exportation.

COINS.

British Silver is now the principal silver circulating medium in Bermuda. The inconveniences experienced by the public during the last three or four years, arising from the unsettled relative value of the Spanish dollar, with reference as well to British silver as Spanish gold, added to the embarrassment caused by keeping up the now useless distinction of a colonial currency, while the Commissariat issues are confined to British silver, and in sterling money, have caused the public to unite, by general consent, in receiving British silver, at the rate of 4s. to the dollar, in place of 4s. 5½d., which is the nominal par of sterling for currency, or even 4s. 4d., which is its intrinsic value. The Spanish dollar has consequently disappeared from general circulation, except when required for payment of customs' duties, when it is received by the officers of that department at the rate of 4s. 4d. sterling per dollar. The doubloon and its fractional parts are almost the only Gold circulating medium in this colony; a doubloon, weighing 7 dwts. 8 grs. and upwards, passes for 16 dollars, or (according to the present current value of the Silver circulating medium) 64s. sterling. Other foreign Gold coins, of which there is but an inconsiderable quantity in circulation, pass at the rate of 3d. currency, or 2d. sterling, per grain.

AMOUNT OF COIN IN CIRCULATION.

There not being any Customs' regulation whereby the import or export of Coin can be ascertained, and as remittances are frequently made by private individuals in specie, over which there does not exist any check or control, it is impossible to afford a satisfactory answer under this head.

AMOUNT OF PAPER CURRENCY IN CIRCULATION.

COURSE OF EXCHANGE.

On bills drawn by the Commissary upon the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, a premium of 1½ per cent. ; thus a bill upon their Lordships for £100 sterling is purchased for £101 10s. in British Silver. In consequence of the recent arrangement referred to in the subsequent column, the dollar, or one-third of the pound currency, is made equivalent to four British shillings in place of 4s. 5½d., which was the old par of exchange; private bills pass at par on the new rate; that is, a bill on London, at thirty days' sight, for £100 sterling, is purchased with 2,000 British shillings, or with doubloons, full weight, at the rate of £3 4s. sterling per doubloon.

All colonial accounts are kept in currency, the par of which is an advance of 50 per cent. upon sterling; thus £100 sterling is equal to £150 currency. All private money transactions in the colony are kept in currency. The duties of Customs under the British Acts are kept in sterling, and are paid by the public in dollars at the rate of 4s. 4d sterling, or in doubloons at 15½ dollars each. All colonial accounts of receipt and expenditure are kept in currency, payments made by the public being in dollars at the rate of 6s. 8d. currency, or 4s. 5½d sterling, or in doubloons, at the rate of 16 dollars each, if of 17 dwts. 8 grs. weight; otherwise at the rate of 3d. currency; or 2d. sterling, per grain, and re-issued by the Treasurer at the same rate.

COINS.

On the 25th November, 1825, his Excellency the Governor in Council promulgated his Majesty's Order in Council, establishing an uniformity of currency in all his Majesty's colonial possessions, similar to that of the United Kingdom; as also a letter from the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury in furtherance of that object, and directing, in pursuance of the said Order in Council—"That from the 1st January, 1826, all the public accounts to be kept in sterling money;" declaring also "four shillings" British silver and copper to be the legal payment of one current dollar of the colonial money of the accounts of Mauritius, and further establishing the rate in British money at which the coins current in Mauritius are to circulate in the public offices of Government.

The value of the token was not altered by the Ordinance of Council of the 25th November, 1825; but by an Order of his Excellency the Governor, No. 74, dated 4th August, 1831, it was reduced to 8*s.* sterling; that of the marquee was augmented $\frac{1}{16}$ of a centime of the current dollar of 4*s.* sterling by it; and that of the copper piece $\frac{1}{32}$ of a centime of the same dollar.

Until the publication of the Ordinance of the 25th November, 1825, two sicca rupees formed the current dollar of the colony, and from the date of the Government Order of the 10th December, 1824, this current dollar was considered of the value of 4*s.* sterling.

The Treasury notes thus issued are of the following tenour :—

The Governor of Mauritius and Dependencies promises to pay to the Bearer, on demand, the sum of — Pounds, sterling, in Specie, at the rates established by Law.

The paper currency during the year 1832 was at par with specie, for which it was exchanged on demand. Of the amount prepared as above stated, £105 was in the Treasury, and the remaining £39,895 in the hands of the public on 31st December, 1832.

In the month of January there was established a banking company, by charter, comprising 1,000 shares of £100 per share. Their issues amounted, on the 31st December, 1832, to £99,588 sterling, in notes of £2, £3, £4, and £20 sterling.—Their transactions were generally in discounting mercantile bills at £9 per cent.

ACCOUNTS.

The Government accounts since January, 1826, are kept in sterling money. Merchants and shopkeepers keep their accounts in dollars and centimes.—Note :—

- 2 sous make one centime.
- 20 ditto, or 10 centimes, one livre or franc colonial.
- 200 ditto, or 100 centimes, ten livres or one dollar.

The sous, centimes, livres, and francs are moneys of account.

COURSE OF EXCHANGE.

During the year 1832 paper and specie were at par, but British money bore a premium of 3 to 4 per cent. above the other coins, in consequence of the demand for bills on England. No bills drawn on England during the year 1832 by the Civil Government. Bills drawn on the Madras Government to the amount of M. R. 6,782 at par. The Commissariat drew bills for British sterling money at the rate of £101 10s. for every £100 bill.

MEASURES.

The French foot, which is the measure in this island, is to the English in the proportion of 100 to 93·89, or in common practice as 16 to 15.

- 5 ditto „ one fathom.

The aune is 44 inches, and it is to the English yard as 9 to 7. Every kind of cloth is measured and sold in the island by the aune, or ell.

The velt is equal to one gallon seven pints $\frac{1}{4}$ English, but it is always taken as two gallons in commercial transactions.

It is by the velt that every liquid is measured here.

The difference between the quantity of black oil in this return, compared with that in the list of imports, is accounted for by importations of that article from Van Diemen's Land. The same remark applies equally to the variation in the number of seal skins.

COINS.

The Coins in circulation are the coins of Great Britain, which are current at their sterling value, and Spanish dollars, which are current at 4s., half dollars at 2s., and quarter dollars at 1s. sterling.

The Paper Currency in circulation consists of notes of the banks of New South Wales, and of Australia and the Waterloo Company.

The two first of these establishments are joint stock companies, the shares in which are transferable; the last is a trading firm of individual merchants.

The notes are all of sterling denomination, and are convertible into British money on demand.

The great portion of the circulation in this colony is carried on by drafts or cheques on one of the two banks, the mass of pecuniary transactions centreing in Sydney, and almost every individual of property having an account with one or other of the banks, in which, for security, a large proportion of their cash is lodged.

COURSE OF EXCHANGE.

By a notice issued by the Deputy Commissary General, dated 8th May, 1828, it was regulated, in pursuance of instruction from the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, that from the 24th of the same month, bills on that Board would be granted by the Deputy Commissary General, at the rate of £100 for every £101 10s. paid into the military chest.

The exchange of bills on his Majesty's Treasury continues to be regulated by this notice.

Bills of private individuals, of undoubted credit, are generally negociated at par; if otherwise, at a discount varying from one to five per cent.

Few, if any, bills of exchange are negociated on foreign countries; and no rate of exchange on such bills can, therefore, be quoted.

The rate of interest allowed by the courts of law is eight per cent. The banks, in discounting bills, charge discount at the rate of ten per cent. Private individuals lending money exact interest at the rate of eight, ten, fifteen, twenty, and thirty per cent.

NOTE.—By an Act of the Governor and Council, passed 9th March, 1832, No. 13, (2 Will. IV.) a savings' bank is established, which is allowed by the said law to give interest for moneys deposited therein, at the rate of five per cent. per annum; and to exact, for moneys borrowed from the same, interest at rate not less than eight per cent. per annum. Ten per cent. per annum is usually obtained.

COURSE OF EXCHANGE.

The Committee of Merchants declare a rate of exchange with England twice a week, founded on the actual transactions during the intervening days.

The Commissary, in pursuance of his instructions from the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, grants bills on their Lordships at the rate of £100 in exchange for every £101 10s. tendered to him in British silver money. He has not for some time advertised for any supplies in other than British specie; should he have occasion so to do, he must come in competition with the merchants.

The average rate of the commercial exchange during the last year has been 50*d.* per dollar at exchange of 4*s.* 2*d.*

AMOUNT OF PAPER CURRENCY IN CIRCULATION.

The only paper currency in circulation consists of the notes of two separate banks (established *en Comandite*), not amounting to £20,000 sterling. They are not received by the Government departments, and are issued more for the convenience of the commercial body than with a view of profit.

These banks are considered very solid, and are conducted in a safe and regular manner.

The introduction of British money into these possessions has not hitherto produced among the commercial body of inhabitants generally any alteration of the mode of keeping their accounts, and of making sales, contracts, &c., which are continued as formerly in Maltese currency, namely, scudi, tari, and grains.

At Corfu there is a public university, also an ecclesiastical seminary, for the education of young men intended for the priesthood of the Greek orthodox dominant church, and in each of the islands of the States is a school, entitled "secondary," maintained at the public expense, in which secondary schools the scholars are instructed in the Greek and Latin classics, in the modern Greek, English and Italian languages, in arithmetic, and the elementary mathematics. In the chief town of each island is a central school, likewise at the Government expense, on the mutual instruction plan, for teaching reading, writing, and arithmetic; and in these schools the village schoolmasters are trained in the method of mutual instruction. Besides these schools entirely at the public expense there are in each island district schools on the same plan as the central schools, where similar instruction is given, the expense being defrayed by the parents of the children. The terms per scholar vary greatly, according to the particular agreements stipulated between the masters and parents, and are frequently paid in kind. Government also contributes to the establishment of these schools by furnishing books, slates, benches, &c., and where no suitable church exists, by providing a school house. The district and village schools are under the immediate superintendence of the head master of the central school in each island, and there is an inspector-general of all these schools. The whole of the establishment for education is under the general direction of the commission for public instruction.

The only coinage of the States is a copper currency to the amount of £10,000 sterling, in farthings.

The general circulating medium is Spanish dollars, in which description of coin, mostly, the States receive for staple produce exported to the amount of about £275,000 sterling annually, exclusive of returns from a considerable capital employed by shipowners in the Levant trade, remittances received for subsistence of the troops, &c.; and in the same specie (Spanish dollars) pay for the article of bread corn alone, imported into the States from the Black Sea and Italy, to the amount of about £170,000 sterling per annum; the quantity of bread corn grown in the island being equal only to one-fourth of the consumption.

Since June, 1825, British silver currency to the amount of £70,000 sterling has been received from England and thrown into circulation; but, judging from the receipts for public duties and rents, and recent state of balances in the respective Treasuries, including the Military Chest, it would appear that the total amount of British silver now remaining in the States does not exceed £25,000 sterling, and that there has been withdrawn from circulation of this description of money £45,000 for remittances to Malta, &c., by regiments returning to England, and for payment of articles imported by British trading vessels.
