The Regimental Divisions of L'Assomption and Montcalm, Argenteuil and Two Mountains, Arthabaska and Drummond, Beauharnois and Laprairie, Brome and Stanstead, Bellechasse and Dorchester, Bonaventure and Gaspé, Chambly and Verchères, Charlevoix and Montmorency, Chicoutimi and Saguenay, L'Islet and Montmagny, Jacques Cartier and Laval, Maskinongé and St. Maurice, Napierville and St. Johns, Nicolet and Yamaska, Ottawa and Pontiac, Soulanges and Vaudreuil, Richmond and Wolfe, have been united for Battalion purposes under the General Order of the 13th December, 1864, and the Regiment of Service Militia to be furnished by them conjointly, is named as such.

Under the Militia General Order of the 13th December, 1864, a Ballot was ordered to take place on the 30th of the same month, and 40,545 men were called for. This aggregate strength was apportioned amongst the various Regimental Divisions, and divided into 51 Regiments of Service Militia, consisting each of 795 Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates. To these Regiments in Lower Canada, some Captains and Subalterns, selected from the passed pupils of the Military School, have been appointed under the General Order of the 20th December, 1864.

The total number of Militia men in Lower Canada, as returned on the County Rolls for 1864, are, 1st Class, 43,746 ; 2nd Class, 77,627 ; Reserve men, 33,701 ; total, 154,674.

The Regimental Divisions of Prescott and Russell have been united Regimentally, and the Battalion to be furnished by them conjointly is so named. Under the Militia General Order of the 13th December, 1864, a Ballot was ordered to take place on the 30th of the same month, and 48,495 men were called for. The aggregate strength was apportioned amongst the various Regimental Divisions, and divided into 61 Regiments of Service Militia, consisting each of 795 Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates. In Upper Canada no appointments of Officers have yet been made to the Service Militia.

The total number of Militia men in Upper Canada, as returned on the County Rolls in 1864, are, 1st Class, 85,081; 2nd Class, 130,553; Reserve men, 54,489; total, 270,123.

Militia General Orders, Circular Memoranda, &c.

Extracts from the Volunteer Militia Act.

“ *Section 18.* The Volunteers shall be liable to be called out in aid of the ordinary Civil Power in case of riot or other emergency requiring such services, and shall, when so employed, receive from the Municipality in which their services are required, the following rates of pay, that is to say: Officers, such pay as is the daily pay in Her Majesty's Service of Officers of corresponding rank, with an additional sum to each mounted Officer of two dollars per day, and non-commissioned Officers and Privates the sum of one dollar each per day, with an additional sum of one dollar per day for each horse actually and necessarily used or employed on such occasion, and shall be also provided with proper lodging by such Municipality—And the said sums, and the value of such lodging, if not furnished by the Municipality, may be recovered from it by the Officer Commanding the Corps, in his own name, and when received or recovered shall be paid over to the Officers and men entitled thereto.

Section 19. It shall be the duty of the Officer commanding any Corps of Volunteers to call out the same, or such portion thereof as is necessary, for the purpose of quelling any riot, when thereunto required in writing by the Mayor, Warden or other Head of the Municipality in which such Riot takes place, or by any two Magistrates therein, and to obey such instructions as may be lawfully given him by any Magistrate in regard to the mode of quelling such Riot;—And every Officer, non-commissioned Officer and man of such Corps shall, on every such occasion, obey the orders of his Commanding Officer;—And the Officers and men when so called out shall, without any further or other appointment, and without taking any oath of office, be special constables and shall act as such so long as they remain so called out.”

“ 9. The several Corps of Volunteers shall be furnished by the Province with arms and accoutrements, whether the same be the property of the Province or the property of the Imperial Government; and the same shall be kept in public armouries, wherever there are such; and where there are no such public armouries, and until the same are provided, the Officer commanding each Corps shall himself actually keep the arms and accoutrements in a good and sufficient building, provided with suitable arm racks and provision for the care thereof, and shall be personally responsible for such arms and accoutrements; and the Officer commanding any such Corps may, in the discretion of the Commander-in-Chief, be allowed annually, such sum for the care of such arms and accoutrements as may appear proper for the same; and no Arm shall, nor shall any Accoutrements be taken or removed from any such public armoury or from the care of such commanding Officer, except under such regulations as may be made in respect to the same by any General Order of the Commander-in-Chief.

2. Nothing herein shall be construed to relieve the Officers or men of the Volunteers, of any liability in respect to the Uniform or Arms or Accoutrements thereof, delivered to the custody, care or possession of any of them,—or in any other respect,—under the Acts eighteen Victoria, chapter seventy-seven, and nineteenth and twentieth Victoria, chapter forty-four, and the thirty-fifth chapter of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada and the Act twenty-fifth Victoria, chapter one,—but notwithstanding the repeal of the said Acts or any of them, any proceedings thereto relating may be brought within twelve months after the discovery of any breach of the provisions thereof.”

M. G. O. No. 2, April, 5, 61. } Permits Officers Commanding Troops of Cavalry to have the Great Coats issued to them altered so as to suit *Mounted Corps*.

M. G. O. No. 2, April, 23, 61. } Forbids the handing over or loaning without special permission Guns, Arms, Stores or Ammunition, the property of the Government, and in charge of the Militia, to any person whatever.

M. G. O. No. 1, May 17, 61. } Promulgates the following regulations with respect to promotions in the Volunteer Militia —

1st. That all Captains commanding corps of the Active Force, who have served as such continuously since the year 1856, inclusive, and whose corps are at present efficient in every respect to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer, shall be promoted to the rank of Major in the Militia.

2nd. That henceforth, (except in special cases,) the rank of Major shall be granted after five years actual service as Captain of a corps which is fully uniformed and is efficient in every respect to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer.

3rd. That henceforth, (except in special cases,) promotion to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in the Militia will be granted only to Officers who have served five years consecutively as Majors at the head of one or more corps who are fully uniformed and efficient in every respect to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer,—thus requiring ten years to attain the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel from the period of the first appointment as Captain.

STAFF.

4th. His Excellency has also been pleased to direct that the rank of Major shall be granted to Captains after five years service consecutively as “Major of Brigade,” to the satisfaction of the Officer on whose Staff they have served; and,

5th. That the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel shall be granted to Majors holding the following Staff appointments for five years consecutively to the satisfaction of the Officers on whose Staff they have served, viz:

Assistant Adjutant General, Assistant Quarter Master General, and Major of Brigade, thus requiring ten years for Captains to attain the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel from the period of their first appointment to the Staff of the Active Force.

M. G. O. No. 1, August, 1, 61. } Provides that in justice to Officers of long Service, that except in special cases, no Volunteer Officer will thereafter be allowed to retain his rank in the Militia of the Province on retiring from the Volunteer Force,—unless he has served five years on the whole, or three years consecutively as an Officer of the Force, the two last years of which must in both cases be in the grade held at the time of such retirement.

M. G. O. No. 3, Augt. 30, 61. } Directs that all Rules and Regulations adopted by Corps of Volunteers under the provisions of the Militia Law, must be signed by every Member of the Corps previous to being sent to Head Quarters for approval.

Extract from the Volunteer Militia Act.

"24. Any Corps of Volunteers may make, agree upon and enter into, such articles, rules and regulations for the discipline and good management of the same as they may think proper, to be sanctioned by the Officer Commanding such Corps and to be by him transmitted for the approval of the Commander-in-Chief; and any such articles, rules and regulations, in so far as they are not inconsistent with this Act, shall, when so approved, but not before, be enforced, and the penalties which may be thereby imposed shall, whenever they are incurred, be recoverable in the manner mentioned in any of the sections of *An Act respecting the Militia* incorporated with this Act, by the Officer designated for that purpose in such rules and regulations, to such uses as may be therein directed."

M. G. O. } Valedictory Order of Sir Edmund Head on leaving
Octr. 22, 61. } Canada—

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief cannot leave Canada without addressing a few words to the officers and men of the Militia which he has had for nearly seven years the honor to command, more especially to that portion of such Militia organized as the Active Force.

The Volunteer Force has been formed since His Excellency assumed the Government of this Colony, and he now desires to thank the officers and men composing that force for the readiness with which they have listened to advice and suggestions on his part for the zeal which they have shown in the service generally, and for the energy with which they have turned out to aid the Civil power or to shew honor to the Governor General himself or to more distinguished strangers.

His Excellency confidently believes that the whole Militia of Canada, Sedentary and Active, will be ready at all times to defend their Homes and support the Crown of England as their Fathers have done before them—but he would exhort them not to slacken in their exertions—perseverance in their Drill and practice with their Rifles will make Canadian as fit and able to protect their Country as any Soldiers in the world, and the strength of the British Empire will, in case of emergency, be exerted with twofold energy and twofold heartiness in support of a people thus qualified to fight in their own cause.

In saying this His Excellency earnestly trusts that no war will touch the frontiers of Canada, and that peace and good will towards those with whom we have no cause for quarrel, will continue to bless our borders as they have done for many years—With this prayer he bids the Militia of Canada heartily farewell.

2. "Field Artillery Exercises" approved of by the G. O. dated Horse Guards, August, 1, 61, to be adopted by the Field Batteries of Artillery in Canada.

M. G. O. } Promulgates the following respecting the appoint-
No. 1, *Novr.* 17, 62. } ment and duties of Brigade Majors—

1. A Brigade Major in accordance with the amended Militia Act of last Session, will be appointed and stationed at such place in each Military District, as the Commander-in-Chief may direct, and be subject to removal within that, or to any other District, at his discretion.

2. The Brigade Majors of each District will superintend the Drill and Instruction of all Volunteer Companies within his District, furnishing Monthly Reports thereof to the Adjutant General's Department, as to their state of discipline and efficiency, and average attendance at Drill.

3. He will inspect not less than once a quarter, and as often as he may be directed, the arms, accoutrements, great coats and other stores issued to each Company within his District, and forward to the Adjutant General's Department, Quarterly Returns thereof, or Special Reports, when required, as to their general state, and deficiencies, when such occur.

4. The Drill Instructors in each District will be placed under his sole control, he will distribute them through the districts and detail them for their respective duties as occasion may require.

5. He will be required to organize Drill Associations amongst the officers and non-commissioned officers of each Battalion of Sedentary Militia within his district, with a view to their acquiring such a knowledge of and proficiency in their drill and military duties as will enable them to impart, as occasion may require, the knowledge thus obtained to those under their command. This branch of his duty will also include the control and supervision of the organizations for drill contemplated by the 11th clause of the amended Militia Act of last Session.

6. It will further be his duty to secure the enrolment of such quota as may be ordered, from time to time, among First Class Service men within his district—first into Companies, and whenever practicable, next into Battalions, under officers qualified to command them.

7. He will further be subject to such orders and regulations as the Commander-in-Chief may see fit, from time to time, to issue for his guidance and instruction. He will report direct to Head Quarters and be the channel of all communications therewith in each Military District, for the Militia, both Sedentary and Active.

8. On appointment he will be expected to devote his undivided attention to the duties of his office, more especially for the first six months after such appointment, and until he has intiated the system, and brought his district into working order.

9. Brigade Majors to rank as Majors in the Militia, and wear the Uniform of their rank, and in accordance with the Militia Regulations on that head.

M. G. O. } Cancels a previous G. O. respecting Service
No. 3, *August*, 26, 63. } Ammunition and directs in future Officers Com-
manding Corps to retain, out of the 60 rounds of Ammunition allowed each effective Volunteer, a small quantity for special services in aid of the Civil Power or for any other emergency.

Circular Memo } Cautions those concerned against the issue of any
No. 4, Augt. 28, 63. } Public Stores without an approved Requisition from
 the Militia Department.

M. G. O. } Forbids Volunteers being engaged in Ball Practice unless
October, 2, 63. } they are in Uniform and under the command of an Officer
 or Non-Commissioned Officer who is to be held responsible for their proper
 conduct.

Brigade Majors to have arrangements and supervision of Targets, to
 detail days for practice, and to keep records of the same in a Book specially
 provided for this purpose.

M. G. O. } Notifies that no person can be appointed a Field
No. 1, Novr. 6, 63. } Officer of Volunteers until he has given proof before a
 Board of Examiners of his competence to command a Battalion at Battalion
 Drill in the field, and has obtained a Certificate to that effect from such
 Board.

No. 2. No person to be appointed a Captain or Subaltern of Volunteers
 without an examination and Certificate from a Board of Examiners of his
 ability to command a Company at Battalion Drill, and to drill a Company
 at Company's drill.

Extract from the Volunteer Militia Act.

"37. The Commander-in-Chief may, by General Order, from time to
 time, appoint a Board or Boards, to be constituted of three or more Officers
 of the Volunteers, of whom one shall be a Field Officer, and to be held at
 such place as is therein specified, to examine any such Officers of the
 Volunteers as may desire to have investigated their knowledge of and
 proficiency in drill and military duties generally; and upon any such
 examination, the said Board or Boards shall report the result thereof to the
 Commander-in-Chief and shall, after the approval thereof by him, deliver
 to any such Officer as may have satisfactorily passed such examination, a
 certificate thereof, which said certificate shall be recorded in a book to be
 kept for that purpose in the Office of the Adjutant General of Militia, and
 the certificate thereafter delivered to the officer so examined; and the fact
 of such examination and certificate shall be notified in General Orders."

M. G. O. } Directs that all Requisitions for the Regulation allow-
No. 2, Decr. 31, 63. } ance of Ammunition, or for the purchase of Extra
 Ammunition, be forwarded direct to the Militia Department.

MEMO.

1. The annual allowance (due 1st April) for all Corps armed with
 Enfield Rifles, is 60 Rounds Ball and 40 Rounds Blank for each man
 actually effective.

2. The requisition, when filled up by the Captain, will be sent by him
 to the Brigade Major of the Division for certificate, who will then forward
 it direct to the Militia Department at Head Quarters for approval. All
 Ammunition must be issued in *kags or barrels*, and the issuing Officers are
 on no account to issue Ammunition in quantities less than a quarter-
 barrel.

Extra Ammunition.

3. Officers in command of Corps, who may require extra Ball Ammunition, are informed that the quarter-barrel contains seven hundred (700) rounds of Ball Cartridges, with the proportion of Caps; and such ammunition will, in future, be issued in quarter-barrels only. Officers making application for *extra* ammunition will therefore, in future, calculate the quantity asked for in quarter-barrels, taking care that the quantity demanded corresponds with the entire contents of one or more quarter-barrels.

4. *Extra Ammunition* is issued on application *direct* to the Militia Department at Head Quarters, by the Officer requiring it, and payment therefore is to be made by the Officer making the application for such extra ammunition, depositing the money in the Bank of Montreal, to the credit of the Receiver General, and transmitting the Certificate of Deposit for the same to the Militia Department. The price of a quarter-barrel of Ball Ammunition, with Caps complete, is eleven dollars sixteen cents.

M. G. O. }
August, 31, 64. } Relates to drill as follows :

1. The General Orders of the 12th February and 9th August, 1864, are hereby cancelled :

2. His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief is pleased to order the several Corps of Volunteers in the Province, to complete the course of sixteen days annual drill, authorized to be paid for under the provisions of section 4 of the Volunteer Militia Law, at such times as may be most convenient, in respect to which the following regulations have been adopted :

3. An efficient Volunteer Battalion shall consist of at least six efficient companies, except in the case of such Provisional Battalions as may be sanctioned by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, and which may consist of four companies. A Squadron of Cavalry consisting of two troops, or a Battery of Field Artillery will be allowed to count as a Battalion.

4. An efficient Volunteer Corps shall be taken to mean a Company, the whole of whose members unless prevented by illness or other reasonable or unavoidable cause, which shall be specially certified by the Officer commanding the Company or Battalion, shall have complied with the requirements in respect to attendance at drill and target practice hereinafter laid down, and which shall, except for cause certified as above, parade its full actual strength at inspection, and shall at such inspection perform the exercises hereinafter appointed *under the command of its own Officers*, to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer, and whose clothing, arms, accoutrements and equipments shall be reported to be in proper condition.

5. No pay will be allowed to any individual Volunteer whose Company is not efficient.

Drill.

6. Each Volunteer for whom payment is demanded shall have attended since the 1st day of April, 1864, at least sixteen days drill. Each days drill to consist of 2 drills of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour each, or if found more convenient to the men a drill of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour will be allowed to count for half a day's drill, at which drills not less than one half the actual strength and at least one commissioned Officer of the Company shall have attended.

7. When a Brigade Field day shall have been ordered it shall be allowed to count as two drills of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour each for all non-commissioned officers and privates attending: provided that not less than one half the strength of the Battalion or Company shall attend.

8. Not more than two Brigade Field days shall be allowed to count for each non-commissioned officer or man during the year.

9. Each non-commissioned officer and man who performs the course of target practice hereinafter appointed shall be allowed to count such target practice as four drills of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour each.

10. In future the year for the purposes of Militia drill and pay, shall commence on July 1, in each year.

11. The course of drill in which each arm of the service must, in order to qualify at the Inspection, display a satisfactory amount of proficiency, will be as follows:

For Artillery.

12. Squad and Company drill including the Manual and Platoon Exercise and Gun drill, in cases where Artillery corps are supplied with Guns.

For Cavalry.

13. Cavalry Sword Exercise and mounted and dismounted Troop and Squadron drill as laid down in the Cavalry regulations.

For Infantry and Rifles.

14. Squad and Company drill with the exception of marching in slow time, including the Manual and Platoon Exercise, skirmishing as a Company, and simple manœuvres in Battalion Drill as laid down in the "Field Exercises of Infantry."

Target Practice.

15. In cases where ranges are provided all Battalions and Companies of Volunteer Militia shall in accordance with the General Order of October the 2nd, 1863, have expended thirty rounds per man of ball ammunition, and the Officers commanding such Battalions or Companies shall keep careful and accurate returns of all Target Practice in accordance with forms which will be provided from the office of the Adjutant General of Militia.

Horses.

16. Pay will be allowed for 16 days drill of 3 hours each, or for 32 drills of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour each for the horses of the non-commissioned officers and men and guns of the Field Batteries of Artillery and for the horses of the non-commissioned officers and men of the Troops of Cavalry, provided that at least one half the strength of the Field Battery or Troop of Cavalry and at least one Commissioned Officer shall attend each drill.

17. Brigade Field days when ordered to the extent of two for each year will be allowed to count as two drills of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour each.

18. The pay for horses will be allowed at the rate of seventy-five cents per horse for each drill of three hours, for the number of horses actually and necessarily present at each such drill not exceeding forty-five for each Field Battery of Artillery, and the number of horses actually and necessarily present at each such drill for each Troop of Cavalry.

19. The course of drill required of each arm of the service by this order, will be certified according to forms which will be supplied from the office of the Adjutant General of Militia; the forms as to the Company drill being certified and signed by the Captain or Officer in command of the Company, and those as to Battalion Drill being certified and signed by the Officer commanding the Battalion.

20. Any sum of money which His Excellency may order to be paid over to the commanding officer of a Volunteer Battalion deemed efficient, under the 16th section of the Volunteer Militia Law, will be so paid over after the annual inspection by officers of Her Majesty's Service.

21. A careful compliance with the provisions of the preceding paragraphs is required, as furnishing proof or evidence of an "Efficient Volunteer Battalion" upon which His Excellency may decide as to the appropriation of any money, under the sixteenth section of the Volunteer Militia Law.

22. The annual inspection to entitle the force to receive pay will take place at any time before the 15th December, 1864—at which the Brigade Majors shall notify the Deputy Adjutant General that the several Corps within their respective districts have completed their course of drill.

23. No notification can be received after the 15th November for this inspection as the state of the weather after the middle of December would render it impossible to have an effective inspection.

24. Corps which cannot qualify so as to enable the Brigade Majors to give notice before the 15th November, cannot be inspected, and consequently cannot become entitled to their pay for year 1864-65 until after the disappearance of the snow in the spring of 1865.

G. O. } Regulates the system and pay for Drill Instruction. Drill
Octr. 5, 64. } Instructors from the Regular Army to be employed in the Cities
of Quebec, Montreal, Kingston and Toronto, at the rate of 40 cents per
diem.

Instructors out of Cities to be paid quarterly at the following rates :

For the instruction of one Troop or Company, \$100 per annum.

no charge for transport or travelling expenses allowed—Before payment services as instructor to be certified by the Officer Commanding the Company and countersigned by the Brigade Major, who is also to supervise the instruction.

The Instructors to be Commissioned Officers of Volunteers who have passed Examination, and obtained First Class Certificates provided that they are willing to assume the responsibility of instructing their respective Companies—In case of their declining to do this First Class passed Candidates from the Military School will be preferred.

M. G. O. } Confers the rank of Captain in the Volunteer Militia on all
Decr. 1, 64. } passed Candidates from the Military Schools who may be
 appointed Drill Instructors to Volunteers.

M. G. O. No. 1, } Directs that from that date all Candidates prior to
Feby. 3, 65. } admission to the Schools must satisfy a Board of Officers
 as to their competence for the position of a Commissioned Officer of Militia.

M. G. O. } Publishes the following Extract from a despatch
No. 1, Feby. 15, 65. } from the Secretary of State for the Colonies dated
 23rd January, 1865.

"I have particular pleasure in noticing the excellent spirit and orderly conduct of the Canadian Volunteers. I hope you will take some fitting opportunity of informing them that the promptitude with which they have answered your appeal is appreciated by Her Majesty's Government."

M. G. O. } Approves of the appointment of Instructors to Drill
Feby. 22, 65. } Associations composed of masters and students of Colleges
 authorized by General Order, outside of the Garrison Towns of Quebec,
 Montreal, Kingston, Toronto and Hamilton. Rate of remuneration same
 as that authorized for a Company of Volunteers, provided always that if
 he instructs a Volunteer Company in addition to a Drill Association, he
 will only receive the rate of remuneration laid down in the G. O. of the
 5th October, 1864.

M. G. O. No. 1, } Forbids Candidates from one Military School of
Feby. 23, 65. } Instruction entering another without special permission.

No. 2. Directs Candidates who have obtained 2nd Class Certificates
 previous to the G. O. of the 3rd inst. and who desire readmission to the
 Schools of Military Instruction to qualify for 1st Class Certificates, to make
 application to the Commandant of the School.

M. G. O. } Authorizes the appointment of 2nd Class passed Candi-
March, 13, 65. } dates from the Military Schools as Instructors to isolated
 Companies, or Companies not in Battalion.

M. G. O. } Publishes the following Rules and Regulations for the
April, 27, 65. } Military Schools of Instruction :

"1. All Candidates for Commissions in the "Service" Militia, will be required before appointment, to obtain a certificate, as hereinafter mentioned, from the Commandant of one of the Schools of Military Instruction ; and no person shall be appointed or promoted to the rank of Field Officer in the "Service" Militia who shall not have obtained a "First class" certificate.

2 A "First Class" Certificate shall be given to those candidates who shall have proved themselves, to the satisfaction of the Commandant of the School of Military Instruction, able to drill and handle a *Battalion* in the field, and who shall have acquired a competent acquaintance with the internal economy of a Battalion.

3. A "Second Class" Certificate shall be given to those candidates who shall have proved themselves able to command a Company at Battalion drill, and to drill a Company at "Company drill," and who shall have acquired a competent acquaintance with the internal economy of a Company and the duties of a Company's officer.

4. All candidates for admission to the Schools of Military Instruction will be required, before admission, to satisfy a Board of officers of their competence for the position of commissioned officers of the Militia.

6. No certificate of either class shall be given to any candidate who is not himself perfectly drilled as a private soldier.

7. No candidate shall be permitted to remain at any of the schools for a longer period than three calendar months from the date of his entry.

8. The travelling expenses of all candidates in coming to, and returning to their homes from the school shall be paid.

9. All candidates on obtaining a "Second Class" Certificate, shall be paid the sum of Fifty dollars.

10. All Candidates for Commissions, while attending the school, shall be considered for all purposes of drill and discipline to be attached to the Regiment which shall constitute the School of Instruction; and it shall be competent to the Commander-in-Chief, on a representation from the Commandant, to dismiss any candidate from the school, for misconduct or other sufficient cause.

11. Candidates for Commissions, while attending the school, shall not be Members of the Mess of the Regiment which constitutes the school.

M. G. O. } Notifies in order to prevent misapprehension, that *Gentle-*
July, 14, 65. } men who have obtained Certificates from the Military
Schools, and are appointed "temporary" to the Volunteer Militia that this is only done to show that they must consider themselves as always available for the Militia, and not that anything derogatory is meant by the terms of the appointment.

No. 2.

M. G. O. } 1. For the maintenance of good order and discipline in the
Augt. 4, 65. } active Volunteer force, the Commander-in-Chief calls the
attention of all Officers, non-commissioned Officers, and private soldiers, to the following clauses of the Volunteer Militia Act, prescribing the penalties which by the law of the Province may be inflicted for offences, viz :

Clauses 9, 10, 11, 12, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 94, 95, 96, 97, 98, 101, 102; and the Commander-in-Chief will after the publication of this order, hold all concerned responsible that they make themselves thoroughly acquainted with the provisions of those clauses, at their own proper risk, in case of failure to do so.

2. As any armed force, not under proper discipline, must be a source of embarrassment and useless expense to the country which maintains it, the Commander-in-Chief desires that all commanding officers of corps will make an immediate report of any offences, committed by the men under their command, which may come within the application of the above clauses, to the local Commandant where there is one, or to the Brigade

Major of the division, who will deal with the same in the manner prescribed by law. And the Commander-in-Chief calls on all Volunteers who have the good of the service at heart, to support him in his endeavour to place the Volunteer Force of Canada, on a really efficient and permanent footing, by the example they can themselves set, in their respective spheres, of implicit obedience to lawful authority.

3. With reference to the foregoing paragraph, Commanding Officers of Corps will send to the Commandant where there is one, or to the Brigade Major where there is no Commandant, in writing, a specification of the offence which may be charged against any man under their command within twenty-four hours after the commission of said offence, together with the written testimony of the witness or witnesses which establish the charge. It is indispensable that the offence shall be clearly defined, and that the evidence shall be clear and conclusive.

If the Commandant or the Brigade Major, as the case may be, shall be satisfied by the conclusiveness of the testimony, that the offence charged has been committed, and that it falls within the application of any of the clauses above mentioned, he will proceed against the offender in the manner prescribed by law. But if the Commandant or Brigade Major, shall deem the testimony inconclusive, or that it does not come clearly within the provisions of the cited clauses, he will personally investigate the matter before taking action upon it. Forms for this purpose will be supplied to Brigade Majors.

4. Recent reports by Inspecting Queen's Officers show that in many instances the arms in use by Volunteer Companies are being rapidly ruined by neglect; that Volunteers are in the habit of wearing the public clothing when not employed on Volunteer duty, in violation of clause 12 of the Volunteer Militia Act, whereby much of the clothing has been worn out before the proper period, and some of it is altogether deficient; also that many Volunteers have been allowed to keep their great coats at their own homes, in violation of clause 12 of the aforesaid Act, and in direct disobedience to the General Order dated at Quebec, 10th April, 1863, by which custom many great coats have been worn out before the proper time, and many are missing.

The Commander-in-Chief therefore orders that in future neither arms, accoutrements or great coats shall be allowed to remain in possession of the men on any pretence; but that they shall be invariably kept either in public armories, or in the custody of Commanding Officers of Corps, who will, under the Brigade Majors, be held responsible for the literal observance of this order. Also, that all cases of the violation of clause 12 of the Volunteer Militia Act shall be immediately reported to the Brigade Majors, as above enjoined in paragraph 3 of this order.

5. Brigade Majors will immediately make a minute personal inspection of all arms, clothing, and accoutrements, as well as of any other description of public stores, which may have been issued for the Volunteer Service, in their respective divisions, and will send to the Adjutant General through the proper channel, a detailed return of the same, classified under different heads, specially noting their condition, the deficiencies, if any, with their causes, and the names of the individuals liable to make them good.

In every quarterly return thereafter, the Brigade Majors will state specially that the deficiencies reported at the end of the previous quarter, have been made good, or if otherwise, the reason why they have not been made good.

6. Brigade Majors are reminded that the certificates signed by them as to the condition of the arms, clothing, &c., are intended as a check for the purpose of saving to the Province the serious loss which would be occasioned by carelessness or neglect; and they are enjoined never to sign a certificate of arms being in good order without satisfying themselves of the condition of the insides as well as of the outsides of the barrels.

7. If the Volunteers have not yet been instructed in the proper method of cleaning their arms, the drill instructor will devote the first meetings for drill, after the receipt of this order, to teaching the men thoroughly this most important part of the duty of a soldier, the neglect of which would render him useless in battle; and the Brigade Majors will report to the Adjutant General, so soon as the Volunteers in their respective districts, or a large proportion of them, are competent to perform it.

8. At every meeting for drill thereafter, the arms will be inspected according to the mode prescribed by the regulations of the army; and this will form in future one of the parade details of every inspection of Volunteers.

9. After firing, at target practice, Commanding Officers will require every man to clean his own rifle before returning it to the Company's arm racks, and any failure in this respect, will be immediately reported in the manner enjoined by paragraph 3 of this order.

10. The foregoing orders with respect to the care and cleaning of arms, are not issued for the mere purpose of ensuring smartness on parade; but they are indispensable to the real efficiency, and continuance of the Volunteer Force. The arms are costly weapons, which with care will last for many years, but unless the rifles are kept thoroughly clean both inside and out, they rapidly deteriorate, and become useless. The Commander-in-Chief will therefore, in future, only keep up those corps, which by taking proper care of the public property entrusted to their charge, will save the Province the useless waste which must result from a contrary proceeding.

No. 3.

The Commander-in-Chief notifies Officers of the Volunteer Militia that none will be allowed to retain their ranks therein, unless they shall have qualified themselves as prescribed by the Volunteer Militia Act, before the 1st July, 1866.

M. G. O. No. 1. } Directs that all correspondence with the Adj. Genls.
Augt. 18, 65. } Depart. where there is a Commandant of Volunteer Militia on all matters concerning the Force under his command, must be carried on direct by such Commandant without the intervention of the Brigade Major. Any orders they may require to issue to subordinate Officers within the limits of their command are to be conveyed through the Major of Brigade.

No. 2. Directs that Commanding Officers of Volunteer Corps who desire to leave their Head Quarters for any period exceeding a fortnight must apply for leave in the usual manner to the Adjutant General of Militia.

M. G. O. No. 2. } Notifies Officers of the Volunteers that a Quarterly Meeting of a Board of Officers will be held at Quebec—Montreal—Kingston—Toronto and London, on the first Tuesday in every quarter beginning on Tuesday, the 2nd January, 1866, for the examination of such Officers of the Volunteer Force throughout the Province as may desire to have their proficiency in drill and discipline tested and certified by such Boards.

The Certificates to be of two Classes :

1st Class.—For such Officers as prove their ability to handle a Battalion at Battalion drill.

2nd Class.—For such Officers as prove their ability to drill a Company at Company's drill and to command a Company at Battalion drill.

No charge for travelling expenses allowed.

A Circular of the same date constitutes these Boards as follow, viz :

and further directs that in testing the knowledge of the Candidates for Certificates the Cadets of the Military School are to be employed.

M. G. O. No. 1. } Directs all correspondence connected with the Volunteer Militia, excepting matters relating to finance which are to be sent direct to the Deputy Adj. Genl. at Ottawa, are to be forwarded by the respective Brigade Majors, as follows :

All letters on Service to be forwarded invariably by Commanding Officers of Corps through their respective Commandants or Brigade Majors, as a contrary course tends to create confusion and delay.

M. G. O. No. 1. } Directs that Officers Commanding Volunteer Corps are not to recruit beyond the number of Men for whom they have Arms and Accoutrements actually in possession.

No. 2. Directs that Candidates for admission to the Military Schools from the Regimental Divisions of Yamaska, Richelieu, Bagot, St. Hyacinthe, Rouville and Iberville, are to forward their applications marked on

the enclosure "On Military School Service" to the D. A. A. Genl. of Militia Montreal. All communications connected with the Volunteer Militia to be forwarded through the Brigade Major at Montreal.

M. G. O. } Fixes the rate of Mileage allowance and Hotel charge in
Decr. 20, 65. } lieu of travelling expenses heretofore allowed to Brigade
Majors and Officers of the Militia when travelling on Public Service under
orders from the Militia Department, as follows :

" By Railroads and Steamboats :

Three cents a mile from 1st May to 31st
October, and four cents a mile from 1st
November, to 30th April.

Land Carriage ;

Ten cents for each mile actually and neces-
sarily travelled, where Railroads and Steam-
boats could not be made available.

These rates to cover
all expenses of Meals,
Cab-hire and all other
incidental expenses in-
curred while *actually*
proceeding to and re-
turning from duty.

Hotels :

Two dollars and fifty cents per diem will be the utmost charge allowed
for Hotel expenses in the Cities of Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa, Kingston,
Toronto, Hamilton or London, and one dollar fifty cents per diem at all
other places in the Province : Hotel charges will be confined to the num-
ber of days the claimant was *actually* and *necessarily* detained at the
Station on the Public Service.

The account of each claimant will be made up in duplicate, on Forms
to be supplied by the Militia Department."

M. G. O. No. 4. } Permits the Great Coats to remain in possession of
Decr. 22, 65. } the men at the discretion of Officers Commanding Corps.

M. G. O. No. 1. } Cancels the G. O's. of the 27th Octr. and No. 3, of the
Jan'y. 12, 66. } 22nd Decr. 1865, and publishes the following :

With reference to General Order No. 6, of the 30th August, 1864, the
Commandants, where there are such, or the commanding officers of corps,
shall have power to divide the yearly drills into any number which they
may think most conducive to the discipline and efficiency of the volunteer
force, and to apportion to each drill or parade, such proportion of the whole
pay of \$8 00 per annum as they may judge proper; provided always, that
the sum apportioned to each drill shall not exceed 50 cents. And in future,
every volunteer who may attend battalion drill under a field officer, and
certified by the commanding officers, may receive credit for such drill,
provided the total attendance at any battalion drill, for which pay is claimed
be not less than 60 men.

But nothing in this order is to be construed as affecting General Orders,
7 and 8 of the 31st August, 1864, respecting brigade field days; nor as
altering in any manner the conditions as to efficiency and the yearly
inspection by competent inspecting officers, on which alone any drill-pay
will be issued, nor as conferring a claim by any Volunteer to an amount
of drill-pay in any one year beyond the \$8 00 authorized by Law.

Circular Memo. } Informs Officers of the Militia that the following
 Sept. 5, 64. } Articles may be obtained from the Militia Department
 at the prices stated.

Officers making a requisition for any of the above articles, will be required to send with the requisition a deposit receipt from the Bank of Montreal, to the credit of the Receiver General of the Province, for such a sum as will cover the price of the articles required; and in all cases where Shaksos, Tunics and Trowsers are required, it will be necessary to give the size of the Head, the Height, and the Waist and Breast measure.

Circular Memo. } Publishes for the information of Officers Commanding
March, 20, 65. } Volunteer Corps and Military Schools, &c., &c., the
 following list of prices of Government Stores, &c., so that in case of loss or
 damage the same may be recovered under the provisions of the following
 clause of the Militia Act.

“ 44. If any person designedly makes away with, sells, pawns, wrong-
 fully destroys, wrongfully damages, or negligently loses, any property or
 thing issued to him or in his possession as a Volunteer,—or wrongfully
 refuses or wrongfully neglects to deliver up, on demand, any property or
 thing issued to him or in his possession as a Volunteer,—the value thereof
 shall be recoverable from him, with costs, as a penalty under this Act is
 recoverable; and he shall also for every such offence of designedly making
 away with, selling, pawning, or wrongfully destroying as aforesaid, be
 liable, on the prosecution of the Commanding Officer of the Corps or
 Battalion, to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars, nor less than five
 dollars with or without imprisonment for any term not exceeding six
 months.

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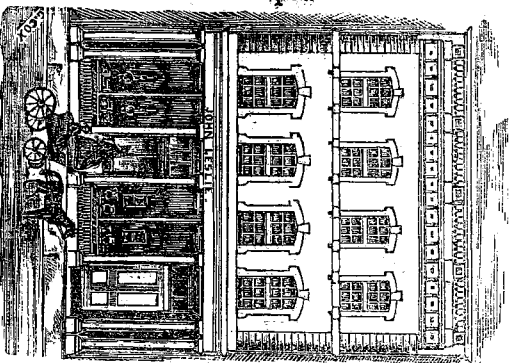
