Condemnations of preserved meats have occurred ever since their first introduction as an article of diet in Her Majesty's Service. The earliest complaint of objectionable matter found in a canister, was received in office on the 24th November 1849.

Yes; but it is to be observed, that prior to the formation of the contract of 2 May 1850, only three complaints of objectionable substances discovered in 7 canisters, had been received in office. Between that period and the formation of the contract of 29 January 1851, 11 further complaints of a similar character were received in office, respecting offal discovered in 21 canisters mixed with the meat; amounting, on the result of all the complaints, to $\frac{1}{100}$ per cent. of the total quantity delivered by the contractor, to that date.

Of 86,614 lbs. of preserved meats supplied to the "Assistance" and "Resolute," 18 lbs. were condemned during their voyage; and 762 lbs. on their return to this country in October last; but, of the total quantity of 51,463 lbs., then returned into store from those ships at Deptford Victualling Yard, it has since been found necessary to condemn 1,226 lbs. more; and in consequence of the very unfavourable reports by the yard officers of the condition of the remainder of the meat, a special survey has been ordered to be held thereon, as soon as Messrs. Cooper & Gamble, from whom the meat was procured, can be present at its examination.

Not from Goldner. They consisted of meat of a superior description, obtained by special purchases from Messrs. Cooper & Gamble, at prices varying from $7\frac{3}{4}d$. to $8\frac{1}{4}d$. per pound.

In consequence of the condemnations and rejections at the home victualling establishments, the contractor was repeatedly directed to remove from the several yards all the canisters containing such rejected meat, in order that the penalties of his contract might be enforced, and that he might be charged with the excess cost of the meat which might be purchased in lieu. His agent accordingly removed from Royal Clarence Yard, in September 1851, 2,093 canisters, the contents of which were, in his opinion, in a putrid state, or likely shortly to become so; but the contractor subsequently declined to remove any further quantities from either of the victualling yards, until he should be recommended to do so by his legal advisers.

Part of the 2,093 canisters were originally delivered into store by the Contractor in September 1848, part in June, July, and November 1849, and part in November 1850. They were all removed, as before stated, in September 1851.
