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THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
-- OF THE
INDUSTRIAL REFUGE
AND FIFTH OF
THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME.



THE Industrial Refuge has now been in existence thirty-five years. Let us devoutly thank our Heavenly Father for permitting us—amid many disappointments and discouragements, brightened, however, from time to time, by one and another woman hopefully rescued from a degraded life—still to labor on amongst that, I had almost said, hopeless class of our fellow-creatures and of our own sex.

One closely connected with the Salvation Army, when asked, on bringing one of these apparently hopeless cases to the Refuge, "Why don't you take her to the Salvation Army Rescue House?" "Oh," she answered, "they only take those who are really anxious to lead a new life." "But," we said, "they all tell you that when asking to be admitted." "Yes; but such as she are *incorrigible*, and we know them and do not care to have them." We admitted this fallen one (for we refuse none, unless those who need to be sent to the Maternity or General Hospital), but

only to find her, after a few days, insist on going out, with the probability that we would see her name in the police reports the next day.

For many years, this institution was the only refuge for that class of women, in Toronto. Now there are five, besides this one; and new and easier methods of reclaiming the fallen and erring are in favor with many, one feature being the doing away with any probation or test, before sending them to a situation. Hence, our diminishing numbers. For, if long experience is to be considered of value, then we claim that the record of this institution bears us out, in asserting that *that* class of women needs restraint and a considerable period of probation, as a *necessity*, as well as a test of their real desire to lead a virtuous life; and therefore we still insist that—before finding places for them, or giving them the supply of clothing necessary for entering any respectable home and appearing at church—they remain in the Refuge at least twelve months. What benefit, we ask, is it, either to the woman herself, or to the family to whom she is sent, if—though in some respects she may be a suitable servant—she is addicted to drink and light conduct? To take her into a Refuge, keep her for a few weeks, clothe her and get her a place, and then, at the end of her first or second month, to find she is back to the Refuge again, sick and perhaps bruised, having spent her wages foolishly and pawned or sold the clothes you gave her! Is there any benefit in such a course? We have known cases of this kind to go on, year after year, the power to keep from their besetting sin getting weaker and the character more and more degraded and defiant. Such can even look you calmly in the face and protest, “It is the last time.” “I have learned a lesson,” and so on.

But this does not prevent our admitting them, again and again, in the hope of its being the turning-point in their downward career. But if they leave before the time of probation is up, we neither clothe them nor help them to find work. Our desire for such is not only to keep them *one year*, but many years; for while in the Refuge, there is a hope that they, like many others, will become faithful and industrious—and their work in the laundry and work-room goes a considerable way towards meeting the expenses of the Refuge. Their characters, too, instead of becoming more degraded, are steadied and improved, and after a time they become respectable members of society. This is the moral and outward improvement we see going on. The inward and spiritual we are not without instances of. Such were the three women who died in the Refuge a few months ago, and had been more or less in our care for a quarter of a century. One, Eliza Moore, had been for many years a faithful messenger of the Home, and a consistent member of the Methodist Church. Another, Mrs. Slater, never left the Refuge during the last five years of her life, and she, too, gave her testimony to her reliance and trust on the Lord Jesus. Both of these had naturally mild and inoffensive dispositions. But Kitty Kelly, in the years we knew her first, was a very different being, most daring, reckless and deceitful, but withal kind-hearted, and at times a good nurse. Her later years were those of very considerable, and, at times, painful suffering; but she bore it patiently and passed away with an assured hope of a blessed eternity. These, and such as these, with those also, who, in their own homes and in service, have been doing well for many years, are the bright spots in our work.

The average number of inmates this year was only 23, as against 28 the year before. Nevertheless, you will notice that the return for work done, viz., \$1558.53, is not much less, showing the faithfulness of those who do remain in the Home, and the healthy and improving influence it has on them.

Inmates in the Refuge, October 1st, 1887, 24; admitted since, 40. Of these, 13 went to service, 3 died, 6 were taken home by friends, 2 dismissed, 1 sent back to the Haven, 19 left of their own accord, and 20 remain, October 1st, 1888.

Mrs. Spence, assisted by her daughter, is still our faithful and trusted Matron. We owe much of the quiet and orderly character of the Refuge to their tact, consideration and real desire for the best interests of the inmates.

Our best thanks are due to Dr. Britton and Dr. Moore, for most assiduous medical services; and to many clergymen and others, as well as to the ladies, who so kindly and faithfully attended to the religious services and the teaching, on the Sabbath.

The Managers also acknowledge, with sincere thanks, a legacy of \$1000 from the late Mrs. Pollard, and also \$500 (not yet paid) from the late Mr. Heron. During their lifetime, both of these friends were liberal contributors to the institution.

THE FIFTH REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME.

This second department of our work — which, it must be remembered, is *distinctly a separate one*, though under the same management, and is maintained for the care and comfort of *respectable aged women* — still bears testimony to

the usefulness of such a Home, and the great need there is for it. 26 women, whose respective ages are--10 above 80, 6 above 75, 4 over 70, and 5 over 60 years—have been cared for and kindly treated, and their paths towards their latter end made comfortable, brightened and cheered by the unremitting attention of the Matron, Miss Lee, and other attendants, assisted by many kind visitors. Five died during the winter and early spring: their ages being 67, 75, 81, 82 and 83, and one a few days ago, aged 84. They were all very weak and feeble, but their last illnesses were, in general, short. All were very grateful for the comforts provided for them, as were those who had been the means of placing them in the Home. We are adding an apartment, large enough to admit of our placing three of those needing the most care in it, with a room for the attendant separated from it only by curtains, thus insuring attention during the night, if required. In order further to add to their comfort, we have engaged (on trial) the services of a young woman, who will devote her time to trying to make their lives as bright and happy as possible, reading to and praying with them and attending to their many little wants. Miss Eberts is well qualified for this position, and we trust the arrangement may be suitable for all parties. This, in addition to the close attention of Miss Lee, not only to their bodily ailments and to the cleanliness and comfort of the Home, but also to the proper nourishment prepared for them, will, we hope, make this Home a real blessing to those, who, in old age and with many infirmities, are left, in the Providence of God, without any near relative who can or will take care of them.

Of Dr. Clapp's most unselfish care and attention to these

aged women, we cannot speak too highly ; and to Mr. Milburn, another sincere friend, we are very grateful, for giving, all through the year, a supply of "Quinine Wine" and "Beef, Iron and Wine" for the Home, and also some for the Refuge.

Many kind Christian women have also helped us very much, by visiting, reading and praying with the inmates, and these services were very much prized by all. Mrs. Hamilton, who was most faithful in this way, has passed away to her heavenly home. We, as well as the inmates, miss her very much. Nor would we be forgetful of the young ladies of the "Flower Mission," and of those who kindly played and sang for them. They, and all such, have their reward in the acknowledgment of the Lord Jesus himself : "Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of the least of these, ye did it unto me."

We would also thank those clergymen and students, both of Wyckliffe and Knox colleges, for the regular and also many extra religious services given at the Home, especially during the winter months. We look again for their valuable help.

We deeply regret that Mrs. Maclellan's other engagements do not admit of her retaining the Treasurership of these "Homes." But as an Honorary Visitor, we shall always be able to secure her advice and assistance.

We append to this report a list of the special gifts and donations sent us, to both the Home and the Refuge, and thank very heartily the donors.
