FORTIETH ANNUAL REPORT.
OF
THE INDUSTRIAL REFUGE
CORNER McMURRICH AND BELMONT STREETS.

In presenting this, the Fortieth Annual Report of the Industrial Refuge, we desire to express our gratitude to our Heavenly Father, for the continued evidences of His approval and blessing.

To shelter the outcast, to raise the poor weak ones who have fallen in the battle of life, and inspire them with Divine hope, to keep the arms of Jesus wide open for the helpless and sinful, is our high and holy mission, and though our efforts have been feeble and sometimes ineffectual, we have reason for thankfulness and encouragement, ever keeping in mind the Master's words, "Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of these My brethren, even these *least*, ye did it unto Me."

Attacking the most difficult problems of city life, and having to deal with the class it is least possible to help, we should be satisfied simply to do our work, without seeing much result; instead of this, we have repeated and constant signs, that bruised hearts are healed, temptations withstood, and new lives are lived.

Perhaps one of the best indications that can be given of the good the institution is doing, is the willing and hearty manner in which the inmates enter into their work. That \$1,531.67 should have been earned during the year by washing and knitting is evidence that they try to return, so far as they are able, kindness for kindness, love for love. It will be understood how restless and impatient of the

necessary restraint of such an institution many of the inmates are, for we have also the thankless and the heartless to deal with, the selfish and the violent to control, and our only power over them is the firm hand and tender heart; many of these wayward ones go out before their time of probation is completed, some return again, glad to be safe in the Refuge, which is to them home.

We cannot be too expressive of our thanks to the Matron, Mrs. Spence, and her assistant, Miss Spence, for their care and watchfulness in conducting so difficult a work, they indeed rule rather by love than fear, and many a weary wanderer on life's pathway has found in them comfort, and help to lead a better life.

Extensive alterations have been made in the Refuge during the year, new closets, bathrooms, and other alterations, making the sanitary state of the building as perfect as possible, necessitating an outlay of about \$400.

On Sept. 30th, 1892, there were in the Refuge 26, to these have been added during the year 27, making a total of 53. 5 went to friends, 9 to situations, 2 to the Hospital, 1 to the Asylum, and 13 left before their time was up, leaving 23 in the Refuge Sept. 30th, 1893.

The Sabbath morning service is still conducted by Mr. Alcorn, the evening service by Mr. Hall, City Missionary, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Chapman and other helpers. The Sabbath school is in charge of Mrs. Carmen, who devotes much time and care to the work, assisted by other lady helpers. Westminster choir gave an enjoyable concert early in the year. St. James' Sq. Christian Endeavor also made several entertaining visits. We desire to thank all who have in any way helped to cheer and brighten the lives of the inmates.

The two physicians, Dr. Britton and Dr. Moore, who attend so willingly to the medical needs of the institution, still continue their valuable services, for which the managers desire to express their grateful thanks. We are also indebted to Dudley & Burns for reduced rates in printing reports.

THE TENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME.

The Tenth Annual Report of the Aged Woman's Home will be found of special interest. Appealing, as this institution does, to the tenderest of human affections, our contributing citizens will be amply repaid for their self-denying gifts, by the consciousness that they have been the means of providing a resting-place and a true home, for a few of those whom we should consider it an honor to comfort and shelter in their declining days.

The year just closed is the first passed in the new building; its capabilities for the purpose for which it was erected had to be tested, and many things needed adapting to the wants of the inmates; no efforts have been spared by the Managers to make all as comfortable as it was possible, but it can easily be understood that this has only been done at the cost of much anxiety, care, and willing service. The Board of Managers desire to render thanks to our loving Father for His gracious help vouchsafed to them in this holy work and to the aged ones in their charge.

When we consider that so many of them have passed the allotted span of life, we are glad to report, that no sickness of a serious character, and only one death has occurred during the year, we can only say, "The Lord hath done great things for us, whereof we are glad."

We began the year with 15 inmates in the Home, we now have 23, 2 of whom are over 90 years of age, 6 over 80, 11 over 70, 4 over 60. By the number of applications that are coming to us, we have no doubt the full capacities of the Home will be tried far sooner than was expected. These facts lead the Managers to feel a great want has been met, by the erection of the new building, and they would earnestly and confidently ask all who are interested in the care of the aged and needy, to contribute liberally

towards defraying the existing debt of \$13,500, so that the money that is required to meet the interest on so large a sum, may be used for the work that is evidently before us. In July a change took place, when Miss Fetherstonehaugh, after four years of very faithful service, and after seeing the aged women comfortably settled in the new Home, retired from the position of Matron, and was succeeded by Mrs. Peacock, who has already done much by her untiring zeal for the comfort of those under her care, and we have every reason to believe that the future will prove still more her suitability for the position.

Mrs. Saunders and Miss Crooks still attend to religious instruction on the Sabbath; Wycliffe and Knox College students take charge of both Sabbath and week day services, Rev. Septimus Jones administers the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. We desire to thank them for this important help to our work. We are also indebted to many friends who have given enjoyment to the aged ones by entertainments; to Old St. Andrews' choir for a very successful concert; to St. James' Sq. Church Christian Endeavor for kindly entertaining the inmates many times; to Mr. Brackenridge for an evening of magic lantern views; and to Mrs. Wilkes who kindly invited all the inmates to her home and entertained them. Dr. Caven and Dr. Scadding have given gratuitously much valuable time to the Home, for which they have earned our hearty thanks.
