

FORTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT
OF
THE INDUSTRIAL REFUGE
CORNER McMURRICH AND BELMONT STREETS.

The Forty-first Annual Report of the Industrial Refuge is presented with deep gratitude for the many tokens of our Heavenly Father's continued care and guidance, in this work of love and mercy. We feel sensible that we have very little to record that has not been said before,— our work is the same year after year, and though we have much to discourage us, yet we feel conscious that some of the seed sown does take root, that hard hearts are softened, and the wayward ones, though so unused to brook restraint, become amenable to wise discipline.

When we consider the depths of degradation to which some of these our fellow beings have fallen, we should be thankful that so many are able to withstand their awful temptations, and by entering into the daily duties of the Refuge, show they are desirous of living better lives. We have again had the old evidences of good done in the past, by the repeated returns of the restless ones, who have gone out before their stated time, and who willingly return to their refuge from bad companions and a life of sin ; this should encourage us to hope the good influence which surrounds them while in the Refuge, is not entirely lost, but will have its blessed results in future years.

“Whatever in love’s name is freely done,
To free the bound and lift the fallen one,
Is done to Christ.”

In July of this year, we lost by death, our esteemed 1st Directress, Mrs. Robert Gilmor, who for forty years, had worked in season and out of season, for the good of this Institution, her kindly voice and wise counsel, will be deeply missed by every member of the Board, as well as by the inmates of both Institutions. The following brief notice of her death, is copied from the *Evangelical Churchman* :—

“Mrs. Robert Gilmor ; died July 29th, 1894. It was with feelings of the greatest sorrow that the large circle of friends in Toronto, and elsewhere, learned of the unexpected death of this devoted servant of God, in Louiseville, at the home of her sister, whither she had gone some three weeks before to spend the summer months. Born not far distant from the spot whence she was called to her rest, she spent most of the intervening years of her life in Toronto, associating herself with the philanthropic and charitable works of this most humane city, and closely with the parochial life of the parish church and cathedral of St. James. How valued through two-score years were the services she rendered to community and church, God alone can estimate ; with Him is her rest, of Him is her reward. As of Dorcas it was said, “This woman was full of good works, and almsdeeds which she did,” so may the same be said of her who is now blessed in the joy of her Lord. None can covet greater distinction than this, to have this inspired utterance applied to them in life and at death, but to win it one must be found in Christ, zealous of good works to the glory of God the Father. And such was Mary Amelia Gilmor, the sweet savour of whose daily living sacrifice of herself upon the altar of humanity, of sweet charity and Christian effort, will long linger about the scenes, and influence the hearts of her fellow-workers in the same causes.”

In July, Mrs. and Miss Spence, resigned their respective positions as Matron and Assistant Matron, to take effect October 3rd. The Managers feel this loss will be a heavy one. Mrs. Spence’s experience of 16 years in this work

had peculiarly fitted her for the position, her wise control over the inmates, strict attention to all the duties of the Institution, and kindly manners, had endeared her to us all. Those interested in this work, will join the Managers, in wishing both Mrs. and Miss Spence, much happiness and blessing in their future home, may "God be with them till we meet again." The position of Matron has been filled by the appointment of Mrs. Cameron, with Miss Cameron as Assistant. We have every reason to believe they will give much satisfaction to the Managers, and become daily more at home with the arduous work before them. The laundry work is still a source of much help to the finances of the Refuge, and is entered into with much willingness by the inmates. The sum of \$1404.62 was earned by this means during the year. Alterations have been made this year to the outside buildings, new coal bins, new fence, and yard boarded, at a cost of about \$100.

On September 30th, 1893, there were in the Refuge 23, to these have been added during the year 33, making a total of 56, 1 sent to the Hospital, 1 to Home for Incurables, 12 to Situations, and 19 left before their time was up, leaving 23 in the Refuge, September 30th, 1894.

The Sabbath morning service is conducted by Mr. Alcorn, in the evening by Mr. Hall, City Missionary, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Chapman, and other helpers. The Sabbath school has been in charge of Mrs. Carmen, assisted by Miss Wilkes, and other lady teachers. Many pleasant entertainments have been given during the winter months, we would specially thank Westminster Choir, St. James' Square Christian Endeavor, Olivet and Central Church Choirs, the Refuge Sabbath School Teachers, and many others, who have given pleasure and entertainment to the inmates. The medical needs of the Institution are carefully attended to by Dr. Britton, and Dr. Moore, who for many years have given us their services. We thank them much for their valuable help. We desire also to thank Dudley & Burns, for reduced rates in printing.

THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME, BELMONT ST.

We present the Eleventh Annual Report of the Aged Woman's Home, with a renewed feeling of thankfulness that we were constrained by Divine Love to build this Home for aged women. The citizens of Toronto may feel a pardonable pride in having such a building so admirably fitted for its purpose, where so many of those whose life's work is nearly done, find a haven of rest for their declining days. The new building has now been in use for two years, and by wise management and much self-denying labor, has become efficient in every part, we feel deeply thankful to the giver of all good, for His continual blessing, may He put it into the hearts of His people to give liberally to this noble work of providing a home for those who are too old or feeble to care for themselves, and whose means are extremely limited. We are thankful to say no sickness of a serious character has visited the Home during the year, except what is incidental to old age and infirmity. We have lost four inmates by death, but this is a small number when we consider the ages of the majority of the inmates. There is no doubt the quiet rest and constant attention given to the aged ones under our care tends to lengthen out many lives, many grow quieter in disposition and more patient as they grow older, so that

“All the jarring notes of life
Seem blending in a psalm,
And all the angles of its strife
Slow rounding into calm.”

The debt on the building is now \$13,000, and though we feel the burden of this large sum a heavy one, we look with much confidence for help from our many friends and well-wishers.

We had at the beginning of the year 23 inmates, we now have 31, 2 over 90 years of age, 7 over 80, 17 over 70, 3 over 60, and 2 special cases under 60. It will be seen from this record that our vacant rooms will soon be full if we increase our numbers in the future as rapidly as we have in the past. Our Matron Mrs. Peacock, is still with us, sparing neither time nor energy in doing everything that is possible to please and gratify the inmates of the Home and in every way considering their comfort. We feel that the work and responsibility of the Matron has greatly increased with the larger number in the Home, but Mrs. Peacock's untiring attention to all, has given her a warm place in the hearts of these aged ones. Our Sabbath services have been kindly attended to by Mrs. Saunders, Mr. Baird, Mr. Frogley, and the teachers from Olivet Church; Wycliffe and Knox students take services both on Sunday and week day. Rev. Mr. McCaul has kindly taken one service in the week. Rev. Sept. Jones, administers the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. We thank them heartily for their attention to the spiritual needs of the aged. Our thanks are also due to those who have so generously given their time to entertain the inmates of the Home: to Mr. J. W. Bengough, St. James Square Christian Endeavor, Olivet Congregational Church Choir, Westminster Mission Band, and Bathurst Street Night-school, also to Mrs. Wilkes, who so kindly entertained the inmates at her home. Dr. Caven, and Dr. Scadding, still give much valuable time to the inmates of the Home, we earnestly thank them for their ready help in every time of need.

MEDICAL REPORT OF INDUSTRIAL REFUGE.

During the past year the inmates of the Industrial Refuge have experienced exceptionally good health, their having been but one case that was of serious nature, but fortunately, and contrary to expectation, this patient recovered. Most of the inmates were vaccinated a few weeks ago. Of those who were not vaccinated, two or three would not allow it, and the remaining few did not require it. I firmly believe that the excellent health of those in the Refuge is due, in a very great part, to the scrupulous cleanliness of the institution, and Mrs. and Miss Spence cannot be complimented too highly for their thorough watchfulness in this particular line. When the medical report is so brief it speaks volumes for the institution and its management.

AGED WOMAN'S HOME.

In submitting a medical report for the past year, we have to chronicle four deaths in the institution : one from chronic Bright's disease and pneumonia, hastened by a fracture of the neck of the thigh bone sustained in falling ; one from natural causes in extreme old age, and two from advanced heart disease. The condition of one of the last named was most serious upon her admission, and death resulted shortly after. It is observed that the general health of the majority of the women improve after their admission to the Home. In those vaccinated recently, a large percentage of the inoculation failed. The nursing of the sick is excellent, and the general sanitary condition of the institution very satisfactory.


