FORTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
INDUSTRIAL REFUGE,
CORNER McMURRICH AND BELMONT STREETS.

Before presenting this, the forty-third annual report of the Industrial Refuge, we desire to express our gratitude to our Heavenly Father for all the blessings vouchsafed us during the past year.

As has been often stated, the purpose of this Institution is to give women who, through infirmity of nature or evil environments have fallen into evil ways, a shelter where they will not be beset by temptations and where they may be led to live honest, Christian lives. As such reformation takes time, it is of importance that those putting themselves under our care should remain at least a year, and it is therefore satisfactory to report that though fewer women have come within the Institution than in some former years, yet the average has been larger owing to their remaining longer, showing in this way that they are grateful for having such a home. A great many give still more practical evidence of this by working most faithfully in the Laundry, Knitting, Quilting and in various other ways doing what they can towards providing for the maintenance of the Home. \$1214.57 was received from these sources during the year, this being nearly one-half of the running expenses.

On September 30th, 1895, there were 27 remaining in the Home and 20 have been admitted since; making a total of 47. Of these 4 went to service, 2 to the General Hospital, 2 to the

Haven, 1 died, 1 returned to her friends, 1 was dismissed and 7 left of their own accord before their year of probation was up; leaving 29 in the Refuge on September 30th, 1896.

We have to report the death of Nancy Gardiner, who was for many years a most satisfactory inmate. She had at different times taken situations, but after rendering faithful service she always returned to what she called her "Home."

Mrs. Cameron still remains with us as matron and shows great diligence in furthering the success of the Institution. Miss Barbara Robertson, who was appointed since the last annual meeting, has proved herself a capable assistant.

It is with sincere sorrow that we record the death of Mr. James Brown, who for over thirty years, took such a deep and loving interest in the Institution. He was for most of that time Superintendent of the Sabbath School and teacher of the Bible class, and had so endeared himself to the inmates that his loss was no ordinary one.

To the regret of the managers, Miss Smith, who has so ably filled the office of Secretary, and Mrs. Anderson, whose duties as Treasurer have been so faithfully discharged, both find it necessary to resign. We are glad, however, that they are to remain with us as members of the Board.

Mrs. Grant very kindly and efficiently took Mrs. Anderson's place during her prolonged absence from home.

Our much beloved honorary president, Mrs. Ewart, who has for so many years taken such an active interest in the work, and through her long connection acquired such a complete knowledge of details, still continues to aid us with her valuable advice.

Service is held every Sabbath morning, and is conducted by Rev. Mr. Dowler; Rev. Mr. Young, Mr. Robert Hall, City Missionary, Mr. Anderson and Mr. Chapman, in turn, taking the evening services. The Sabbath School is in charge of Mrs. Carmen, assisted by Miss Durand and Miss McBride. The tea and concert given under their auspices was much enjoyed by the inmates.

Mrs. Renaud's weekly visits are much appreciated, also the monthly entertainments given by the Hospital Workers of Walmer Road Baptist Church.

We thank most cordially all other kind friends who have given entertainments for the inmates, or have helped in any way to brighten their lives; Dr C L Starr and Dr. Moore for their valuable services so gratuitously rendered, and Dudley and Burns for reduced rates in printing our annual report.

THE THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME, BELMONT ST.

We now turn to quite another branch of the work—that of providing for respectable aged women a home where, for a small amount, they may spend their declining years in comfort, and have the care and attention necessary to old age. It is now thirteen years since this work was commenced, and it is with thankful hearts that the managers acknowledge all God's goodness to them and those under their charge during that time, but more especially throughout the year just ended.

There are at present 38 inmates in the Home—one less than at the beginning of the year—16 new inmates were admitted during the year, and 6 removed by death. The number of deaths is not to be wondered at when we consider that most of those in the Home have passed the allotted span of life. Of those who died 2 were over 90 years of age, 2 over eighty, and 2 between 70 and 80.

Under Mrs. Peacock's efficient management The Home continues to be as prosperous as in former years.

The appeal of last year has apparently been successful, for the managers expect that when the mortgage falls due in December they will be able to pay \$5000 of the debt. This amount has not been taken from the regular income, but is in consequence of legacies left and the liberality of kind friends who have donated money for that purpose.

We take this opportunity of thanking most heartily those friends who have so kindly taken charge of the religious servi-

ces—Rev. Mr. Coulthard who takes the Sabbath morning service ; Rev. Mr. Wood who dispenses the communion once a month ; Mr. Bryce, and the Students from Knox and Wycliffe Colleges. Mrs. Ball and Mrs. Saunders continue to visit regularly, and the Misses Wilkes deserve special thanks for their very faithful work in the Home.

We are also indebted to Mr. S. Howarth for his kindness in treating the inmates to a ride on a chartered street car, and for the cake and fruit he so thoughtfully provided for them on their return ; and to Mrs. Wilkes, who invited all the inmates to her own home where she entertained them most hospitably.

In addition to Dr. Wm. Caven and Dr. Scadding, we now have on our medical staff Drs. Boyd, Boultbee, Stenhouse and James Caven. These all have our most hearty thanks for the services they have so willingly and faithfully rendered the Home.

MEDICAL REPORT OF AGED WOMAN'S HOME, 1895-'96.

The number of women who have been in the Institution during the past year is 55. During this period there have been 6 deaths and 11 discharges, leaving 38 in the Home at the present time. The number of deaths is the same as for last year, although there have been more inmates this year than last.

The health of the women has, on the whole, been very good, and those who have been sick have had careful attention at the hands of the matron and nurse. The hospital ward affords very good accommodation for the sick, and not only this part but the whole building is kept scrupulously clean.
