### FORTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF

### The Toronto Industrial Refuge

In presenting our forty-fifth annual report to the friends of the institution, and the public generally, it is impressed upon us how little that is really new and interesting there is to tell. To quote Mrs Burns, for many years Secretary of The Home. "We cannot give novelty to our reports; year after year it is the same old story, now twenty eight times told. But of this we can assure our kind friends and supporters, that although our institution is growing older, it admits of no abatement of appliances nor any cessation of energy and prayerful effort—our work admits of no holiday." If this was true of the 28th report, how much more so it is at the present time!

Yet how grateful we ought to be that our heavenly Father in His goodness has permitted us to continue our labors in this portion of His vineyard, and has blessed our feeble efforts to rescue from haunts of sin and misery many of the most degraded of our sex.

Our doors are always open, and any woman who shows a desire for reformation, by promising to remain in the institution for at least twelve months, is admitted, regardless of nationality or creed.

We have much cause for thankfulness that during the past year so many of our unfortunate fellow creatures were directed to The Refuge, and so brought for a time under moral restraint and Christian influence. Several of them remained a sufficient length of time to enable us to cherish the hope that some permanent good may result—while there

are, of course, the usual discouragements to be met with in others who, in spite of the promises made, return almost immediately to their old habits and associations.

There were 27 inmates at the beginning of the year, and 21 have since been admitted, making 48 in all, made up as follows:

Leaving 30 in the Refuge on the 30th September, 1898.

Mrs. Cameron who had charge of the Home at the close of last year, was obliged, owing to ill-health, to resign the matronship; but we are fortunate in having secured the services of Mrs. McMartin, and would willingly bear testimony to the zeal and ability with which she discharges the various duties of her office. She is well seconded by Miss Calder, whose work is more particularly in connection with the laundry which is a most profitable source of revenue to the Home. The amount realized during the past year by this means was \$1,590.70 and, in addition, all the necessary sewing, knitting and quilting was done by the inmates, which speaks volumes for the faithfulness of the workers and proves that the Home does not belie its name, but is truly an "Industrial Refuge."

The resignation of Mrs. Grant having been received with much regret, Mrs. Anderson consented to accept the onerous position of Treasurer, previously filled by her. The Committee appreciate very highly the care and exactness with which the accounts are kept.

In order that we may have a constant reminder of one who for so many years was indefatigable in her efforts to promote the interests of the Home, the managers have caused an enlarged photograph of the late Mrs. Ewart to be hung in the Board Room, trusting that it will be an incentive to all to labor with the same unselfish and untiring spirit which characterized her efforts.

The following clergymen and others have kindly conducted the Sabbath services: Rev. Mr. Dowler, Rev. Mr. Young, Mr. Robert Hall, City Missionary, Mr. Anderson, and Mr. Chapman. The Sabbath School is still in charge of Mrs. Carman, assisted by Miss Durand and Miss Mc-Bride.

Many pleasant entertainments were enjoyed by the inmates, notably the Christmas tree provided by the teachers and their friends. Mrs. Renaud and the workers of the Walmer Road Baptist Church, continue to visit regularly and they are always received with much pleasure. We tender our grateful thanks to Dr. Starr, who has been most attentive to the medical needs of the inmates, and to Messrs. Dudley & Burns for printing the annual reports at reduced prices.

# THE FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME, BELMONT ST.

It is again our duty and privilege to present to you at this, the close of the fifteenth year in our history, a report which we trust will gladden the hearts of all those interested in the Home. This is a charity which we feel demands the interest of every one, inasmuch as it is maintained for the care and comfort of respectable aged women who have, in the majority of cases, no friends to care for them and little, if any, means of support. As we behold in the face of each one who makes her home within these walls, a separate history of human sorrows, telling of ties that have been broken, dreams of happiness dissolved, and happy days that have not ended as planned, we would express our heartfelt gratitude to our loving Father who has allowed us

to do our share towards brightening these lives and giving them in the December of life a home where comfort and

peace prevails.

Another matter for which we are devoutly thankful is that we are now able to report our Home entirely free from debt—the mortgage having been wiped out at the end of

last year.

The statistics, as regards the number of inmates, are almost identical with those of last year. We began the year with 42 in the Home and 9 more admitted since, giving a total of 51. Of these 3 left, and 6, most of whom were over eighty years of age, were removed by death. There are at present several applications before the Committee which, if accepted, will tax the Home to its greatest capacity. It is thought that before long some means will require to be taken to provide extra accommodation.

We can but reiterate what has been said in former years regarding the excellence of our Matron, Mrs. Peacock, whose work is never ending, and often seemingly unappreciated. Miss Robinson's services as nurse continued to be much valued.

Our thanks are due and gratefully offered to all those who have so kindly conducted the various Sabbath services: Rev. Mr. Coulthard, Rev. Mr. Rix, Mr. Bryce and the students from Knox and Wycliffe Colleges.

The visits of the Misses Wilkes, the Pansy Band and the Walmer Road workers are much appreciated by the inmates. To Drs. Wm. Caven and Scadding, assisted by Drs. G. Boyd, Stenhouse, McIlwraith and Fenton, we are much indebted for faithful medical attendance given gratuitously and cheerfully.

### AGED MEN'S HOME.

In our last Annual Report it, was announced that the Managers contemplated utilizing the Home formerly occupied by the aged women as a Home for aged men, to

be carried out on the same lines, but to be an entirely separate institution. This is now an accomplished fact, only that instead of using the old Aged Woman's Home for the purpose, it was fitted up for an Industrial Refuge, and the larger part, with the entrance on Belmont Street, has been remodelled and is now known as the Aged Men's Home.

The dedicatory services and public opening were held under very favourable auspices on the evening of Thursday, October the 6th, and if the success of that meeting is any earnest of what we are to expect for the Home in the future, we certainly have great reason to feel encouraged and grateful. And now that we have entered on this new branch of the work, we would ask from the Christian citizens of Toronto, the same generous support that has been extended to the other Homes under our management.

# ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT OF THE INDUSTRIAL REFUGE.

In spite of the numerous changes which have been made in the building during the year, and the exposure necessarily attendant on such changes, the general health of the inmates has been very good.

There has been only one case of a serious nature. This was one of pneumonia in a very old inmate and for some time it seemed doubtful if she would recover, but by careful nursing she has again regained her accustomed strength.

The other cases were more trivial in character and readily yielded to ordinary treatment. The sanitary condition of the present building I consider excellent, and this, together with the careful attention of the matron and her assistants makes the work of the medical officer very much lighter.

# MEDICAL REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME, 1897-'98.

The number of women who have been in the Institution during the past year is 51. Of these 6 have died and 3 have been discharged, leaving a total of 42 in the Home, the same number as at the corresponding season last year. Those who died were all far advanced in years.

Last year the staff recommended the building of a mortuary, and the carrying out of this recommendation by the board has made a great improvement.

The sanitary condition of the Institution has been excellent as usual.
