INTRODUCTION.

In laying this volume (my first edition) of the *County of Durham Directory* before the public, it would, perhaps be too much for me to assert that it is entirely free from errors, as this could scarcely be safely said of any work of the kind ever published. This being the case, I content myself with the statement that no pains or trouble has been spared on my part to secure accuracy, and that whatever errors (if any) may be discovered in this work, they will turn out of a trivial and immaterial character.

The County of Durham (which forms part of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham) is situated in nearly the centre of the Province of Ontario. It is nearly square, having a frontage of three townships on Lake Ontario which forms its southern boundary, by two townships in depth, extending to the County of Victoria and Lake Scugog on the north, a distance of some twenty-five miles, while its western boundary is formed by the County of Ontario and Lake Scugog, its eastern line is formed by the County of Northumberland.

The County of Durham comprises 6 townships and the incorporated towns of Port Hope and Bowmanville, and the village of Newcastle, making 9 Municipalities, which are divided for Parliamentary and Registration purposes, into two Ridings the east and the west. The former of which comprises the townships of Hope, Manvers and Cavan, and the incorporated town of Port Hope, and the latter the townships of Clarke, Cartwright and Darlington, and the incorporated town of Bowmanville and the village of Newcastle.

Each Riding is represented in the House of Commons, and the Legislature of the Province of Ontario by one member for each House. The East Riding is represented in the Dominion Parliament at Ottawa, by Mr. Francis H. Burton, of Port Hope, and in the Legislature of Ontario at Toronto, by Mr. A. F. H. Williams, also of Port Hope, while the welfare of the West Riding is looked after by Mr. Edward Blake of Toronto, at Ottawa, and Mr. John McLeod of Bowmanville, at Toronto.

The Municipal Government of the county consists of the members of the County Council of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham, and as this work is merely for the latter county, its Municipal Officers will be found under the head of the Reeves and Deputy Reeves for the county.

Durham is a county of great agricultural wealth, and the time is fast approaching when it must take its place as one of the first counties east of Toronto, for agricultural and manufacturing enterprise, containing as it does some of the finest farms in the Dominion, together with several large and prosperous manufacturing establishments, the number of which is daily on the increase, enabled as it is by the fine harbors on Lake Ontario, combined with the excellent water privileges throughout the county, backed by men of both enterprise and capital, the future of this fair county must be both a brilliant and useful one.

Of its area—estimated at 340,000 acres, the larger portion is under cultivation. The soil is rich, fertile and usually very productive. Large quantities of wheat, barley, and other grains are raised annually, which find a ready market and bring good prices in some of the numerous towns or villages, of which no county of the same size in the Province has a larger number, or ones of greater importance either as grain markets or manufacturing centres, owing to which facts, combined with the truly fine harbors of Port Hope, Bowmanville and Newcastle, make it a county for agricultural purposes surpassed by none in Canada.

The bulk of the population, numbering about 43000, are agriculturists. There are, however, a large number of manufacturers, merchants and traders.

The principal manufactories are the Massey Agricultural Works at Newcastle, Helm's Foundry and Machine Works at Port Hope, the Bowmanville Chair Factory, and the large Woollen Mills at Newcastle, Orono and Millbrook, with a large number of Flour and Saw Mills scattered throughout the length and breadth of the county. Durham possesses a large number of churches of various denominations, large sums are devoted annually by the different Municipalities to the interests of education, and the county possesses some of the best Grammar and Common Schools in the

Dominion. There are six newspapers published within the county, three at Port Hope, two at Bowmanville and one at Millbrook.

The county boasts of a large number of thriving towns and villages, scattered in all directions throughout its length and breadth.

The railroads of the county are the Grand Trunk and the P. H. L. and B., the former of which crosses the county nearly at its southern boundary, and the latter, upon which the inhabitants of the county, and particularly the citizens of Port Hope may point to with pride, as it is one of the best managed roads in the Dominion, and under the able superintendence of Mr. A. T. Williams and assistants, is destined at no distant day to be of the greatest importance to the county, if not to the whole Dominion.

A few years since, the proposition from any man to have built a railroad across the continent, connecting the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans would have been a sufficient reason to have consigned him to a lunatic asylum for life, but as visionary as the scheme looked then, the present success of the Union Pacific Railway has not only demonstrated the practicability of the project, but has also shown to the world that it could not only be built and run but as an investment for paying railway stock it has but few if any rivals in America.

This, combined with the immense growing trade of the Western slope of the Pacific, will call in a few short years for another railway across the continent, and as the Legislative power of the United States will not feel at liberty to grant a charter to a competing line for some years to come, the capitalists of this country and the States will combine, and not only procure a charter but build a Northern Pacific Railway across the continent and through the Dominion of Canada; these being facts that any school boy can see, the next question will be through what portion of the Dominion would it be most practical to build it, and as no route offers less engineering difficulties than a route through the County of Durham, there is no reason why, if the P. H. L. & B. road was pushed on by extension, as it evidently is the aim of its superintendent to do, why it should not form the southern terminus of a Northern Pacific Railway that will be built I firmly believe within the next ten or fifteen years, and I believe, Mr. Williams, with his knowledge of railways, sees this as plainly as I do, and it is now for the inhabitants of Durham to say if at any time this road calls upon them for municipal help, if they are willing or not to second the efforts of a gentleman who, with proper assistance, will do all in his power to make Port Hope the most important railway terminus in the Dominion of Canada. With you Durhamites be the result, and that your decision may be a good one is the hope of a well-wisher for the prosperity of this fair county.

A village in the township of Manvers, on the P. H., L. & B. R., 24 miles from Port Hope, was first settled by Messrs. J. Byers and S. Wilson in about 1855 or 1856. The first store was opened by Mr. F. Bleakley, in 1858 and the Post Office was established in 1859, Mr. F. Bleakley being the first Postmaster. At present it contains one civil organization, viz., a Loyal Orange Lodge, No. 1022, holding meetings in a Hall built by them of wood, in 1864, at the cost of nearly \$200. The churches are, a Canada Presbyterian, of wood, erected in 1860, costing \$600, and a New Connection Methodist of the same material, built in 1862, at about the same cost. One school-house, three hotels, three general stores and the usual number of mechanics. Population about 150.

BOWMANVILLE,

An incorporated town situated in the township of Darlington, having a fine harbor on Lake Ontario, about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the centre of the town known as Port Darlington. Was first settled by Messrs. Bowman and Lewis, about 50 years ago, the latter of whom opened a store in about 1820, but was shortly succeeded by the late Charles Bowman, Esq. The Post Office was established in 1823 or 24, Mr. Robert Fairbairn being the first Postmaster. This place was known as Darlington Mills until 1831 or 32, at which time the name was changed to Bowmanville, after Charles Bowman, Esq. It was incorporated as a village in 1852, and as a town in 1857. It was formerly a place of great promise, but during the stagnation of business after the panic of 1837 and 8 it remained (like many other places) for some years without any apparent improvement, but during the last few years it has been gradually improving, and it undoubtedly has a brilliant future. The civil, military, and fire organizations are, one Masonic Lodge, No. 31; one I. O. G. T. Lodge, No. 259; one Sons of Temperance Division, No. 39; and one T. A. Society, known as the Bowmanville Total Abstinence Society; also the Bowmanville Literary Society; and a Mechanics' Institute and Library. The military spirit is shown by one Volunteer Infantry Company, No. 1, 45th Battalion, Wm. H. Scott, sen., Captain; and the musical talent is developed by the fine brass band of the 45th Battalion, under the tuition of Prof. W. Andrews; while the property of the

citizens is protected from fire by one fire engine Co., Capt. Thomas Hoar, and a Hose Co., Capt. Colnett. The head office of the Ontario Bank, and a branch of the Royal Canadian are both situated in the town, on King street. The manufactories are the large works of the Bowmanville Furniture Manufacturing Co.; two Foundries; five Mills; one Tannery; one Marble Works; one Hoop-Skirt Factory; one Hub and Spoke Factory; one Pump Factory; several Carriage Factories, besides a number of Waggon-makers, Blacksmiths, &c. The town also contains several fine general stores (one of which that has been erected during the present season, known as the Beaver Block, the property of F. F. McArthur, Esq., is really a fine building and a credit to the place), besides a large number of grocery establishments and other places of less note. The town also has several hotels. The Registry Office for the West Riding of Durham, is also located here on King street near the Post Office. The township of Darlington and the West Riding of Durham Agricultural Societies, both hold their annual fairs or meetings here, on the grounds kept for that purpose, upon which the Battalion drill-shed has been erected. There are two weekly papers published in the town, and a third one is about being established. The *Canadian Statesman*, W. R. Clime, editor and proprietor, and the organ of the Bible Christian denomination, known as *The Observer*, under the control and editorship of the Rev. C. Barker, both of these journals have a large circulation throughout this and the adjoining counties.

The public buildings of the town are, a town hall and market house, built of brick in 1855, at the cost of nearly \$18,000; a United Grammar and Common School, built of brick in 1854 or 55, at the cost of some \$6000; and a Battalion drill-shed, built of wood in 1867, costing nearly \$2500. The churches are nine in number, as follows: (St. John's) Church of England, built of brick in 1855 or 56, at the cost of some \$9000; a Roman Catholic, built of brick in 1857, at the cost of nearly \$1000; (St. Andrew's) Scotch Presbyterian, built of wood in 1838, at the cost of \$1500; a Canada Presbyterian, built of brick in 1852, costing about \$2000, this congregation are about to build a large church, at the probable cost of some \$6000; a Wesleyan Methodist, built of brick, in 1851 or 52, enlarged and remodelled in 1869, entire cost about \$10,000; a Primitive Methodist, built of brick in 1846, at the cost of nearly \$2000; a Congregational, built of wood in 1838, at the cost of about \$1000; a Bible Christian, built of brick in 1857, at the cost of nearly \$8000; and a Disciples', built of brick in 1856, at the cost of \$4000. Bowmanville being a port of entry, there is a

The churches are, one Wesleyan Methodist, built of wood in 1857 or 58, at the cost of about \$1200; one Bible Christian of the same material, built in 1847 or 48, and since then twice enlarged, entire cost about \$2000. The other public buildings are a Town Hall, built of wood in 1857 or 58, costing about \$800; a School-house, built of brick (originally intended for a hotel), costing about \$2000, but sold to the school section for some \$1700. The manufactories are, one grist mill; one tannery; one pump-factory, and a cabinet shop, with several blacksmiths and waggon-makers. There are also two general stores, two groceries, two hotels, &c. Daily mail. Distance from Bowmanville 5 miles, from Port Hope 26 miles. Population about 350.

Wm. Graham, and a large squad of Col. Smart's Cavalry of Port Hope. The musical talent is cultivated by a fine brass Band, also connected with Col. Smart's troop, under the able tuition of Prof. Phillip, of Port Hope. The manufacturing interests are represented by one united Foundry and Agricultural Works; one grist mill; one oatmeal mill; one machine shop; two saw mills; one shingle mill; one flax mill; one woollen factory; one steam carriage factory; and two tanneries, and the usual number of mechanics, several general stores, five hotels, &c. Daily mail, and money order office. Population not far from 1300.

NEWCASTLE,

An incorporated village in the township of Clarke, and having a fine harbour on Lake Ontario, was first settled by Mr. Moses Beach, in 1830 or 1831. The first store was opened by Mr. E. Shelley, in 1835, and the Post Office was established in 1843 or 1844, Mr. John Short being the first postmaster, the village was surveyed in 1841, by J. K. Roche, P. L. S., for the Hon. George Boulton, and it took its name from what was formerly known as the Newcastle District. The Grand Trunk Railway passes through the village and has a station at which all trains stop. At the present time it contains several civil and one military organization, viz.: One Masonic Lodge, No. 66, one Loyal Orange Lodge, No. 764, one of the I. O. G. Templers, No. 203, and a Total Abstinence Society, and one Volunteer Infantry company, 45th Battalion, Captain John J. Robson. The Montreal Telegraph and Canadian Express companies each have offices. The public buildings are, a Town Hall, built of wood in 1847, at the cost of about \$500. A company drill shed of the same material, built in 1862, at the cost of some \$600, and a united Grammar and Common School, of brick, built in 1856 or 1857, costing about \$6000. The manufactories are a combined agricultural works and foundry, a woollen mill, two flouring mills, a planing mill, and a marble factory, besides the usual number of mechanics. The churches are, a Church of England, built of brick in 1858, costing about \$8000. A Scotch Presbyterian, built of wood in 1850, at the cost of nearly \$2000. A Wesleyan Methodist of brick, erected in

1867, at the cost of over \$6000, and an Independent Church, built of wood some years since, but for the last few years it has not been used. The Episcopal Methodist congregation at present holding service in the Town Hall, are preparing to build. With the advantages of its fine harbor, railway communication, several general stores, four hotels, and different manufactories this place should become one of considerable importance in time to come. Distance from Port Hope 17 miles, Toronto 48 miles, Montreal 285 miles. Daily mail and money order office. Population not far from 1300.

ORONO,

A village situated in the township of Clarke, of which it is the municipal or township seat, was first settled, by Mr. E. Johns, in about the year 1834. The first store was opened by Mr. J. L. Tucker, the present Reeve of the township, and Warden of the united counties of Northumberland and Durham, in 1845. The Post Office was established in 1852, Mr. J. L. Tucker being the first and present Postmaster. The village has one military organization, viz.: One volunteer Infantry Company, No. 2, 45th Battalion, Captain J. L. Tucker; one fire engine company and several civil societies, as follow: One Loyal Orange Lodge No. 409. One Sons of Temperance Division No. 79, the latter of which hold their meetings in a Hall built for them, in 1851 or 1852, of wood, costing about \$600. The place also boasts of an excellent Brass Band under the leadership of Mr. Walter Billings.

The public buildings are, the Town Hall, built of brick, in 1857, at the cost of about \$1200, a Common School House of the same material, erected in 1853 or 1854, costing nearly \$4000, and a Drill-Shed built of wood in 1866, at the cost of \$1000.

The manufactories are represented by one foundry, also, one combined foundry and machine shop, one flouring and grist mill, one woollen factory, one flax mill, one tannery, one heading factory, and one steam cabinet and chair factory, besides the usual number of mechanical representatives. The mercantile business of the place is represented by several general stores, four hotels, &c. The Montreal Telegraph Company have lately extended their line to this place, and have an office here for the transaction of business, under the management of Mr. Matthew Henry, watchmaker, jeweller, &c. There are five fine church edifices in the place, as follows: One Canada Presbyterian built of brick in 1868, costing some \$4000, one Wesleyan Methodist of the same material, built in 1857, at the cost of nearly \$2500, one Episcopal Methodist also of brick, erected in 1862, at the cost of \$4000, one Christian, of brick, built in 1868, at the cost of \$3000, and one Bible Christian, of brick, now in the course of completion, and will cost about \$3000. The Scotch Presbyterian Congregation, now holding

PORT HOPE,

An incorporated town in the township of Hope, is situated in a valley (surrounded by fine sloping hills), at the mouth of Smith's creek, which gives it one of the best harbors on the north shore of Lake Ontario, from which a large amount of lumber and other

produce is shipped annually than from any other place of its size in the Province. It is known as the county town, but as a union exists between Northumberland and Durham, the county buildings are situated in Cobourg, the county seat of the former county. It was formerly known as Smith's Creek, but in 1820, the name was changed to Port Hope. It was first settled by Mr. Myndert Harris in 1792 or 1793. The first store was opened by Mr. Jeremiah Britton, in 1815, and the Post Office was established in 1817 or 18, Mr. Charles Fothergill being the first Postmaster, who was succeeded by Mr. David Smart, (that is D. S. was the first to hold a commission after Fothergill) in a short time, who held the office until his death, a period of nearly 49 years, and he was succeeded by his son, Col. R. W. Smart, the present Postmaster. The fine water-power supplied by Smith's creek, causes it to be somewhat noted for its manufactories, among which I may mention 4 flour mills, 2 foundries, 2 planing mills, 1 button factory, 1 woollen mill, 3 tanneries, and several other works of less note; its water-power combined with its excellent facilities for shipping, via the harbor and the G. T. Railway, which passes through the southern portion of the town, and the P. H. L. & B. Railway which terminates here, must make it a place of great importance in time to come.

The public buildings are, a Town Hall and Market House, erected of brick in 1852, entire cost with bell and clock about \$7000. A Battalion drill-shed of wood, built in 1867, at the cost of about \$2200. The schools are, a united Grammar and Common, with two Primary ones, situated in different parts of the town, together with a branch of Trinity College, known as the Trinity College School; the union and College schools each have a drill association connected with them, to perfect the youth in military exercises, as well as in the other educational branches. There are two Volunteer Infantry Companies, Nos. 1 and 2, of the 46th Battalion, the former of which is commanded by Capt. F. A. Benson, and the latter by Capt. Thos. Craig. There is also a company of Garrison Artillery, under the command of Capt. S. Sculthorp, and last though not least, one of light Cavalry, commanded by Col. R. W. Smart. Connected with the 46th Battalion is an excellent brass band, under the able leadership of Prof. W. Philp, and I might here add that this band is one of the best in Ontario. The town also has two fire engine companies.

The civil societies are represented by 3 Masonic Lodges, Nos. 26 and 114, with a Royal Arch Chapter, not yet numbered. The Orange body have four lodges, Nos. 44, 141, 309 and 532; as well as the St. George's and St. Andrew's Societies; also the I. O. G. T.

have a lodge, No. 142. The Young Men's Christian Association, and Bible Society, each have rooms. The East Durham and township of Hope Agricultural as well as the Port Hope Horticultural Societies, hold their fairs in the town.

The Montreal Telegraph and the Montreal Union and Canadian Express Cos., have an office. The Ontario, Toronto, Montreal and Royal Canadian Banks, each having agencies, all said to be doing a large business. There are two Churches of England, one of which was built in 1818; one Roman Catholic, built of brick in 1852, at the cost of about \$10,000; one Scotch Presbyterian, built of brick in 1860, at the cost of about \$3000; one Canada Presbyterian, of brick in 1865, at the cost of \$8000; one United Presbyterian, of brick in 1864, at the cost of \$3000; one Wesleyan Methodist, of wood in 1862, at the cost of \$4000; a Baptist, of brick in 1867, costing about \$9000; and a Bible Christian Chapel.

There are three weekly papers published in the place, viz: *The British Canadian*, J. B. Trayes, editor and publisher. The Port Hope *Guide*, Messrs. Johnston, editors and publishers, and the Port Hope *Mercury*, Robt. Romain, editor and proprietor, all of which have a large circulation throughout this and the adjoining counties. The streets are wide and spacious, and lighted with gas. The mercantile business of the place is very extensive, while the mechanical branches are not neglected. The hotel accommodation is not surpassed by any town of its size in Canada. Daily mail. A money order and savings bank office. Distance from Toronto 63 miles, Montreal 270 miles. Population about 5000.




