## PREFATORY REMARKS.

---

The lateness of the appearance of the present work, which was unavoidable, is the author's apology for the shortness of the general remarks he has to offer.

In a political sense, matters being now somewhat settled, the Colony of British Columbia seems to require for its prosperity :—

1.—A revision of the tariff, whereby articles capable of being produced here shall pay such a duty as shall encourage home production, while other things shall be admitted with almost nominal duty.

2.—The setting aside of a comparatively large sum for public works, of which the collateral advantage would be the offering of employment to new arrivals.

3.—The execution of public works at periods when a dearth of other employment is most likely to occur.

4.—The setting aside yearly of a certain sum for the purpose of assisting population to these shores, paid agents in Europe and a line of vessels to form part of the scheme.

This is the more necessary when the inmates of English poor-houses are compelled by law to emigrate, and we find numbers of skilled workmen co-operating to settle up the lands of the States.

5.—The forming of good trunk roads, if in this island, say from this port to every available harbor on its shores ; by which is meant a good summer road completely cleared, say from five to six yards wide ; and the tall timber cut down say, 100 feet wide. It is a fact that many men will travel along a main track and explore right and left ; but who, naturally, will not travel through the unbroken forest or over the pathless waste. These roads would offer immediate employment to new arrivals at a certain small figure of remuneration, and could be paid for half in land.

6.—The initiation of a liberal land system ; the suggestion is to fix upon enough for ten to twenty holdings, say 50 to 100 acres each, as free grants, say 10 miles apart, on these trunk roads. Actual residence and improvements, on pain of forfeiture, to be a *sine qua non*. These fixed stations would invite settlements around and facilitate the sale of adjoining lands.

7.—An intelligible and fixed Indian policy by which the natives would know what would be done with and to them.

Let certain allotments on a liberal scale be made to them as near as possible to their present camps. Let them be compelled to reside there. Let a certain yearly sum be expended to provide them with a resident agent and assistants if necessary.

Let them be improved first by being taught how to secure comfortable shelter, then shown how to grow or procure abundant food and clothing. Having a friend at hand to advise and assist they will gradually improve ; possibly acquire some useful trade. After this will be time enough to teach reading and writing and the improvement of the mental and moral powers. It is to be regretted that the very reverse of this has been the system hitherto followed.

To recapitulate, we want then :

- 1.—A revision of the tariff to exclude goods that can here be produced, and *vice versa*.
- 2.—A liberal and regular outlay on public works ; and
- 3.—The execution of these when labor is cheapest.
- 4.—A thoughtful and economical immigration scheme ;
- 5.—The forming of numerous trunk roads ;
- 6.—A liberal land system and free grants ;
- 7.—An intelligible Indian policy ; and to add
- 8.—A grant of public money for the establishment of any new line of industry, such as the opening of a new coal or copper mine or a fishery, to be paid after, say, five years' existence of the latter.

With these eight suggestions, carried out in their integrity (and many others crowd on the mind such as the revision of our mining laws &c., with a view to facilitate the investing of foreign capital) we can afford to let stand such weightier matters as Confederation and Reciprocity with the States. The latter to be advantageous must be a mutual want, and the former, if it comes,

the author firmly believes, will be at the most innocuous, incapable of doing us material good, without an Atlantic and Pacific railway on British ground.

One thing may be taken as quite certain : without Confederation the trans-continental railway will never be built ; and in the author's opinion, without the railway (for a waggon road would be simply nowhere) the results of Confederation, if not prejudicial, would be simply *nil*. But with the railway, we cannot help adding, a future worth calling one is before this Colony.

Its vast mineral wealth of the regular English type, its exceeding harbor facilities, and its position relatively to China, the Sandwich Islands, India or Australia, all point to wealth and greatness. Even Free Port, which again has its advocates, would fade into insignificance.

But when will English statesmen learn to treat public questions with a view to Imperial interests ? and not in a spirit of pandering to popularity and economical views !

It will only be necessary, shortly, to allude to the sudden demise of our late Governor. His absence in the North at the time of the celebration of the Queen's birthday was felt by all. His unexpected removal from us by death, on the 10th inst., drew forth the largest funeral attendance, as a token of respect.

**VICTORIA MUNICIPAL AMENDMENT ORDINANCE,  
MARCH 15th 1869.**

By clause 1 the qualification of Mayor and Councillors to be, being the owner at the time of election and three months before of real estate of the value on the Assessment Roll of five hundred dollars. 2. The tax on real estate may be increased from  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{3}$  per cent. All rates and taxes shall be deemed to be due on the 1st April, yearly. Interest at 12 per cent. charged after one month on real estate taxes; after one year the interest and costs may be registered against the land with interest at 18 per cent., &c., &c. By clause 6, the boundaries as per Ordinance, 1867, altered so as to exclude Beacon Hill Park.

By THE ROAD ORDINANCE, MARCH, 9th, 1869, the City of Victoria is a road district. All male residents and all holders of property not exceeding ten acres to pay two dollars yearly; the money to be expended in improving the streets.

THE FIRE COMPANIES' AID ORDINANCE, 1869, gives power to levy a rate of  $\frac{1}{4}$  of one per cent. on all owners of real estate, payable in the first instance by the tenant or occupier, unless such property be already assured against fire through a Victoria agent, in half its municipal assessed value. Fire Assurance Co.'s to make yearly returns of assurances effected, and pay a tax of  $\frac{1}{4}$  of one per cent. The total tax not to exceed \$3,000 in one year, and to be paid over to the Fire Companies in the city.

By THE HEALTH ORDINANCE, 1869, the Corporation of Victoria and the Municipal Council of New Westminster are Local Boards of Health. A Health officer to be appointed by the Governor to superintend Local Boards, &c., &c.; penalty for offering him any obstruction one to two hundred dollars.

The bylaws under the old Act of 1862 re-enacted, with greater penalties, but only after notice first received. A penalty of \$50 is imposed for all persons found selling for food unsound live animals or meat. The port of Victoria to be part of the health district; ships may be boarded and inspected.

THE COMMON SCHOOL ORDINANCE of 1869 repeals the Common School Act, 1865.

School districts may be created on petition to the Governor by two-thirds of resident householders in the district. (For particulars see the Act) No petition required from any existing school district. A Local Board may be elected of three members annually. The Victoria Corporation and New Westminster Council are hereby Local Boards. The Local Boards by public meeting are to decide how the sum required to supplement the

public grants shall be raised. Tuition fees, if any, not to exceed \$2 monthly. The Local Boards to have power to levy an annual tax not exceeding \$2 per head on all resident householders in the district in lieu of fees. The Governor may appropriate not exceeding five hundred dollars for the purpose of assisting the payment of salary of a school teacher, &c., &c. on the Local Board giving satisfactory evidence that the portion promised by them has been secured. Every minister of any religious denomination shall have access to the school for the purpose of instructing the children of his denomination.
