Ontario Welcomes the Tourist

ONTARIO

AREA—407,262 square miles. Three times as large as British Isles, larger than France, and one and a half times as large as Texas; 1,000 miles east to west, 1,075 from north to south. Over 230,000,000 acres of land, of which only 13,500,000 acres are under cultivation; 20,000,000 acres of farm lands in New Ontario.

Directions for Proper Use of this Map.

First—Find the name of City, Town or Village which you want in the Index on pages 47-48-49-50. There you will find after the name of each place three symbols, as for instance, London 1-G-3. The figure 1 means you must locate Map Section 1, and by drawing a line from G and 3 on the Map Section you can put your finger on the place you wish to locate. (There are ten Map Sections for the whole Province of Ontario.)

Second—To find your distance to any desired place, count the number of squares through which your road runs from where you are to the place you want to go; each square is ten miles. Heavy lines on Map represent Provincial Highways. Medium lines represent County Roads; and Light lines represent Township Roads.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO AMERICAN TOURISTS.

Residents of the United States returning from Canada are permitted by Paragraph 1695 of the Tariff Act of 1922 to take into the United States from Canada, without the payment of duty, all wearing apparel, personal and household effects taken by them out of the United States, and, in addition \$100 in value of articles acquired in Canada for personal or household use, or as souvenirs or curios, but not bought on commission or intended for sale.

In this value of \$100 must be included wearing apparel acquired in Canada, regardless of how long or for what purpose it has been worn; but due allowance will be made by the United States Appraising Officers for depreciation through wear and use, and duties will be charged upon articles at their value in their condition when taken back to the United States.

OPERATION OF CARS

Permits

The owner of every motor vehicle driven on the highway must secure a numbered permit for such motor vehicle. Application for such permits is made to the Department on form supplied. Where an owner changes address he must "within 6 days" send by registered letter or cause to be filed in the Department "his new address." In case of a sale or transfer of a motor vehicle for which a Permit has been issued, both vendor and purchaser must within 6 days "forward a notice to the Department of the sale or transfer by or to him." No permit will be issued if the serial number of the motor vehicle is obliterated or defaced.

Driver's License

With three exceptions, no license or permit is required in Ontario for the driver who operates a car. The exceptions are: (a) Chauffeurs, (b) persons between 16 and 18 years of age. No person under 16 may drive a car, and those between 16 and 18 only after they have shown their ability by passing the same examination as chauffeurs, (c) any person who hires a car.

Non-residents.

Residents of other Provinces of Canada permitted to operate with home Province license for three months. Residents of United States for 30 days in one year. Chauffeurs exempt for same periods.

Speed

Cars must not be driven at a greater rate of speed than 20 miles per hour in cities, towns and villages, and outside these not at a greater rate than 25 miles per hour. Circumstances may make even these rates unlawful, for the Act provides: "Any person who drives a motor vehicle on a highway recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances, shall be guilty of an offence." At curves and street intersections where the driver "has not a clear view of any approaching traffic," the speed must be reduced to one-half the above rates. Driving a car in a race or by an intoxicated person is specifically forbidden.

Passing Street Cars and Horse-Drawn

Vehicles

There are special provisions about passing street cars and horse-drawn vehicles. While a street car or radial car is standing to take on or discharge passengers, a motor vehicle shall not pass it or approach within 6 feet "until the passengers have got on or got safely to the side of the road, as the case may be." A motor vehicle must not pass on the left-hand side of any street car which is operated in the centre of the highway, whether such street car is stationary or in motion. When approaching horses, "all reasonable precautions to prevent frighten-

ing them" must be taken. If signalled by the driver to do so, the operator must stop both his car and his engine.

Rules of the Road.

The rules of the road to be observed are, briefly, these. In meeting vehicles, turn to the right of the centre of the road. In overtaking them, give audible warning, and pass on the left of the vehicle overtaken, which is required to turn to the right, and leave one-half of the travelled road free for you to pass. When you are coming to an intersection, vehicles on your right hand have the right of way; vehicles on your left hand give way to you.

Municipal By-Laws

There are local traffic rules in most cities and towns. These must be observed where they are not inconsistent with the provisions of the Act above set out. Some cities have by-law designated certain streets as through streets. Vehicles travelling upon side streets must stop before crossing through streets. Such by-laws are valid if approved by the Department of Highways.

EQUIPMENT.

Headlights

Provisions to regulate glaring headlights are in force. Headlights must be so designed or arranged that no parallel beam or light, "when measured 75 feet or more ahead of the lamps, shall rise above 42 inches from the level surface." No headlight non-glare device will be recognized as legal which has not been approved by the Department of Highways. Spotlights may be used if affixed to the left side of the car and the light projected so as to "strike the extreme line of the travelled portion of the

highway within seventy-five feet of the vehicle." SPOTLIGHTS which revolve upon a pivot are forbidden. Parking lights allowed.

Brakes

Every motor vehicle shall be "equipped with at least two brakes in good working order." Any police officer may, at any time, cause an inspection to be made of the brakes and require the driver to have the brakes put in good working order.

ACCIDENTS

If an accident occurs on the highway, every person in charge of a vehicle "who is directly or indirectly a party to the accident, shall remain at or return to the scene of the accident and render all possible assistance and give in writing to anyone sustaining loss or injury, his name and address and also the name and address of the owner of the vehicle and the number of the permit."

Liability of the Owner

Wherever there is a violation of the Highway Traffic Act, or any act of negligence on the part of the driver, and as a result any person sustains loss, both the owner and the driver are liable in damages, as well as to the penalties referred to. The only exception to this liability on the part of the owner is where at the time of the violation the car was "in the possession of some person other than the owner or his chauffeur without the owner's consent."

Limitations and Actions

No action shall be brought against a person for the recovery of damages occasioned by a motor vehicle after the expiration of were sustained.

Witnesses, Etc.

In almost every case where an action is brought against an owner or driver for damages, his liability will depend upon a question of fact—was he or was he not guilty of negligence? That question is determined by a Court or Jury solely upon the evidence and credibility of witnesses. As the Act further imposes upon the owner or driver the burden of proving that he was not guilty of negligence, it is of the utmost importance that the names of witnesses be secured, and all data preserved that will assist in the defence of any action that may be brought.

The provision of the Act which places the onus on the defendant in actions for damages caused by a motor vehicle does not apply in case of collisions between motor vehicles on the highway.

OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

Time Limit for Serving Summons

A summons issued for violation of the Act shall be served "within ten days of the alleged offence," provided that the time may be extended by a Magistrate upon evidence showing "that the person summoned could not be served within the time specified."

Criminal Negligence

In addition to the penalties imposed by the Highway Traffic Act, 1923, the Criminal Code makes every one guilty of an indictable offence, and liable to two years' imprisonment, "who causes grievous bodily harm" to any person by furious driving, wilful misconduct, or by the neglect of any duty imposed upon him. The provisions of the Code may be invoked where bodily injury is done, and not in cases of property damage only.

Defence of Alibi

Where it is an alleged offence has been committed against the Act and the owner is summoned to appear in a County "other than the one in which he resides," the owner may wish to show that neither he nor his motor vehicle were at the place of the alleged offence at the time. In that case the owner may appear with two witnesses before a Justice of the Peace in his own County, and there give proof of his defence.

Trial Before Justice.

When you are charged with a violation of the law, you should be summoned within a reasonable time. You are entitled to information as to the time and place the offence was committed, and to an adjournment, if necessary, to procure witnesses or counsel. The evidence of the complainant must show beyond reasonable doubt that an offence was committed, and you should be particular to see that both the wording of the summons and the evidence given show an offence within the wording of the Highway Traffic Act or some valid municipal by-law. Sometimes it does not.

CANADIAN CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

For a period of one month a motorist who is a resident of the United States may bring his car into Canada for touring purposes only and return to the United States either by the port of entry or by any other port, without having to file a bond with the Canadian Customs officials. All that is required is that he fill out at the Customs Office on the border on entering Canada, a form in which particulars are given respecting his car. This form is made out in duplicate, a copy being retained by the Customs officer, and one by the motorist, which is to be surrendered to the Customs officer at the port of exit on leaving Canada.

The motorist should carry with him the automobile registration card identifying his car, as this must be displayed on demand of Customs officials.

If the tourist intends to keep his car in Canada, for longer than one month, it will be necessary for him to provide a bond.

Under this bond he may keep his car in Canada, and use it for touring purposes only, for a period up to six months in one year, but at the expiration of this time no extension or renewal will be permitted.

The following States have reciprocity for thirty days with Ontario in respect to motor vehicle licenses, with the exception of those indicated:

Alabama, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire (20 days), New Jersey (15 days), New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming, Washington.

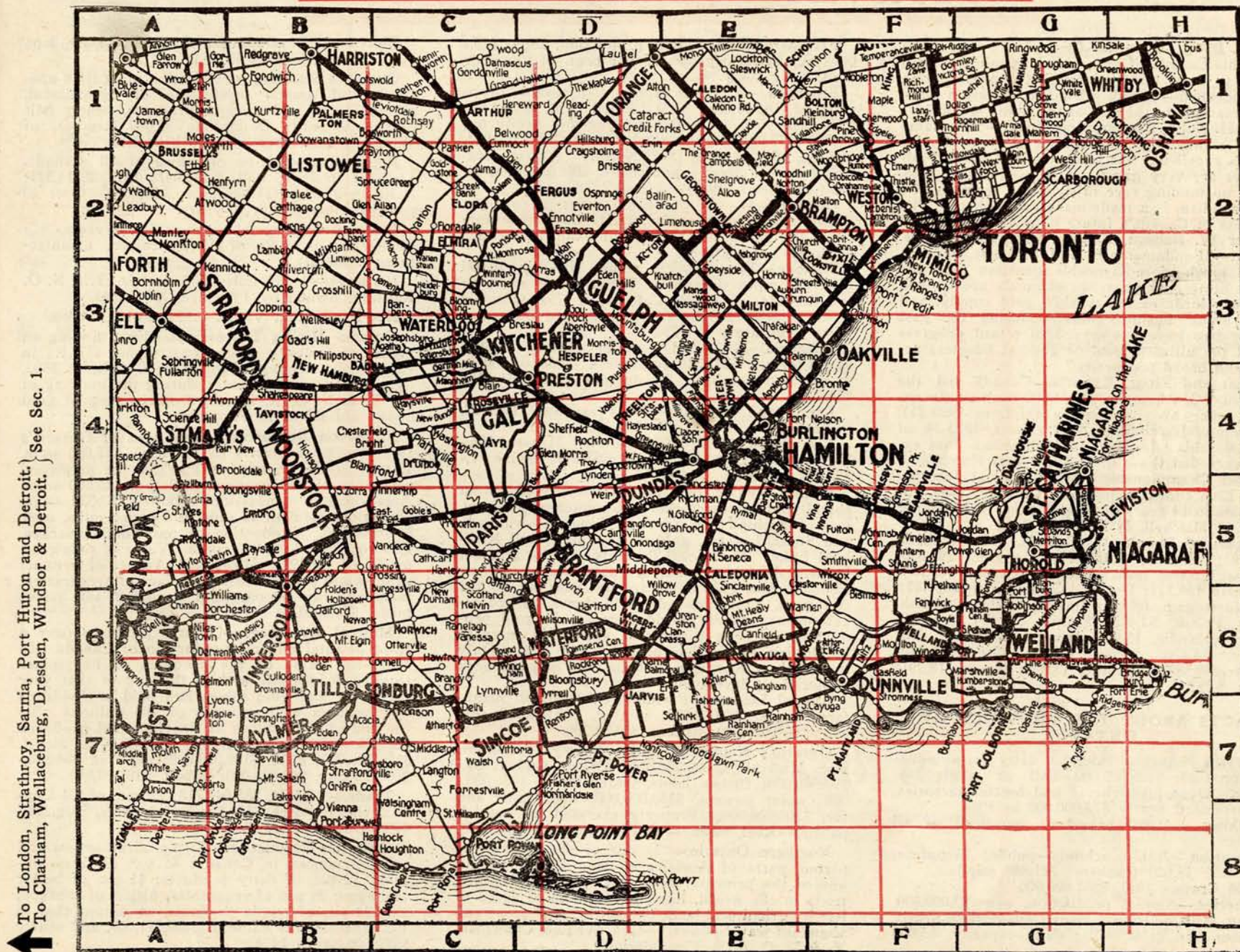

Facts About Canada and Ontario

Lord Byng, Governor-General: "I am keen about this Canada of ours—for it is mine, as well as yours. It is the beginning of a great nation full of idealism—proud, self-made, setting a wonderful example to the rest of the living world."

Otto H. Kahn, Banker, New York:—"The name Canada stands high throughout the world. Its credit is excellent. Its resources and natural advantages are very great. It is producing a fine, sturdy, upstanding race of men and women. To be a Canadian, is a trade-mark everywhere. The greatness of Canada's future is beyond question."

Roger W. Babson, Babson Statistical Service, Boston:—"Fundamentally and basically, Canada is in a much more favorable situation than the United States, whose trade channels are choked with two-thirds of the world's gold supply, and where minor business flurries during the past year or two have but served to retard progress toward the ultimate goal of general business activity and broad prosperity."

Wheat and Flour Exports.—Canada led the world in 1923-24, with 292,424,000 bush.; only exceeded once by any country (U.S. in 1920-21). Canada stood second in flour export, 1923-24, of 12,022,000 bbls. In May, 1924, Canadian flour exports exceeded those of U.S. for first time.

Wheat Championship.—Was won at International Live Stock Exhibition, Chicago, 1924, for 13th time in 14 years of competition. 1924 winner was J. C. Mitchell, of Dahinda, Sask.

Origins of People in Canada, 1921.—British, 4,868,903; French, 2,452,751; German, 294,636; Hebrew, 126,196; Indian, 110,814; Russian, 100,064; Ukrainian 106,721; Dutch, 117,506; Austrian, 107,671; Norwegian, 68,856; Italian, 66,769; Swedish, 61,503; Polish, 53,403; Finnish, 21,494; Danish, 21,124; Icelandic, 15,876; Hungarian, 13,470; Rumanian, 13,470; Swiss, 12,837; Greek, 5,740; Chinese, 39,587; Japanese, 15,868; Negro, 18,291; Syrian, 8,282.

Dairying.—Annual value of dairy farm industry's product, \$125,000,000—half of whole Dominion. Over 1,000 cheese and butter factories, etc., produced nearly \$75,000,000 in 1924.

Good Roads.—Of the 49,875 miles of roads in southern part of province, 27,117 have been surfaced and paved, or over half of total. 1,874 miles of provincial highway.

History.—First settled about 1784 by 10,000 United Empire Loyalists. Ontario set apart as the Province of Upper Canada, in 1791, with Sir J. G. Simcoe as the first Lieutenant-Governor. First Legislature in 1792.

Industrial.—1922, 9,174 major plants; capital, \$1,643,187,941. 237,319 employees. \$268,662,730 in wages and salaries. Production value, \$1,274,424,802.

Lands and Forests.—Gross revenue, 1921-22, \$4,439,340.

Live Stock.—1922, 6,062,084, viz.: Horses, 685,852; cattle, 2,836,181; sheep, 986,617; swine, 1,553,434. Poultry, 13,964,317.

Mining.—Value, 1923, \$80,951,149. Pre-Cambrian shield contains the nickel and copper of Sudbury, iron of Michipicoten, silver of Cobalt, Gowganada and South Lorrain, gold of Porcupine and Kirkland Lake. The nickel deposits are the greatest known; the silver mines are phenomenal in their richness, and gold fields are not excelled on the continent. Ontario's gold yield shows marked development. While world decrease in gold production has been 36 per cent. since 1915, increase in Ontario output has been 156 per cent. Only one-tenth of Northern Ontario gold belt has been explored or developed.

Annual Income.—Farming, \$450,000,000; manufacturing, \$2,000,000,000; mining, \$80,000,000; forestry, \$90,000,000; fishing, \$3,000,000.

Ontario's Natural Wealth.—Nearly 10 billions, viz.: Mineral, \$2,000,000,000; Crown timber, \$4,797,500,000; Crown lands, undeveloped, \$230,000,000; water powers, \$150,000,000; fish, game and fur, \$200,000,000. Property assessed by municipalities—Real, business and income, \$2,410,723,053.

Northern Ontario.—"Is one of the most prosperous parts of America to-day. Besides being one of the principal gold and silver mining districts in the world, has also millions of acres of fertile agricultural land; extensive forest areas and abundant water-power."—Geo. W. Lee, Chairman, T. & N. O. R. R. Commission.

Electrical Development.—1924, 1,445,480 h.p., out of available 4,950,300 h.p.

Ontario's Standing.—Population more than one-third, and annual production of agricultural, manufactured and mineral products, nearly half of that of entire Dominion. 30,000 members of Women's Institutes in 1,000 branches.

Population.—Now one-third of all Canada. 1,620,851 in 1871; 1901, 2,182,947; 1891, 2,114,321; 1921, 2,933,662; 1924 estimate, 3,062,000. Over 10 per cent. increase in 10 years.

Production.—Annual average for 5 years, \$2,400,000,000, or 45 p.c. of all (agriculture, manufactures, mineral).

Railways.—11,000 miles, 767 electric. T. & N. O. Railway, owned by Province, 329 miles.

Net Production Value.—1922, \$1,159,614,460.

Ontario Mining Discoveries.—First finding of nickel at Sudbury when constructing C.P.R., in 1883; next, striking of silver at Cobalt, in 1903, by a blacksmith's hammer, during the building of the T. & N. O. R. R.; third, uncovering of gold at the old Dome in Porcupine.

Pulpwood Resources.—Total area of Ontario's forest lands (exclusive of Patricia), 125,000 sq.m. Extent of the District of Patricia, the pulpwood resources of which are unexplored, 146,000 sq.m. Area of pulp concessions granted, 33,325 sq.m. Capital investment in pulp and paper mills, over \$140,000,000. Production of pulpwood (average, 1917 to 1921), 1,000,000 cords. Value of pulpwood produced in 1921, \$16,626,104. Value of product of pulp and paper industry at place of preparation, including raw wood, pulp exported and paper made, \$70,000,000.

Mineral Resources.—Ontario produces over a third of total mineral production of Canada. In 1922, the value of the products of her mines totalled \$65,867,183, and to the end of that year the silver and gold mines had paid in dividends and bonuses well upwards of 104 millions. To the end of 1922, mines of Province had produced \$675,388,185, viz.: Silver, \$220,800,000; nickel, \$176,700,000; gold, \$108,300,000; pig iron \$84,800,000; copper, \$60,800,000; cobalt, \$10,100,000.

Trade.—1923-24, \$85,047,718; 25 p.c. of all Canada, viz., imports, \$454,809,219; exports, \$396,238,499. Duty, \$64,822,162.

Ontario's Production.—23 p.c. of all grains and roots produced in Canada; 46 p.c. of farm animals, 52 p.c. of dairy products; 41 p.c. of butter and eggs; 29 p.c. of vegetables; 61 p.c. of tobacco; and 23 p.c. of maple products, an output that in 1923 reached the value of \$400,511,000, and nearly \$500,000,000 in 1924.

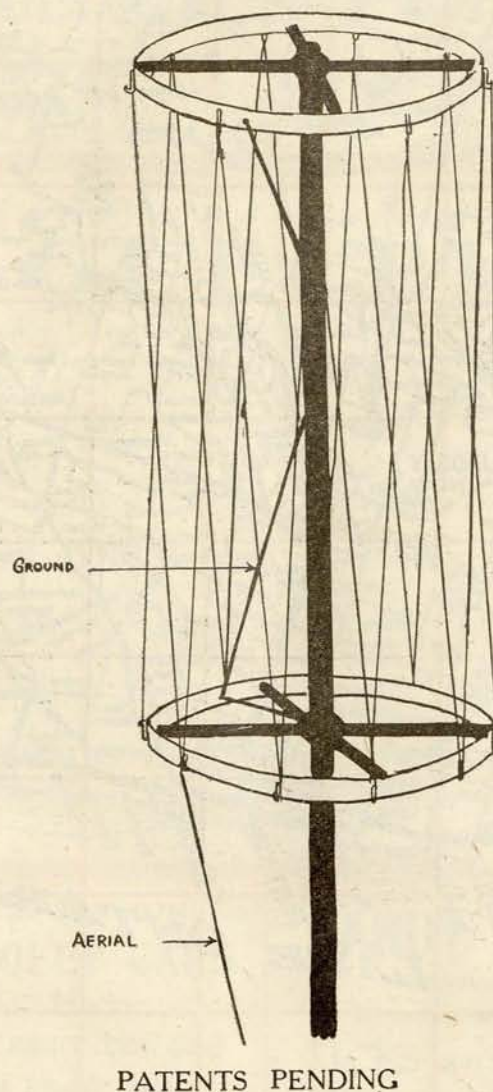

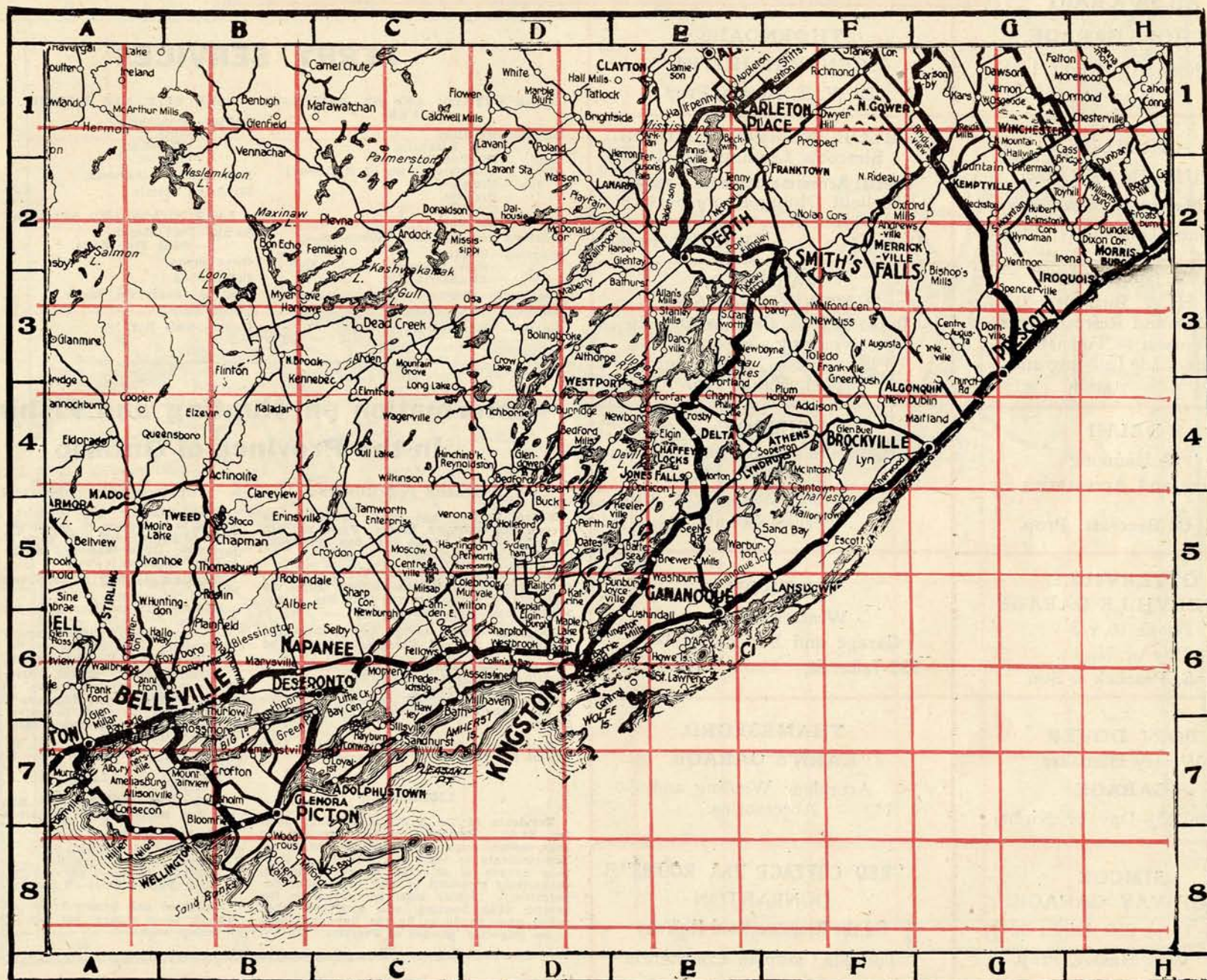

Partridge—From the 5th day of November to the 20th day of November. Limit:—10

Grouse and Pheasant—Closed until 1925. Partridges per Season each Person.

Duck—From the 1st day of September to the 15th day of December, both days inclusive.

Wild Geese—1st day of September to 15th day of December, both days inclusive.

LICENSES.

Residents of the Province to hunt deer, fee, \$3.00. Residents of the Province to hunt moose, reindeer or caribou, fee \$5.00. Non-residents to hunt, fee, \$25.00. A shipping coupon is attached to every license, authorizing shipment of deer (see under Exportation). License must be carried on the person when hunting, and produced when called upon to do so by the Superintendent or an inspector, warden or overseer.

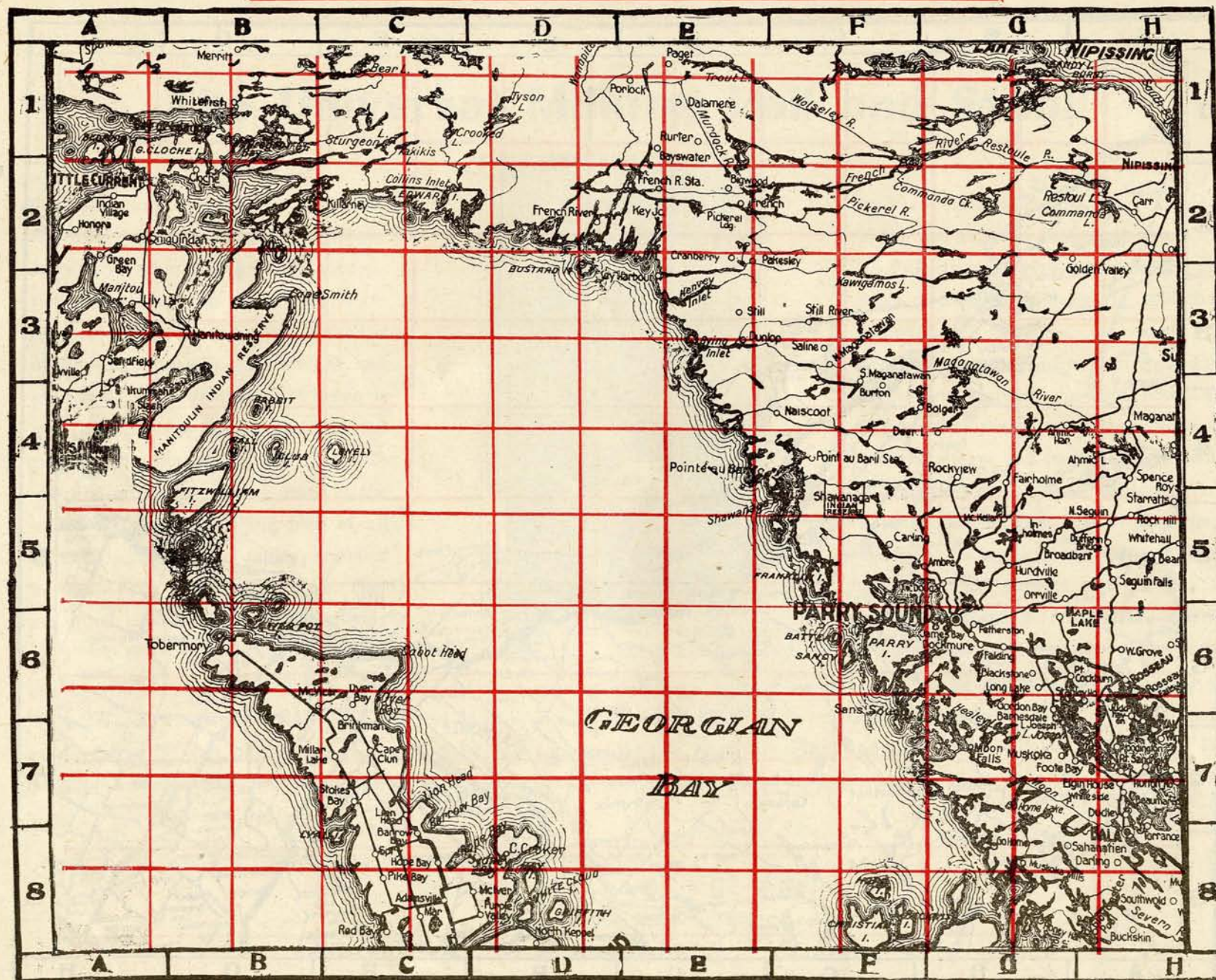


SCALE 10 MILES TO SQUARE

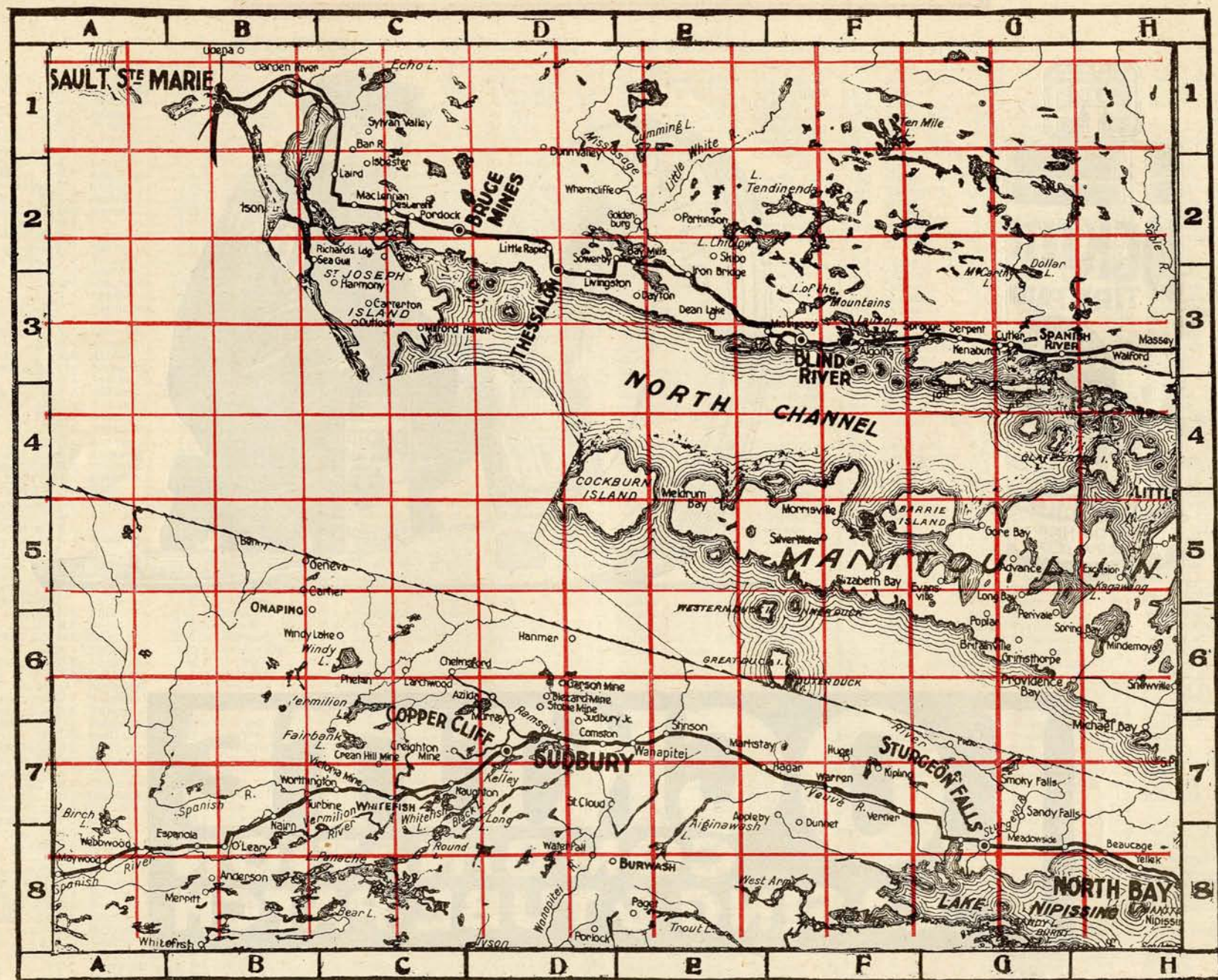

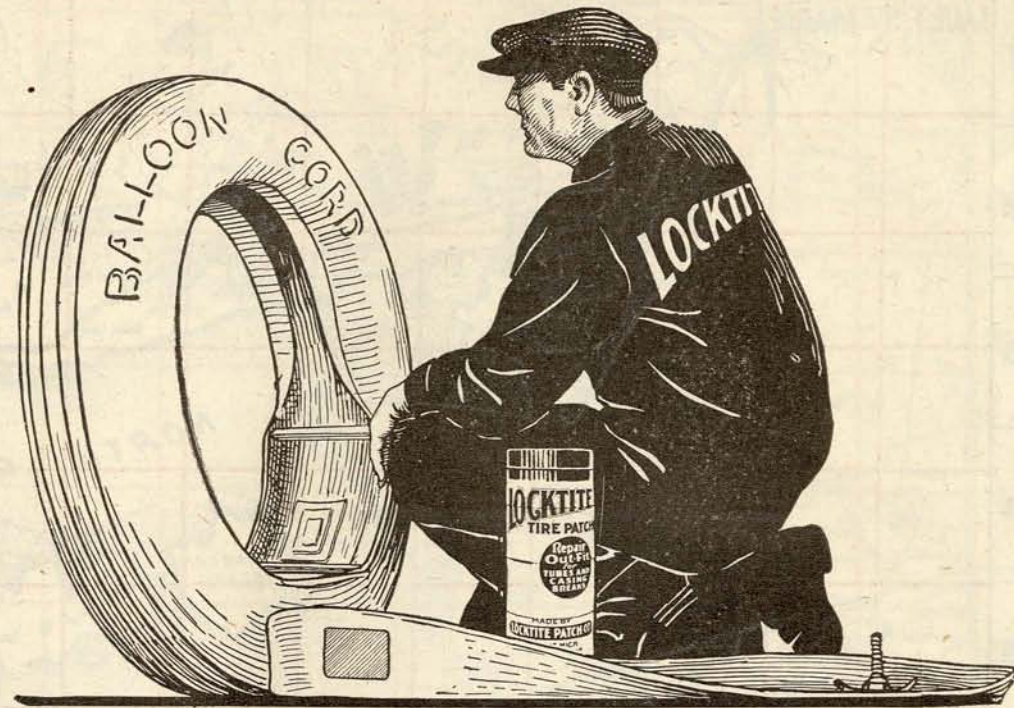
