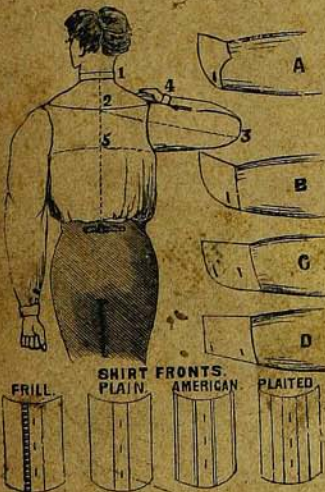

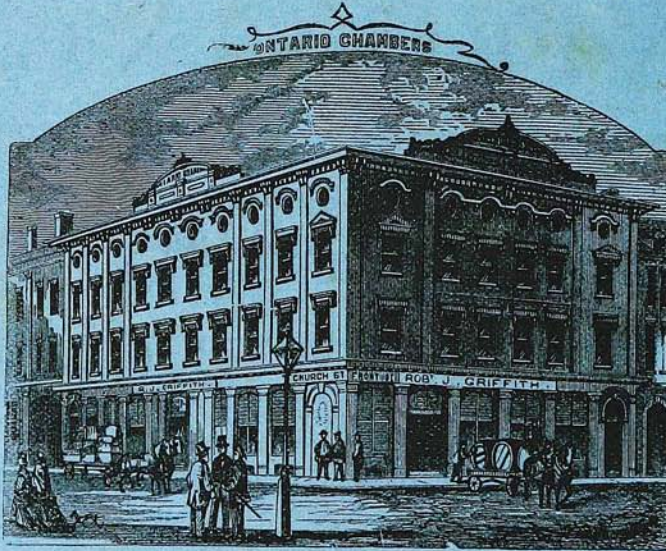

NORTHERN RAILWAY CO. OF CANADA.

The line of road now owned and operated by this company was built under the charter of the "Ontario, Simcoe and Lake Huron Railroad Company," which was approved, August, 1849. The road was opened from Toronto to Aurora, 30 miles, in May, 1853, to Bradford in June, and to Barrie in October of the same year. By the close of 1854 the whole line from Toronto to Collingwood, with branch from Lefroy to Bell Ewart, was completed. The "Ontario, Simcoe and Lake Huron Railway Company" organized with a capital stock of \$2,000,000; but authority was subsequently granted to increase the same to \$3,000,000, and to borrow a further sum of \$1,200,000. The Company received from the Government, in the shape of guarantee, £475,000 sterling, and the interest on the government bonds, issued in its behalf, was duly paid up to January, 1856; but such interest was paid out of capital, and as soon as the capital account was closed further payments ceased. In the first few years of its existence the managers of the road between Toronto and Collingwood appear to have devoted considerable attention to *through* business, and to the establishment of steamboat lines in the interest of the railroad company from Chicago to Collingwood, and from Toronto to various ports on Lake Ontario; but experience soon demonstrated that this trade was too fluctuating and hazardous to be relied on as a special source of revenue, and an entirely new policy was inaugurated in 1859, when the title of the Company was changed, and a re-organization of its finances was concluded. Since that time attention has been paid to the development of local traffic, and no business has been touched which at any rate did not leave some margin of profit. The wisdom of this policy has been clearly demonstrated, and earnings have now increased from \$40,044 86 in 1859, to \$894,774 40 in 1872, while operating expenses have been reduced from 82 per cent. to a little more than 60 per cent. of gross earnings. It has been stated above that after 1856 the Company failed to pay the interest on the Government loan, and the arrears of interest accumulated so rapidly that the question of selling the road in accordance with the existing lien of the Government was seriously agitated; but it was argued by those who appreciated the best interests of the Province that there was no reasonable hope at that time of finding persons who would give an adequate price for the property, and that in the event of a sale the Government would be compelled either to sacrifice its entire claim, or to assume the works themselves, and advance from provincial funds the sums required to maintain the line. It was therefore recommended that the whole property should be revested in the company, and that it should be allowed to issue £250,000 sterling of first preference bonds, which should displace the provincial lien. Certain stipulations were made about the prompt repayment to the Government of advances which it had made in 1856 to keep the road in repair, and the following financial basis was ultimately agreed on: (1) first preference bonds, £250,000; (2) second preference bonds, £223,189 14s. 6d.; (3) Government lien, £475,000; (4) balance of interest arrears due the Province, £50,000; (5) interest arrears on Company's bonds, £43,434 8s. 4d.; (6) stock subscriptions, £169,276 8s. 3d.: total liabilities, £1,297,825 11s. 1d. It will be seen from the above statement of liabilities that the road from Toronto to Collingwood had cost £18,000 per mile,—a striking proof of the reckless manner in which the road had been built and the property managed; and those who had sufficient faith in the ultimate success of the enterprise to undertake the intricate task of extricating the Company from its difficulties and developing the earning abilities of the property, deserve the highest praise for the consistency with which they have adhered to one settled line of policy, and placed the road in a condition to pay regularly the annual interest upon its bonded debt.

The report for half year ending July 31, 1874, shows that the gross traffic receipts were \$432,052 68, as against \$441,528 06 in 1873,—a decrease of 2.14 per cent. The ordinary operating expenses were \$267,785 62, as against \$276,386 23 in 1873; and the ratio of operating expenses in 1874 was 61.97 per cent., as in comparison with 64.67 per cent. in 1873. The expenditures upon necessary extensions and additions to works, buildings, rolling stock, and general equipment, amounting in the aggregate to \$51,717 27, was charged to revenue. The equipment of the Northern Railway

Company now consists of 32 locomotives, 24 passenger cars, 6 mail, baggage, and express cars, and 729 freight cars of all classes; but the equipment is entirely insufficient for the requirements of the traffic, and propositions have been made, both to the English and Canadian proprietors, for permission to re-arrange the capital account, and thereby enable the managers to carry out a wise and comprehensive scheme of improvements. This scheme contemplates a change of gauge, and the purchase of sufficient new rolling stock to meet the demands of a rapidly increasing traffic. This change of gauge is further necessitated by the fact, that the Great Western and Grand Trunk Railway Companies have both abandoned the old provincial gauge of 5 feet 6 inches, and if the *Northern Railway Company* contemplate maintaining business relations and interchange of traffic with other railway companies, it must adopt a similar gauge to that of its principal connections. It may be appropriately noted here that the English proprietors have consented in a liberal spirit to the adoption of any course which may be necessary to secure the permanent efficiency of the road, conditioned that such course does not prejudice their existing interests; and as the Dominion Parliament, at its last session, agreed to such amendments of the charter as will enable the Company to create new capital, there is no doubt that the improvements will be carried out, and that the onward progress of the *Northern Railway Company* to financial prosperity and success will not be retarded.

This line, occupying as it does the shortest Railway communication between the waters of Lakes Huron and Ontario, is the shortest route for transit to the Lake Superior mining district and Manitoba. The "Collingwood and Lake Superior Line," the steamers of which leave Collingwood every Tuesday and Friday, was the first steamboat line established in connection with the North Shore of Lake Superior. Its steamers are now of the finest character, and its reputation for speed and comfort unsurpassed. As the route of this line avoids the open waters of Lake Huron and passes through the beautiful scenery of the "North Channel" on the northern shores of Manitoulin Island, it is becoming a favorite resort for summer excursionists. Complete connections have also been made with the Dawson Route at Thunder Bay, and the Northern Pacific Railway at Duluth, by which freight and passengers are forwarded cheaply and with facility to all points in Manitoba.

The Northern Railway is also the great highway to the Free Grants District of Muskoka; and so soon as the Extension Railway is completed to Gravenhurst, will bring the furthest part of that district within 10 hours of Toronto.

Above all things, the Northern Railway is a Local Line. It has stations at an average of every 3 miles, the policy of its managers since 1859 having been to aid and facilitate the development of the local resources of the country, giving this their first attention; and in this way they have largely contributed to the advancement and progress of the district which is tributary to the Line.

NORTHERN EXTENSION RAILWAY CO.

This company was formed by the amalgamation of the Toronto, Simcoe and Muskoka and the North Grey Railway Companies, both of which had been projected and constructed to form feeders to the Northern Railway, and to retain territory which was being entered by rival railway projects.

The North Grey, 20½ miles in length, runs along the south-west shore of Georgian Bay from Collingwood to Meaford. It was originally intended to have been extended to Owen Sound, but the inhabitants of that town not granting the assistance required, the project was abandoned and Meaford made the terminus. The Toronto, Simcoe and Muskoka was projected to reach the Muskoka district, and retain to Toronto the trade which, it was feared, would be abstracted from it by the Midland Railway, and was opened from Barrie to Orillia in 1872.

These lines having been amalgamated, construction has been proceeded with on the Muskoka Branch, fourteen miles being added in 1873, and three miles to Severnbridge in 1874; but it is a subject of regret and of commercial injury to Toronto and the district of Muskoka, that owing to the small measure of government and municipal aid given to the road, the Extension Company is not in a position of sufficient financial strength to press its works to completion with that rapidity which the public interests would dictate. There remain but twelve miles, of which a large portion of the grading has been done, to reach Lake Muskoka; and there is no doubt that once this link is completed, the whole Muskoka district will spring into activity and wealth.

The lines of this company are leased of the Northern Railway Company upon a contract, whereby 35 per cent. of the gross earning inures to the lessors; and as the lessees have been unable to furnish the necessary equipment for the due development of the traffic, the question naturally arises whether the Extension Company will not have a legal right of redress against them if the sufficient amount of equipment is not promptly furnished.

The policy of constructing these feeders has been amply justified, as, while contributing very largely their traffic to the main line, they have created a good traffic upon their own mileage; and it is instructive to notice that in 1874, while the earnings of the Northern Railway decreased $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., the earnings of the Extension Railway increased $48\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. This, with an incomplete line, is very satisfactory; and there is no doubt that so soon as the Extension is completed to Gravenhurst, a traffic will arise which will fulfil the ideas of its projectors.

THE MONTREAL TELEGRAPH CO.

This popular Company, which has its wires laid along the line of the Northern Railway and its connections, was incorporated in the year 1846, with a capital of \$60,000, and began its operations with 12 or 15 offices between Montreal and Quebec. Its history has been an uninterrupted success from the start; its lines having been extended to the remotest sections of the country wherever they can be maintained, and offices opened in nearly every village and hamlet throughout the country. Its capital stock has been increased to \$1,750,000; its miles of lines to 21,000; and its number of offices to 1,200. Extensions are constantly going forward into newer and remoter sections of the country as routes are opened up, and new offices are almost daily being opened.

This company is apparently unaffected in its prosperity by rival schemes, having outlived several in the course of its history. No country in the world is probably better served in the matter of telegraphic communication than Canada. The great abilities and enterprising spirit of Sir Hugh Allan, the President of the Company, have been as serviceable in developing the organization we are now describing as in founding the magnificent system of Oceanic communication with which his name is so familiarly identified. An enterprising, but at the same time shrewd and far-seeing policy has, in fact, characterized the Company's operations from the very outset. In this respect, and in all questions demanding liberal and comprehensive action, this Company has been greatly assisted by possessing in Mr. H. P. Dwight, the Superintendent of the Western District, a gentleman who has had regard not so much for an immediate return for the work undertaken as the certain steady expansion of business in a corresponding ratio with the increase of trade or population. Mr. Dwight's management extends over the most important section of the Company's territory.

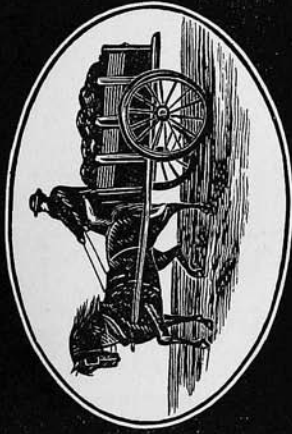

BRACEBRIDGE.—An Incorporated Village in the Township of Macaulay, District of Muskoka, at the head of navigation, and at the confluence of the North and South branches of the Muskoka River, distant from Washago, the present terminus of the Northern Railway, 23 miles. Population, 800. It contains one telegraph office, one express office, two newspapers, one public school, one woollen factory, saw and grist mills with good privileges for more, as the locality abounds with falls and cascades, making it also a favorite resort for summer tourists. It is the

district seat of the stipendiary magistrate, the Crown Lands agent, the registrar, issuer of licenses, &c., and will no doubt soon be the County Town, as a movement is on foot to have Muskoka formed into a county for municipal purposes. Steamboats arrive daily during the season of navigation, and in winter daily stages connect with the Northern Railway. Stages also leave Bracebridge, Huntsville route tri-weekly, Baysville route weekly, Ullswater route semi-weekly, Uffington route semi-weekly, and in winter the Parry Sound route, tri-weekly; steamer Nipissing carrying mails daily between Gravenhurst and Rosseau, calling at Bracebridge; fare, 50 cents.

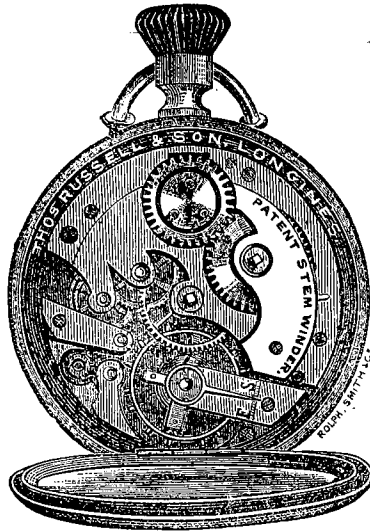

T O R O N T O .

The readers of Moore, who, as the boat stretches across the lake, and Toronto, bristling with spires, lying gracefully laid out on the slight acclivity which slopes from the Bay to Yorkville, is pointed out to him, recalls the lines,

Where the blue hills of old Toronto shed
Their evening shadow o'er Ontario's bed,

will have abundant reason to reflect on the truth that the poet is of imagination all compact. If he asks, "Where are the hills?"—there is no hill to echo "where." Having left the great inland sea, with its blue shores receding on the left, and on the right surf-beaten shores of farm lands merging into the tender-tinted sky horizon, that sweeps away far to starboard, he enters a bay, protected by a natural breakwater. He is now in the presence of a great city—a city of magnificent buildings—arborescent streets, and activity of life which rightly belongs to the "Queen City" of the West, and the prosperous capital of Ontario.

This continent is the continent of cities of rapid growth. Like Jonah's gourd, they grow up in a night—but, unlike that famous vegetable, they can look forward to a longevity as great as that which has fallen to the share of mighty cities of the Old World. Little more than half a century ago wild duck might have been shot where there are now busy wharves; and where straight and spacious streets intersect each other, stately with lofty buildings; where stores are rising hourly; where large and handsome churches are scattered round; where a Park spreads itself out, a spacious lung for the future crowded city; where colleges, one of which can be described as magnificent as a building and in all its appliances, are as numerous as there are sections in the community; where pretty women, dressed in the latest fashions from London and Paris, are hurried forward in the rapid sleigh, or saunter of a Saturday down the brilliant King Street promenade—where all this and more may be seen in the course of a day, there, within the memory of men still living, the Indian may have been met with hunting a trail, or bartering in barbarous commerce.

Built on Tamarac Swamp, which was chosen as the site of the future capital by Governor Simcoe, standing in the midst of a wealthy agricultural country, Toronto is a great and growing market, and forms a connecting link between the Old World and the daily-developing resources of the vast West. The city can be observed to grow as we gaze at it. Within a few years some of its most conspicuous buildings have been erected. Fifty years ago the city lay east of the present market-place. In 1829 there were no more than seven brick houses in the whole city; shanties were the order of the day. Nor was it until some score of years ago that the Railway brought with it a breath of power, which has sent forward the city with mighty strides. Henceforth the North-West had a future and offered a career. The development of that great country is going steadily forward, and as it progresses, Toronto—which must be the great *entrepot* of its commerce, the market of its produce—must grow in wealth, in importance and power.

The stranger landing from boat, or stepping from train, has only to cast his eye down Front Street, with its succession of splendid warehouses, to see what Toronto is commercially. Walking up Yonge Street, he soon finds himself in King Street, at once the great business route and fashionable promenade. On the left of the journey eastward, he will pass the great publishing house of Adam, Stevenson & Co., a monument of the reading and literary ability of the Dominion, whence the *Canadian Monthly* issues; the *Globe* and the *Leader* offices; at the head of Toronto Street, which turns up opposite the *Leader* office, the handsome new Post Office; farther east, St. James' Cathedral on one side, and the St. Lawrence Hall on the other; while looking westward we have the office of the *Mail*, the Rossin House, the official residence of the Lieutenant-Governor, and so past the fashionable quarter on to the most picturesque drives round Toronto. Here on one side we have the lake rolling against a bold bluff, and on the other sweetly wooded streams,

and miniature pictures of fairy scenery. After Queen Street, those which run parallel with King Street, where we have kept the traveller standing a long time, most of the streets are occupied with private residences, some of which are very handsome. Yonge Street, which runs right north from the crossing, where we have button-holed him, is a business street full of activity; running parallel with it are on the west (we mention a few residential routes) Simcoe Street and John Street, both fashionable neighborhoods, and on the east, Church Street and Jarvis Street, which are not without claims of their own—especially Jarvis Street. Carlton Street, which runs nearly from the entrance to the Park in Yonge Street across the whole east of the city, should be mentioned as a place where fine residences, and a new handsome church, St. Peter's, as well as the Horticultural Gardens, may be encountered.

And now, to be more particular, St. James' Cathedral, facing on King Street, and a fine specimen of Gothic architecture, which rose in 10 months, in 1849, when the original building was burned down. The chancel, semi-octagonal in form, is pierced by windows of the transition period; the graining and general ornamentation being in strictest keeping with the gothic style. The internal height of the nave is 70; of the aisles, 35; length, 20; width, 115 feet.

Some distance on the left, up Church Street, little inferior in beauty and finish, the largest Methodist Church in the world, the Metropolitan, stands. It will accommodate 3,000 persons, and is an admirable specimen of florid ecclesiastical gothic. It was built through the exertions of Mr. Punshon, the greatest master of florid pulpit rhetoric in the world, and might not inappropriately bear over its principal door-way "*Quid facundia posset, re patuit.*" The inside is characterized by beauty, neatness and light.

The Roman Catholic Cathedral, standing a little higher up, is outside a chaste structure; inside gorgeously ornamented, and is said to be the second handsomest Roman Catholic Church in Canada. Of St. Paul's, St. Peter's, Trinity, St. George's, St. Andrew's, Knox's Church, and others, it is sufficient to say that all of them are appropriate for the purpose of Divine worship, and most of them are ornaments to the city.

The St. Lawrence Hall, erected in 1850, and having a front extending along King Street for 140 feet, is a fine structure, with a well-finished hall inside; the front being of cut stone, and the architecture known as Roman-Corinthian. In its rear runs the St. Lawrence Market, 200 feet in length and 39 in breadth, with stores on either side. In the cupola, there is a fine-toned alarm bell, weighing 2,130 lbs., which is frequently heard during the winter, when the stove pipes grow too warm, and the hurry and roar of the fire-breathing engine is heard in the highway.

The City Hall, built in the Italian style, and completed so recently as 1857, has a frontage of 140 feet, and extends the length of 178 feet to the Bay. The aggregate cost amounted to \$13,000.

Amongst Hotels, the first calling for mention are the "Queen's" and the "Rossin House," the former on Front Street, and commanding the Bay and Lake; the latter at the corner of King and York Streets. The "American" and the "Walker House," a new structure, and the "Revere House," standing opposite the "Rossin," are also very good hotels.

The Houses of the Ontario Parliament—exceedingly old-fashioned structures—stand between Simcoe and John Streets, and looking on to Front Street, face the Bay. The chamber is a handsome room, and there is a good library attached. Near this, to the north, is the palatial residence of the Lieutenant-Governor.

If, on leaving the Government House, the traveller proceeds northward, he passes Upper Canada College, where most of the promising youth of Ontario have been and are educated; and getting into Queen Street, let him turn to the left, and walk, or drive, for some miles westward through this busy thoroughfare, and he will stand before a spacious building, erected 23 years ago, and the dome of which may be seen from the Lake for 30 miles. "The chief architectural feature about the building consists," says a writer in the *Globe*, "of a hexastyle portico, in the Grecian-Ionic order, of cut stone; the columns are raised upon a lofty rusticated base, occupying a storey and a-half in height, with two handsome flights of stone steps, and a bold stone landing; the tympanum of the pediment

is ornamented with the Royal Arms in *bas relief*. The centre building is surmounted by a lofty dome, covered with tin (which can be seen for thirty miles on the Lake), within which is the wrought iron tank, or reservoir, capable of containing eleven thousand gallons of water, which is pumped up daily from the Lake by a steam engine."

Near the Asylum are the old and new forts, the latter built substantially of stone.

Nearly facing the Lunatic Asylum is Trinity College, a building in the third period of English architecture. Its rooms and chapels are fitted up in the very best style, and it possesses a fine quadrangle of 170 by 120 feet. The College is entirely devoted to the Church of England, and the University connected with it confers degrees only on candidates who, on oath, profess themselves attached sincerely to the Church of England.

Coming back eastward along Queen Street we pass the Park Avenue—which furnishes a magnificent vista—and then find our attention arrested by Osgoode Hall, a fine, two storey building, consisting of a central block, and two large projecting wings, stone-faced. This is the temple dedicated to Themis in the capital of Ontario, and it may with truth be said she has no unworthy shrine; the courts are roomy and well ventilated, and the library is in many respects superior to those of the Inns of Court, in London.

We may now take a drive up the Avenue, and entering the Queen's Park note first the Queen's statue, then the handsome houses which are rising on the right; then the monument to the brave men who fell fighting against filibustering Fenians at Ridgeway, the group consisting of soldiers, with grief on one side and resignation on the other, and the figure of Britannia crowning all; and finally crossing a little valley wherein an artificial lake spreads itself, approach and visit the University buildings, a massive Norman Tower rising from an architectural square, of Norman Romanesque—an imposing structure, which has well been said would not be out of place in the city of Oxford. Next to the University is the Observatory, which is well fitted up with all modern appliances.

To the west of the Park entrance is the Toronto Cricket Ground.

Driving back eastward, we pass into Yonge Street, and through Carlton Street into Church Street, turning down which we come to the Model School—a building in the Roman Doric order—which was erected in 1851-2, at a cost of \$125,000, the foundation stone having been laid by the Earl of Elgin. The class-rooms are admirable in their way, and there is a magnificent lecture hall. The pictures, though copies, are worth seeing, as are some of the busts. The Normal and Model Schools are one building, and there is accommodation for 400 pupils. The garden is exceedingly pretty and well kept.

The Horticultural Gardens, which have been already mentioned, can be come to by a slight detour eastward, and will well repay a visit.

There is no country in the world better provided for, in respect of education, than Canada, and no city better off, therefore, than Toronto. There are, besides the educational institutions already mentioned, thirteen public schools, presided over and managed by a Board of Trustees, under the supervision of an inspector, the system being in principle undenominational, the Roman Catholics being, however, allowed to have separate schools without being taxed to swell the general fund—a privilege of which they avail themselves.

The fire alarm system is singularly complete. There are boxes at certain corners, the keys of which are near, and in a few minutes after a fire appears a bell is rung, which tells the whole city in what quarter the flames are breaking out.

Toronto is not rich in places of amusement. A new Theatre is nearly completed, and an Opera House will soon be at the disposal of *entrepreneurs*. Shaftesbury Hall, which is attached to the Young Men's Society, is a good hall in some respects, but the ventilation is wretched, and the acoustics most imperfect. It will accommodate from 1,000 to 1,200 people. The Music Hall will accommodate 800 people. Its acoustic properties are good. This is a favorite place for balls during the winter.

The three principal places of interment are, the Necropolis, the St. James, and the Roman Catholic Cemeteries—the St. James' Cemetery being very beautiful, and having an air of seclusion which adds to its impressiveness. The grounds are tastefully disposed and decorated, and separate spaces are allotted for the various Churches. Monu-

ments as tasteful and as costly as in any graveyard in the world are to be seen here. Flowers are strewn on the graves, and the whole scene is beautiful and suggestive. The Necropolis and the Roman Catholic Cemeteries should also be visited.

In addition to Roman Catholics, Episcopalians, Methodists, Baptists, and Independents, there are represented in Toronto by Churches the Plymouth Brethren, the Lutherans and the Swedenborgians.

When journeying eastward, the Don should be seen, where there is some good picturesque bits. Here is the new jail, a square stone building without architectural pretensions, and not far the distillery of Gooderham & Worts—one of the largest on the continent.

The city is also well served by the Montreal and Dominion Telegraph Companies. The manager of the Montreal Telegraph, Mr. Dwight, is, owing to his obliging character, a universal favourite.

The emigration shed is entirely—office and all—of wood, and is well arranged and managed.

The city is supplied by five systems of railway—the Grand Trunk, the Great Western, the Northern, the Toronto, Grey & Bruce, and the Toronto & Nipissing; and to these will soon be added the Credit Valley.

The new Union Railway Station, in the south-west, is one of the handsomest buildings in the city, and its clock has added greatly to convenience and beauty.

Distances are as follows:—From Hamilton 40 miles, from Niagara Falls 50 miles, from Collingwood 94 miles, from London 114 miles, from Kingston 165 miles, from Ottawa 223 miles, from Montreal 333 miles, from Quebec 513 miles, from New York 500 miles, from Boston 592 miles, from Liverpool 3,033 miles. Value of assessed property in 1870, about \$27,000,000. Population, about 70,000.

Toronto is, as we have said, growing rapidly. To judge of its business energy we have only to walk through its streets. In doing this, too, it will be seen what a fine race, composed of English, Irish and Scotch, are building up the future of a mighty people. Strong, sturdy men; handsome women; all having a fine, free, open expression. There is no sign of poverty anywhere, and though there is a "House of Providence," there is nothing of the abject poverty which meets us in Old Country cities. Toronto has all the notes of a capital. Walking down its streets you frequently meet most of the principal men of the Dominion; Hon. Alexander McKenzie, the present Prime Minister, his countenance full of strength and purpose, and his whole bearing of conscious rectitude; Hon. Edward Blake, with his strong square built feature, and searching eye; Right Hon. Sir John Macdonald, with his head of genius and free ploughed with the furrows of care and thought and sorrow; Hon. George Brown, with tall energetic frame, and the face and form as of one born to command; while Cabinet Ministers, from the Local Legislature, are often on King Street—be it said without irreverence, as thick as pickpockets. There is consciousness that Toronto is a growing capital in every mind, and hence, though the population is only 70,000, there is nothing provincial to be met with anywhere. Even literary greatness is occasionally to be seen elbowing politicians, and the spare intellectual figure of Mr. Goldwin Smith flits by us like an attenuated dream; while, as we have indicated, beauty of no mean character divides attention with eminence of other kinds. It is no wonder, then, that the words of Mr. Elgar, the lyric poet of the Dominion,—"what age can match the glorious youth of this Canada of ours?"—should be paraded by each citizen in regard to the Queen City of the West. Their pride, indeed, in the present is just their hopes of the future well founded; for yet a few years hence, and Toronto will surpass the city of to-day as maturity surpasses boyhood.

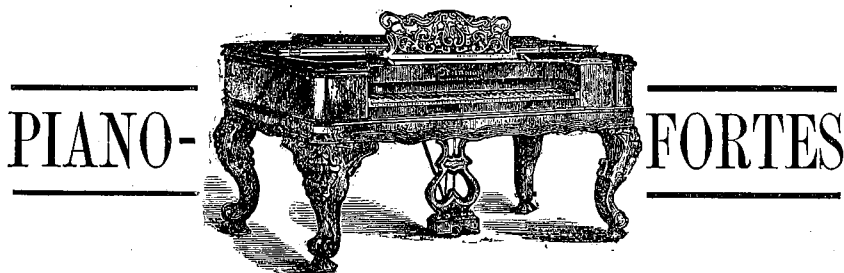

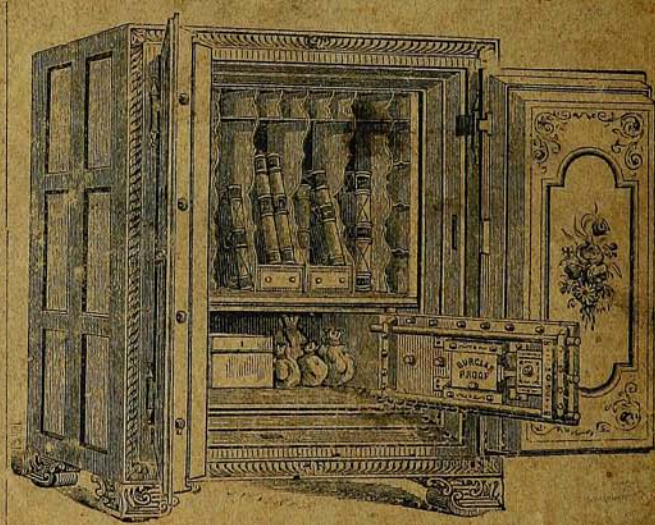
