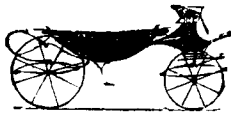

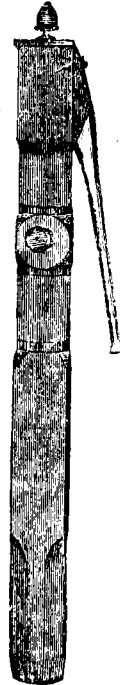

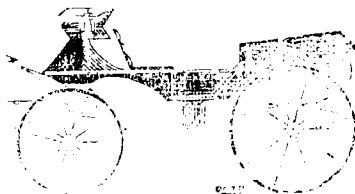

HISTORICAL

## PERTH COUNTY.

---

**T**HIS County is bounded on the north by the County of Wellington ; on the east by the Counties of Wellington and Waterloo ; on the south by the Counties of Middlesex and Oxford, and on the west by the County of Huron. It contains fifteen municipalities, viz., the towns of Listowel, Mitchell, St. Marys and Stratford, and townships of Blanshard, Downie, Ellice, Elma, Fullarton, Hibbert, Logan, Mornington, North Easthope, South Easthope and Wallace.

The County is well watered by the rivers Avon and Thames, besides numerous smaller streams, some of which afford ample water power for mills and factories. The soil is rich and fertile ; the surface generally level and the farms well improved. The "Great Swamp" encroaches on the townships of Logan and Ellice. In this swamp the rivers Maitland, Saugeen, Thames, Bayfield and Grand take their rise. The timber is principally beech, maple, elm &c., with a little pine, basswood, hemlock &c.

The County is intersected by the main line and the Buffalo and Lake Huron division of the Grand Trunk Railway ; the Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway, which enters the County at Tavistock and runs north to Listowel ; and the Southern Extension of the Wellington, Grey and Bruce Railway, running through a portion of the north part of the County ; thus affording every facility for the transportation of merchandise to the eastern and western markets.

For electoral purposes the County is divided into two Ridings or Electoral Divisions, numbered respectively fifty-seven and fifty-eight. The North Riding consists of the townships of Wallace, Elma, Logan, Ellice, Mornington and North Easthope, and the towns of Stratford and Listowel. The South Riding consists of the townships of Blanshard, Downie, South Easthope, Fullarton and Hibbert, and the towns of Mitchell and St. Marys.



The greater part of the County of Perth formed a portion of what was originally known as the "Huron Tract," a triangular block of land purchased from the Provincial Government by the Canada Company in 1827, commencing with the east limits of the townships of North and South Easthope, and extending towards Lake Huron, where the westerly limit of the triangle extended from and inclusive of the township of Bosanquet, to and including the township of Colborne. These lands were then in the possession of the Indians, and even in 1833 and following years were frequented by them as their hunting grounds. The average cost of the land to the Company was 2s 10½d per acre.

In 1832 the present counties of Huron, Perth and Bruce were called the "London District," and London was the district town, previous to which the courts were held at Vittoria, on the Lake Erie side. In 1838 the District and County of Huron was formed, Goderich being the district town, the population of the District being at that time only 4000.

In 1847 the late J. J. E. Linton Esq., was delegated to Montreal where Parliament was then sitting, by the inhabitants of Stratford and neighborhood, to have certain townships separated from the County of Huron and formed into a separate district and county. The population of this portion was then nearly 10,000. In the following year Mr. Linton succeeded in his mission and had the honor of naming the County with Stratford as the County town. The name "Perth" was given out of respect to the first settlers in North Easthope, who were from Perthshire, Scotland.

In 1852 the County buildings were completed, of brick, and handsomely located on a plot of ground granted by W. F. McCulloch, Esq., above the north bank of the river. In January 1853 the County was set apart by proclamation.

In 1829, in the whole Huron Tract there were only three miserable log huts and two unfinished frame houses, intended for the reception of emigrants; no road, with the exception of a narrow track through the woods, through which the sun was not visible owing to the overhanging trees. The population at this time consisted of only three families. The Company had laid out town plots at Mitchell and Stratford, which up to 1840 were known as the "Big Thames" and "Little Thames" respectively. The first emigrant settlers arrived in the fall of 1832, and the late J. J. E. Linton Esq., in July 1833. Mr. Linton settled near Stratford, in the third concession of Downie. To the south the nearest neighbor he had was near the Governor's Road, which leads to London; and to the north, a few on the Huron Road. North of that road, to the

Georgian Bay, there were no settlers. At this time the Company's lands were sold at one dollar and a half per acre.

The first saw mill was erected for the Canada Company by D. Ford and John Sebring, at the then "Little Thames," in 1833. They also erected a grist and flouring mill in 1834. The latter was the first erected on the Company's lands, and was the only one north and west of the line of London at that time.

The area of the County is 446,728 acres, or 698 square miles.

## BLANSHARD.

This township is bounded on the north-west by the township of Usborne (Huron Co.); on the north and north-east by Fullarton; on the east by Fullarton and Downie; on the south by East Nissouri (Oxford Co.), and West Nissouri (Middlesex Co.); and on the south-west by Biddulph (Middlesex Co.). The township contains 45,924 acres.

The north branch of the River Thames runs through the west and south-west portion. The bed of the river is rocky and furnishes excellent stone for building and general purposes. The soil is rich and fertile; the surface mostly level, the western portion being more undulating. The timber is mostly beech and maple, with a little pine, basswood, hemlock &c.

The main line of the Grand Trunk Railway passes through the township, entering it on the east line from Downie, and passing out on the south-west line, where it enters Biddulph. The London Branch of the G. T. R. also traverses a portion of the township, from St. Marys to the Nissouri line, where it leaves the County.

There are six post offices in the township, viz., Anderson, Fish Creek, Kirkton, Metropolitan, St. Marys and Woodham.

**Anderson** is a post office on the second concession, seven miles west of St. Marys.

**Kirkton**, a post village, is located on the Huron County line, between the fourth and fifth concessions, distant 10 miles west from St. Marys, and one and a quarter miles from Woodham. It contains two churches (Canada Meth. and Epis.), two blacksmith shops, a tailor shop, two carriage shops, a store, hotel, and 100 inhabitants.

**Star of the West Temple**, No. 130, United Order of Templars, has been organized 18 years. D. W. Delmage, W. C. T.; Robert Gallander, Sec. Meets every Thursday evening. There are 70 members.

L. O. L. No. 591. Thos. Hollingshead, W. M. Meets the first Thursday in each month. There are 40 members.

There is also a Grange order here.

The Canada Methodist Church is built of brick, was erected 15 years ago, at a cost of \$2,000, and will seat 350. Services at 10.30 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. each Sabbath. Sunday school at 9 a. m. in summer, and 2 p. m. in winter. Prayer meeting, Wednesday evening. Bible Class, Friday evening. There are 120 members. Rev. John L. Kerr, pastor.

St. Paul's Church (Epis.) is a frame building. It was erected 17 years ago, at a cost of \$1600, and will seat 400. Service at 10.30 a. m. Sabbath school at 9 a. m. The communicants number between 30 and 40 families. Rev. W. E. Scott, pastor.

**Metropolitan** is a post office on the eighth concession, six miles from St. Marys.

**Prospect Hill** (*Fish Creek, p. o.*) is situated on the south boundary, lot 28, west of the Mitchell road, distant seven miles from St. Marys. It contains two hotels, a carriage and blacksmith shop, a store, two churches (Meth. and Epis.), and 65 inhabitants.

The carriage manufactory of Alfred Padfield was established in 1850. From six to eight hands are employed in the manufacture of carriages, wagons, sleighs, cutters &c., and in a general jobbing business.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 200. Services at 10.30 a. m. each Sabbath. Rev. Mr. Barreltrough, of Granton, officiates.

The Church of England is a frame building, seating 300. Services are held at 3 p. m. each Sabbath. Sabbath school at 1 p. m. Rev. Mr. Scott, of Kirkton, officiates.

The post office was established in 1854, John Bell being the first post master.

The town of **St. Marys**, which now comprises an area of about 2,600 acres, with a population of over 5,000, is located in the south-eastern part of the township of Blanshard upon the north branch of the River Thames; at its confluence with Trout Creek and the Junction of the London Branch of the Grand Trunk Railway with the Sarnia or Main Line. It was originally built upon 400 acres owned by the Canada Company, and derives its name from the wife of Thomas Mercer Jones, Esq., who was Commissioner of the Company at Goderich, she having donated fifty dollars towards the erection of a school house in the village. It was then called "Little

Falls," from the circumstance that the River Thames at this spot formed a small cataract with a fall of about four feet flowing over a limestone bottom, but the subsequent quarrying of stone from the bed of the river has very much reduced this fall. Thomas Ingersoll, second son of Mayor Ingersoll, of Ingersoll, in the County of Oxford, purchased two hundred acres of the Company's survey, and the remaining two hundred were bought by his brother James Ingersoll, of Woodstock, who, in 1841, purchased the interest in the saw mill and grist mill which had been jointly erected by his brother and himself the year previous. The old grist mill has been largely added to and is now one of the largest flouring mills in this section of the country, it is now owned and carried on by Messrs. Box & Sommerville.

The first store was opened in 1841 by John Ingersoll, eldest son of the late Thomas Ingersoll, on the corner of Queen and Water streets, and the first tavern the same year on the lot at present occupied by the National Hotel.

The first school house was erected of stone in 1843, Thos. Sellars being the builder; and the first iron foundry in 1849 by John Moore, whose son still continues in the business. This was followed by a second in 1858, established by McDougall & Davis.

In 1849 Gilbert McIntosh started the first carding mill, and soon afterwards the machinery requisite for a woolen factory was added.

The churches are as follows: Church of England, Presbyterian, Canada Methodist, Baptist, Methodist Episcopal and Roman Catholic. The sites for all the Protestant churches, together with cemetery grounds were donated by James Ingersoll, Esq.

The Town Hall and Market Buildings were built by private subscription on land purchased by the same means, and handed over to the town in 1863.

The town of St. Marys is very picturesquely situated, and contains many fine buildings, the greater proportion of which are of cut stone obtained from the quarries, the supply of which is inexhaustible. The stranger on entering the town for the first time is immediately struck with the magnitude of the two splendid stone viaducts, which are triumphs of engineering skill. The one crossing Trout Creek, on the London and St. Marys Branch of the Grand Trunk Railway, has a total length of about eight hundred feet, and is laid on eleven piers sixty-six feet apart and sixty-six feet high. It is composed of massive piles of masonry and tubular iron, and is similar in construction to the other which is on the Sarnia Branch and spans the Thames, the total length of which is over six hundred feet and laid on nine piers which are over forty feet high and sixty-six feet apart.

The school buildings are very handsome structures, comprising a high school, a central school, and three ward schools, which are thoroughly officered with an efficient corps of teachers. There is besides a Roman Catholic school which is well patronized. It is a handsome stone structure, erected in 1876.

St. Marys Engine and Agricultural Works, on Thomas street, was established five years ago; employ six to eight hands in manufacturing engines and agricultural implements of all kinds, their principal work being mill and engine work. Reid & Wood, proprietors.

J. Mack & Co's. saw mill, stave, heading and hoop factory, on Elizabeth street, during the past year cut 600,000 feet of lumber; they employ six hands and the business is estimated at from \$10,000 to \$12,000. It was established by Wm. Garner 15 years ago. In connection with the above there is a large cooper shop.

Dewar & Moyes' carriage and waggon factory employ a number of hands and do an extensive business.

Craig & Hamilton, sash and planing mill, established 1864, employ about 15 hands in the manufacture of sashes, doors, blinds, mouldings and in a general building business.

St. Marys Tannery, on Wellington street, was established in 1860. Capital \$3,000. Four men are employed in the manufacture of about 1,500 hides per annum. M. Smith, proprietor.

St. Marys Woolen Mills, on Church street, were established in 1860. Capital \$40,000. About 20 hands are employed doing a large and increasing business. Dufton & Myers, proprietors.

Joseph Billings' pump factory, on Queen street, has been established about six years. 200 log pumps are turned out annually, valued at \$2,500.

St. Marys Flax Mill, Water street north. This mill was established in 1862, and was the first flax mill started in the town. It manufactures from 70 to 90 tons of dressed flax and about 500 tons of fine tow per annum, giving employment to about 40 or 50 hands regularly, and in the Fall months from 125 to 150 are employed. Dr. D. H. Harrison, proprietor.

The flax mill of John & William Weir, on James street has been established five years. They employ about 25 hands regularly, and from 75 to 120 during the Fall months. Manufacture about 1,200 tons of raw flax per annum. Their sales are about \$30,000 per annum.

John Adair's agricultural implement factory, on Wellington street north, was established 19 years ago. Employs five to six hands who are constantly engaged in manufacturing waggon, buggies, and all kinds of agricultural implements, also a general blacksmithing business.

The Novelty Works, Queen street west, (late Haggert's foundry), are driving a good business; employ six hands who are constantly engaged in the manufacture of horse rakes, wringers, &c., also the famous Bunnell's Washing Machine, for which there is a great and increasing demand.

Besides the above there are numerous other industries, conspicuous among which are a broom factory, two asheries, two lime kilns, and quarries, besides numerous carpenter, cabinet making, and blacksmith shops, all of which are doing a good and flourishing business.

**Woodham**, a post village on the town line between Blanshard and Usborne, 10 miles west from St. Marys, contains a flouring mill, saw mill, pump factory, three carriage shops, an hotel, cooper shop, two blacksmith shops, a harness shop, store, tailor shop, shoe shop, two churches (Canada Meth. and Primitive Meth.), and 150 inhabitants.

The Canada Methodist Church is a brick building, seating 250. It was erected in 1870 at a cost of \$1400. Services at 10.30 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. Sabbath school at 2.30 p. m. Revs. John L. Kerr and W. H. Gane, officiate. There are 38 members.

The Primitive Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 250. It was erected in 1870. Services are held at 2.30 and 6.30 p. m. Prayer meeting on Friday. There are nine members.

Woodham Division No. 384, S. of T. was organized in 1872. Geo. O'Banyon, W. P.; — Nairn, R. S. Meets every Monday. There are 50 members.

L. O. L. No. 492. David Brethour, W. M.; Richard Sparling, Secretary. Meets first Thursday in each month. There are 46 members.

St. Marys Chosen Few, Black Preceptory, was organized in 1872. Wm. Robinson, W. M.; Francis Montgomery, Secretary. Meets Thursday on or before full moon. There are 28 members.

The Woodham Steam Saw Mills, of Abrey & Edwards, have been established three years. From six to eight hands are employed. A wooden pump manufactory has been added the present year (1877).

The Woodham Mills (flouring) has two runs of stones, with a capacity of 100 bushels a day. Steam power is employed.

The population of the township is 3,242.

## DOWNIE.

This township is bounded on the north west by the township of Fullarton; on the north east by Ellice; on the east by South Easthope; on the south and south-west by Blanshard and West Zorra (Oxford Co.). The River Avon runs across it from east to west, and two smaller streams pass through the north and south corners. The township is well improved and the soil of good quality. In the north part the surface is generally level, though in the south it is hilly and broken. The main line and Buffalo and Lake Huron branch of the Grand Trunk Railway pass through the township. The township contains 47,736 acres, and the population in 1877 was 3137. There are seven post offices in the township, viz, Avonbank, Avonton, Conroy, Fairview, Harmony, St. Paul and Sebringville.

**Avonbank** is a post office on the River Avon, on the tenth concession, four miles west of St. Paul, and six miles from St. Marys.

**Avonton** is a post office on the sixth concession, lot 16, and on the River Avon, seven miles from Stratford and four from Sebringville. The post office was established in 1863, Archibald Shiells being the first post master.

**Conroy** is a post office on the Stratford and St. Marys gravel road, six miles from Stratford, and five from St. Marys.

**Fairview** is a post office on the line of the Embro and Stratford gravel road, and at the boundary line of the counties of Perth and Oxford. It is six miles from Stratford.

**Harmony** is a post village on Trout Creek, on the line between the Gore of Downie and South Easthope, four miles from Stratford and five from Tavistock. It contains a Methodist church, a shoe shop, store, saw and chopping mill, carriage and blacksmith shop, and 75 inhabitants.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 200. Services at 2.30 and 6.30 p. m. Sunday school at 10 a. m. Prayer meeting, Thursday. Rev. F. E. Nugent, pastor.

L. O. L. No. 313, meets first Friday in each month. Arthur Robb, W. M.; Wm. McKay, S. There are 80 members.

**Kastnerville** is a small village located on the Huron road, three miles from Stratford and one from Sebringville. It contains an hotel, cheese factory, brewery, cooper shop, cider mill, and 75 inhabitants. There is no post office the residents generally receiving their mail at Stratford. Peter, John and Michael Kastner settled here June 9th, 1832. At that time the place where Stratford now stands was an unbroken wilderness.

The Kastnerville Cheese Factory has been established seven years and consumes the milk of between 300 and 400 cows, manufacturing 1800 cheese per annum.

The Kastnerville Brewery was established in 1865. Four men are employed in the manufacture of 2000 barrels of ale, beer and porter per annum.

**St. Paul** is a post office and station on the main line of the G. T. R., on lot five in the ninth concession, five miles from Stratford.

**Sebringville** (formerly Black Creek) is a post village on the line between the townships of Downie and Elliot, and a station on the Buffalo and Goderich division of the G. T. R. four miles from Stratford and eight from Mitchell. The Black Creek flows through the village, affording excellent hydraulic facilities. The village contains three churches (Prim. Meth., Baptist and Evangelical), three carriage shops, two flouring mills, three shoe shops, two blacksmith shops, a harness shop, tannery, tailor shop, cabinet shop, vinegar factory, four stores, two hotels, a tin and stove store, and 325 inhabitants.

The Sebringville Mills (flouring) have been established 30 years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 200 bushels a day.

The Sebringville tannery was established in 1872. From four to six hands are employed in the manufacture of harness, upper leather, sheep skins, lacing, belting &c. Kastner & Co., proprietors.

The mills of Kastner & Litt turn out from 1,000,000 to 1,500,000 feet of lumber and lath per annum.

The Baptist Church is a frame building with a seating capacity of 200. It was erected in 1874. One service is held every other Sunday at 10 a. m. and 7 p. m. alternately. Rev. Samuel Baker, of Tavistock, officiates.

The Evangelical Church is a brick building, erected about seven years ago at a cost of \$4,000, and has a seating capacity of 650. Services at 10 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sunday school after morning service. Rev. C. F. Braun, pastor.

The Primitive Methodist Church is a frame building, erected about six years ago at a cost of \$800, and has a seating capacity of 200. Services at 6.30 p. m. Sunday school at 2.30 p. m. Rev. James Moore, of Mitchell, officiates.

The place was first settled in 1833, by John Sebring, who built a saw mill in 1834. He also built a grist mill in 1852, in which year the first store was opened by Daniel Sebring. The post office was established in 1853, P. A. Sebring being the first post master.

The thriving town of **Stratford**, the county seat of Perth, is pleasantly located on the river Avon, at the angles of the townships of Ellice, North and South Easthope and Downie, and is the centre of one of the most fertile and thickly settled agricultural districts of the Province. At the present time it is perhaps the most rapidly growing town in the Province, with a population of about 9,000. It is also the seat of a considerable manufacturing interest, and with its natural facilities for growth and expansion, coupled with the active, enterprising spirit characteristic of its business population, is destined in the near future to become a city of no mean proportions. It is distant from London 39 miles, from Goderich 45 miles, from Hamilton 61 miles, from Sarnia 80 miles, from Buffalo 115 miles, from Windsor and Detroit 143 miles, and from Toronto 88 miles.

The business streets are lined with many fine blocks and stores, devoted to the varied departments of trade and commerce, while numerous elegant mansions and residences adorn the suburban portions.

The town was lighted with gas for the first time in January 1876.

Stratford contains a number of fine public buildings, prominent among which may be mentioned the Court House and Jail, on the height on the north bank of the river, a brick structure, erected in 1842; the Market House in the centre of the Market Square, containing the Town Hall and the various offices connected with the Town Government, which is also a handsome brick structure; the Odd Fellows' Building, on Downie street, opposite the Market House; the Waverly, Phoenix and Albion Blocks, on Ontario street; the Rankin Block, corner of Market and Wellington; the Thompson & Williams Manufacturing Company's Works, on Erie street, one of the most extensive works of the kind in the Dominion, together with other buildings of lesser note.

The railway station here is one of the finest in the Province, and the workshops in connection with the road are very extensive, and give employment to a large number of men.

Avondale Cemetery, "the City of the Dead," occupies a pleasant location in the north-west part, overlooking the "Classic" Avon. It is tastefully laid out, with gravelled walks ornamented with shrubbery, and contains a number of handsome monuments.

Connected with the Cemetery, but on the opposite side of the river, is a grove and pleasure grounds for the accommodation of picnic and pleasure parties.

The town supports fourably managed weekly papers, viz: *Stratford Beacon*, *Stratford Herald*, *Stratford Times*, and the *Canadian Colonist*, the latter being printed in the German language and liberally patronized by the German residents of the surrounding country.

The main line of the Grand Trunk Railway passes through the town from east to west, and is intersected by the Buffalo and Goderich Branch of the same road. The Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway was completed to Stratford and opened for traffic in the spring of 1876. The Stratford and Huron Railway was completed to Listowel in December 1877. Thus, it will be seen, that in her railway facilities, Stratford is rendered easy of access from all points.

In her school facilities, Stratford has every reason to congratulate herself on the excellent advantages provided, through the wisdom and liberality of her citizens, for the thorough education of her youth. The school buildings comprise a Central school, Grammar school, and four Ward schools, thoroughly officered with an efficient corps of teachers, and liberally patronized. There is besides a Roman Catholic Separate school, which is also well sustained.

There are 12 churches in the town, representing the usual phases of religious belief, viz: Presbyterian, Methodist, Baptist, Lutheran, Church of England, Independent, Roman Catholic, and a society of Plymouth Brethren.

The Canada Company laid out and reserved a town plot for a village, consisting of about 2,500 acres, at Stratford, and up to 1840 the place was known as the "Little Thames," the river Avon being a branch of the river Thames, and flowing into the latter above St. Marys. The name of the river was afterwards changed to Avon, and that of the village to Stratford, in honor of the birthplace of the immortal bard. The wards of the town are named Avon, Falstaff, Hamlet, Romeo and Shakspeare.

The first saw mill was erected in 1833 by D. Ford and John Sebring. A grist mill was erected by the same parties in 1834. Messrs. J. J. E. Linton, Sebastian Fryfogle, Andrew Schach, Henry Runstaller and Wm. Sergeant were the earliest settlers in the vil-

lage and its vicinity. The latter was the proprietor of the Shakspeare Inn. The first store was opened in one of the log shanties erected west of the bridge, in 1834, by Geo. Worsley, and afterwards continued in a small frame building opposite, by John C. W. Daly, Esq., for several years. Mr. Daly was the first post master. He also acted as agent for the Canada Company for 30 years, and was for many years senior magistrate and militia officer for the counties of Huron, Perth and Bruce, and is still a resident of the town. John Monteith also opened a store at an early date. The next store was opened in 1839 by John Gouinlock.

The village was incorporated in January 1854, the population at that date having reached 1400. It was incorporated as a town in 1858, when the population was about 2,500. At the present date the population may be safely estimated at 9000.

Stratford Cricket Club was organized in 1853. C. J. MacGregor, M. A., Honorary Prest.; R. Smith, L.L.B., Prest.; T. M. Daly, jr., Sec.-Treas.; J. Grayson Smith, field captain.

Zion Lutheran Church is located on Cambria street near intersection of Gore. It is built of white brick, was erected in 1873, and cost \$2,500. The society was organized in 1863 and numbers 20 members. There is no reside it pastor but preaching is held on Sunday afternoons. Sabbath school at 1 p. m. in winter, and 9 a. m. in summer.

The Central Methodist Church is located on Erie street, near Patrick. It is built of white brick and was erected in 1874 at a cost of \$20,000. It has a seating capacity of 1000. There are 250 members. Services are held at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sabbath school at 2.30 p. m. Prayer meeting on Thursday evening. In connection with this church is a Young People's Christian Association, having for its object the spiritual and intellectual development of the young people of the church and congregation. The Association meets on the first and fourth Mondays of each month. Rev. Manly Benson, Pastor; Rev. John W. Cooley, Colleague. James Huston, Superintendent of Sabbath school.

The South Side Methodist Church is located on the corner of Gore and Cambria streets. It is a frame building with stained glass windows, and has a seating capacity of 250. It was erected in October, 1876, and cost, including site, about \$1800. There are 60 members. Services at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sunday school at 2.30 p. m. Prayer meeting on Thursday evening. Rev. Manly Benson, Pastor; Rev. John W. Cooley, Colleague. W. E. Jones, Superintendent of Sabbath school.

Christ Church (Independent) is located on Waterloo street, corner of Brunswick. It is built of white brick, was opened in 1874 and cost \$10,000. The seating capacity is 400. The society was organized in 1846 with nine members. The present membership is 75. Services at 11 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. Sabbath school at 2.30 p. m. Lecture every Thursday evening. Bible class Friday evening. Rev. Henry Hughes, Pastor.

St. Joseph's Church (Roman Catholic) is situated on Huron street, near St. George. It is built of white brick, with cut stone

dressings, and was erected in 1868 at a cost of \$30,000. Its dimensions are 160 feet long and 70 wide, the transepts being 82 feet, and height 52. The style of architecture is the second period of gothic. The spire, when completed, will be 180 feet high. The inside consists of nave and side aisles, chancel, porches and vestry. The roof is supported by fourteen pillars. The ceiling is groined with moulded ribs and bosses. On each side of rear of transepts stands an octagonal pillar, 50 feet high, which adds much to the beauty and stability of the structure. The walls are adorned with excellent oil paintings, illustrative of Scriptural scenes and characters. The altar, considered to be the finest in the Province, is a beautiful piece of architecture, and adorned with 11 Munich statues. There are three entrance doors to the auditorium, which is seated for 1,000 persons on the ground floor, and 250 in the gallery. Services are held at 8.30 and 11 a. m. each Sabbath. Sunday school at 3 p. m. Vespers at 7 p. m. Rev. E. B. Kilroy, D. D., pastor. Rev. J. O'Connor, assistant pastor.

St James' Church of England is located on St. George street, near Huron; it is built of brick, of early English Gothic architecture, was erected about 1869, at a cost of about \$25,000, and has a seating capacity of about 1000. The society numbers about 300 families. Services are held at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. each Sabbath; Sabbath school at 3 p. m. Rev. E. Patterson, M.A., rector. Rev. John P. Curran assistant minister.

The "Home" Mission Chapel (Epis.) in connection with St. James' Church, is a frame building, on Gore street near Cambria, seating 250, and was erected in 1876, at a cost of \$1400. Services at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sunday school at 2.30 p. m. Rev. E. Patterson, M. A., incumbent; Rev. John P. Curran, assistant minister.

The Baptist Church is located on Ontario street, near Waterloo. It is a frame building. The number of members is about 140. Services at 11 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. each Sabbath. Sabbath school and Bible class at 2.30 p. m. Prayer meeting Thursday evening. Rev. Charles Walker, pastor.

The Primitive Methodist Church is located on Waterloo street near Douro. It is a frame building, erected about 1861, with a seating capacity of about 300. The society was organized the same year. The number of members is about 60. Public services are held each Sabbath at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sabbath school at 2.30 p. m. Prayer meeting Thursday evening. Bible class Monday evening. Rev. Geo. Wood, pastor.

Knox Church, (Presbyterian) is located on Ontario street, corner of Waterloo. It is built of white brick, with a spire over 200 feet

in height. It was erected in 1872, at a cost of \$20,000, and has a seating capacity of 1,000. There are about 350 members. The congregation was first organized in the fall of 1849, by the late pastor, Rev. Thos. Macpherson, who has continued the pastoral charge to a recent period. Services are held at 11 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. each Sabbath. The Sabbath school, which has about 400 members, is held at 3 p. m. Prayer meeting, Thursday evening. Bible class, Friday evening. Rev. P. M. McLeod M. A., pastor.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church is located on St. Andrew street. It is built of white brick, was erected in 1866 at a cost of about \$9,000, and has a seating capacity of 500. The congregation was first organized in connection with Woodstock charge in 1838; re-organized in connection with North Easthope in 1848; and created a separate charge in 1857. The number of communicants is 225. Public services are held each Sabbath at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sabbath school at 3 p. m. Prayer meeting every Wednesday evening. Young People's Literary Association Friday evening. Rev. E. W. Waits, pastor.

The society usually known as Plymouth Brethren, has been organized about 11 years. There are from 25 to 30 members. Public services are held each Sabbath as follows: viz., Communion at 11 a. m. Sunday school at 2.30 p. m. Preaching at 6.30 p. m. Chapel on Brunswick street, near the Drill Shed.

The Thompson & Williams Manufacturing Company, on the corner of Erie and Gore streets, was incorporated in 1874, with a capital of \$100,000. About 200 men are employed in the manufacture of all kinds of agricultural implements, sawing machines, horse powers, water works, car wheels, locomotive repairing, &c. They also erect flouring mills, saw mills, stave factories, cheese factories, &c., the machinery for which they manufacture. The sales amount to about \$200,000 per annum.

The fanning mill and separator manufactory of Louis Barthel, on Erie street, near St. David, was established in 1875. Six men are employed, with facilities for turning out 500 mills per annum.

The Dominion Tannery, on Erie street, south of Galt, was established in 1875. Six men are employed in the manufacture of about 10,000 sheep skins and 3000 calf skins annually. Grant & Collins, proprietors.

Perth Furniture Warerooms, at 1, 3 and 5 Ontario street, were established in 1874. Fourteen men are employed and the sales amount to \$22,000 per annum. Campbell & Abraham, proprietors.

The tannery and whip manufactory of John F. Scholz, at 89 Erie street, was established in 1860. Eight hands are employed and the sales amount to about \$20,000 per annum.

The Stratford Woolen Mills, at 3 Church street, were established in 1868 and employ 20 hands. Duften & Myers, proprietors.

The Sharman & Foster Implement Works, on Birmingham street, opposite Patrick, have been established 30 years. Fifteen to twenty men are employed in the manufacture of the Little Giant Thresher, combined mowers and reapers, and other agricultural implements, to the value of \$40,000 per annum. Joseph Sharman, proprietor.

Esson's saw mill, on William street, near Mary, was established about 1854. From 40 to 50 men are employed in the manufacture of sash, doors, blinds, furniture, and in a general building business, to the value of \$20,000 per annum.

The pump factory of Osborn & Wreford, on Douro street, near Waterloo, has been established about 20 years. Two hundred log pumps are turned out annually, valued at \$1,500.

The Avon Tannery, on Cobourg street, was established in 1849. Five men are employed in the manufacture of 2000 hides per annum. Geo Hilton, proprietor.

The Counter Check Book manufactory of Gordon & McKay, on York street, was established in 1873. From six to eight hands are employed in the manufacture of 40,000 counter check books annually.

The Stratford Flour and Oat Meal Mill, on R. R. ave., was established in 1876. There are four runs of stones. Pochlman & Mogk, proprietors.

The Dominion Agricultural Works, on R. R. ave., were established in 1876. From fifteen to twenty men are employed in the manufacture of threshing machines, for which they have facilities for turning out 100 machines annually. Macdonald, Macpherson & Co., proprietors.

The tinware and plumbing establishment of C. B. Johns & Co., at 56 Ontario street, has been established six years and employs from 12 to 15 men.

The furniture manufactory of Wm. Hepburn, at 60 Ontario street, was established in 1866. Six men are employed and the sales amount to from \$5,000 to \$6,000 per annum.

The cooperage of Peter Durst, on the corner of Wellington and St. David streets, has been established 10 or 12 years, and employs five hands, turning out 400 flour barrels per week.

The soda water manufactory of John Pratt, on Erie street, corner of Patrick, was established in 1869. Six men are employed and the sales amount to from \$4,000 to \$5,000 per annum.

The Stratford Flouring Mills, on York street, have five runs of stones, with a capacity of 130 barrels a day. W. Mowat & Son, proprietors.

The Stratford Tannery, on the corner of Church and Patrick streets, was established in 1865. Capital \$10,000. Five men are employed. Sales about \$20,000 per annum. Alex. Smith, proprietor.

The flax mill of S. S. Fuller was established in 1869. Capital, \$15,000. About 60 hands are employed in the manufacture of from 1000 to 1,100 tons of raw flax per annum.

The Dominion Pump Works, at 90 Downie street, were established in 1871. About \$2,500 worth of wooden pumps are sold annually. W. H. Sellon, proprietor.

The brick yard of Thos. Loney, on Huron street, opposite the Driving Park, has been established three years, employs from 12 to 15 hands, and turns out 300,000 brick and 100,000 drain tile annually.

The pottery of J. B. Helbling, on Hibernia street, near Vincent, was established in 1871. From four to six hands are employed, turning out about \$2,000 worth of goods annually.

The pump factory of Thos. Werrell was established in 1877, employs five hands and turns out 200 wooden pumps per annum.

The Stratford Marble Works of Gadsby & Sharman, on Downie street, near George, were established in 1871, and employ four men.

The Avon Planing Mills, on Mill street, were established in 1857. About 25 men are employed in the manufacture of sash doors, blinds, mouldings, and in a general building business, to the amount of from \$20,000 to \$25,000 per annum. Scrimgeour Bros., proprietors.

The shirt factory of Menno Christner on Huron street, corner of Vincent, was established in 1877, and employs from eight to ten hands.

The manufactory of John Humphry on Huron street, near Vincent, was established in 1863, and employs from eight to ten hands in the manufacture of wagons, sleighs, ploughs and other agricultural implements.

The Perth Carriage Works, at 18 Huron street, were established in 1869, employ from six to eight men, and turn out \$7000 worth of work annually. Jas. Walkom, proprietor.

The Stratford Planing Mills, on Cobourg street, were established in 1872. Capital from \$18,000 to \$20,000. From 25 to 30 men are employed in the manufacture of sash, doors, blinds, &c., to the value of about \$30,000 per annum. Thos. Orr, proprietor.

The Stratford Spring Brewery, on Patrick street, near Birmingham, was established in 1874. It has facilities for manufacturing 100 barrels a week.

**Little Lake Brick Yard**, at Little Lake, on the Shakspeare road, about two miles east of Stratford, has been established about 18 years. Capital about \$6,000. Seventeen men are employed in the manufacture of white brick, about 1,000,000 of which are manufactured annually. Wm. Roberts, proprietor.

The **Beaver Mills** (flouring) have been established 20 years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 100 barrels a day. Walter Marshall, proprietor.

## ELLICE.

This township is bounded north-east by the township of Mornington; north-west by Logan; south-east by North. Easthope; and south-west by Fullarton and Downie. There is a good deal of excellent land in the township. The north-east part contains a large quantity of swamp. A branch of the Thames runs through the western part. The Stratford and Huron Railway passes through the township, from its south to north border, leaving it on the Mornington line near the village of Brunner. The area of the township is 45,355 acres and the population 2,551. There are two post offices in the township, viz., Kinkora and Wartburg.

**Ellice Centre** is a village located on the tenth concession, two and a half miles north of Wartburg, and contains a church (Evangelical) two saw mills, a store, shoe shop, two blacksmith shops, an hotel, and 125 inhabitants. There is no post office, the residents receiving their mail at Wartburg.

The saw mill of James Bennoch has been established 10 years. Eight men are employed in the manufacture of lumber, lath and pickets.

The Evangelical church is a frame building, seating 100, and was erected about 10 years ago. Services at 2.30 p. m. Sabbath school at 10.30 a. m. Prayer meeting on Wednesday evening.

**Kinkora**, a post village on the seventh concession, lot 30, two and a half miles west of Wartburg, eight miles from Sebringville, and twelve from Stratford. It contains a Catholic church, blacksmith shop, shoe shop, store, cheese factory, and 50 inhabitants.

The Catholic church is a frame building, seating 400, and was erected about 20 years ago. Mass is celebrated at 11 a.m.; vespers at 4 p. m. Sunday school at 3 p. m. Rev. John O'Neill, priest.

The village was settled by Mortimer and Patrick Hisson. The post office was established in 1855.

**Millbrook** is a hamlet situated half way between Wartburg and Kinkora, one mile and a quarter from each, and contains a saw mill and Catholic school.

**Wartburg** is a post village on lot number 20 in the 6th concession, five miles from Sebringville, and nine from Stratford. It contains a Lutheran church, a blacksmith shop, store, carriage shop, hotel, and 30 inhabitants.

The Lutheran church is a frame building, seating 200. Services are held at 2 p. m. Sunday school at 1 p. m.

The village was settled chiefly by Germans, about the year 1849. The post office was established in 1859, Richard Coulton being the first post master.

#### ELMA.

This township is bounded on the north-east by Wallace township; on the east by Maryborough; south east by Mornington; south-west by Logan and Ellice; and north-west by Grey (Huron Co.). It is watered by several branches of the Maitland river. The surface is generally level and there is a fair proportion of good land. The South Extension of the W. G. & B. R. enters the township at Listowel, on the north line, and runs south-west to Newry Station, thence westerly, leaving the township on the west line, on the 10th concession. The S. & H. R. enters the township from Mornington, traversing across the north-east quarter to Listowel. The area of the township is 67,404 acres, and the population 3,744.

PERTH COUNTY DIRECTORY.

There are seven post offices in the township, viz., Donegal, Hammond, Listowel, Monckton, Newry, Newry Station and Trowbridge.

Donegal is a post village located three and three quarter miles east of Newry and 10 miles from Listowel. It contains a store, blacksmith shop and 55 inhabitants.

Hammond is a post office on lot 31 of the 5th concession, distant seven miles from Listowel. It was established in 1865.

Listowel, an incorporated town, is situated on the town line between Elma and Wallace, 25 miles from Stratford, and 22 from Mitchell. The town is regularly laid out and is rapidly increasing in wealth and population. It is the seat of a considerable manufacturing interest and surrounded by a fine agricultural district. It contains many fine blocks and stores, and numerous elegant private residences. The school facilities are ample and efficient. The High School building, erected the present year (1877), is one of the handsomest school buildings in the Province, an ornament to the town and a credit to the promoters and builders. It is built of white brick and contains ten apartments. The cost of the building was \$15,000. The River Maitland passes through the centre of the town, affording excellent facilities for manufacturing purposes. The Southern Extension of the W. G. & B. R. passes through the town, and it is also the present northern terminus of the Stratford and Huron Railway, by which means it is connected with the two main trunk lines of railway, thus affording easy access to the town from all points of the Province. The *Press* is represented by the *Listowel Banner*, a well conducted and influential weekly paper, published by Ferguson & Elliott. There are five churches in the town, viz., Epis., Cong., Presb., M. E. and Canada Meth., several of which are substantial brick buildings, handsomely finished and comfortably furnished. The mercantile interests of the town are well represented and in a flourishing condition.

The Elma and Wallace Agricultural Society's fair grounds comprise a plot of six acres adjoining the town, on which is erected a substantial two-story building, octagonal in shape. The society was organized 21 years ago and holds regular fairs.

The Listowel Driving Park Association was organized in 1877. They have a course comprising 13 acres at the east end of the town. R. H. Henderson, Pres.; Theodore Rolfs, Sec.

Listowel Fire Co. No. 1. was organized in August 1877. A steam fire engine has been purchased at a cost of \$3,600. Thos. E. Hay, chief engineer; Benj. Brook, assistant; Henry Goddard, captain.

The carriage works of Little Bros. & Co. on Wallace street, have been established 12 years. Twenty hands are employed in turning out from \$15,000 to \$20,000 worth of work annually.

The pump factory of Pelton Bros. on Main street west, has been established two years. Two hundred log pumps are turned out annually.

The stave factory and cooperage of J. M. & A. Clinie, on Mill street, have been established six years. From 25 to 30 hands are employed in the manufacture of from 25,000 to 30,000 staves per day and from 1200 to 1300 barrels a week.

The saw mill of J. M. & A. Clinie employs seven or eight hands and cuts 15,000 to 20,000 feet of lumber per day.

The flouring mills of J. M. & A. Clinie have been established 20 years. There are six runs of stones, with a capacity of from 200 to 250 barrels a day.

The Listowel Woolen Factory, on Wallace street, has been established 10 years. Ten hands are employed and from 30,000 to 40,000 pounds of wool are worked up annually. B. Brook, proprietor.

The Victoria Tannery, on Main street, corner of Mitchell road, has been established 12 years. Four hands are employed in the manufacture of all kinds of leather but sole, to the value of about \$6,000 annually. Peter Kanapp, proprietor.

The Excelsior Sash and Blind Factory, on Elma street, was established in May, 1877. Twenty-four men are employed in the manufacture of sash, doors, blinds, school desks, and a general building business. Robinson & Dunham, proprietors.

The Listowel Brewery, on Royal street, was established in 1876. Five hands are employed in the manufacture of 20 barrels of lager beer daily. Kuntz & Roth, proprietors.

The sole leather tannery of Towner & Campbell, on West Victoria street, has been established 10 years. Ten men are employed, turning out 10,000 sides annually.

The Listowel Foundry, on Elma street, has been established 12 or 14 years. Twenty men are employed in the manufacture of mowers and reapers, and agricultural implements generally, to the value of \$20,000 annually. McIlwraith & Austin, proprietors.

The Empress Mills (flouring) on West Victoria street, were established Jan. 1st, 1877. There are seven runs of stones, with a capacity of 300 barrels a day.

The Listowel Flax Mills have been established seven years, and employ 40 hands in the manufacture of scutched flax. J. & J. Livingston, proprietors.

The Listowel Door and Sash Factory, on Inkerman street, was established in 1873. Fifteen to twenty hands are employed in the manufacture of sash, doors, blinds, school desks, and a general building business, to the value of from \$40,000 to \$50,000 annually. Large & Feier, proprietors.

Messrs. Hess Bros., on Main street, are extensively engaged in the manufacture of furniture, school desks &c., which gives employment to a large force of men.

The Listowel Mechanics' Institute was organized in 1873. The library contains 700 volumes. A public reading room is attached to the library. A literary and debating society is connected with the Institute, and a regular course of lectures sustained. A. McIlwraith, Pres.; R. Ferguson, Sec.-Treas. and Librarian. There are 100 members.

Barnard Lodge, No. 225, A.F. & A.M. meets the first Wednesday on or before full moon. There are 55 members. Jacob Heppler, W. M.; Wm. Speers, Sec.

Listowel Lodge, No. 160, I.O.O.F., was instituted March 13, 1875. Meets every Tuesday. There are 50 members. E. C. Clarke, R. S.

Listowel Lodge, No. 617, L.O.L., meets first Friday in each month. There are 60 members. Wm. Little, W. M.; A. S. Devit, Sec.

Red Cross Temple, Royal Black Preceptory, was instituted in May, 1877. Meets last Monday in each month. There are 25 members. R. L. Alexander, W. M.; T. G. Fennell, Recorder.

Listowel Temperance League was organized in August, 1877. G. S. Clinie, Pres.; R. Ferguson, Sec. There are 50 members.

The Listowel Caledonian Society was organized in Sept. 1877, and meets the last Friday in each month. R. Ferguson, Chief; John McKenzie, Sec.-Treas. There are 60 members.

The Church of England, on Main street, is a frame building, erected 15 years ago at a cost of \$1800, and has a seating capacity of 300. Services at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Rev. Hugh Cooper, pastor.

The Congregational Church, on Raglan street, is a brick building, erected in 1876 at a cost of \$4,700, and seats 400. Services at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 9.30 a.m. Prayer meeting,

Wednesday evening. There are from 70 to 80 members. The society was organized in 1856. Rev. Edwin Rose, pastor.

The Presbyterian Church is a frame building, erected in 1868, at a cost of \$2,500, and seats 350. Services at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 2.30 p.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. Bible class, Thursday. There are 170 communicants. Rev. John W. Bell, M. A., pastor.

The Canada Methodist Church, on Elma street is a frame building, seating 500. Services at 10.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 2.30 p.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. Bible class, Tuesday. There are 150 members. Rev. John G. Scott, pastor.

The M. E. Church is a brick building, erected in 1876 at a cost of between \$4,000 and \$5,000, and seats 450. Services at 10.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 2 p.m. Bible class, Tuesday. Prayer meeting, Thursday. There are 75 members. Rev. Robt. M. Pope, pastor.

The Christadelphian Society was organized in 1860. Services at 11 a.m. There are 30 members. D. D. Hay, M.P.P., chief speaker.

The site of Listowel was laid out in 1854 by John Grant, P.L.S., and the first lot was purchased by W. H. Hacking, the first and present postmaster. Wilhelm Meissner was the first settler. He came in April, 1852, and John Benning came with him. John A. Tremaine was the next in-comer, in October, 1852. Mr. Hacking came from Guelph in 1855, occupying three days in coming from Hawksville, the road being only partly cut out. He opened the first store, in 1856, in which year the post office was established. D. D. and W. G. Hay, A. N. Poland, D. D. Campbell, Charles Dodd and James Barber, were among the earliest settlers, in 1854.

Listowel was incorporated as a village in 1866, and as a town in 1875. The present population is about 3000.

**Monckton**, a post village on the town line between Elma and Logan, on the gravel road from Listowel to Mitchell, being about 11 miles from each place. It contains three churches (Presb., Epis. and Meth.), three hotels, two saw mills, three stores, a shoe shop, carriage and blacksmith shop, and 200 inhabitants.

The Monckton Saw Mills have been established three years. Fifteen to twenty men are employed in the manufacture of lumber, lath, posts &c., turning out about 3,000,000 feet of lumber annually. Wm. Machan, proprietor.

Knox Church (Presb.) is a frame building, seating 300. It was erected 10 years ago. Services at 2 p.m. Sunday school at 1 p.m. Rev. Robt. Renwick, of Elma Centre, officiates.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 150. It was erected in 1877. Services at 10 a.m. Rev. E. A. Fear, pastor.

The village was laid out in 1857 by Edward Winstanley, the proprietor of the land. The post office was established in 1858, Edward Greensides being the first and present post master.

**Newry**, a post village on the gravel road from Mitchell to Listowel, six miles from Listowel, and one mile from Newry Station. It contains a store, carriage shop, cheese factory, blacksmith shop, hotel, shoe shop, and 100 inhabitants.

The Newry Cheese Factory was established in 1873. John Morrison, proprietor.

The village was first settled by C. Coulter, and the post office was established in 1861.

**Newry Station**, a post village, is located on the Mitchell and Listowel gravel road, five miles from Listowel. It is a station on the Southern Extension of the W. G. & B. R. and contains two churches (Bap. and Presb.), two blacksmith shops, a rake factory, two carriage shops, two hotels, a saw mill and cheese box factory, bakery, flouring mill, two stores, a stove, shingle and barrel factory, a shoe store, tannery, harness shop, tailor shop, and 350 inhabitants.

The stove and barrel factory of Kertcher & Anderson has been established four years. Ten to twelve hands are employed in the manufacture of staves, shingles, barrels, &c., to the value of from \$8,000 to \$10,000 annually.

The lumber, lath and cheese box factory of Dunn & Wood has been established five years. Ten men are employed in the manufacture of 1,000,000 feet of lumber, 50,000 to 60,000 lath, and 8,000 to 10,000 cheese boxes annually.

The Newry Station Mills (flouring) were established in January 1877. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 100 barrels a day. Steam power is employed. Hill & Bowes, proprietors.

The Newry Tannery has been established four years. Kip, calf, upper, lace and harness leather is manufactured, to the value of \$12,000 annually. Peter McVean, proprietor.

There is also a rake factory for the manufacture of wooden rakes. Elma Centre Lodge, No. 969, I.O.G.T., was organized in 1876. James Hay, W.C.; John Langhead, Sec. Meets Fridays. There are 60 members.

The Presbyterian Church is a white brick building, seating 450. It was erected in 1877 at a cost of \$5,000. Services at 10.30 a.m. Sunday school at 9 a.m. Bible class at 6.30 p.m. There are 100 members. Rev. Robt. Renwick, pastor.

The Baptist Church is a frame building, seating 300. It was erected in 1876 at a cost of \$1,500. Services at 10.30 a.m. Sunday school at 9 a.m. There are 60 members. Rev. Alex. McKenzie, pastor.

This rising village has grown up in the last six or eight years and is rapidly improving.

**Trowbridge**, a post village on lot 7 in the 2d concession, five miles from Listowel. The middle branch of the Maitland River runs through the village, affording an excellent water privilege. The village contains three churches (Canada Meth., M. E. and Presb.), a grist mill, two saw mills, two stores, a cabinet shop, hotel, two carriage shops, two blacksmith shops, a cheese factory, shingle factory, and 150 inhabitants.

The Victoria Cheese Factory was established in 1874, and uses the milk of 200 cows in the manufacture of 60,000 pounds of cheese annually. Thompson & Cosens, proprietors.

An Orange Lodge was organized here three years ago. Meets first Tuesday on or before full moon. Geo. Rose, W. M. There are 30 members.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 250. It was erected in 1862. Services at 10.30 a. m. and 2.30 p. m. Sunday school after morning service. Bible class, Monday. Lecture and prayer meeting, Thursday. There are 70 members. Rev. Joseph Deacon, pastor.

The M. E. Church is a frame building, seating 200. Services every other Sunday at 2.30 p. m. Rev. Mr. Pope, of Listowel, officiates.

The Presbyterian Church is a frame building, seating 250. It was erected in 1877, at a cost of \$725 including site. Services at 2.30 p. m. Sunday school at 1 p. m.

The village was settled in 1852 by the Code, Christie, Frier, Moss and Cosens families, and the post office was established in 1854, G. Code being the first post master.

## FULLARTON.

This township is bounded on the north-east by the townships of Logan and Ellice; on the north west by Hibbert; south west by Osborne and Blanshard; and south-east by Downie. It is watered by the River Thames and Black Creek, the former passing entirely through the township, and intersecting the village of Fullarton, and the latter passing through Carlingford. The Buffalo and Goderich division of the G. T. R. crosses the township near and parallel to the north-east line. The land is generally of excellent quality and the farms well improved. The township contains an area of 49,020 acres, and the population is 2,520. There are four post offices in the township, viz., Carlingford, Fullarton, Motherwell and Russeldale.

**Carlingford** is a post village situated on Black Creek, on lot 5, in the 6th concession, distant seven miles from Sebringville, eight from Mitchell, ten from Stratford and ten from St. Marys. It contains two churches (Meth. and Presb.), a carriage and blacksmith shop, hotel, shoe shop, store, and 50 inhabitants.

Carlingford Temple, No. 237, I. O. G. T. was organized April 7th, 1877. John Davidson, W. C.; Daniel Hetherington, S. Meets Mondays. There are 43 members.

Carlingford Lodge, No. 1176, L. O. L. was organized 15 years ago. James E. Canuing, W. M.; Wm. Plunkett, S. Meets Saturday on or before full moon. There are 25 members.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 250. Services are held at 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 10.30 a.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. Rev. Messrs. Fisher and Mapleton, officiate. There are 60 members.

The Presbyterian Church is a frame building, seating 200. Services at 2.30 p.m. Sunday school at 1.30 p.m. Rev. J. K. Hyslop, of Avonton, officiates.

The village was first settled in 1856, by Abraham Davidson, who was the first post master.

**Fullarton** is a post village on the River Thames, at the intersection of the Thames and Mitchell roads, being 16 miles from Stratford, 12 from St. Marys, and six from Mitchell. It contains three churches (Bible Christian, Canada Meth. and Rep.), two stores, a saw mill and cheese box factory, hotel, cheese factory, shoe shop, harness shop, blacksmith shop, carriage shop, cabinet shop, and 150 inhabitants.

The saw mill and cheese box factory of John Goettler has been established three years. Four hands are employed in the manufacture of 300,000 feet of lumber and from 4000 to 6000 cheese boxes per annum.

The Fullarton Cheese Factory was established in 1870, and consumes the milk of 600 cows in the manufacture of from 2200 to 2400 cheeses per annum. Wm. Huxley, proprietor.

Summervale Temple, No. 108, L.O.G.T. was organized June 17th, 1875. David Davis, W.C.; Joseph Woodley, S.; James Woodley, Lodge Deputy. Meets Fridays. There are 65 members.

The Baptist Church is a frame building, seating 150. It was erected in 1866 at a cost of \$650. Services at 11 a.m. Sunday school before morning service. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. There are 43 members. Rev. Alex. McFadyen, pastor.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 200. It has been erected 10 or 12 years. Services at 2.30 and 6.30 p.m. alternately. Sunday school at 1 p.m. Prayer meeting, Thursday. There are 45 members. Rev. John Fisher, pastor.

The Bible Christian Church is a frame building, seating 150. It was erected 20 years ago. Services at 2.30 and 6.30 p.m. alternately. Sunday school at 1 p.m. Prayer meeting, Tuesday. There are 46 members. Rev. Geo. Dunkley, pastor.

The village was settled in 1843 by John and James Woodley. The post office was established in 1853, John Buchan being the first post master.

**Motherwell** is a post office on the River Thames, six miles from St. Marys.

**Russeldale** is a post village on the Thames road, lot 34, six miles from Mitchell. It contains an hotel, blacksmith shop, store, and 40 inhabitants.

#### HIBBERT.

This township is bounded north east by the townships of McKillop and Logan; north west by Tuckersmith; south east by Fullarton; and south west by Osborne. The B. & L. R. division of the G. T. R. passes through the township near and parallel to the north-east line. The area of the township is 44,332 acres, and the population 3,169. There are three post offices in the township, viz., Cromarty, Stada and Carronbrook.

**Carronbrook** is a post village and station on the Buffalo and Goderich division of the G. T. R., five miles from Mitchell. Carron Brook, a small stream, passes through the village. It contains an Episcopal church, two carriage shops, four hotels, five stores, an ashery, harness shop, tailor shop, two shoe shops, a saw mill, two blacksmith shops, a salt manufactory, stave factory, and 450 inhabitants.

The Carronbrook Mammoth Salt Mills were established in 1874 and are among the most extensive in the Province. The furnace consists of three arches, over which is the pan for boiling, which is 134 feet long by 34 feet wide. The water is brought five miles through iron pipes, from near Seaforth, and the boiling is continued night and day. Twelve men are employed and 200 barrels of salt are turned out per day of 24 hours. In connection with the works is a stave factory, employing 12 or 13 men. J. & J. Kidd, proprietors.

St. Ann's Church (Epis.) is a frame building, seating 100. It was erected in 1867, at a cost of \$1000. Services every other Sunday at 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. alternately. Sunday school at 4 p.m. Rev. Mr. Evans, of Mitchell, officiates.

The village was first settled by Thos. Fox. The post office was established in 1854. U. C. Lee being the first post master.

**Cromarty** is a post village on lot 16, in the 11th concession, six miles from Carronbrook, and contains one church (Presb.), two carriage shops, two blacksmith shops, a shoe shop, hotel, store and 65 inhabitants.

The Presbyterian Church is built of stone, and has a seating capacity of 500. It was erected in 1864 at a cost of \$700. Services at 11 a.m. Sunday school at 9.30 a.m. Prayer meeting, Thursday. Rev. Peter Scott, officiates.

The post office was established in 1856, John McLaren being the first post master.

**Staffa** is a post village on lot 16 in the 9th concession, distant five miles from Carronbrook. It contains a Methodist church, a carriage shop, blacksmith shop, shoe shop, store, hotel, flouring mill, and 100 inhabitants.

The Staffa Mills (flouring) have been established 12 years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 400 bushels per day. Robt. G. Webb, proprietor.

Rock of Safety Temple, No. 591, I.O.G.T. was reorganized in 1874 Joseph Heggarrh, W.C.; Wm. Norris, S. Meets Wednesday. There are 50 members.

The Canada Methodist Church is a white brick building, seating 250. It was erected in 1877 at a cost of \$1500. Services at 10.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. alternately. Sunday school at 2.30 p.m. Rev. J. S. Fisher, of Fullarton, officiates.

The village was settled in 1859 by Chas. Tuffin. The post office was established in 1862, Thos. Dunn being the first post master.

### LOGAN.

This township is bounded north-west by the township of McKillop; north-east by Grey and Elma; south-east by Ellice; and south-west by Hibbert and Fullarton. It is well watered by branches of the Thames. There are three post offices in the township, viz., Bornholm, Brodhagen, and Mitchell. The area of the township is 53,771 acres, and the population 2,789.

**Bornholm** is a post village on the Mitchell and Elma gravel road, five miles from Mitchell, seventeen from Listowel and the same from Stratford. It contains two hotels, a blacksmith shop, saw mill, store, and 75 inhabitants. The village was settled by John Hagarty. The post office was established in 1863, T. Hagarty being the first post master.

**Brodhagen** is a post office on lot 31 in the 8th concession, on the Brodhagen River, six miles from Carronbrook and nine from Mitchell. The post office was established in 1863, C. Brodhagen being the first post master.

**Mitchell** is situated on the town line between the townships of Logan and Fullarton, and is a station on the Buffalo and Goderich division of the G. T. R., 32 miles from Goderich, 103 from Toronto, 128 from Buffalo, and 12 from Stratford. The River Thames passes through the town. There are a number of good gravel roads leading into the town, affording excellent facilities to the farmers for bringing grain and produce to market. The gravel road from the north is 30 miles in length, intersecting the townships of Logan, Elma and Wallace, to the boundary of Minto, Wellington Co. From the south there are two gravel roads, one from St. Marys, and

the Thames road from Exeter. East and west it is intersected by the Huron gravel road and the G. T. R. The manufacturing interests of Mitchell are steadily growing in importance, and the mercantile interests are well sustained and liberally patronized.

In her educational facilities Mitchell is by no means behind her sister towns of the Province, the accommodations being ample, the buildings substantial, and the schools efficiently officered and well patronized.

For fire protection the Holly system of water works has been established at a cost of \$15,000. Hydrants are situated at regular intervals through the town, and the works have thus far proved effective and given general satisfaction.

There are seven churches in the town, viz., Canada Presb., Cath., Canada Meth., Bible Christian, Lutheran, Primitive Meth. and Epis., several of whose structures are substantial brick buildings and ornaments to the town.

For the accommodation of strangers Mitchell can boast of superior hotels, the most conspicuous of which, the Hicks House and the Royal, are not surpassed in the Province west of Toronto.

The Mechanics' Institute has been organized about 20 years. The library contains 1200 volumes. Connected with the Institute is a reading room, and evening classes are sustained every winter. J. Broderick, Prest; Frederick Butcher, Sec. Rooms over Colwell's store, Main street.

The *Press* is represented by the *Mitchell Advocate* and *Mitchell Recorder*, issued weekly, ably managed and well supported.

The population of the town is about 2,700 and steadily increasing.

The tannery of Wm. Kerr has been established seven years. Nine men are employed, turning out 6000 sides of buff and pebble leather annually.

The A. M. Gibson Manufacturing Co. was organized June 1st, 1877. Capital \$75,000. From 125 to 150 hands are employed in the manufacture of iron and wood working machinery, steam engines, boilers, burglar and fire-proof safes, agricultural implements &c.

The oat meal mill of Currie & Thompson has been established five years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 80 to 100 barrels a day.

Holland's Mills (flouring) have been established eight years. There are four runs of stones, with a capacity of 150 barrels a day.

The machine shops of Hill & Harrison were established in 1877. Six hands are employed in the manufacture of mill machinery, grist and saw mills &c.

The Ontario Carriage Works have been established four years and employ ten men. James McPhail, proprietor.

The furniture, sash, door and blind factory of Flagg & Vroman was established in 1873. Twelve men are employed who turn out work to the value of \$8,000 per annum.

The Dominion Hosiery Manufactory has been established two years and employs 50 hands, turning out \$20,000 worth of hosiery annually.

The Canadian Knitting Mill has been established three years. It employs 38 hands in the manufacture of all kinds of knit goods to the value of \$20,000 per annum. Albert Goebel, proprietor.

The tannery of F. G. Lynde has been established 25 years. Four hands are employed, turning out harness and upper leather to the value of \$5,000 or \$6,000 annually.

The Mitchell Packing House has been established five years, and does a business of from \$60,000 to \$80,000 per annum. Jno. Whyte, proprietor.

The Mitchell Woolen Mills have been established 10 or 12 years. Nine to twelve hands are employed in the manufacture of all kinds of woolen goods. D. H. Dorman, proprietor.

The Mitchell Foundry was established in 1866. Twelve men are employed in the manufacture of stoves and agricultural implements to the value of \$35,000 annually. A. Mulheron & Co., proprietors.

The carriage works of Stiles & Tucker were established in 1856. Connected with this establishment is a planing mill and manufactory of bent stuff. Twenty-five hands are employed, turning out work to the value of \$20,000 per annum.

The flax mill of Andrew Forrester has been established eight years. Thirty-five hands are employed in the manufacture of scutched flax to the amount of 30 to 40 tons per annum.

The stave factory of Alex. Mitchell has been established four years, and manufactures 3,000,000 staves and heading annually.

St George Mills (flouring) have been established seven years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 400 bushels a day. S. Pearce & Son, proprietors.

The Mitchell Hose Co. was organized in 1875. There are 32 members. Wm. Livingstone, Captain; John Mulheron, Chief Engineer.

Mitchell Lodge, No. 135, L.O.L. has been organized about 25 years. Arthur McArthur, W.M.; Joseph Pollard, S. Meets second Monday in each month. There are 31 members.

The Mitchell Grange was organized in 1875 and consists of 102 members. Meets every two weeks. A general store is maintained.

Tudor Lodge, No. 141, A. F. & A.M. meets Tuesday on or before full moon. Thos. Babb, W.M.; Hugh McIntyre, S.

Fortress Lodge, No. 415, I.O.G.T. was organized about 1864: J. H. Flagg, W.C.; M. Vroman, S. Meets Thursdays. There are 85 members.

Bissel Lodge, No. 51, I.O.O.F. was organized in 1868. C. A. Hennicke, N.G.; Isaac Hord, S. Meets Mondays. There are 130 members.

Trinity Church (Epis.) is a frame building, seating 400. It was erected in 1861 at a cost of \$2,500. Services at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Sunday school at 9.30 a.m. There are 60 communicants. Rev. W. B. Evans, M. A., incumbent.

The Primitive Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 200. It was erected about 15 years ago, at a cost of \$900. Services at 2.30 p.m. Sunday school at 9.30 a.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. There are 28 members. Rev. J. H. Moore, pastor.

The Lutheran Church is a frame building, seating 200. It was erected in 1862. Services at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. alternately. Sunday school at 1 and 2 p.m. alternately. There are 25 members. Rev. Mr. Schultz, of Logan, officiates.

Knox Church (Canada Presb.) is a frame building, seating 200. It was erected 22 years ago, at a cost of \$2000. Services at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 2.30 p.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. Rev. James W. Mitchell, M.A., pastor.

The Bible Christian Church is a brick building, seating 400. It was erected 24 years ago. Services at 10.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 2.30 p.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. Young people's prayer meeting, Friday. There are 100 members. Rev. Wm. Hooper, pastor.

The Canada Methodist Church is a brick building, and was completed 10 or 12 years ago. Services at 10.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sunday school at 2 p.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday. Young people's prayer meeting, Tuesday. Rev. Chas. Lavell, pastor.

The Roman Catholic Church is a brick building, seating 500. It was erected in 1876 at a cost of \$4000. Services at 10.30 a.m. every alternate Sunday. Sunday school at 3 p.m. There are 40 families in connection with this church. Rev. Dean Murphy, priest.

The village plat consisted originally of 400 acres, owned and laid out by the Canada Company. The place was originally known as the "Big Thames." The first sale of lots took place in 1836, and in October of that year, John Hicks, who was the first settler, pitched his tent in Mitchell. The next pioneer was Daniel Kerr, who settled in November, 1842. The first store was opened in

September 1844 by W. F. McCulloch. The second store was opened by Wm. Matheson, in November of the same year. The first church was erected by the Wesleyan Methodists in 1855, of brick, at a cost of \$2000.

Mitchell was incorporated as a village June 10th, 1857, Thos. Ford being the first Reeve. The town was incorporated in 1873, Thos Matheson being the first Mayor. The present population is about 2,650.

#### MORNINGTON.

This township is bounded north-west by the township of Elma; north-east by Maryborough (Wellington Co.); south east by Wellesley (Waterloo Co.); and south-west by Ellice. It is well watered by branches of the Grand River, affording excellent facilities for manufacturing purposes. The Stratford and Huron R. R. enters the township on its south-west border near the village of Brunner, and runs north to Listowel, intersecting the village of Milverton on the way. The township is well settled and contains a large number of excellent farms. The area of the township is 43,523 acres. There are 10 post offices in the township, viz., Brunner, Burns, Carthage, Millbank, Milverton, Morningdale, Musselburgh, Poole, Topping and Tralee.

**Brunner** is a post village on the Ellice line, 12 miles from Stratford by rail and three from Milverton. It contains two saw mills, an hotel, a blacksmith shop, and 60 inhabitants.

The saw mill of Chas. Gropp has been established four years. Twelve men are employed in the manufacture of lumber, lath and shingles, to the value of \$5000 per annum.

The saw mill of James Kyle has been established 15 or 16 years. Eight to ten men are employed in the manufacture of lumber, lath and shingles, turning out from 750,000 to 1,000,000 feet of lumber per annum.

**Burns** is a post village on lots 9 and 10, in the 10th and 11th concessions, 19 miles from Stratford and 11 from Listowel. It contains a carriage and blacksmith shop, a store, hotel and 40 inhabitants. The place was first settled by Wm. Cousins, who was appointed post master on the establishment of the office, in 1862.

**Carthage** is a post village on lot 6 in the 12th concession, eight miles north of Milverton, and nine from Listowel. Smith's Creek passes through the village, affording good hydraulic power. The

village contains a Methodist church, a blacksmith shop, three stores, a harness shop, tailor shop, carriage shop, flouring and saw mill, hotel, and 100 inhabitants.

The Carthage Flouring Mill has been established 14 or 15 years. James Moore, proprietor.

The Carthage Saw Mill has been established 14 or 15 years, and cuts about 1,000,000 feet of lumber per annum. James Moore, proprietor.

Forest Home Temple, No. 54, I.O.G.T. meets every Friday. Geo. Barker, W.C.; Jas. Watson, S.; Jas. Moore, Temple Deputy. There are 30 members.

The Canada Methodist Church is a log building, seating 150, and was erected 12 or 14 years ago. Services at 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. alternately. Sunday school at 2 p.m. Prayer meeting, Wednesday.

The village was settled in 1849 by Alex. Patterson, Alex. Glenn, J. Barton and Thomas Hamilton. The post office was established in 1854.

**Dorking** is a post village in the north east corner, lying partly in three counties, viz., Perth, Waterloo and Wellington. It contains a blacksmith shop, two stores, two hotels, a cooper shop, and 50 inhabitants.

Oak Leaf Division, No. 358, S. of T. was organized in 1875. Chas. McLaughlin, W.P.; John Miller, Scribe. Meet Thursdays. There are 59 members.

The Canada Methodist Church is a frame building, seating 150. It was erected in 1874 at a cost of \$1100. Service at 2 p.m. Sunday school at 12:30 p.m.

**Millbank** is a post village on the northern gravel road leading from Stratford, from which place it is distant 17 miles. The River Nith flows through the centre of the village and affords an excellent water privilege. The S. & H. R. passes within two miles from the village, from which point it is proposed to extend a branch. The village contains three churches (Presb., Epis. and Canada Meth.), three hotels, a brick yard, ashery, harness shop, confectionery store, pump factory, cabinet shop, two drug stores, two book stores, a jewelry store, two foundries, a flax mill, two general stores, a bakery, tailor shop, two carriage shops, three blacksmith shops, a stove and tin shop, a saw and grist mill, two shoe shops, a carding mill, and about 500 inhabitants.

The flax mill of W. & P. Livingston has been established seven years. Twenty hands are employed, turning out about \$10,000 worth of flax per annum.

The agricultural implement manufactory of Jacob Kollman was established in 1863. Twenty men are employed in the manufacture of all kinds of agricultural implements to the value of, from \$30,000 to \$40,000 per annum.

The Phoenix Foundry was established in January 1877. Four men are employed in the manufacture of ploughs, cutting boxes, and other agricultural implements. John Martin, proprietor.

The Millbank Saw Mills have been established 20 years. About 800,000 feet of lumber is cut per annum. Rutherford & Melvin, proprietors.

The Millbank Flouring Mills have been established 25 years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 125 bushels a day. Rutherford & Melvin, proprietors.

L.O.L. No. 45, Thos. Magwood, W.M.; Thos. Farrell, S. Meets Friday on or before full moon.

The post office was established in 1862, David Matthews being the first post master.

**Topping** is a post office on the northern gravel road, on the line of North Easthope, 10 miles from Stratford. The post office was established in 1862, S. Crozier being the first post master.

**Tyrone** (Tralee p. o.) is a post village on Smith's Creek, on the north-east line, seven miles from Listowel, and contains a blacksmith shop, two hotels, a store, and 50 inhabitants.

The township originally formed part of the "Queen's Bush," which also included the townships of Peel, Arthur, Wellesley and Maryborough, formerly clergy reserves, but gradually opened for settlement.

### NORTH EASTHOPE.

This township is bounded north-east by the township of Wellesley, east by Wilmot, north-west by Ellice, and south by South Easthope. It is watered by the River Avon and tributaries of the River Nith. The land is generally level, though near the centre it is somewhat hilly, and in the north it is partly swampy. The soil is excellent and there are many fine farms. There are five post offices in the township, viz., Gadshill, Hampstead, Lisbon, Nithburg and Shakspeare. The area of the township is 43,691 acres.

**Amulree** is a small village on the 6th and 7th concessions, four miles north of Shakspeare, and nine from Stratford. It contains a store, hotel, a saw and shingle mill, chopping mill, blacksmith shop, and 50 inhabitants. There is no post office, the residents receiving their mail at Shakspeare.

The saw mill of Alex. M. Fisher was established in 1876. Eight men are employed and 10,000 feet of lumber are turned out per day. In connection with the saw mill is a chopping mill, recently established.

**Gadshill** is a post village on the northern gravel road, and on the line of Ellice, five miles from Stratford, and is almost entirely surrounded by the "Great Swamp," which commences about a mile east of it and runs north-west for several miles. The S. & H. R. runs within a mile of the village. The village contains one church (Evangelical), a carriage shop, two saw mills, two blacksmith shops, a shoe shop, two stave factories, a cooper shop, two hotels, a store, planing mill, grist mill, shingle factory, fanning mill factory, and 100 inhabitants.

The saw mill of James Corcoran has been established 10 years. Twelve men are employed in the manufacture of lumber and lath.

The saw and planing mills of Henry Ratz have been established 19 years. Fifteen men are employed in the manufacture of lumber, staves, heading, shingles and fanning mills.

The grist mill of Henry Ratz has been established three years. There are three runs of stones.

The stave, heading and barrel factory of Junker & Hasenpflug has been established five years. Eleven hands are employed. One thousand cords of wood are worked up per annum.

**Hampstead** is a post village on the 11th concession, six miles north of Shakspeare and 10 from Stratford. It contains a Presbyterian church, a blacksmith shop, cheese factory, shoe shop, and 40 inhabitants. A fine brick school house has been erected the present year (1877) at a cost of between \$3000 and \$4000.

The Hampstead Cheese Factory has been established nine years, and consumes the milk of 300 cows. David Robertson, proprietor.

The Presbyterian Church is a frame building, seating 250. It was erected 14 years ago. Services at 2 p.m. Sunday school after service. There are 25 members. Rev. Robert Watt, of Shakspeare, officiates.

The village was settled about 1853, by Peter Stewart. The post office was established in 1865, Richard Lillico being the first post master.

**Lisbon** is a post village on the line of Wilmot, Waterloo Co., 13 miles from Stratford. It contains a shoe shop, hotel, blacksmith shop, tailor shop, grocery, cheese factory, and 75 inhabitants. The residents are principally German.

The Lisbon Cheese Factory was established in 1870, and consumes the milk of 250 cows in the manufacture of from 50,000 to 60,000 pounds of cheese annually. John N. Zinkann, proprietor.

The village was laid out in 1855 by John Zinkann, the present postmaster.

**Nithburg** is a post village on the line of Wellesley, 12 miles from Stratford. The River Nith flows through the village, affording an excellent water privilege. The village contains a store, grist mill, saw mill, cooper shop, blacksmith shop, and 75 inhabitants.

The Nithburg Mills (grist) have been established 20 years. There are three runs of stones. J. & D. Gabel, proprietors.

### SOUTH EASTHOPE.

This township is bounded north by North Easthope, east by Wilmot (Waterloo Co.), west by Downie, and south by East Zorra (Oxford Co.) The Buffalo and Lake Huron division of the G.T.R. and the P.D. & L.H.R. run parallel to each other through the township from Stratford to Tavistock, and the main line of the G. T. R. crosses from east to west parallel to the north boundary. Within three miles of Stratford are several small lakes, known as the "Little Lakes," one of which, in this township, covers about eight acres, is of an oval shape, and apparently has no inlet or known source of supply. It supplies another lake at a short distance. It is placed between two ridges, and is most beautifully situated, being surrounded by evergreens. The soil of this township is exceedingly fertile, and the farms well improved. The area is 24,683 acres, and the population 1,668. Although the villages of Harmony, Shakspeare and Tavistock lie partly in this township, there is not a post office in the township itself.

**Sebastopol** is a small village located one mile north of Tavistock, and contains an hotel, shoe shop, flax mill, carriage shop, cider mill, blacksmith shop, and 100 inhabitants. The residents receive their mail at Tavistock.

The flax mill of Klein & Kalbfleisch has been established five years, and employs 18 men, turning out from \$15,000 to \$20,000 worth of flax per annum.

It contains two tailor shops, four hotels, three shoe shops, a bakery, two stove and tin shops, two carriage shops, a pump factory, three general stores, two cooper shops, a woolen mill, three cabinet shops, a flax mill, two flouring mills, a tannery, three blacksmith shops, a pottery, harness shop, jewelry store, stave and barrel factory, drug store, cheese box factory, saw and planing mill, three churches (Evangelical, Baptist and Lutheran), and 700 inhabitants. The residents are principally German.

The Tavistock Carriage Works have been established seven years, and employ 12 men. From \$8,000 to \$10,000 worth of work is turned out annually. Henry Diebel, proprietor.

The Tavistock Mills (flouring) were established in 1866. There are four runs of stones, with a capacity of 100 barrels a day. Geo. Malcolm, proprietor.

The cheese box factory of Robison & Robertson was established in 1875 and employs two men, turning out about 16,000 boxes annually.

The saw and planing mill, and furniture manufactory of Kalbfleisch & Schafer was established in 1869, and employs from 15 to 20 men in the manufacture of furniture, house building &c.

The stave, heading and barrel factory of John Zimmerman has been established nine years, and employs from 12 to 15 men.

The Tavistock Steam Woolen Mills have been established six years, and employ 10 or 12 hands in the manufacture of all kinds of woolen goods. Field & Hetherington, proprietors.

The Tavistock Pottery was established in 1876 and employs five hands, turning out from \$3,000 to \$4,000 worth of goods annually. Wendlin Schuler, proprietor.
