These Registration Fees are, of course, in addition to the Postage, and must be prepaid.

DISPOSAL OF UNPAID OR INSUFFICIENTLY PAID LETTERS MAILED IN CANADA.

If for places within the Dominion.—A letter wholly unpaid is not forwarded, but is sent to the Dead-Letter Office, Ottawa. If prepaid at least one rate, that is, 3 cents, the letter is forwarded to destination, but is rated with double the deficient postage. This rule applies also to city or "drop" letters, the postage on which 1 cent per $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce.

If for the United States.—A letter, whether wholly unpaid, or insufficiently paid, is not forwarded from Canada, but is sent to the Dead-

Letter Office, Ottawa, in order to be there opened and returned to its writer.

If for the United Kingdom.—A letter wholly unpaid is forwarded, but is rated with double postage, that is, 5 pence sterling per $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce. If it is insufficiently prepaid, it is charged at the same rate, deducting what may have been prepaid.

If for other British Colonies or Foreign Countries (except France).—A letter whether wholly unpaid, or only insufficiently paid, is sent to the Dead-Letter Office, Ottawa.

LOCAL OR "DROP" LETTERS.

One cent per half ounce, to be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

POSTAL CARDS.

Canadian Postal Cards of one cent each circulate within the Dominion,—and are transmissible, without further charge, to the United States and Newfoundland.

Newspapers.—Between places in the Dominion, to the United States, to Newfoundland, publishers prepay their edition in bulk, at the rate of one cent for each pound weight; no further charge on delivery. Transient newspapers within the Dominion, to the United States and Newfoundland, one cent per four ounces, to be prepaid by stamp. Transient papers for the United Kingdom, two cents per four ounces.

Periodicals.—Published in Canada not less frequently than once a month, sent from office of publication, or from news agencies, for places in the Dominion, to the United States or to Newfoundland, the postage rate is the same as for newspapers, *i.e.*, one cent per pound, when paid by the bulk weight; Transient Periodicals, one cent per four ounces. Newspapers and periodicals for the Dominion, the United States, or Newfoundland, weighing less than one ounce each, may be posted singly, if prepaid by stamp, one half cent each.

A "book packet" may contain any number
of separate books, publications, works of liter-
ature and art, maps or prints, photographs,
daguerotypes, when not in glass or in frames
containing glass; any quantity of paper, vellum,
or parchment (to the exclusion of letters), and
the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either
written, printed or plain, or any mixture of the
packages must be *open at both ends or both sides*.

Patterns.—Rates between Canada and United
Kingdom and France, same as for Book Post.

Patterns or samples must not be of any
intrinsic value; and this rule excludes all
articles of a saleable nature, and whatever may

have a value of its own, apart from its mere use as a pattern; nor must the quantity of any material or article sent as a pattern or sample be so great that it could have on this ground an intrinsic value.

Patterns, &c., must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, and such like, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, simply tied at the neck, or, provided that bags be transparent, they may be entirely closed, if they are for delivery within the United Kingdom. Bags, however, entirely closed, even though they be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to foreign parts. Patterns and samples of merchandize, not exceeding the weight of eight ounces, addressed to the United States, may be sent at the rate of ten cents for each package.

A packet of patterns of samples sent to France or Portugal, must not exceed 18 inches in length, and 12 inches in width or depth; a packet to any other place abroad must not exceed 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth or depth.

Parcels can only be sent by Post to places in Canada. Postages and registration fee must be pre-paid. The limit of weight to Parcels is 4 lbs.

Transmission of Patterns and Samples within the Province of Canada.

Patterns or samples of merchandise, and goods for sale, may be posted in Canada, to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on pre-payment by postage stamp of a rate of one cent per four ounces, under the following regulations:—

I.—Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened, or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

II.—The packet may bear on the *outside* the address of the sender in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended—also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the articles enclosed; *inside* there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves—the particulars, however, of the trade marks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves instead of on the outside of the packet, at the option of the sender.

III.—Any sample or pattern packet containing a letter, or otherwise violating the conditions of the preceding rules, is to be rated and treated as a letter.

IV.—The rate of 1 cent per four ounces is to be pre-paid by postage stamp,—and if such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the package is to be rated with the deficient postage, and a fine of five cents in addition.

V.—Packets of samples or patterns may be registered on pre-payment by postage stamp of a registration fee of five cents in addition to the

postage rate—and provided such packets be duly handed in to the Post Office for registration.

A registration receipt or certificate should always be obtained for such packages when presented for registration.

VI.—No packet of samples or patterns must exceed 24 ounces in weight; any packet exceeding that weight is to be sent to the Postmaster-General.

Penal Clause.—The Act contains the following penal clauses: To enclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a parcel posted for the parcel post, or to enclose a letter, or any writing, or make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to enclose any other thing in a newspaper, posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers), is an offence punishable by a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars.

Miscellaneous Postal Matter.—On books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices current, hand-bills, book and newspaper manuscripts, printers' proof sheets, whether corrected or not; maps, prints, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, sheet music, whether printed or written; documents wholly or partly printed or written, such as deeds, insurance policies, militia and school returns, or other documents of like nature, packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions or grafts, paterus or samples of goods or merchandise, when posted in Canada for any place in Canada, the rate of postage is one cent per four ounces in weight, to be pre-paid by postage stamp, or by the use of stamped Post bands when suitable for the purpose. No letter or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter must be sent or enclosed in any article of miscellaneous mail matter; and all transmissions authorized by this regulation must be put up in covers, open at the ends or sides, or in such manner as to admit of inspection to ensure compliance with this condition.

Miscellaneous mail matter as above specified, when addressed to the United States or to Newfoundland, may be forwarded, when pre-paid the one cent per 4 oz. rate, as if addressed to a place in Canada, with the exception of packets of samples and patterns of merchandise addressed to the United States, on which the special rate of ten cents must be pre-paid.

Money Orders in Canada.—All the Money Order Post Offices in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Manitoba and British Columbia, are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many Orders of \$100 each as the applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz :—

Money Orders on the United Kingdom.—The Money Order Offices in the Dominion also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, the Channel Islands, and British India, save those in British India for which there are special rates, for any sum up to £10 sterling, and grant as many Orders for £10 sterling each as may be needed to make up the amount to be remitted. All the Money Order Offices in the Dominion are also authorized to grant Money Orders on the United States, the maximum amount of which, however, upon a single order is limited to \$40 Canadian currency. The rates are:—

In all classes of Orders, as many of the maximum amount may be obtained as will be

needed to make up the sum the applicant desires to remit.

By the amended Post Office Act, which came in force on the 1st October, any Postmaster issuing Money Orders on credit, and any person aiding and abetting, or procuring the issue of such orders, will be guilty of misdemeanor.

The Money Order Post Offices in the Dominion are furnished with lists of all the Money Order Offices in Canada, the United Kingdom, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Manitoba, British Columbia and Newfoundland, and the Postmasters are instructed to afford every information in their power, in respect of the places upon which they draw, together with any other information relating to the issues as the intending remitters may desire.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

1. The Post Office Savings Bank commenced operations in Ontario and Quebec on the 1st April, 1868.

2. The direct security of the Dominion is given by the Statute for all deposits made.

3. At each Savings Bank Post Office the Savings Bank regulations may be read by the public, giving full information with respect to the mode of depositing and withdrawing money, and these regulations are printed upon the cover of the Pass Book supplied to each depositor.

4. Any person may have a deposit account, and deposits are received daily during the ordinary hours of Post Office business, of any number of dollars, from \$1 up to \$300, the total amount which can be received from a depositor in any one year, except in cases to be specially authorized by the Postmaster-General.

5. The Postmasters of the Savings Bank Offices will act as agents for the receipt of the money deposited for transmission to the Post-

master-General, and for the payment by the Postmaster-General of money withdrawn by depositors.

6. Each depositor is supplied with a Pass Book, and the sums paid in, or withdrawn, are entered therein by the Postmaster receiving or paying the same. In addition, a direct receipt for each amount paid in is sent to the depositor from the Postmaster-General, and the Postmaster-General will issue a cheque payable at any Post Office Savings Bank desired, for any sum withdrawn.

7. Every depositor's account is thus kept with the Postmaster-General, and a depositor may pay into his or her account with the Post Office Savings Bank, at any of the Savings Bank Post Offices, which at the time may best suit his convenience, and exercise the same choice in drawing out money, subject only to the obligation of producing the Pass Book, in proof of identity, whenever paying in or drawing out deposits.

8. Interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum is allowed on deposits.

9. Postmasters are forbidden by law to disclose the name of any depositor, or the amount of any sum deposited or withdrawn.

10. No charge will be made to depositors on paying in, or drawing out money, nor for postage or communications with the Postmaster-General in relation thereto.

11. The Postmaster-General will always be ready to receive and attend to all applications, complaints, or other communications addressed to him by depositors or others, relative to Post Office Savings Bank matters.

ST. JOHNS

Is beautifully situated on the west shore of the River Richelieu, at the head of the Chambly Canal and at the foot of the navigable waters of Lake Champlain, in the Barony of Longueuil, district of Iberville, county of St. Johns. It is incorporated, and is the *chef lieu* of the district. Two sessions of the Queen's bench, holding criminal jurisdiction, three sessions of the Superior court, and three of the Circuit Court are held here annually. The town boasts of a number of fine buildings, churches, &c., several manufactories and foundries, saw, planing and grist mills, brickyards, &c. It has a market open every day, well supplied with all kinds of meats, poultry, game, fish, vegetables, fruits and farm produce of every description, and does a large trade in lumber, firewood, grain, pressed hay and other country produce. St. Johns is an important station of

the Grand Trunk railway (Montreal, St. Johns and Rouse's Point branch), and the terminus of the Vermont Central and the Stanstead, Shefford and Chambly railways. Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here. The town of Iberville (or St. Athanase) is situated on the east side of the River Richelieu, immediately opposite, and is connected with St. Johns by a bridge. A railway bridge also spans the river close by. Distant from Iberville half a mile, from Chambly 12 miles, from Montreal 27 miles, from Rouse's Point 23 miles, from St. Armand 25 miles, from Waterloo 41 miles. Mail twice each day. Population about 5000.

In the early part of the past summer a most disastrous conflagration took place, destroying the better portion of the town, taking with it, with few exceptions, the large business district, of so much importance to the place. Destitution seemed then apparent, as the visitor to the desolate scene would suppose, on witnessing the terrible relics of what was, but a short time previous, a thriving and prosperous district, but the imposing block after block of large stores

and private residences that are now rapidly covering the ground so harshly visited not more than four months ago, are ample proofs that St. Johns was and is not discouraged, but that her citizens are determined to counteract the event by placing themselves in a position of defence more profitable to themselves and to the country round about them. In place of the wooden buildings burned, large cut-stone and brick blocks appear, displaying an *energetic* contrast to those they are the successors of. Among them stand most prominent the new Merchants' Bank, Langelier's block, Clement's block, McDonough's block, Insurance Block, etc., manifesting in themselves the ready enterprise, the *energy* and the *prompt action* of the citizens.

In spite of the general depression in the various branches of trade, in spite of the terrible "*drawback*" she has sustained and fairly surmounted, we cannot but say that St. Johns ranks among the first in the Dominion, size considered, as her pottery, glassworks, shoe manufactories, foundries, flour, grist and saw mills, stone and china-

ware companies works—all in thriving and prosperous condition—bear ample witness. We may as well here mention that the Stone and Chinaware Company have been the recipients of the Centennial medal, showing that their work is appreciated and will stand test with any other of the same nature.

Among the principal manufactories are : The Stone Chinaware Co., who chiefly manufacture white granite and French pearl ware,—steam power. Employing about 150 hands.

The St. Johns Boot and Shoe Co., steam power, manufacturers of boots and shoes of all kinds ; propelled by two 15-horse power steam engines, with a capacity for employing from 300 to 400 hands ; average number now employed about 120.

Mr. John Rossiter, tanner, carrying on business in this line to a large extent. Though deprived of his former works by fire, he has in course of erection a large and commodious building, nearly completed, in which he will be enabled to resume work on double the scale. Employing about 20 hands.

There is an extensive trade in pressed hay and grain here—pressed hay more especially. It is collected from the surrounding country and pressed into suitable form for exportation to the United States and Europe to the extent of 600,000 or 800,000 tons per annum. Messrs. Bertrand and Wheeler are the principal traders in this line.

Mr. John Parker has an extensive brewery at the head of Champlain street, where is manufactured ale and porter of faultless brands, with which St. Johns and the surrounding country is supplied.

St. Johns has its water works, as well as other more pretentious places, and the arrangements of the same puts to shame the regulations and contrivances of some of her sister towns. The water is taken from Lake Champlain by two splendid engines of 25-horse power each. A fine reservoir capable of supplying the town, both for domestic and fire purposes, is suitably placed on Longueuil street. In connection with this the town is well protected in case of coming in contact with fire in the shape of some 30 or 40 hydrants suitably placed at proper intervals. It

is intended to still further increase the number shortly.

The water works are owned by Louis Mollé, Esq., jun., M.P.P., who receives a nominal sum from the council to defray the expense of keeping the engines running both night and day in case of fire.

The fire department is upon a sound basis. It consists of a fine steam Silsby engine, throwing 4 streams; 1 hand engine worked by 20 men; 1 hook and ladder truck, New York regulation, with 20 men to attend to its working; 5 hose reels, with 2,500 feet of good durable hose, with 40 men to look after their proper use; the whole under the able supervision of Chief Engineer Capt. L. Jones. It is a volunteer brigade, guided by the most stringent by-laws enforced by the corporation. The corporation have now in process of erection a suitable fire station, opposite the Market and City Hall, with the latest improvements in its construction, and every modern appliance, at a cost of \$5,250.

There are two newspapers published in the town, one in each language. The *St. Johns News* and *Frontier Advocate*, weekly, issued

every Friday, and has 36 columns. It is published and owned by E. R. Smith.

Le Franco-Canadien, a French bi-weekly of 28 columns ; I. Bourguignon, proprietor ; F. G. Marchand, M.P.P., editor-in-chief. Published every Tuesday and Friday.

The town is suitably adapted as a summer residence, being beautifully situated at the confluence of the Richelieu River and Lake Champlain. Game is plentiful, and, what with hunting and fishing, and other rural pastimes, the pleasure-seeker would be amply repaid for choosing St. Johns as a summer resort.

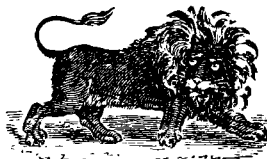

WEST FARNHAM.

This is a large and thriving town, beautifully situated on the Yamaska River, in the western part of the parish of St. Romuald, county of Missisquoi, district of Bedford.

The water power possessed by this town is very extensive, and is taken advantage of by the many mills and factories.

There are numerous saw and grist mills, shingle and lath mills, and flax and woolen mills in full operation here, and a large amount of lumber is exported to the United States annually.

The South Eastern Counties, Stanstead, Shefford and Chambly and Central Vermont Railways, have a station here.

There are a number of fine stores together with two or three good commodious hotels, among which may be found the WEST FARNHAM HOUSE, by Mr. Norbert Robidoux, and the AMERICAN HOUSE, by Mr. Lyman Collier.

In either of these hotels every comfort will be tendered the traveller.

The Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here, which may be found at the railway station.

The distance from Bedford is 12 miles, from St. Johns 14 miles, from Cowansville 14 miles, and from Montreal about 42 miles. Mails, twice each day. Population about 1500.

We would call attention to Mr. Jesse Clark's saw mill and buttertub manufactory. This building has three flats 60 feet high, 60 feet in length, by 50 feet in breadth. It is the finest of its kind in the Dominion, it being supplied with all the modern improvements in machinery. Its movements are frictional, which is a great saving of power, thereby enabling its owner to produce a large amount of work at a small cost.

GRANBY.

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The streets of the village are nicely laid out, lying parallel with the river and intersected by others at opposite angles.

The Stanstead, Shefford and Chambly Railway has a station here, and the patronage the village affords it with its exports of leather, prepared lumber, etc., speaks well to a still further increase of railway facilities, ere long, in order to be enabled to meet the fast increasing demand for exportation.

There are several fine stores here, as well as churches. There is also a branch of the Merchants' Bank of Canada, and the Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here.

Granby was the first post office in the township, and Richard Frost was the first postmaster ; he was succeeded by the present respected gentleman, Horace Lyman, who has occupied that position since 1833, and though advanced to a good old age, bids fair to retain it for many years yet.

S. H. C. Miner is the most extensive manufacturer. He owns large tanneries, both steam and water-power, as well as the most important saw, grist and planing mills in the village. A large amount of lumber is turned out by them, finding a ready market across the lines.

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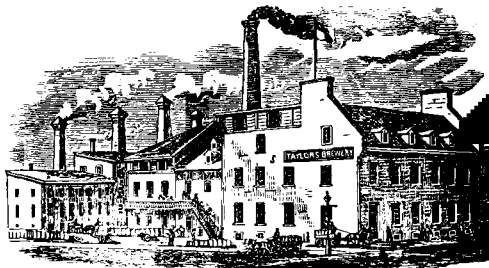

WATERLOO.

A thriving village in the Township of Shefford. It is the most important village in the township.

This village is the present terminus of the S. S. & C. R. R., but steps are being taken to have it in running order as far as Magog this season.

There are several fine stores, as well as many beautiful private residences and public buildings.

The village is rapidly advancing in size and commercial importance, and the extensive iron works, tanneries, door, sash and blind factories, planing mills, boot and shoe manufactory, together with the several large and thriving stores, are ample proofs of this.

The post office, court house, mills, etc., as well as many private offices, are situated in the *Lower* village.

The village has daily communication with Montreal and other important points by rail, and by stage with other places nearer at hand.

There are several fine and commodious churches in the village, the spires of which attract the eye of the stranger on entering the place.

There are several large hotels, where every comfort and attention is tendered the traveler, and at reasonable rates.

The Waterloo Academy, under the care of Mr. Cyrus Thomas, assisted by his lady, Mrs. Thomas, as preceptress, is situated about the centre of the village. It is a fine structure, but, on account of the rapid increase in population and size of the village, it has been found necessary to transfer the primary department to another building. The energy and promptness of the inhabitants will, without a doubt, be manifested in this instance, ere long, by the erecting of a more commodious building capable of meeting the wants of the fast increasing population.

The present "stand still" in trade throughout our country, and, in fact, everywhere on the continent, has not omitted gathering Waterloo under its wing, but, in spite of all this, the people are determined to hold their own, as the busy hum of the

mills and factories, together with the rattle of machinery and the general hurry and bustle to be heard and seen through the week, will testify.

There is a newspaper published weekly here, under the proprietorship of Messrs. Parmelee & Ingalls; a jobbing office is in connection, where every variety of printing is executed.

The Montreal Telegraph Co. is represented here by two branch offices, one at the railway station and the other in the lower part of the village, so situated as to make it convenient to reach either in a short time.

The people of Waterloo are, as a rule, very courteous and obliging, and a stranger entering the village rapidly comes to the conclusion that he is at home among them. We write thus through experience, and, as our motto is "honor to whom honor is due," we consider it our duty to mention it.

In conclusion we would say "Prosperity to Waterloo," and may the cloud that hangs so heavy over *her* as well as the rest of our country be lifted, and commercial "*sunshine*" be once more seen throughout the length and breadth of our land.

Near the village are large deposits of iron and copper ore. Distance from Granby about 18 miles ; Knowlton 10 miles ; Magog 21 miles ; Melbourne 33 miles ; Stanstead Plains 42 miles ; Roxton Falls 18 miles ; Sherbrooke 36 miles ; from St. Johns 50 miles ; and Montreal about 76 miles.

ROXTON FALLS.

A pretty village situated on the banks of the Black River; which divides it in two parts, and is united by two large bridges. There is a fall of thirty-three feet here which affords good water power for manufacturing purposes, being utilized for the purpose of tanning sole leather, the working of grist, saw and planing mills, carding mills, sewing machine and butter tub factories.

The village is in the county of Shefford, district of Bedford, incorporated in 1862. A railroad, now in course of construction, will shortly connect this place with the Grand Trunk, Sorel and Waterloo and American lines of railways, and will be in operation from Sorel to the Air Line early during the coming winter.

Over one hundred thousand hides of sole leather are annually manufactured here by the Messrs. Shaw Bros. and John Wood, more than ten thousand cords of hemlock bark being con-

sumed in its production. Considerable dye stuffs are also manufactured here, and a brisk trade in lumber of all kinds is carried on.

The nearest point by railway is Actonvale, distant 6 miles. The distance from Waterloo is 16 miles; from Granby, 18 miles; from Montreal, 60 miles. Mail daily. Population about 1,100.

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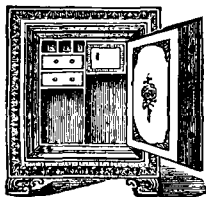

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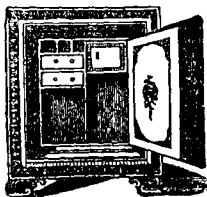
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
