Night coming on, and Dame Crump being fearful of losing either herself or the pig, tried to coax it on, and said :—

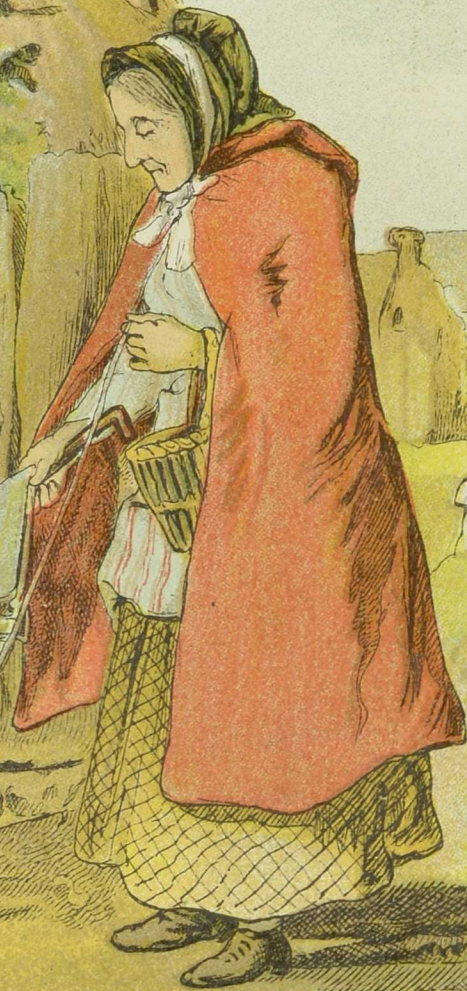
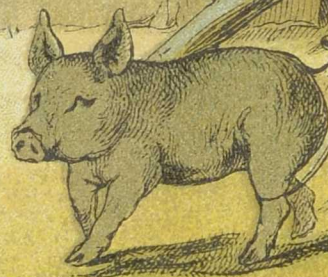




PRAY, PIG,

And I shan’t get home to-

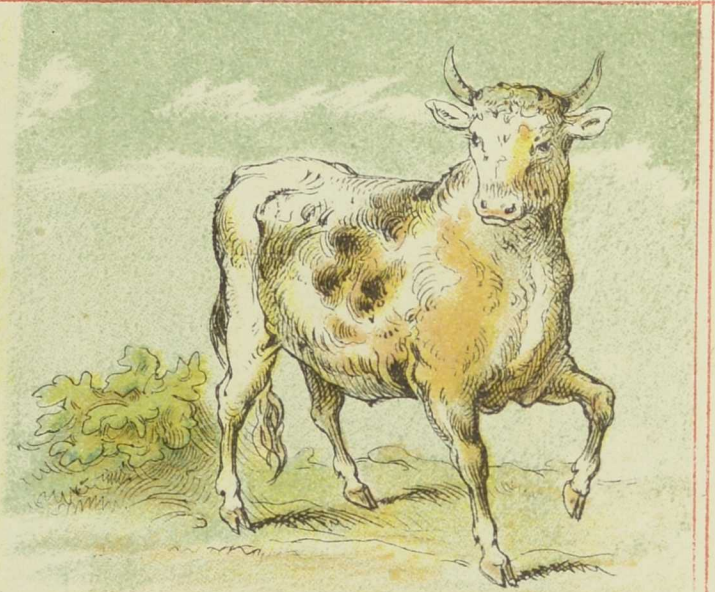




UT the water lay calm,

But the rope took no notice, so she turned round, and seeing a rat she said:—



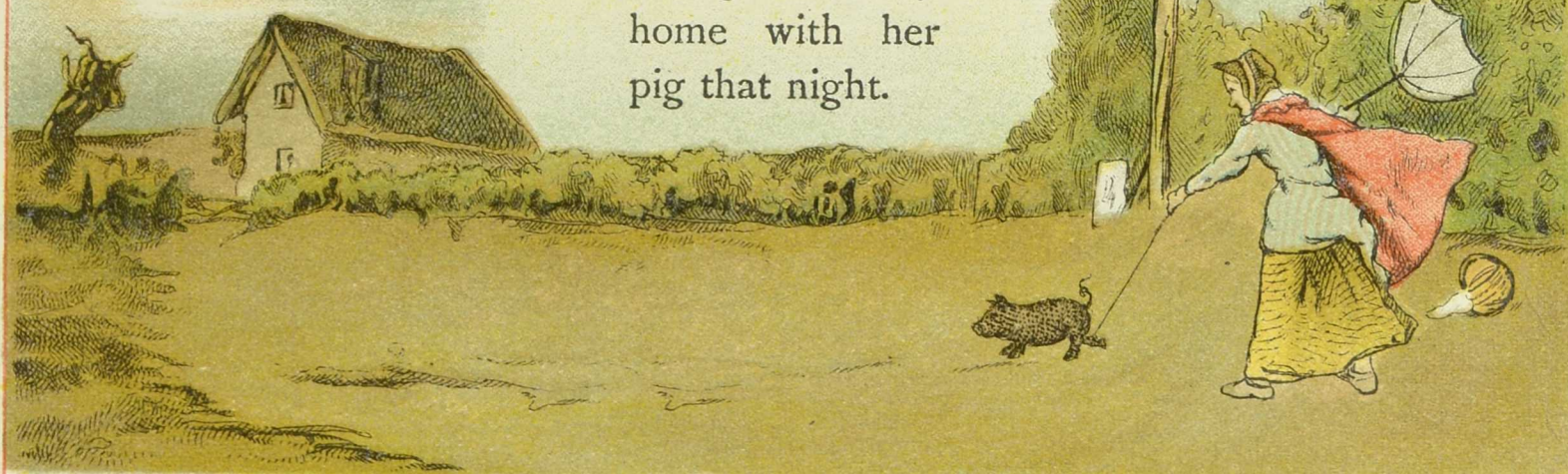
PRAY, RAT,
