FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The interest taken in the Library continues to increase, as shown by the tables of statistics attached. The circulation of books for home reading was 279,160, being the largest number of volumes issued in any one year since its establishment.

The main library and the branches have been thoroughly renovated, linoleum laid down in the reading rooms, and every convenience provided for the comfort of the readers and attendants. By the removal of the chairs and substitution of sloping stands for tables, the reading rooms have been rendered less noisy, and freed from the presence of an undesirable class.

The third and fourth supplements to the catalogue of the Central Circulating Library have been issued. The catalogue of the Reference Library was delayed for the insertion of a supplementary list of books received while it was being printed, this has now been added, and the complete catalogue is in the hands of the binder.

In the early part of the year strong representations were made from citizens residing in the Eastern and North Western districts of the City, that they were unable to use the Library owing to their great distance from it. Arrangements were therefore entered into for the erection of a special building on Bolton Avenue, and for obtaining the use of a large room in Worms' Hall, Dundas Street, as Branch Libraries, and on October 31st, and December 11th, respectively, the Eastern and North Western Branch Libraries were formally opened.

The difficulties in the way of providing large numbers of books for these new Branches has been obviated by the adoption of a special telephonic system connecting all the Branches, and centering in the main building, so that readers at any of the Branches can consult catalogues, and have every facility for selecting from the same large collection of books, as readers at the Central Library. Deliveries and returns are made every day by a special conveyance.

A deputation of the Board visited Ottawa for the purpose of urging upon the Government the propriety of admitting books for Public Libraries free of duty. We regret that the Government resolved to make no alteration in the Customs' Act during the past session, but it is earnestly hoped that when it is reconsidered, that the desired change may be made, and the reproach wiped away that Canada is the only country in the world where books for libraries are dutiable. The sum of \$911 has been paid for customs duties by the Board during the past year.

At a competitive examination for assistants held on May 1st, sixteen applicants presented themselves, and of this number four were successful in attaining the requisite number of marks.

On September 12th, His Excellency Lord Stanley of Preston, Governor-General, accompanied by Lady Stanley, and their suite, visited the Library. His Excellency, after replying to a short address giving an account of its origin, progress, and present condition, passed some time among the books, and expressed himself highly pleased with such an "admirable collection."

5,157 books have been added to the Library, which now contains 53,216 volumes. Among the more important of these additions are Gavard's *Galleries de Versailles*, 19 vols., folio; Lord Kingsborough's *Antiquities of Mexico*, 9 vols., folio; Munich Gallery, folio; Wilson's *American Ornithology*, 9 vols., quarto; Robert's *Holy Land and Egypt*, 6 vols., folio; Roscoe's *Monandrian Plants*, 2 vols., folio; *Vetusta Monumenta*, 4 vols., folio; Smithsonian Institute, *Contributions to Knowledge*, 25 vols., quarto; *Mercure François*, 1611-44, 25 vols.; Percy Society Collections, 34 vols.; Shakespeare Society Collections, 48 vols.; Napoleon's *Egypt*, 21 vols., folio; Shakespeare Facsimile quartos, 44 vols.; St. Vallier's *Catechism du diocese de Quebec*, 1702; *Memoire pour François Bigot*, 1763; *Pinetum Britannicum*, 3 vols., folio; McKenney and Hall's *Indian Tribes of North America*, 3 vols., folio.

The sale in London, during the month of July, of the Library of the late Sir David W. Smith, first surveyor-general of Upper Canada, 1794-1804, enabled us to purchase 24 volumes of Manuscripts, which have proved on inspection to be of extreme value. Original applications for land grants from U. E. Loyalists, original plans of towns and villages, minutes of the sessions of the Land Commission, and many hundred

public and private letters, invaluable as material for the history of the settlement and early days of this Province, are contained in the collection.

The purchase also of the manuscript narrative of the insurrection of 1837, by Colonel Fitzgibbon, and the donation of an original Mississagua vocabulary, have further enriched our collection of manuscripts.

Continual watchfulness has enabled us to make some very important additions to the department of Canadian history and literature, which promises to be one of the most important in the Dominion.

The increasing value of the books has necessitated providing additional securities against destruction by fire. All the doors and openings into the room where the books are deposited have been provided with fireproof doors, in accordance with the standard of the Board of Underwriters. The manuscripts are deposited in the fireproof vault.

The accounts of the Library have been duly audited, and statements of the receipts and expenditure, and assets and liabilities, are appended.

Much pleasure is taken in stating that the Chief Librarian, the Secretary, the Librarians in charge of the branches, and the other assistants and employees of the Library, performed their respective duties with efficiency, and to the satisfaction of the Board of Management.
