










THE LORD MAYOR'S SHOW.


Remember, remember, the ninth of November,

The Judges on the British Bench Are always fair and just; And what the British Judges say, Even Foreign people trust.



Pull together, ye threeFrom the Kingdom United;When once you combine,All the World is affrighted.


