And Solicitor for Letters Patent for New and Useful Inventions in the Province of New-Brunswick.

Summary of the Provincial Law in reference to Letters Patent.

The Governor is empowered to grant Letters Patent for fourteen years, upon the application of an inventor, or discoverer, made under oath.

A description of the invention with drawings and references thereto, and a model, in certain cases, to be lodged in the Provincial Secretary's office. If the discovery consists of a composition of matter, specimens of the ingredients thereof are to be left at the Secretary's office.

If a person entitled to a Patent in this Province die hefore it is granted, his Executor or Administrator may obtain the same. Letters may issue to the assignee of any person entittled to a patent. A foreign patent can be assigned, and the assignee will be entitled to Letters for this Province, during the remainder of the time such Patent has to run. Every Provincial Patent is assignable in whole accinerate

Provincial Patent is assignable, in whole or in part.

Letters Patent may be extended beyond the original time for 7 years, under certain circumstances. The penalty for infringing on a Patent is three times the actual damage occasioned by such offence, recoverable in the Supreme Court. A Patent becomes void if not introduced, or manufactured in the Province within three years.

The first Act for Incorporating a Water Company in Saint John was passed by the Legislature in 1825—the capital stock £10,000. The sum was too small to carry out the intentions of the Directors, and although the Company was organized, and 10 per cent. of the Stock paid in-the money was restored, and no further proceedings had under the Act. In 1832 and 1835, other Acts of Incorporation were obtained, extending the capital stock to £20,000, and the Company organized in 1836 The works were completed upon the Report of Col. Baldwin, C. E., who recommended the water to be taken from Lilly Lake in a sluice to a cistern near the Aboideau, and from thence pumped by a steam engine to a Tank near the Block House. The water from this source was first introduced into the City in October, 1838. This means of supply was found not to answer the purpose—and the Company resolved to abandon Lilly Lake and the Engine House, and obtain a supply at a greater elevation. In 18 8, they obtained an increase of capital of £10,-900, and laid an iron main of 12 inches from Little River to the Aboideau. This work was completed in 1851, and the increased supply brought into the City in the month of September. The increasing wants of the City and the adjoining Parish of Portland, the latter being totally destitute of water supply-and the former only supplied in certain districts-together with the imperative necessity existing for a larger supply in case of calamity, and the Company not being able to pay more than six per cent. per annum to a

portion of the Stockholders, rendered it impossible for them to yield to the growing wants of the City and Parish; it was resolved at a public meeting called on the 30th August, 1854 for the purpose, that some immediate steps should be taken to carry out the scheme en a large and more extended scale, and obtain a transfer of the Stock, on certain terms, from the Company to the City and Parish. Commissioners were appointed in 1854 to arrange with the Company-who agreed to dispose of the stock and works of the Company for the sum of £28,902 15s. 9d. In 1855, an Act passed the Legislature transferring the Water Company and the works into the hands of three Commissioners, for the City of Saint John and Parish of Portland-with power to issue Debentures to the extent of £75.000, and requiring them to proceed immediately with an improved water supply. By this Act all property in the City and Parish where mains pass, is in each year, rendered liable to assessment, whether the water be taken or not; it is levied, raised and collected at the Commissioners office, on valuation, mode of occupation, and probable consumption. Assessed owners of property can, on written application, have service pipes led to their property, as far as the side line of the street, in front thereof, at the expense of the Commissioners-but inside fittings have to be at the cost, care and risk of the owner or occupant. The Commissioners do no inside work-but require that competent Plumbers be employed to do the work;all waste of water is strictly prohibited, under penalty of immediate shut off-and a charge of 10s. for turning on the same. The Commissioners, their officers, and servants, to have access to all premises and vessels supplied. Hotels, Steam Engines, Factorics, Baths, &c., are supplied by agreement. Wilful and malicious injury to the works is made felony by the Act. The Assessments and rates and arrearages due the Commissioners are to be paid after 39 days notice; -if unpaid at the expiration of that time, to be recovered by destraint warrants on goods and chattels found on the premises. Appeals for reduction of rates require to be made to the Common Council before the expiration of the 30 days notice. The half-yearly coupons of the Debentures issued by the Commissioners are payable at the office on presentation on the 1st day of May, and 1st day of November, in each year.







and Ladder and eight Engine Companies.

SAINT JOHN SUSPENSION BRIDGE COMPANY .-

The project of constructing a Suspension Bridge over the River Saint John, near the City, originated with William K. Reynolds, who after two years of persevering exertion succeeded in obtaining a Charter and forming a Company for this purpose.

The Bridge was erected in 1852, at a cost of £20,000. Mr. Reynolds being the Contractor, and Capt. Edward W. Serrell, of New-York, Chief Engineer. Its dimensions are as follows:—Span, 650 feet; Width of Roadway, 23 feet; Height of Towers, 52 feet; depth from floor of Bridge to top of high water 72 feet—suspended from 10 cables, each containing 300 strands of wire, making total of 3000 strands.

ST. JOHN MECHANICS' INSTITUTE-

This Institution was formed in 1888. It is under the Direction of a President, two Vice Presidents, a Treasurer, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, and a Board of Directors—three-fourths of whom are Mcchanics. These are all elected, annually, from among the Members, whose number now amounts to nearly four hundred. Prosperity has attended this Institution since its first establishment. In 1840 its popularity lead to the necessity of erecting a Building for the use of its Members. This Building contains a Hall for Public Lectures; a large room, in which the Gesner Museum is deposited; a Library Room; a News Room; and other rooms, which are appropriated to particular objects. The New-Room is constantly supplied with the latest and Reviews of the Mother Country and United States. The Library contains now upwards of 3000 volumes, and every year receives additions of new works, of sterling worth. The Museum, which, by the liberality of those who purchased it in shares from Dr. Gesner, is now the property of the Institute, contains a large and valuable collection of Minerals, a great variety of Zoological Specimens, and many Chinese, Indian, and other Curiosities, and frequently receives additions from-sea Captains, and others, who get into their possession'i foreign articles of an attractive description. The Hall, which, in its original state, could accommodate from seven to eight hundred people, has been lately so enlarged, that accommodation can be given to seven hundred more. This Hall is exceedingly useful, and appears to be the most eligible place for Societies to hold their Annual and other Public Meetings. The Members of the Institute have been favoured with courses of Lectures in the Hall every Winter.

SAINT JOHN SOCIETY LIBRARY-

This Institution was formed in 1811. In that year a number of gentlemen impressed with the importance of having a good Library in the City, met together for the purpose of establishing one, among whom were Major General Hunter, William Campbell, Robert Parler, William Hazen, Jr., John Robinson, Dr. Adino Paddock, Joseph Leonard, Thomas Millidge, Jr., C. J. Peters and Thomas Wetmere.

A Constitution was adopted on the 12th Dec., and each member was required to pay in Five Pounds, and an annual subscription of Twenty-Five Shillings. Ward Chipman, Esq., was the first President, and John Robinson, Esq., the first Vice President. The number of its members was limited to fifty, but subsequently the shares were divided, and the Library is now owned by one hundred Proprietors, who pay an annual subscription of Fifteen Shillings. Non-Shareholders pay an annual subscription of Twenty-Five Shillings. The Library now contains about Four Thousand Volumes of Books, besides the curre tumbers of all the leading Reviews and Magazines published in England and the United States, Library open from 3 to 4 P. M., daily.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN SOCIETY.

The formation of Young Mens' Societies can be traced back to the latter part of the reign of Charles the Se ond. In that period of abounding iniquity associations of young men for the purpose of mutual edification in godliness were established. The first was formed in London in 1678, and in twenty years afterwards there were twenty distinct Societies in that City and its suburbs. Nor were these devoted young men without their imitators, for similar Societies were soon established at Cambridge, Gloucester, and

other Towns in England. Under the encouragement of the Archbishop of Dublin similar Societies made their appearance in the Kingdom of Ircland; in Dublin alone from beginning with one Society, numbering three or four individuals, they in a few years increased to nine or ten distinct kindred institutions. These associations were subsequently merged first in the Societies for the Reformation of Life and Manners, and then in the Societies for Promoting Christian Knowledge and Propagating the Gospel.

The Constitution of one of these Societies in 1678 contains the following provisions, which clearly shew

the excellent designs of the Founders :-

I. "That the sole design of this Society being to promote real holiness of heart and life, it is absolutely necessary that the persons who enter into it, do seriously resolve to apply themselves in good earnest to all means proper to make them wise unto salvation.

II. "That, in order to their being of one heart and of one mind in this design, every member of this Society shall own and manifest himself to be of the Church of England and frequent the Liturgy and the holy exercises of the same. And that they be careful withal to express due Christian charity, candour and moderation towards all such Dissenters as are of good conversation.

III. "That the members of this Society shall meet together one evening in the week at a convenient place, in order to encourage each other in practical holiness, by discoursing on spiritual subjects and reading God's holy word; and to pray to Almighty God and praise his name together. And to this assembly any serious person may be admitted upon request.

IV. "That at such meetings there be no hot disputes about controversial points, State affairs, or the concerns of trade and worldly things; but that the whole bent of the discourse be to glorify God and edify one another in love."

These provisions are admirable, and worthy of imitation at the present day—this enlightened Nineteenth

Century.

About fifteen years ago the young men of London determined to have an organization of their own, and Societies were speedily formed on the ancient model

now, however, not only for their mutual improvement but for the diffusion of christian truth in the Parishes of England, in the missions of her Colonies, and in the vast field which is occupied by the Jew, the Mahommedan, and the Pagan. Great good has already been accomplished by these Associations, and the future will doubtless reveal still greater results

from them.

The Church of England Young Men's Society in the City of St. John was formed about three years ago. The objects of it are, primarily, the advancement of moral and religious habits among young men who are resident in the City; and secondly, the general advancement of evangelical religion in the City, Province and elsewhere. To effect these objects, weekly meetings of the members are held, in which the Bible is studied, and Essays upon religious subjects are read. The rooms of the Society are also opened four evenings in the week, where the members can resort for the perusal of Books, Magazines and Newspapers. Courses of Lectures are also delivered every winter by Clergymen and other members of the Church of England friendly to the Association. A Library is being formed of religious books, and other means are about being adopted to promote the great objects of the Society. Each member pays 15s. a year. The annual meeting for the election of officers and the transaction of other business is held on the first Tuesday in January. At the last meeting, the following gentleman were elected office-bearers for the current year :-

Young Men's Christian Association.

This very useful Association was established in this City in December, 1884, on the plan of Societies of the like nature begun in London in 1844, and followed since by numbers in the United States and the Sister Provinces. A number of zealous and active young men, belonging to different Evan gelical Churches, requested the Mir isters of the Protestant Denominations and others interested in the retigious welfare of youth to meet together, and having formed a Constitution on the mouel of the English and United States Associations, and chosen their officers, begun to act in a room of the Mechanics' institute, and since removed to Judge Ritchie's

August, at 8 P. M., and an hour later on Saturdays. and on the eve of public holidays: these hours, the Association at once adopted, and ask no change, unless it comes from the employers. In some cases this agreement was misunderstood, or not acted upon; irregularity in the hours of closing, had nearly led to a return of the late hours system of former years, when with the advice and concurrence of many of the employers the Association was formed, not for the purpose of forcing (as some have alleged) employers into regularity, but by kindly means, and by making this arrangement understood, endeavouring to secure the full benefits of the early closing movement. Their first Public Meeting was held in the Hall of the Mechanics' Institute on Tuesday evening, the 13th January, at which the Rev. Dr. Gray delivered an Address, in which he urged upon the Association, the necessity of aiming at the adoption of the Saturday half-holiday movement, which has achieved such glorious results for the benefit of the people, in those cities of Britain where it has been adopted.
