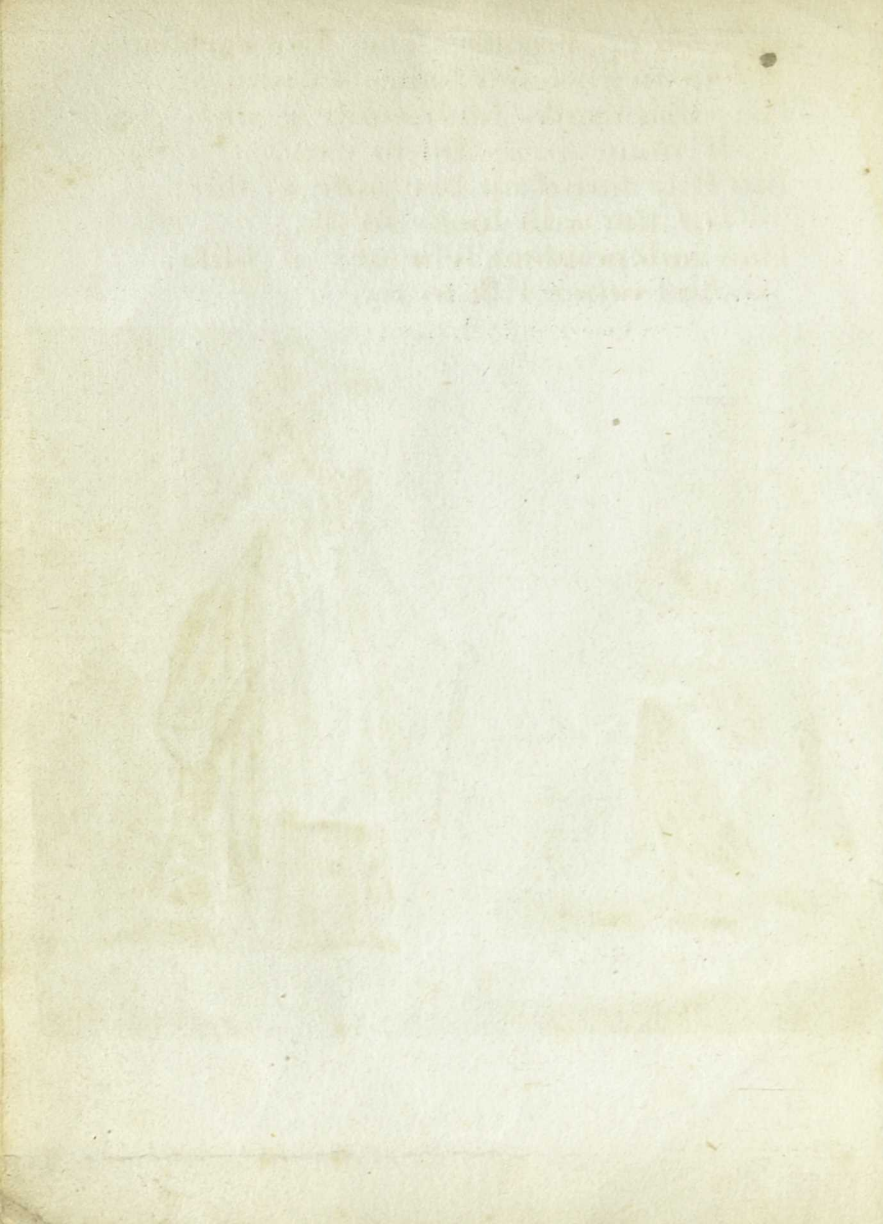

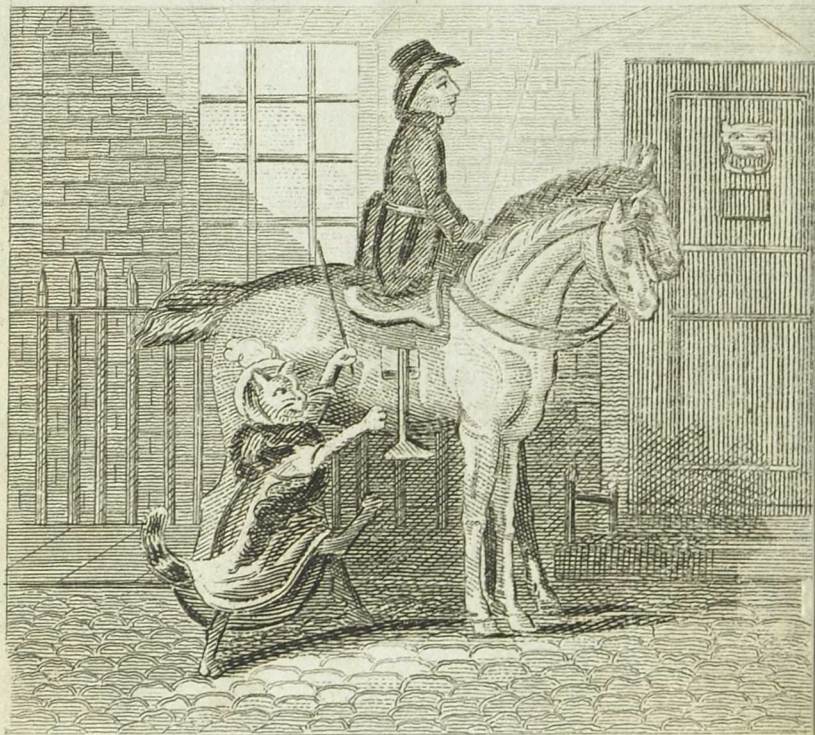
Now Trot would fain have shut the door,

Their heels, an hour or more.

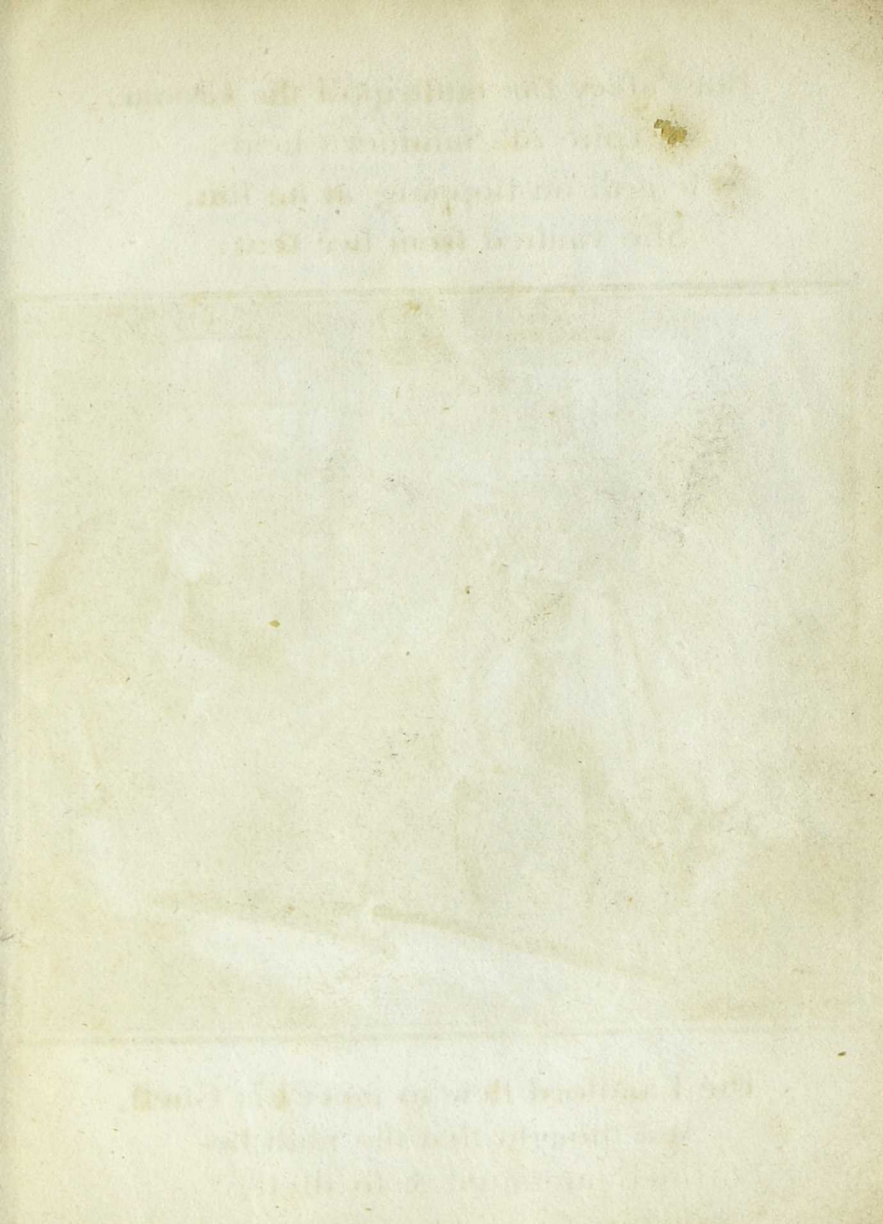


Th' impatient steed who wing'd for flight

And trotted home again.

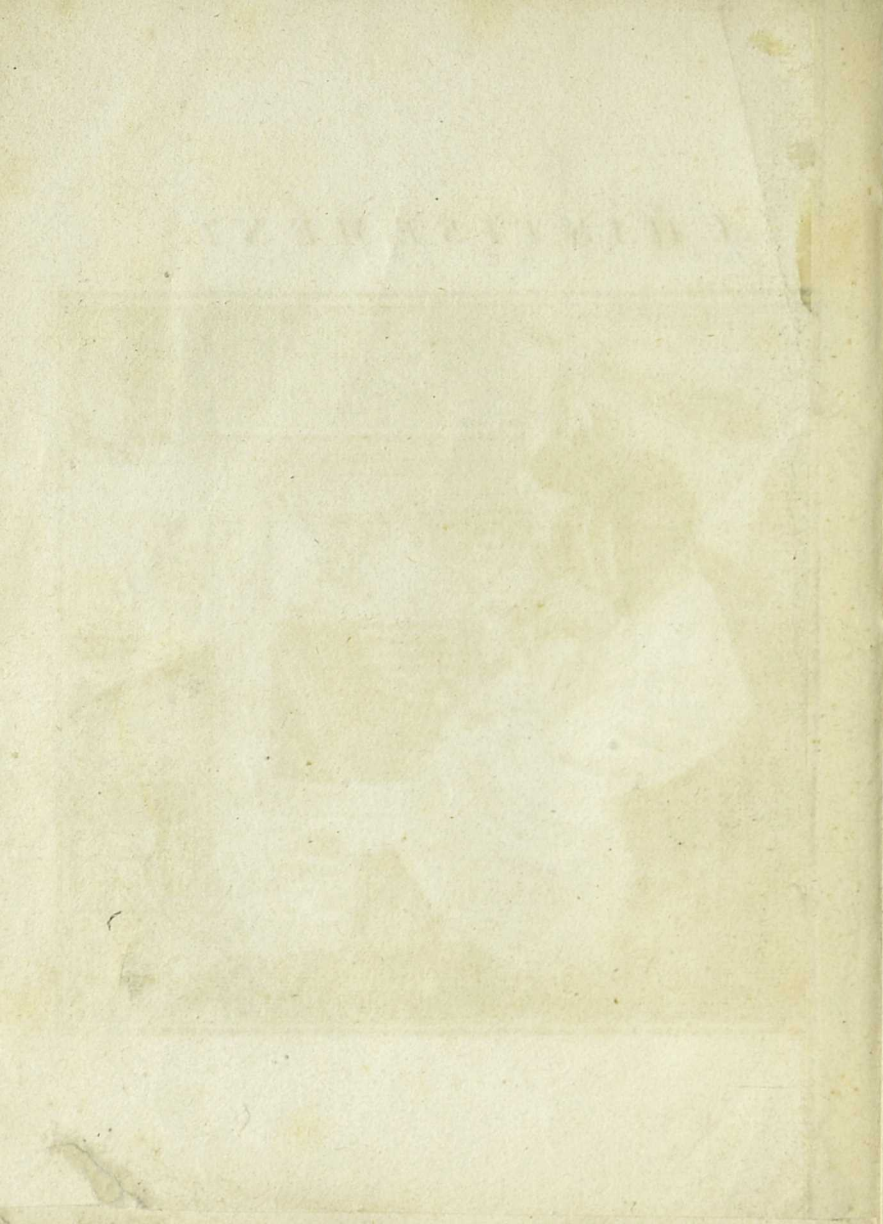


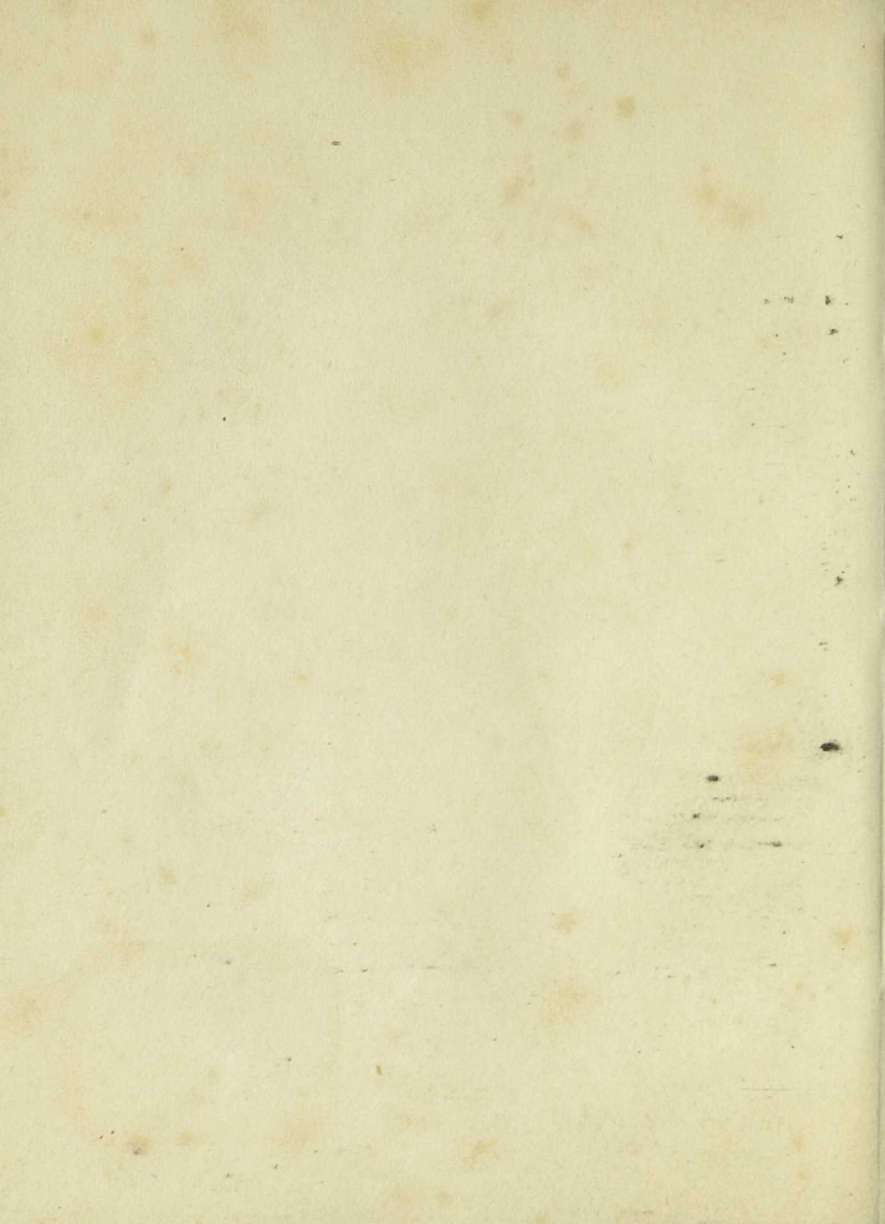

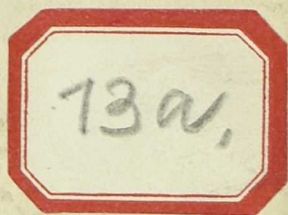
