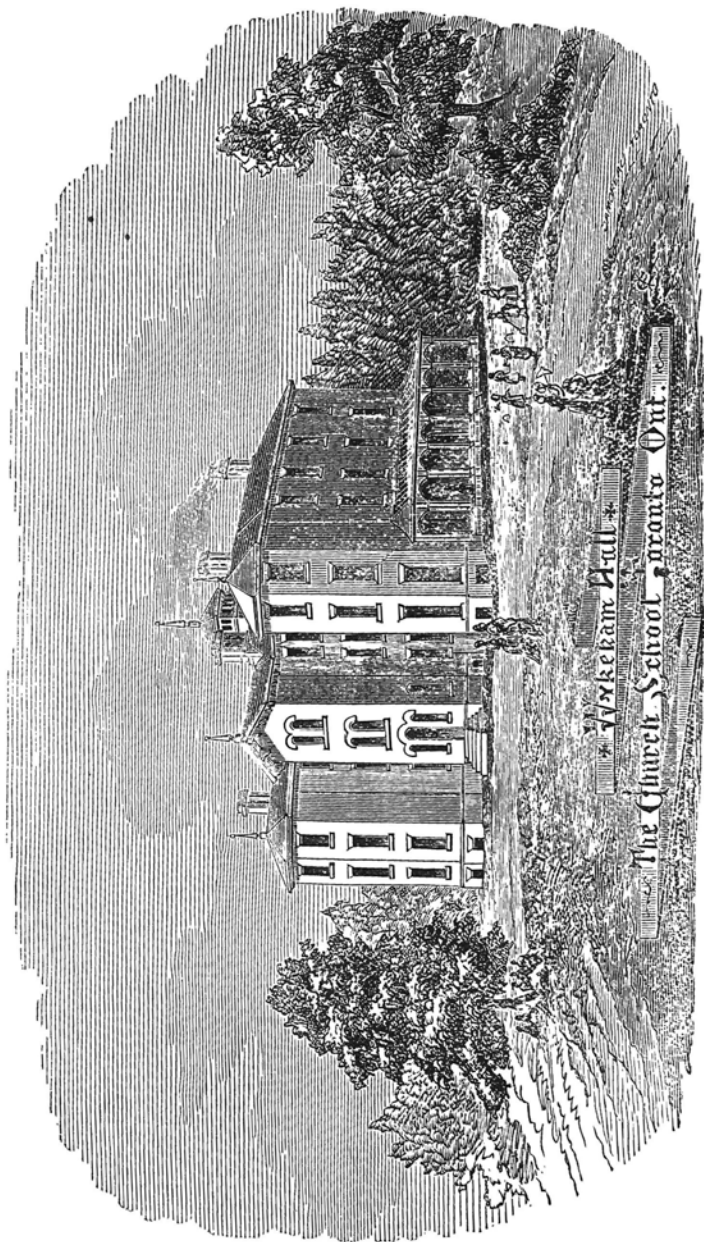

### OBJECTS.

1. This School was founded under the auspices of him whose name it bears, and is intended to perpetuate his memory in connection with an important work for the Church of Christ. It is designed, primarily, for the benefit of daughters of members of the Anglican communion, but is open to all who, being desirous of availing themselves of its advantages, are willing to conform to its regulations.

2. It is made a main object to secure for the Pupils of the School competent and careful Scriptural Instruction, in accordance with the doctrines of the Church of England, and to habituate them to the practical recognition of their religious duties.

3. The Course of Study is co-extensive with that of first-class schools. The greatest importance, however, is attached to such solid mental culture as may develope the understanding, strengthen the judgment, and refine the taste; the acquisition of the more superficial accomplishments being kept in due subordination to this primary object.

4. In accordance with this plan of study, the main endeavour will be to prepare the pupils for the serious duties of life, as members or heads of families.

5. Simplicity and economy in dress, as well as a general moderation in expenditure will be enforced, with a view both to the moral benefit of the Pupils, and a saving of unnecessary expense to their parents.

The School is placed under the government of a Council, consisting of the Bishop of the Diocese, who is *ex officio* President, and of eight Clergymen and eight Laymen.

### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. The Scholastic Year is divided into Three Terms: Michaelmas, Lent, and Easter.

2. Michaelmas Term begins on the first Wednesday in September, and ends on the twenty-first of December; Lent Term begins on the sixth of January, and ends on the Wednesday before Easter; Easter Term begins on the second Wednesday after Easter, and ends on the fifth of July.

3. No Pupil is allowed to continue in residence during the Summer Vacation, and any Pupil remaining during either of the other vacations, will be required to pay the sum of Four Dollars per week for Board.

4. All Fees are payable strictly in advance. Any person sending a Day Pupil to the School, must previously obtain from the Bursar a Card of Admission, to be presented to the Lady Principal. The Bursar will draw at sight on Parents who may send Pupils as Boarders, and may not have procured for them Cards of Admission.

5. All Books, Stationery, Drawing Material, and Music, required by the Boarders, are provided by the School and charged to the Parents or Guardians of the Pupils.

6. No debts whatever are to be contracted by or for the pupils, and all money for their use should be left at the discretion of the Lady Principal.

7. No charge being made for pew-rent, it is a rule that every Pupil shall contribute to the offertory at Church not less than ten cents each Sunday.

8. The following declaration is required from each Pupil on admission :—" I, . . . . . do promise that I will faithfully observe the Rules of the School, obey the Authorities, and diligently attend to the studies required of me."

9. No Parent or Guardian is entitled to remove a Pupil from the School without giving a half-term's notice, or paying a half-term's fees. It is regarded as essential that Pupils should present themselves invariably on the first day of the Term.

10. Pupils are arranged in Four Classes, known as the Elementary, the Junior, the Intermediate, and the Senior. These classes, however, are sub-divided as occasion requires. An Examination is passed by each Pupil, on entrance, according to the result of which she is assigned to her proper class or sub-division.

11. A Pupil is promoted from one class to another, or from one sub-division to another, upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects of study specified for the class in which she has been placed.

12. A Report, respecting the proficiency and general conduct of each Pupil, is sent to the Parent or Guardian at the close of each Term.

13. All Examinations are conducted by the Lady Principal, and such associates as may be appointed by the Council.

14. All Pupils are required to attend punctually at Daily Prayers and Religious Instruction.

15. Boarders are required to bring for their own use the following articles, which are to be distinctly marked :—Six table napkins and ring, silver forks and spoons. An Entrance Fee of \$12. is charged to Boarders, to defray the expense of beds and bed linen, which they were heretofore required to provide.

16. The only persons allowed to visit Pupils are parents or guardians, lady friends in Toronto introduced by them, or persons from a distance who shall bring a written request from such parents or guardians to be permitted to visit their children or wards. Reception day : Tuesday, after three o'clock. Pupils are permitted to visit at the written request of such friends as their parents or guardians may name,

on two Saturdays of each month, but are required to return in time for evening prayers.

17. The Council have thought proper to appoint a medical gentleman of high standing as Physician to the School, but any parent can, if he prefer, name the medical attendant for his daughter.

## COURSE OF STUDY.

### SUBJECTS OF INSTRUCTION IN THE ELEMENTARY CLASS :—

*Scripture* : Short Scripture Lessons. *Catechism* : Text of Church Catechism with explanations.

*Reading* : In any part of the Third Book (Canadian Series). *Writing*. *Spelling* : Limited to words of one and two syllables, and dictation from the simpler parts of the Third Book. *Geography* : The general outlines of the Eastern and Western Hemispheres, and the definitions, orally and with book. *Grammar* : The different parts of speech, orally and by book. *English History* : To the reign of Henry II. ; a general knowledge of the principal events. *Arithmetic* : To write and read any Arabic number up to 1000 ; addition and subtraction of simple numbers. *French* : To translate any of the sentences contained in Haa's Elementary Book, up to page 55, from English into French and French into English ; to decline affirmatively, interrogatively and negatively the Present Tense of the two auxiliary verbs. *Class Singing*. *Instrumental Music* (optional). *Calisthenics*.

### SUBJECTS OF INSTRUCTION IN THE JUNIOR CLASS :—

*Scripture History* : Outlines. *Catechism* and *Collects*, with explanations.

*Reading* : In addition to the work in the Elementary Class, words of three and four syllables from book, and dictation from the Fourth Reading Book. *Writing*. *Geography* : A more detailed knowledge of the map of the Western Hemisphere ; the map of Europe, with the definitions political, mathematical and physical ; the natural productions, &c., of North and South America. *English History* : A knowledge of the leading events of each reign, with the dates of accession. *Dictation*. *Grammar* : A knowledge of the parts of speech ; the inflection of nouns ; comparison and relation of adjectives ; classification of pronouns, and the nature of each class ; the separation of a sentence into its two essential parts. *Arithmetic* : Arabic and Roman notation up to billions ; the four simple and four compound rules, with miscellaneous examples. *French* : First Part of Pujol ; translation of any sentence therein into French and English, with vocabularies ; two auxiliary



verbs negatively, affirmatively and interrogatively. *Latin* (optional) : Grammar and Exercises.

#### SUBJECTS OF INSTRUCTION FOR THE INTERMEDIATE CLASS :—

*Scripture History* continued. *Catechism*, with Sinclair's and oral explanations. *Gospels* learned and Explained. Lessons on the *Liturgy*. *Church History*, taken with the Senior Class.

*Reading. Spelling* : Any word in the History or Reading Book, either orally or by written dictation. *Writing. Geography* : From maps and book in detail. *Arithmetic* : Review of previous work ; vulgar fractions ; addition, subtraction ; multiplication and division of decimals ; reduction of vulgar fractions to decimals ; miscellaneous examples. *Grammar* : A thorough acquaintance with all the grammatical forms and definitions ; the analysis of any simple sentence, and the parsing, with application of the rules of syntax, of any ordinary sentence in the Reading Book. *English History* : A thorough knowledge of the leading events in each reign, with the inventions, discoveries, &c. *General History* : Various periods in successive Terms, the work of last Lent Term having been as follows : Brief sketch of the different States of Greece, their political constitution, religious ceremonies, struggles for supremacy, foreign wars, the rise of the Macedonian Empire, &c., up to the period of the subjugation of Greece by Rome. *Astronomy* : Astronomical definitions ; the sun ; planets, their laws of motion, theory as to their formation, physical constitution, and influence on each other ; eclipses ; tides ; fixed stars, and a brief sketch of the constellations. *French* : Pujol—Syntax, 1st Part ; English into French ; French into English, written exercises ; four regular conjugations, and such irregular verbs as occur in the lessons ; translation of fables, natural history anecdotes ; conversations and oral exercises. *German* : 1st division, Ahn's Grammar, 1st Part, German into English, English into German, phrases and vocabularies ; 2nd division, simple phrases and vocabularies. *Class Singing. Drawing. Instrumental Music* (optional).

#### SUBJECTS OF INSTRUCTION IN THE SENIOR CLASS :—

*Scripture History, Catechism, and History of the Prayer Book* continued. *Gospels and Epistles. Church History.*

*Reading* in Poetry and Prose. *Grammar* : 1st division, Analysis of prose and verse ; 2nd division, grammatical forms and definitions, analysis of any sentence contained in Grammar or Reading Book, distinguishing between principal and dependent clauses ; grammatical and logical subject and predicate. *Arithmetic* : Review of previous work ; simple proportion ; compound and conjoined

proportion ; practice, &c. ; miscellaneous examples. *Algebra* : not compulsory. *History* : Ancient and Mediæval. Different periods are taken up in successive terms. *Natural Philosophy* : Preliminary principles ; mechanics of solids ; mechanics of liquids ; mechanics of gases and vapours. *English Literature* : Different periods are taken up in successive terms. *Physical Geography* : Introductory outlines ; aim and object of the science, its theoretical and practical bearings ; Earth, its general and planetary relations, structure and composition ; connection between Geology and Physical Geography ; distribution of land ; configuration of land and mountain systems ; water, its oceans and ocean currents, &c. *French* : 1st division, Third Part of Pujol ; syntax ; translation of English biographical sketches into French ; French literature, authors. 2nd division, Pujol, Second Part ; Syntax ; English exercises into French ; translations of French into English ; selections from Bossuet, Fenelon, &c. *German* : 1st division, 3rd part of Ahn's Grammar, theoretical and practical ; translation of authors ; 2nd division ; 1st part of Ahn's Grammar ; phrases into German, and German into English. *Italian* : Last part of Ollendorff's Grammar ; translation ; selections from authors. *Latin* : 1st division, Latin authors. *Instrumental Music*. *Drawing*. *Vocal Music*. *Physiology*.

NOTE.—Such of the pupils as have completed the course above stated, and may desire to reside in Wykeham Hall, and be subject to its discipline, whether to qualify themselves as Teachers, or for the prosecution of special branches of study, may do so on the same terms as members of the Senior Class.
