Northern District Library

Northern District Library is pleasantly located immediately north of Eglinton, off Yonge Street, within easy reach of all Toronto citizens. This is the first multi-media Library in the City of Toronto. This means that all materials, whether films, books, magazines or records are arranged by subject in one place in the Library and easily accessible.

Eighty percent of the collection is available for home use and the Library also has a general reference section with dictionaries, encyclopedias, almanacs, etc. Northern District Library is open on December 15th, 1975 with over 70,000 books, 700 magazines, and 5,500 films, records, slides and cassettes on the shelves. In the next 10 years these collections will increase to over 150,000 books, 10,000 films, records, etc. and 900 magazines. About twenty-five percent of all materials in the Collections are of Canadian origin. The collections at Northern District Library are available to readers throughout Metropolitan Toronto by means of the metropolitan public library Inter-Library Loan System.

Northern District Library has the first automated circulating system in the City of Toronto and all materials borrowed from this library will be checked in and out through an automatic memory bank. This is a pilot project testing the use of computers in library work in the City of Toronto and the system can be extended to other libraries in the City. To take home materials, borrowers must secure at the front desk a machine-readable library card for use in the automated system.

Community meeting rooms are available for regular Library programmes or community use. Enquire with the librarian in charge for more information. The Northern District Library is the headquarters of the Toronto Public Library system. It is the headquarters for foreign language books in the system, and includes the BASIL DEAN THEATRE COLLECTION and archival material about libraries in the City of Toronto.
