A Brief Story of "Clio."

Bartley Campbell's "Clio," with all the fine scenery from Niblo's, New York, including the great earthquake, will commence a week's engagement at the Grand Opera House on Monday, March 15. It comes direct here from Detroit and Chicago, where it has been the success of all successes the past three weeks. "Clio" is the story of a maiden who became enamored of Fabian, and he, in return for her love, gave up his dreams of fame and fortune to woo and wed her. But before the consummation of their happiness is reached, designing men and women so play upon Fabian's credulity and imagination that he becomes convinced of her faithlessness, and in a moment of rashness he renounces her, and goes back to his work of achieving a great and lasting fame. Clio follows him, and by her innocent wiles attracts the attention of the king, who publicly manifests admiration for her. Fabian's credulity is again played upon to an extent which compels him to believe that Clio has become the king's mistress. In the meantime the artist has grown to be a fast friend of the king, who heaps honors on Fabian. On the king's birthday, when the revels are at their highest, and Fabian has presented to the court his works of living statuary, an earthquake visits the palatial surroundings, and everything is at once in confusion and terror, in the midst of which Fabian can be heard denouncing Clio for her shamelessness. As last the artist overhears the well-laid plans and plottings of Countess Ellis and Count Giovannine, and his heart returns to Clio as suddenly as it had turned away. Such, in brief, is the story, which is laid in the fourteenth century, and surrounded by all the accessories of classic costumes, living statuary, great battles, handsome scenery, and one of the strongest dramatic casts ever in this city in a spectacular production.
