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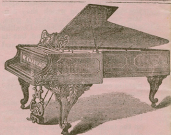

### Patrons of the Grand Opera House.

There will be no reduction in the Gallery prices as no really good attraction can be induced to play under a 25 cent basis.

The foregoing prices will be the standard rate from the date mentioned. In making this change the high class of entertainments heretofore given in the Grand Opera House will be rigidly maintained.

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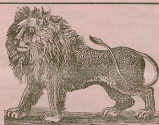
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
