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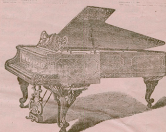

Patrons of the Grand Opera House.

In common with many of the managers of the best theatres in the United States and Canada, I have decided to make a material reduction in the prices of admission to the Grand Opera House, and in doing so I believe I will be meeting the wishes of a large number of my patrons. On and after Monday, 24th January, the prices of admission will be reduced to 25, 35 and 50 cents. Orchestra and Parquette, present price \$1, reduced to 75 cents; Sofa Chairs, present price 75 cents, reduced to 50 cents; Dress Circle, first two rows, present price 75 cents, reduced to 50 cents, balance of Dress Circle 35 cents. There will be no reduction in the gallery prices as no really good attraction can be induced to play under a 25 cent basis.

The foregoing prices will be the standard rate from the date mentioned. In making this change the high class of entertainments heretofore given in the Grand Opera House will be rigidly maintained.

The reduction commences with one of the best attractions that has ever appeared in Toronto, viz., the great Madison Square Theatre success, "Saints and Sinners." This is an evidence that the public, not the theatre, will be the party profiting by the change.

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Erie Improvements.

From The New York Times, Thursday, Oct. 14, 1886.

The Erie Railway is engaged in making extensive improvements. The new ferry house at this City will be almost entirely fireproof, being constructed of iron and glass. The work about the station will probably be completed by spring. Temporary offices, waiting and baggage rooms will be constructed inside the station, to be replaced by permanent improvements in the spring. A new bulkhead, also, will be erected along the river front. At the tunnel through Bergen Hill a new system of ventilation by means of shafts from the crown of the hill to the tunnel will be introduced. They will furnish light as well as air. At the entrance to the tunnel patent safety switches will be placed, with a new system of interlocking signals, thus rendering the danger of accidents very small. Similar switches and signals will be placed at the Newark junction, at that of the Northern Railroad, and at all draw-bridges. New ties are being placed where needed, and new rails will be put down on the entire road. Many of the stations on the roads are to be rebuilt, and all are to be colored uniformly. Additions and improvements are being made to the rolling stock, fifty new cars have been received and thirty more are being ballasted the Eastern and Delaware divisions is also being pushed. Two new steam locomotives have been ordered from thirty to fifty cars. The double track from Jersey City to Red Bank is being completed. In two years, and the road will then be remarkably clean and easy to ride over. In addition to the regular force of the road, 1,800 laborers are now at work on it.



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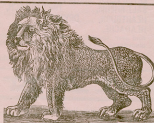
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
