Programme

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL, THE VISCOUNT WILLINGDON, G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.B.E., will arrive at the Parliament Buildings at 11.45 o'clock, A.M. The ceremony will proceed in the following order:

1. The Prime Minister of Canada, the Right Honourable W. L. Mackenzie King, P.C., C.M.G., LL.D., delivers a brief address and invites His Excellency the Governor General to inaugurate the carillon.
2. Twelve trumpeters stationed high in the Tower sound a fanfare.
3. The Honourable J. C. Elliott, K.C., Minister of the Department of Public Works of Canada, presents to His Excellency the Governor General, an electric key-block.
4. His Excellency the Governor General presses the key, signalling the Carillonneur.
5. Mr. Percival Price, Carillonneur, plays " O Canada ", " The Maple Leaf " and " God Save The King ".
6. The Governor General and party leave for the ceremony of planting the Confederation Maple Tree.
