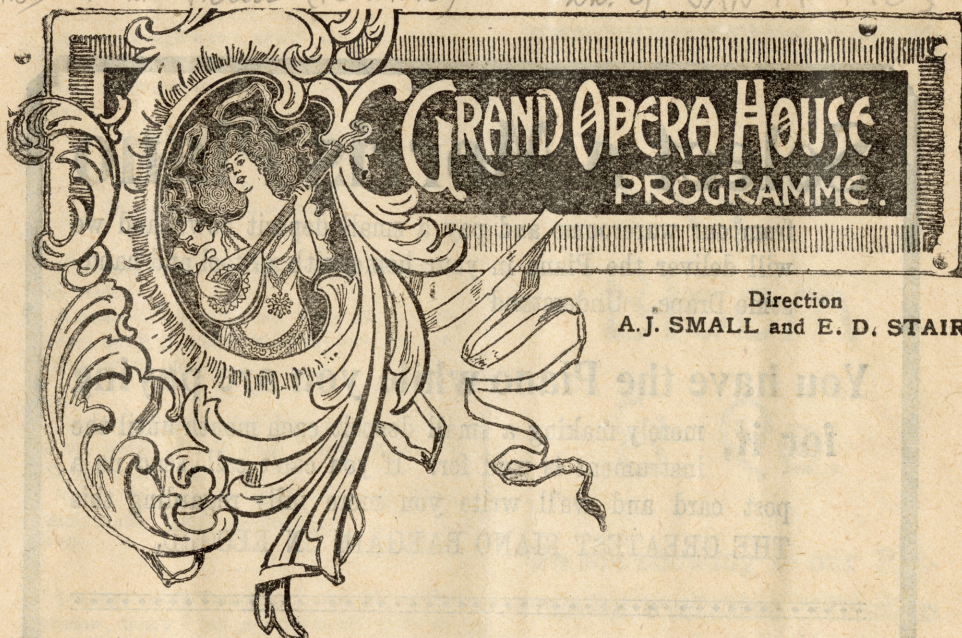




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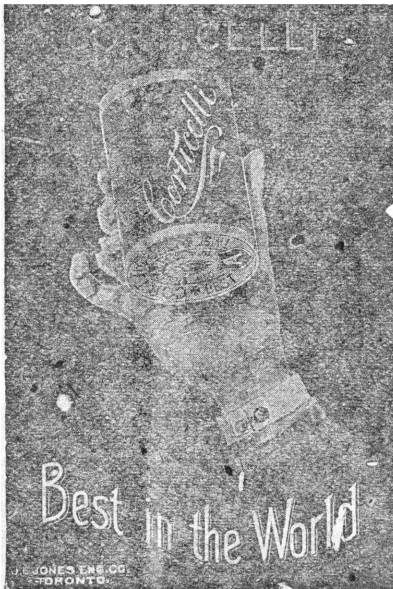
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In sunshine use the brushy part,

A provincial newspaper, referring to a fatal accident which befel a prominent fellow-townsmen, says :

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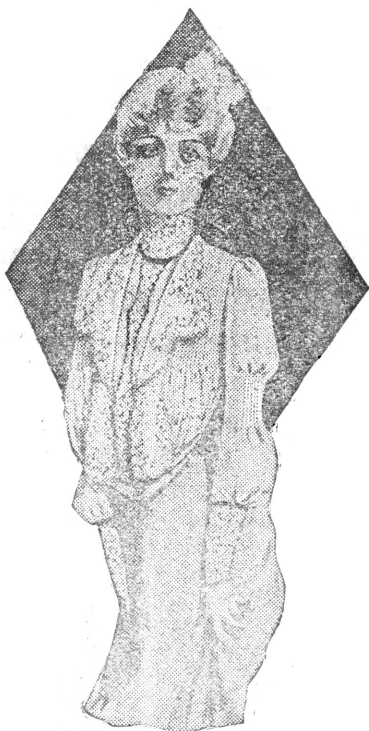

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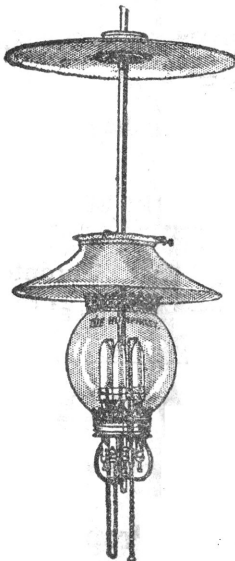

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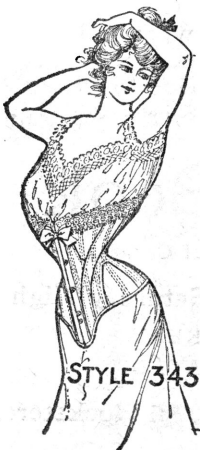
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SYNOPSIS

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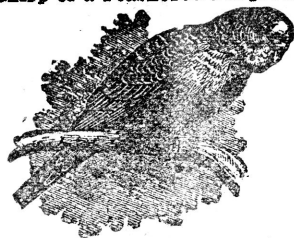
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
