Juvenile Members

A number of complaints have been received regarding the conduct of some of the Juvenile members. Knowing that in most cases it is through ignorance of the Rules and Regulations of the Club that misdemeanor occurs, we hereunder quote extracts from the By-Laws and Resolutions of the Board in connection with the Juvenile Members:---

t. The attention of Juvenile members is expressly drawn to the fact that the Granite Club is primarily an adult's Club. The creation by the Club of this class of membership is in the nature of an innovation and it is the hope of the Directors that Juveniles will so conduct themselves and observe the rules as not to give reasonable cause for complaint by adults.

2. The privilege of membership has been granted to the youth in the hope that a real benefit will be derived morally and physically by them from their association with the Club. It is for the Juveniles to see that they make a proper use of these privileges and give no reasonable cause for the curtailment or cancellation, in whole or in part, of the Juvenile Class of membership.

 Juvenile members must not be guilty of any boisterous, unladylike or ungentlemanly conduct while on the Club premises.

4. Smoking by Juvenile members is strictly prohibited.

 The interpretation placed by the House Committee, or by any officer or employee to whom such authority is delegated by the House Committee, shall be final.

6. Juvenile members are not permitted in the locker rooms after 6 в.м. on week days, except Saurday (other than for the purpose of dining with their parents). On Saurday they are not permitted in the locker rooms between the hours of 12 noon and 6 в.м. Between 6 and 10 в.м. the privilege of skating is extended to the Juvenile members.

The Directors will appreciate the co-operation of the parents in the observance of Rules and Regulations relative to Juveniles.
