The special vegetables offered below are not necessarily novelties. As a matter of fact, some of them have served Canadian gardeners for years. We take great pleasure in developing the special strains we offer for there are just as wide differences between strains of one and the same vegetables as there are between blooded live stock and the ordinary farm type. We are continually striving to serve the gardeners throughout Canada.

**41—BEANS—LARGE POLE LIMA**—While the seed retains its distinctive green color, it is as prolific as any white lima; the vines are vigorous, bearing quantities of pods, each usually containing four beans.  
Pkt. 10c, ½ lb. 35c, 1 lb. 60c, 2 lbs. \$1.10.

**44—BEANS—EARLY GOLDEN CLUSTER WAX**—Long, stringless; fine quality; pods in clusters; pure white seeds.  
Pkt. 10c, ½ lb. 35c, 1 lb. 60c, 2 lbs. \$1.10.

**92—CABBAGE—DUTCH WINTER OR HOLLANDER WINTER**—Excels as a "late spring" seller. The heads averaging about 8 pounds, very solid, white color; coming out fine in spring.  
Pkt. 10c, oz. 40c, ¼ lb. \$1.25; 1 lb. \$3.75.

**109—CARROT—MARKET GARDEN (RED CORE CHANTENAY)**—The shape is the same as regular Chantenay. The core is more red, giving it the appearance of being coreless.  
Pkt. 10c, oz. 25c, ¼ lb. 65c, 1 lb. \$2.00.

**111—CARROT—IMPERATOR**—Sleek appearing, 7½ to 8 ins. in length, 1 to 1½ ins. in diameter at the crown, well crowned with rounded shoulders, just enough top to bunch well, deep orange color which extends throughout the interior flesh and indistinct core. Shape tapers slowly to a semi-stump point. The quality is good.

**144—SWEET CORN—BANTING**—Stalks 4 ft. high, bearing 2 or 3 ears of about 5½ ins. each, with 8 rows of plump, yellow kernels. 10 days earlier than Golden Bantam.  
Pkt. 10c, ¼ lb. 20c, 1 lb. 50c, 2 lbs. 90c.

**145—SWEET CORN—GOLDEN GEM** is absolutely the earliest yellow Sweet Corn, being about 2 weeks earlier than Bantam. While it has shorter stalks than Bantam, the ears are as large and the quality fully up to Bantam. Be sure and try some of this extremely early Sweet Corn.  
Pkt. 10c, ½ lb. 40c, 1 lb. 70c, prepaid.

**151—SWEET CORN—KINGSCROST GOLDEN BANTAM**—This corn is an inbred strain of Golden Bantam. In tests it has been found to be about 10 days earlier than the Parent Corn, and seems to be especially adapted to market gardening. As all the ears are ready to pick at nearly the same time, for home gardening successive plantings should be made.

**179—CUCUMBER—WEST INDIA GHERKIN**—A very small oval prickly sort, distinct from all others. It is grown for pickles only and must be used when young.

**229A—MUSKMELON—HONEY ROCK (OR SUGAR ROCK)**—A wonderfully sweet melon with thick orange flesh and a distinctive flavor, suggesting the Honey Dew taste. An excellent home garden variety.  
Pkt. 10c, oz. 35c, ¼ lb. 70c, 1 lb. \$2.00.

**250—TENDERGREEN OR MUSTARD SPINACH**—A new variety of greens, producing only a small root, but large, dark green leaves having a small rib. It is the only vegetable that is ready for table or market in 25 days after planting, and will produce 8 to 9 crops a year. An excellent addition to the list of greens.

**269—ONION—MOUNTAIN DANVERS, YELLOW GLOBE**—Early, slightly smaller than Southport, a fine market onion. When aphids damages the late onion crop it does not harm this variety, due to early maturity.

**349—RADISH—GIANT CRIMSON BUTTER**—This is by far the largest of early turnip radishes. Recommended for home gardens. Can be planted throughout the summer.

**381—NEW RUBY RHUBARB SEED**—Bright red, tender, juicy stalks which are mild in flavor. Originated by the Dominion Experimental Farm at Ottawa.

**404—SQUASH—ZUCCA DE PERGOLA MARROW (Cucurbita Pepo)**—A vegetable marrow which grows 3 ft. in length and 3 ins. in diameter. Pale green in color. Used by Italians for slicing and frying like egg plant or baking, stuffed with meats.

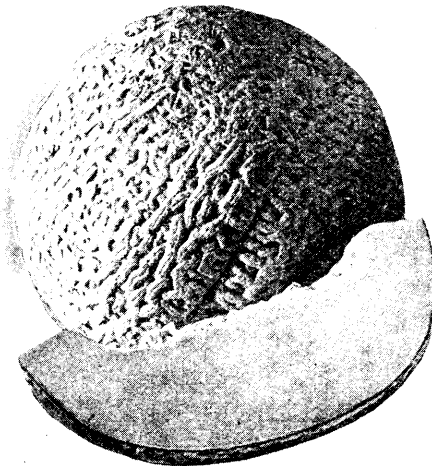

They are light green in color, and the pulp inside is pure white. When young and tender the squash is sliced off and fried like egg plant. When older it is cooked like other varieties.

**408—WINTER SQUASH—SYME'S BLUE**—A distinct type of Hubbard and a very fine quality squash. Fruit resembles the Warty Hubbard in size and shape, but the color is a clear green-blue and very distinct. Extra thick-meated, fine-grained, dry and of excellent flavor.

**444—TOMATO—SCARLET TOPPER OR PRITCHARD**—Fruits are of good size, smooth, globular, extremely solid and heavy with thick walls and deep scarlet color. It is very uniform, exceedingly productive and borne in clusters. An outstanding variety for market or home garden use.

**447—TOMATO—HETEROSIS**—If you do not already know this heavy yielding tomato, give it a trial. It is the finest medium-sized variety for forcing in the greenhouse or for outdoor planting. It is an enormous cropper, producing extra large clusters of round, entirely smooth, dark scarlet fruit.

**448—TOMATO—GRAND RAPIDS**—An excellent variety for forcing, especially adapted for growing in the greenhouse, but will also do well outdoors. Fruits medium size, rich scarlet, good quality and produced in clusters.

**495—GARDEN SORREL**—Is boiled and served like spinach, also delicious for soups. As the hot sun tends to increase its acidity, a northern exposure is advisable. It should be sown in drills 18 ins. apart. It is hardy, but the roots should be divided every four years.

## ALFALFA CLOVER

**OUR ALFALFA SEED IS ALL CANADIAN GROWN.** In recent years Alfalfa has come to be recognized by wide-awake farmers as one of the most valuable of crops for hay and pasture. **COSSACK ALFALFA**—This is a newly developed strain of extreme hardiness and, where it has been tried in Ontario, has given excellent results, both as to hardiness and yields.

## RED CLOVER

In the growing and selection of our Flower Seeds, "Quality" has always been our first consideration, and we can safely recommend all seeds offered in this Catalogue as the best obtainable. Our many years' experience has won for us the reputation of having the Best Flower Seeds in Canada.

Most flowering plants will live in almost any soil, but to give them a fair chance to develop, some care should be taken to make the ground suited to their needs. The soil best adapted to flowering plants generally is a light, friable loam, containing a sufficient amount of sand to render it porous. Many flowers are better if produced on plants of vigorous growth, hence a portion of the garden should be prepared by deep digging, thorough pulverization and liberal enriching with large quantities of well-rotted manure. Since some other varieties produce the largest and finest colored flowers when grown on rather light, poor soil, a portion of the garden should not be enriched.

**Seeds for Conservatory and House**—For winter blooming, the seed should be sown in shallow boxes any time during the spring or summer. Procure a mellow soil, almost one-fourth sand; sow the seeds on the surface, covering lightly with a little fine sandy earth; cover the box with a pane of glass, keep darkened and keep the soil slightly moist until the seeds germinate, when light and air should be admitted, partially or wholly removing the glass and placing the boxes in a warm, sunny window.

**Annuals** attain full growth, bloom and die the first year from seeds.

**Biennials** bloom the second year from seed and then die, though many, if sown early in the spring, will flower the first year.

**Perennials** usually bloom the second year from seed, and continue to grow and bloom for many years. Some will bloom the first year if sown early. **Full Cultural Directions for Sowing** are printed on each and every package and we urge the purchasers to study them carefully.

## TO SUCCEED WITH ANNUALS

1. Many people fail to get a good display of flowers by not sowing early enough.
2. Another reason and one even more prolific of harm, is sowing the seed too thickly; or 3, too deeply; and
4. Not thinning out the young plants soon enough; or 5, sufficiently.
6. Many people again do not think Hardy Annuals worth taking any trouble about, little knowing the exquisite beauty that many of them return for really but little pains bestowed—little, however, they must have and at right time.
7. For sowing choose a fine day (free from frost), when the ground works well, and rake the surface over.
8. Mix small seeds with five or six times their own bulk of dry sand so as to make it easier to sow thinly.
9. As soon as the seedlings are large enough to handle, thin them out well, allowing each one ample room to grow and expand to the full according to the known size to which the plant in question grows. It is worse than useless to thin after the plants grow leggy. If thinning out is done carefully and early enough, many of the plants can be replanted elsewhere if done immediately.
10. In dry weather, give the Annuals a thorough soaking once a week.
