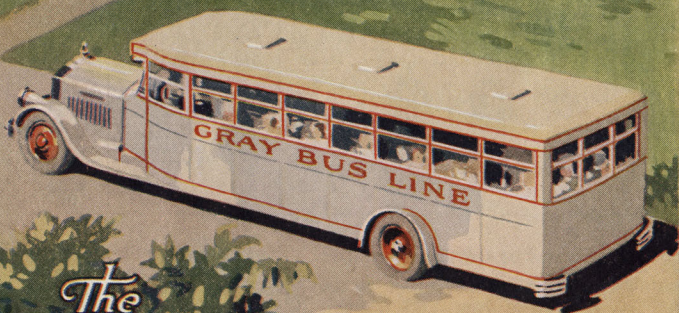

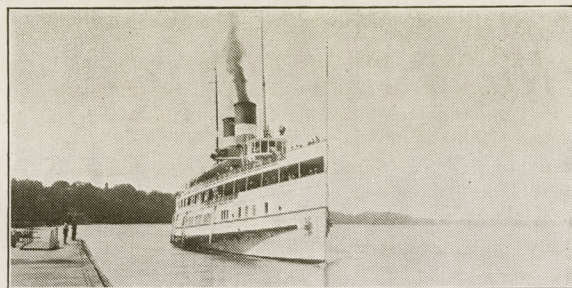

Visitors to Buffalo or Niagara Falls can so conveniently include Toronto in their itinerary, that they should not miss the opportunity of visiting this charming city. From May until October, the steamers of the Canada Steamship Lines, plying between Lewiston and Toronto, afford by far the most pleasant and comfortable route, including, as they do, the beautiful lower Niagara River and the thirty-mile sail across the western end of Lake Ontario. These large and popular boats are the finest on the Lake, the service is excellent, and surely two or three hours on the water is a delightful and refreshing change that would add much to any journey.

From Buffalo the new motor coach service of the International Bus Corporation and Niagara Gray Bus Line offers quick, comfortable and convenient service to Lewiston Dock. Those wishing to may use either the New York Central or International Railway to Niagara Falls, where close connections are made with The Niagara Gorge Railroad for Lewiston. This old established and popular route is the only one which includes the ride *through* the winding gorge and at the water's edge. The coaches or the Gorge cars run directly to the Steamship Terminal at Lewiston.

As may be noted from the schedules opposite, the round trip may be made in a day, but those who have time will welcome the opportunity of staying longer. There are hotels to suit all tastes, and Toronto is famous for its hospitality.

TREASURE'S TORONTO TOUR

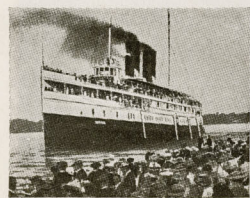
See Toronto in a Day

THESE personally conducted Toronto tours have been increasing in popularity every year since 1903 when they were first established. This is due to experience, constant improvement and the fact that they are operated via the only route which includes the ride *through* the Niagara Gorge and the beautiful sail down the river from Lewiston to Lake Ontario.

Leaving Niagara Falls every morning during the summer months in special trains from Treasure's Tour Office in the Great Gorge Terminal, passengers ride down the Gorge past the world famous Whirlpool Rapids, the Whirlpool, and Devil's Hole, with a splendid view of Brock's Monument on Queenston Heights, then to Lewiston Dock. Boarding one of the Canada Steamship Lines steamers, one first enjoys a forty-five minute sail down the now peaceful and winding Niagara River, past Stella Niagara, Youngstown; old Fort Mississauga at Niagara-on-the-Lake on the Canada side and historic Fort Niagara on the American side, both at the mouth of the river on Lake Ontario. The steamers cross the westerly end of the lake, with Hamilton on the left and the City of Toronto ahead in the distance.

On arrival in Toronto, Treasure's Special de luxe type motor coaches meet the steamer and transfer the party to the Hotel Carls-Rite for dinner. After dinner there is a wonderful sight-seeing ride with a guide on each coach who explains the points of interest which include Col. Pellett's Castle, the reproduction of Old Windsor, a tour of the Parliament Buildings, Mary Pickford's birthplace, Toronto University, Allen Gardens, Queens Park, and Rose Dale the finest residential section. On the return from the sightseeing trip one and a half hours are allowed for shopping before leaving Toronto.

These tours leave Niagara Falls 8.45 A. M. week days; 9.30 A. M. Sundays from late in May until the end of September. The parties usually return from Toronto at 4.40 P. M., arriving Niagara Falls 7.50 P. M., week days, or 3.30 P. M., arriving Niagara Falls 7.15 P. M., Sundays. All Eastern Standard Time.

There is an orchestra on the boat for dancing on the return trip and those who wish may have supper at a moderate additional charge. The fare for the round trip is \$5.50 which includes round trip ticket, dinner and sightseeing trip in Toronto with guide. Dancing from June 15th to September 15th.

NIAGARA'S GREAT GORGE TRIP

There Is No Automobile Road Through the Gorge

BY far the easiest and most complete means of sightseeing at Niagara Falls is Niagara's Great Gorge Trip whose electric observation cars are operated the year around and on very frequent schedules during summer months. These cars leave the Great Gorge Route Terminal, located at the foot of Falls Street and opposite the entrance to the park on the American side, and in a minute or two are crossing the Falls View Bridge toward Canada. Turning up stream, they run through the most beautiful part of Queen Victoria

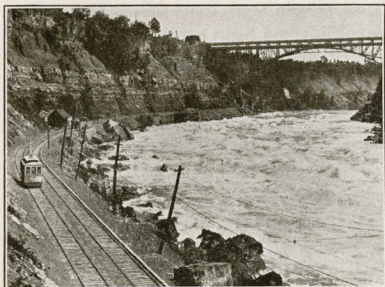


Panoramic View of American and Horseshoe Falls, as seen from Niagara's Great Gorge Trip cars

Park to Table Rock, at the Canadian end of the Horseshoe Fall.

Running down the river from Table Rock, close to the edge of the bank, they pass in turn, the Whirlpool with its Aerial Cable Car; Niagara Glen with its lovely walks and shady nooks; the great power plant of the Ontario Electric Commission; and Queenston Heights with Brock's Monument towering on the summit. As the cars gradually descend to the Queenston-Lewiston Bridge, passengers get a splendid view of the lower Niagara River winding its way to Lake Ontario and bordered by orchards and vineyards.

After crossing the river the cars run down to Lewiston, then start back through the great Niagara River Gorge. The tracks are now almost at the water's edge and the beauties of the Gorge are seen at their best. First comes the Queenston Power Plant,

viewed from an impressive angle, then Devil's Hole, then the lesser Rapids below the great Whirlpool and finally the Whirlpool Rapids themselves. Climbing up out of the Gorge the Falls may be seen in the distance, framed in the arch of the Upper

Bridge. On re-entering Niagara Falls one may stop at the main plant of the Niagara Falls Power Company where visitors are welcome and guides are furnished free.

The trip as described takes two hours, but it may well be extended by stopping over at any or all of the points of interest and continuing on a following car at no extra charge. The fare for the round trip is \$1.50 for adults, children \$0.75.



The Gray Bus Line Follows the Lower Niagara River

GRAY BUS LINE

COMFORTABLE BUSES take you from the business section of Niagara Falls, through the most attractive residential part, out into the country to Lewiston Heights with its summer homes and Country Club. Ahead and below lies the rich fruit country bordering Lake Ontario, with the lower Niagara River peacefully winding its way to the last of the Great Lakes, and just as peacefully separating Canada and the United States. Quaint Lewiston; a beautiful ride to Youngstown; then Historic Fort Niagara at the mouth of the River, and on Lake Ontario.

Established by the French over two centuries ago, the "Castle" they built in 1725 is still standing and an effort is being made to have the United States Government restore it. Later held by the British, this Fort was not finally possessed by the Americans until after the war of 1812. Fort Niagara is now the headquarters of the 28th Infantry, and is one of the few garrisoned military posts on the border between the United States and Canada.

Gray Buses leave Niagara Falls and Fort Niagara on frequent schedules, the trip taking one hour each way. You may stop over at Fort Niagara. Round Trip Fare, \$1.00.

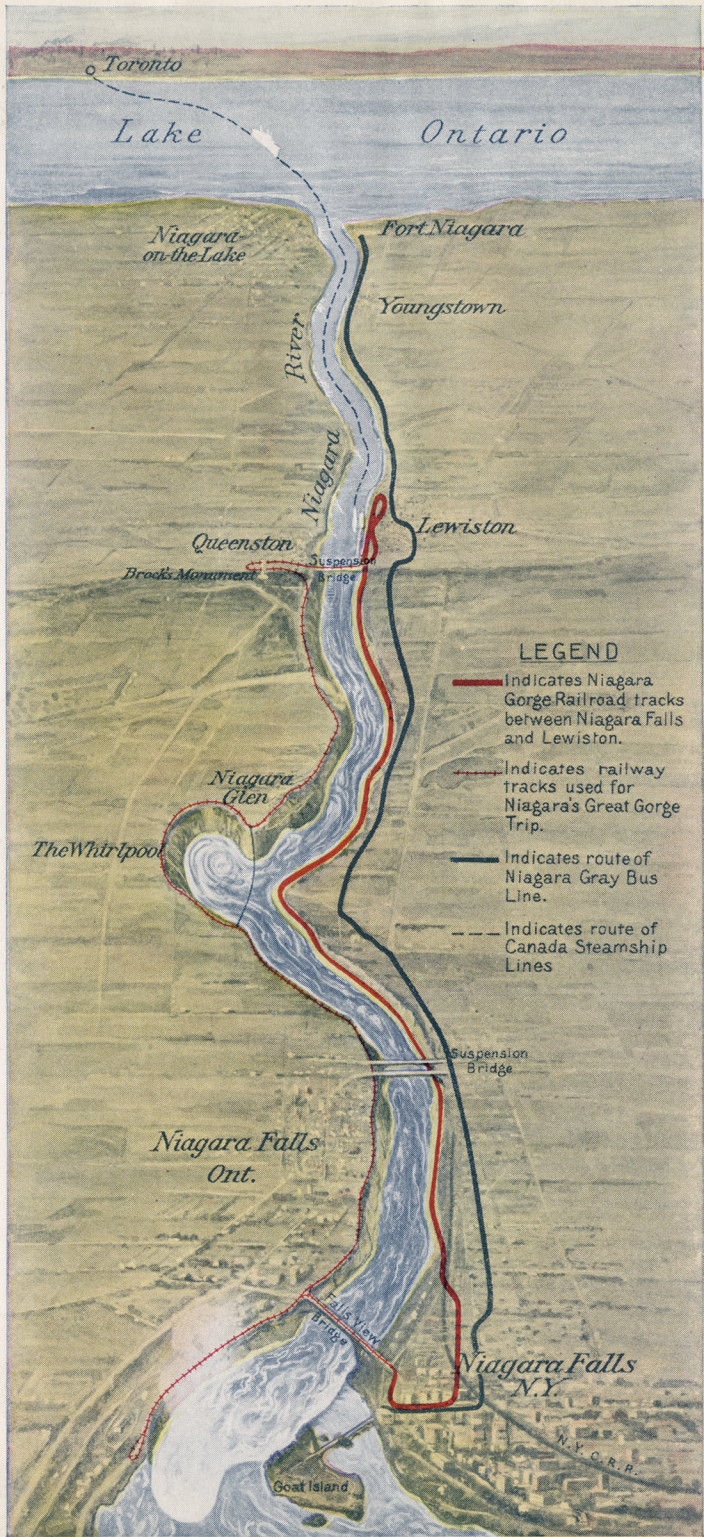
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The Evening Illumination of Niagara Falls

ILLUMINATION SPECIALS

YOU have not fully enjoyed the beauties of Niagara until you have seen the evening Illumination. Twenty-four giant searchlights mounted on the Canadian side give the Falls every color of the rainbow, while deep in the Gorge, the Whirlpool Rapids are flooded with light which brings out to the full, the tremendous rush of the mighty river. No other Illumination Trip includes the Whirlpool Rapids.

On summer evenings our "Illumination Specials" trips, starting at dusk, include the Whirlpool Rapids on the American side, and a splendid view of both Falls which can only be obtained from Queen Victoria Park on the Canadian side. You avoid a long walk or the tiresome congestion of automobile traffic, with no customs or immigration delays. The cars are held five to ten minutes at the Whirlpool Rapids, and from the time they start to cross the bridge to Canada the Falls are in full view. Fare for the round trip, \$0.75.
