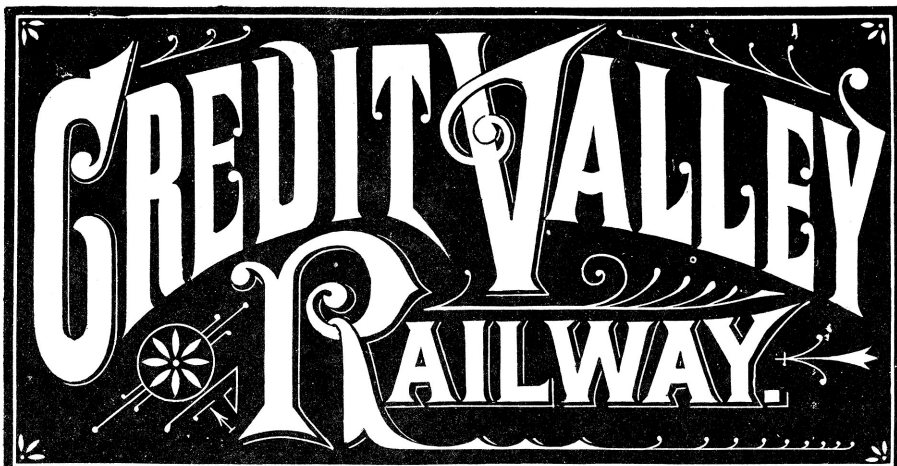

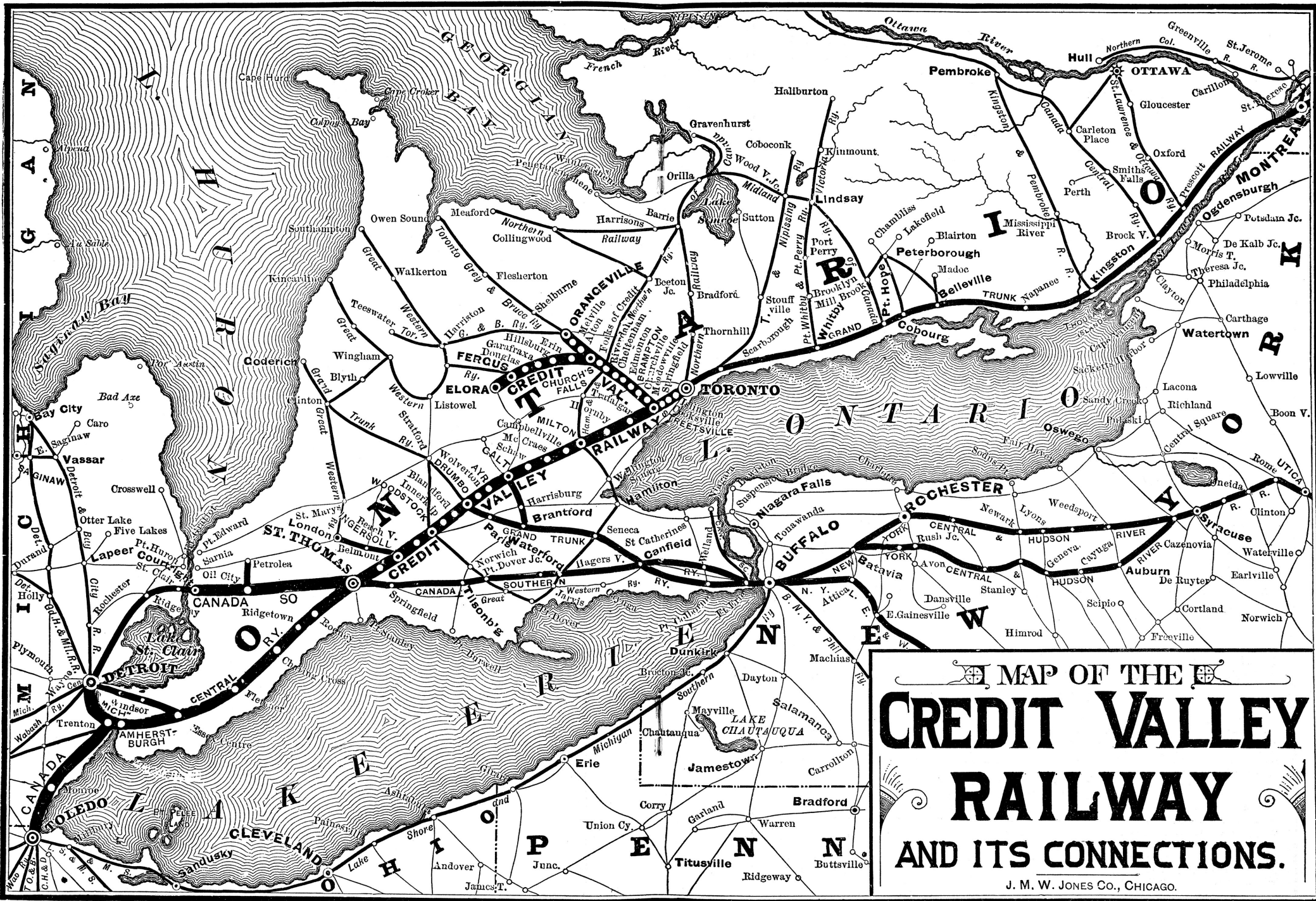

TO Through Passengers

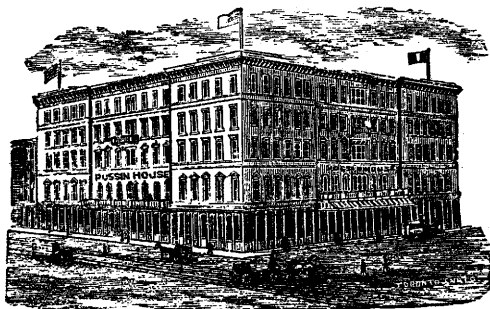

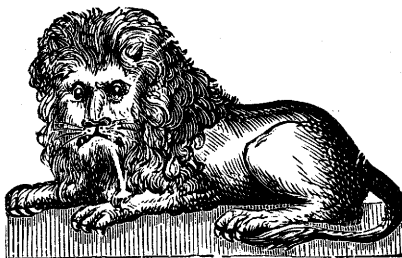
